
For more than a century, America’s transportation system has carried people, goods, and ideas across the nation, stitching together communities and regional economies. Today, however, that legacy could be at risk.

Deferred maintenance, growing cyber vulnerabilities, antiquated technology, and more frequent and intense weather events are impacting an aging network of roads, bridges, rail, runways, and transit lines. The American Society of Civil Engineers’ 2025 Infrastructure Report Card assigned most of the nation’s surface-transportation and aviation assets grades ranging from “fair” to “poor,” signaling mounting safety and reliability concerns.

An upcoming series of major international and national events will further strain the nation’s transportation network. In June 2026, 11 American cities will welcome more than 5 million fans for the FIFA Football World Cup. Shortly thereafter, nationwide celebrations for the 250th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence will include a variety of public events. Two years later, Los Angeles will host the 2028 Summer Olympics.

# Growth in Demand for Manufacturing Drove Growth in Surety Bond Guarantees in FY25

## SBA Backs Historic \$10.6 Billion in Contract Value

The U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) announced that its Surety Bond Guarantee (SBG) Program delivered record results in fiscal year (FY) 2025 with \$10.6 billion in guarantees, marking the strongest year in the program’s history.

In FY25, the program supported more than 2,200 small businesses – especially those within the construction, contracting, manufacturing, and fabricating sectors.

“In addition to surpassing the \$100 billion mark in 2025 for small business lending and SBIC investment, the Trump SBA guaranteed a record \$10.6 billion through our Surety Bond Guarantee Program to support small manufacturers,

contractors, and other job creators across our industrial base,” said SBA Administrator Kelly Loeffler. “With historic backing from the SBA, this Administration is empowering small businesses as they meet new demands for hiring, growth, and investment made possible by the America First economic agenda.”

Through its Surety Bond Guarantee Program, the SBA provides a guarantee on surety bonds for certain surety companies, which allows the companies to offer surety bonds to small businesses that might not meet the criteria for other sureties. Surety bonds help small businesses compete for and win public and private contracts by providing the customer with a guarantee that the work will be completed.

The results underscore the agency’s broad success in expanding access to capital, strengthening domestic manufacturing, and helping small businesses reduce their regulatory burdens. Last year, the agency approved record lending

through its 7(a) and 504 loan programs, totaling \$45 billion to more than 85,000 small businesses. Combined with capital deployed through the SBIC and SBIR programs, the agency supported over \$100 billion in capital in FY25.

### Surety Bond Guarantee Program Record Performance Highlights:

- \$10.6 billion in total contract value supported through guaranteed bid and final bonds, surpassing last year’s record by 15%.
- More than 2,200 small businesses assisted, the highest number in the past decade.
- \$3.4 billion in contracts generated for small businesses, exceeding the previous annual record by 19%.
- 75 bonds guaranteed for manufacturers and fabricators, a 36% increase over FY2024.

# Construction Costs Rise At Fastest Rate Since January 2023 In November, Outpacing Increases In Contractors' Bid Prices

The producer price index for materials and services used in nonresidential construction rose 0.4 percent in November and 3.6 percent over 12 months—the largest year-over-year increase since January 2023, according to an analysis by the Associated General Contractors of America of government data released today. Association officials said their latest survey found rising materials costs are a top concern of contractors for 2026 as firms grapple with a host of tariffs on construction materials.

“Input costs for construction are rising faster than for producers or consumers in general, partly because the industry is faced with steep

tariffs on many materials,” said Ken Simonson, the association’s chief economist. “Although many contractors are accelerating purchases and attempting to pass along cost increases, their bid prices have not kept up, rising only 2.7 percent in the past 12 months.”

Simonson noted that the producer price index for aluminum mill shapes, which are subject to a 50 percent tariff, soared 28 percent from November 2024 to last November. The index for steel mill products, which are also subject to a 50 percent tariff, rose 4.6 percent. But certain steel products climbed much more: the index for fabricated structural metal bar joints and rebar, a key building material, jumped 16.6 percent.

Association officials noted that the association’s 2026 Construction Hiring and Business Outlook Survey, conducted with Sage, found a majority—53 percent—of contractors list materials costs as one of their top concerns for 2026. Other frequently mentioned concerns include economic slowdown or recession, listed by 62 percent of participants, and a variety of concerns about labor availability, quality, and cost.

The survey also found only 24 percent of contractors said they had not been affected by tariffs. Forty percent of firms reported raising bid prices in response to actual or proposed tariffs, while 35 percent passed most or all tariff costs on to project owners and 32 percent accelerated purchases to avoid paying prospective tariffs.

Association officials said the November price data and their survey results together show that tariffs are driving up construction costs. Officials urged the Administration to quickly conclude trade agreements and other adjustments to bring materials costs back down.

“The frequent increases and announcements about prospective tariffs have pushed up the cost of construction and made owners hesitant to commit to projects,” said Jeffrey D. Shoaf, the chief executive officer of the Associated General Contractors of America. “Contractors and owners alike need more certainty and fewer price shocks from tariffs to assure a healthy construction market in 2026.”

## The Current State of Construction Industry Diversity

According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, women comprised only 10.9% of the construction workforce. By bringing a broader skill set, diverse teams contribute to more informed choices and resource allocation.

## Expanding the Talent Pool

The construction industry is actively seeking skilled laborers. By embracing diversity and inclusion, construction companies can appeal to a wider candidate pool. This helps address labor shortages and attracts more skilled professionals. A larger talent pool can also foster healthy competition and elevate industry standards.

## The Roadblocks to Diversity

Given the benefits, why does the construction industry still grapple with diversity? Numerous factors contribute, some deeply ingrained in the industry’s culture. Let’s examine these challenges:

frastructure, ensuring safety, bridging funding gaps, streamlining regulatory oversight, improving efficiency with emerging technologies, and tapping private sector expertise to address both existing problems and new needs. To achieve these goals, the DOT is focusing on:

Prioritizing public safety. The DOT has requested US\$22 billion for the Federal Aviation Administration to update and modernize technology for increased safety, including hiring and training up to 2,000 new air traffic controllers. Additionally, the DOT has recently made US\$982 million available to local governments for roadway safety projects.

Diversifying funding approaches. With traditional federal funding stretched thin, states and metropolitan agencies are experimenting with new revenue streams, including “value capture” mechanisms and long-term public-private partnerships. Virginia’s first-of-its-kind dynamic tolling express lanes, which were opened to traffic in 2012, have been successful. Other recent state public-private partnership projects, such as those in Tennessee and Georgia, which aim to develop miles of express lanes and provide significant upfront payments to the states while allowing concessionaires to recoup their investments through tolls, point one way forward.

Regulatory agility. At the federal level, DOT aims to reduce the regulatory burden for critical infrastructure projects, allocating US\$9 million in the fiscal 2026 budget to the Interagency Infrastructure Permitting Improvement Center to streamline permitting reviews. The administration is identifying regulations that contribute to delays while focused on safety. These changes aim to facilitate quicker, more efficient project completion.

### East Bay Small Business Development Center (SBDC)

East Bay Small Business Development Center (East Bay SBDC) hosted the Startup World Cup East Bay Regional competition on September 10, 2025, at Cal State East Bay University in Hayward. This ambitious initiative drew 140 startup applications from across the region, with 10 finalists selected to pitch before a panel of judges and investors.

The regional competition offered substantial awards: the first-place winner received the Hayward Horizon Award with a \$10,000 cash prize and the opportunity to compete in the Grand Finale; the second-place winner received the East Bay SBDC Award with a \$5,000 cash prize; and two third-place winners each received \$2,500 cash prizes—the City of San Leandro Award and the Fremont Bank Award. The event was made possible through partnerships with platinum sponsor City of Hayward, along with gold, silver, and bronze sponsors including East Bay SBDC, City of San Leandro, Fremont Bank, and City of Newark.

The winner would not only receive their cash prize, but they also earned the chance to compete in the Startup World Cup. This global event, organized by Pegasus Tech Ventures, is one of the largest startup competitions, featuring more than 100 regional events spanning six continents. The Grand Finale took place this year in San Francisco, where they pitched for a \$1 million investment prize and to gain access to a powerful

network of international investors, mentors, and industry leaders.

Under Nancy Mangold's leadership, the East Bay SBDC provided comprehensive support to regional applicants and all Top 10 finalists. The center offered workshops including Pitch Deck Guidance, Perfect Your Pitch intensive preparation sessions, and Build Traction and Partnership workshops, along with free one-on-one advising to assist applicants in preparing their pitch decks for the application process. East Bay SBDC coaches Shawn Flynn and George Parrish worked directly with finalists to refine their presentations and develop competitive strategies for both the regional and global competitions.

The regional competition featured a distinguished panel of judges including Shawn Flynn (Managing Director, Silicon Valley Highpoint Capital and Host of The Silicon Valley Podcast), George Parrish (Chief Evangelist, Bay Angels and Executive Director, Entrepreneur Lab), John Busch (Executive Leader and Startup Advisor, Berkeley SkyDeck), Simon Ng (CFO, Quark Pharmaceuticals), Izzet Darendeli (Associate Professor, Cal State East Bay), and Selina Zhang (Chair of Deal Flow Committee, Bay Angels).

The event also included a panel discussion on East Bay Regional Support for Startups, featuring representatives from the US Small Business Administration, California Office of the Small Business Advocate, Cal State East Bay, Nor-Cal SBDC, City of Hayward, Activate Berkeley, Berkeley Startup Cluster, Startup Tri-Valley, and Diablo Valley Tech Initiative. After the regional competition, the SBDC continued to support

these innovative startups with business model development, go-to-market strategies, and funding assistance.

#### Building a Win Streak

At the Startup World Cup Grand Finale on October 4, 2024, EarthGrid PBC, based in Richmond and also an East Bay SBDC client, competed against ten startup finalists selected from thousands of startups around the world and pitched in front of a panel of Silicon Valley venture capital investor judges, and won the \$1 million investment prize.

EarthGrid PBC develops patented plasma tunnel-boring technology to enable the U.S. and other countries to fix their electricity transmission grids at a fraction of the cost. The East Bay SBDC provided advising services from Axel Tillmann and Kaustav Chaudhuri at Nor-Cal SBDC's Tech Futures Group on pitch deck preparation, meeting and presenting to new investors, raising equity investment and pivoting to California government procurement.
