The Role of Black Labor in Shaping America's Workforce

It is Black History Month, and this year's theme is "African Americans and Labor," which highlights the ways Black people have influenced labor movements and shaped the workforce in the U.S.

Labor, economics, and the financial health of communities are all intrinsically linked with one another. At Self-Help, we believe in ownership and economic opportunity for all, and labor rights are a key part of making that a reality. That is why we are honored to recognize Black History Month, the history and influence of Black labor, and how that has shaped and empowered diverse communities across the country.

In this blog post, we will be discussing the history of Black workers in labor movements, the role of HBCUs in Black labor, and the future of Black wealth creation and economic empowerment.

The History & Influence of Black People in Labor Movements

African Americans have had a crucial role throughout labor movements in America. Due to the history of segregation and racial violence, civil rights were a necessary aspect of truly progressing labor rights. Black workers have had to push for both civil and labor rights, which has resulted in a huge impact on the trajectory of

workers' rights and on the labor movement as a whole.

The Caulkers Association

In the early 19th century, Black workers dominated certain trades, like caulking. Caulking was of great importance during that time, as ships risked leaking without it. There is documentation of a strike by Black caulkers at the Washington Navy Yard in 1835, which is considered the first strike of federal civilian employees, during which the workers advocated for ten-hour workdays and pushed to address grievances around lunch-hour regulations. The Caulkers Association was then formed in Baltimore in 1838 as one of the first Black trade unions in the U.S., which set a precedent for the power of unions to collectively bargain and improve working conditions for members.

The Colored National Labor Union

During the Reconstruction era, American trade unions started forming more frequently with both Black and white workers sharing an interest in trade union organizations. While the National Labor Union (NLU) passed a motion claiming that they did not recognize color during their 1869 convention and that anyone could join the NLU, many local unions ignored this and remained segregated. In addition to prevalent



Governor Newsom highlights Anduril Industries' \$1 billion expansion in Southern California

Governor Gavin Newsom today highlighted Anduril Industries' announcement of a \$1 billion investment to build a new 1.18 million-square-foot campus spanning Long Beach and Lakewood, expanding the company's California footprint to support long-term growth. Maintaining its current headquarters in Costa Mesa, Anduril's new campus will support approximately 5,500 direct jobs on site, with thousands more supported indirectly through construction, security and sup-

porting services. The facility, which will include lab space, prototype manufacturing and areas for engineers and software developers, is expected to open in mid-2027.

"Anduril's world-class innovation and deep California roots are helping shape the next generation of America's aerospace and defense industry. With this major investment, they are reinforcing California's leadership in this critical sector, creating good-paying jobs and strengthening the state's innovation ecosystem."

Anduril Industries develops advanced defense technologies, including drones, missiles, robotic submarines and autonomous fighter jets. The company currently employs 7,000 people across 35 locations, with roughly half based in Southern California. Anduril joins a dynamic ecosystem of Southern California aerospace & defense companies, propelled by a highly skilled technical workforce and a deep history of U.S. defense and aviation industries. Today, the region is one of the fastest-growing hubs for innovative space technology and advanced manufacturing in the country.

California's aerospace & defense leadership

California is home to one-third of the nation's space technology companies and employs more aerospace engineers and defense personnel than any other state. An "accelerate" sector under the California Jobs First Blueprint launched by Governor Newsom, the state's aerospace & defense sector is underpinned by an incredibly experienced workforce, world-class infrastructure and strong public-private investment, contributing an estimated \$35 billion annually to California's gross domestic product (GDP).

California is not only a national economic powerhouse — it is driving the future. Nearly \$100 million proposed for Exposition Park improvements

Mayor Karen Bass joined local leaders at Exposition Park to announce nearly \$100 million in proposed funding to execute critical renovations, infrastructure improvements, public safety upgrades, and other projects ahead of upcoming major events including the 2026 FIFA World Cup and 2028 Olympic and Paralympic Games.

“Los Angeles is about to enter the most intensive – and exciting – three year period of major sporting events that any city in the world has ever experienced, and these investments will ensure that Angelenos continue to benefit from these events for decades to come,” said Mayor Bass. “I want to thank all of our state and federal partners and the Exposition Park leadership for recognizing and investing in the need to provide a welcoming and accessible experience for fans from around the world.”

The historic investment comes as Exposition Park prepares to welcome the world with the upcoming major events, as well as the planned openings of the Lucas Museum of Narrative Art and the Endeavor Space Shuttle exhibit at the California Science Center. The funding would come from Governor Gavin Newsom’s proposed state budget for Fiscal Year 2026-2027, which allocates \$96.5 million for critical improvements and maintenance to Exposition Park. An additional \$1 million in federal funding was secured by Representative Kamlager-Dove.

“These upgrades to Expo Park are essential as we welcome the world for the Olympics and Paralympics and World Cup,” said California Natural Resources Secretary Wade Crowfoot. “Just as important, these upgrades also improve the safety and usability of the Park for Angelenos who need it to get outdoors. We’re proud of these proposed improvements and unique partnerships that are making Expo Park a truly world-class urban destination.”

“I was proud to secure over \$1 million in federal funding for my old stomping grounds, Exposition Park,” said Congresswoman Sydney Kamlager-Dove. “Investing in Expo Park as we prepare to host the 2026 FIFA World Cup and LA28 Olympic and Paralympic Games is a win for LA and for America. This funding will help to not only create a welcoming and safe environment at Exposition Park for visitors, but also benefit our community for years to come.”

“These valuable state and federal investments will advance our efforts to transform Exposition Park into a premier global destination,” said Andrea Ambriz, General Manager of Exposition Park. We are building upon our history and creating a safe, accessible, and modern Park ready to host the world. Over 300 jobs will be created, and I’m proud that our Park will be built through the hands of local community workers. Exposition Park is the backyard of Los Angeles, and will be ready to be the front yard to the world by 2028.”

“On behalf of the Board, I want to thank Governor Newsom and his continued leadership to support all Californians, and, through this investment, strengthen the backbone of our economy--our workforce from the surrounding community,” said Courtni Pugh, Chair of the Board of Directors for Exposition Park and California Science Center.

“This is a significant investment for job creation in South Los Angeles,” said Mark Wilson, President and CEO of the Coalition for Responsible Community Development. “It’s important that community members have an opportunity to benefit from legacy investments and create a sense of pride and ownership of their contributions to the transformation of Exposition Park. I’m proud to support projects that provide equity and access to family sustaining careers that have a lasting impact.”

Cyber, Secured: Cybersecurity Beyond the IT Team

As digital tools such as BIM, AI agents and digital twins become standard in construction, cyber vulnerability grows. Last year, the average cost of a data breach topped \$4.4 million. In an industry defined by thin margins and tight schedules, cybersecurity is no longer just an IT concern—it is a business and project risk. Reducing exposure requires a holistic ap-

proach, but construction leaders should focus on three priorities in 2026.

1. GOVERNANCE AS A GUARDRAIL

Most firms are already piloting AI tools to update schedules, manage supply chains and monitor jobsite safety in real time. But these systems are only as reliable as the data they access.

Shifting from manual cleanup to AI-powered data governance is essential. Environments filled with redundant, outdated or trivial data increase

the risk of AI “hallucinations” or accidental exposure of sensitive project, contract or employee information. Industry reports show that up to 55% of stored data falls into this category. Automating data inventory, archiving and deletion helps ensure AI tools operate on clean, secure datasets.

2. PROJECT-BASED USER ACCESS

Today’s biggest cyber threat is often not a hacker, but a dormant account. Workforce turnover, subcontractor access and shifting project teams

create risk when permissions linger. Former employees and contractors remain common entry points for ransomware.

Digital access should mirror physical jobsite access: time-limited, role-specific and automatically revoked when a project ends. Pairing a least-privilege model with mandatory multi-factor authentication—which can block nearly all automated attacks—significantly reduces exposure.

racial tension, this desire to remain segregated is also thought to be due to resentment between white and Black workers, who saw each other as competitors (when white workers went on strike, Black workers were often employed in their place and vice versa).

Because white workers excluded Black workers from their trade unions, Black workers started organizing independently and established the Colored National Labor Union (CNLU) during a convention that same year, which pursued equal representation for Black people in the workplace. The CNLU was one of the first national Black labor organizations and established the Bureau of Labor in Washington, D.C. to assist workers of color. The president of the CNLU, Isaac Meyers, believed that white and Black workers should organize together for higher wages and a comfortable standard of living, and he traveled the country encouraging Black workers to orga-

nize and convincing white labor unions to allow nonwhite workers into their organizations.

The Brotherhood of Sleeping Car Porters

The Pullman Company was the largest employer of African Americans in the late 1800s and early 1900s, purposefully hiring formerly enslaved people to achieve high-quality customer service on the Pullman cars. The sleeping car porters worked long hours for little pay and endured dehumanization while being expected to provide a wide range of services to ensure passengers had a comfortable trip.

The Brotherhood of Sleeping Car Porters (BSCP) was established in 1925 in an attempt to reform these working conditions. They chose civil rights leader A. Philip Randolph as the leader of BSCP since he was not employed by the Pullman Company and could not be fired by them for his actions. Randolph advocated on the Black porters' behalf through a number of publications, including a pamphlet called *The Pullman Porter*, which informed the

public about the poor working conditions and wages for the porters and ultimately shifted public opinion.

Due to several factors, it took another twelve years for the American Federation of Labor (AFL) to recognize BSCP as an international charter. When they finally did, BSCP was the first African American union to be chartered by the AFL, and they were successful in achieving several of their goals including higher wages, fewer hours in the work month, right to hearing before discharge, and reduction of the abuses by service inspectors.

Being a Pullman porter became one of the better paid and socially regarded positions available to Black people, which contributed to the growth of the Black middle class.

Black Labor & Civil Rights in the 20th Century

Between 1915 and 1960, The Great Migration occurred, in which five to six million African Americans moved north, away from racial vio-

lence and toward industrial cities to pursue job opportunities. This had a significant impact on the labor force, as Black workers were needed to contribute to steel, automobile, railroad, and shipbuilding industries.

During this time, the labor movement and civil rights became intertwined. Black trade unionists linked the priorities and interests of the labor movement with demands for racial equality. After the AFL and Congress of Industrial Organizations (CIO) merged in 1955, a Civil Rights Department was created and hundreds of thousands of Black trade unionists became part of an integrated labor movement. Organized labor backed the civil rights movement's campaigns and mobilized 40,000 union members for the March on Washington for Jobs and Freedom in 1963.

Equalizing opportunity: California group forms union to help Black carpenters, apprentices

As president of the National Black Contractors Association of America, I recently sent two carpentry apprentices to a construction job in San Diego. The young men got up at 6 a.m., made their lunches and got their gear. But when they arrived at the job site, the employer sent them home. He said he could only hire workers "from the union hall," meaning from Carpenters Local 619 in San Diego.

We're filing a complaint. It is frustrating. I could have given up; I'm semi-retired. But there's so much injustice and inequality — somebody has to fight for the under-represented African American worker.

The National Black Contractors Association of America is uniquely positioned to be on the right side of history. Over three decades, it has run the country's first Black American, federal- and state-approved "open shop" construction ap-

prenticeship program, which means its apprentices can work on jobs whether they're union members or not.

The association's union and non-union members and national chapters inaugurated the National United Black Carpenters Union Local 100. This initiative aims to advocate for the rights of Black carpenters who are marginalized and excluded from predominantly Hispanic carpenters unions. The new union will include apprentice members.

Historically, Black Americans have faced exclusion and marginalization by predominantly white unions since the 1800s. Blacks were excluded from union membership, jobs and apprenticeships in the construction industry.

The federal Civil Rights Act of 1964 aimed to level the playing field by making it illegal to discriminate against racial minorities in workplaces and improving access to union memberships and skilled trades apprenticeships.

Additionally, state prevailing wage regulations and the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban

Development rules required that all unskilled workers be approved as apprentices.

And the California California Labor Code requires all public works projects to ensure that 20% of paid work hours goes to state-approved apprentices, as part of a mandatory hiring and training program. This requirement addresses the need to maintain a skilled workforce, replace aging workers and alleviate labor shortages in our industry.

The Black Contractors Association in 1991 fought union opposition to become a state-certified carpenter and drywall lather apprenticeship program.

Today, though most of the construction industry's privately owned projects are "open shop," or merit-based employers, most contractors are members of large construction industry associations which had banned hiring apprentices from non-union sources like the Black Contractors Association.

In 2020, after George Floyd's death by Minneapolis police sparked uprisings, leaders of the Associated General Contractors of America initiated negotiations that resulted in lifting that ban.

Still, many taxpayer-funded construction projects continue to keep out Black Contractors Association apprentices because of exclusionary mandates in their collective bargaining agreements or in project labor agreements, where contractors and unions agree on employment conditions for unionized and non-union workers on a project.

Ironically Democrats promoted the idea of project labor agreements as a way to create more jobs and higher wages for the poor. Workers receive prevailing wages regardless of union membership, but they also have to pay monthly union dues.

This appeared to be a tactic to collect union membership dues to fund political campaigns aimed at establishing one-party rule in California.

SB 694 Advances, Strengthening Protections Related to Veterans' Benefits

Senate Bill 694 (SB 694), legislation addressing deceptive and unfair practices related to benefits claims for veterans and military-connected individuals, has passed both chambers of the California State Legislature. The bill passed the Senate on Jan. 26, 2026, and the Assembly on Sept. 4, 2025.

SB 694 amends the California Civil Code and the Military and Veterans Code to strengthen protections during the benefits claims process, including provisions related to deceptive practices, improper fees, and misuse of personal credentials.

"Veterans earned their benefits through service and sacrifice, and they should never be misled, overcharged, or exploited when trying to access them," said Los Angeles County Supervisor

Janice Hahn. "I applaud my friend, Senator Bob Archuleta, for leading SB 694 and strengthening critical protections to ensure veterans and their families can access the benefits they deserve without falling victim to predators."

The legislation expands the definition of public social services under the Consumers Legal Remedies Act to include additional veterans' benefits and clarifies that certain fees associated with benefits claims are unlawful if they exceed what may be charged by U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs-accredited attorneys or claims agents.

SB 694 also prohibits individuals or businesses from requiring claimants to share login credentials or provide access to systems operated by the U.S. Department of Defense, Department of Veterans Affairs, or Department of Homeland Security in connection with a transaction. Contracts entered in violation of these provisions are void.

Additional provisions restrict charging or receiving compensation for the preparation, presentation, or prosecution of benefits claims, except as permitted under federal law, and establish disclosure requirements for events or presentations related to veterans' benefits that are not sponsored by or affiliated with recognized government or veterans' organizations.

"SB 694 strengthens protections during the benefits access and claims process by prohibiting deceptive practices and improper fees," said Jim Zenner, director of the Los Angeles County Department of Military and Veterans Affairs (MVA). "It reinforces the importance of expert claims assistance provided by accredited and accountable professionals, including MVA Veterans Service Officers, at no cost. Friends don't let friends use unaccredited claims agents for VA benefits."

MVA operates a countywide Veterans Service Officer workforce, with accredited VSOs located throughout Los Angeles County. VSOs provide expert, no-cost assistance with benefits claims, including disability compensation, pension, and survivors' benefits, ensuring claimants have access to accredited support.

SB 694 was introduced by Sen. Bob Archuleta and Sen. Sabrina Cervantes, with Assembly Member Schiavo serving as principal coauthor. SB 694 has been enrolled and is expected to be acted upon by the governor in the coming weeks.
