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Black Innovation and Entrepreneurship: Past, Present, and Future

Black-owned businesses remain critical to the United States' economic success and global competitiveness. According to the U.S. Joint Economic Committee, there are over 3 million Black-owned businesses in the country, contributing over \$200 billion to the economy each year and employing approximately 1.2 million Americans. That number only continues to increase over time, with more and more young people joining the ranks of entrepreneurship.

At a U.S. Chamber of Commerce Equality of Opportunity event, Black business owners and leaders discussed the enduring power of entrepreneurship, the challenges and opportunities

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that lie ahead, and potential pathways to success for rising Black professionals.

The Past: The Civil Rights Movement and the Business Community Were Initially at Odds

Robert "Bob" Brown, Chairman and CEO at B&C Associates Inc., shared his experiences as a liaison between the business community and the Civil Rights Movement of the 1960s.

"The business community and the Civil Rights Committee were at odds at the very beginning ... because nobody was ready for this revolution to take place," he explained. "The business community was totally unprepared because Black people had never reacted this way before, so they needed some guidance as [to] what to do,

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where to go, and how to do it."

Brown's insights and expertise as a Black business and communications professional helped him to bridge the gap between the two parties, allowing for a more cooperative path forward.

The Present: Growing Black Entrepreneurship Requires an Equitable Playing Field

Nicholas Perkins, Chairman, President, and CEO of Perkins Management Services Company and Fuddruckers, believes entrepreneurship is "the gateway to economic independence" — especially for people of color, who have been historically disadvantaged and underrepresented.

Though the U.S. has made progress in supporting minority entrepreneurship, he also noted that "there is a lot of work that needs to be done to create a more equitable playing field for access to capital, contracts, and opportunities for minorities in our countries."

According to a recent study, U.S. Black startup founders received just 1% of venture capital in 2022, despite an overall increase in Black businesses in the country.

"There must be more intentionality to hold financial institutions responsible for lending

Types of Capital for Construction Businesses

Construction companies need capital to get off the ground, stay in business, and keep growing. The term capital is used across industries to represent all of a company's financial assets, including cash, inventory, equipment, and more

Several different types of capital — working capital, debt capital, and equity capital — are common in the construction industry. Construction companies need a solid understanding of capital to run a successful business.

In this article, we'll explain what construction businesses need to know about the different types of capital available — and how to use them

What is capital?

Capital is a fundamental financial concept meaning anything that is able to generate value. Money, for example, is a basic form of capital because it can be used to invest and create more wealth. But capital can take many other forms: Human capital, for instance, is labor that can build wealth. Construction businesses may have equipment, materials, or technology that function as capital, too.

However, when most construction companies think about capital, they are almost always thinking about cash. That's because other forms of capital — like labor or equipment — can't generate value if you don't have enough cash to take on new jobs, acquire materials, or cover overhead.

Joshua Leyenhorst, a CPA at BasePoint who has worked with many construction companies, defines capital like this: "Capital is all of the financial resources available to start or maintain a construction company, including working capital, debt capital, and equity capital."

Each type of capital has a specific purpose for construction businesses as they get started or look to grow.

3 types of capital for construction

Construction companies need to know the differences between the three types of capital and why each one is useful for managing and growing a business. For most businesses, working capital will be front of mind, but debt capital and equity capital serve important purposes as well.

SBA Trains 200,000th Boots to Business Entrepreneurship Course Graduate

The U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) announced the 200,000th graduate of the Boots to Business (B2B) program. This milestone reemphasizes the long-standing importance of military-connected entrepreneurs to the nation's economy and celebrates 11 years of B2B instructor achievements nationwide and overseas.

"SBA's Boots to Business program is about strengthening our aspiring military entrepreneurs, especially now as they are contributing to the record rate of new business applications we're experiencing under President Biden's leadership," said SBA Administrator Isabel Guzman. "The Boots to Business program is set up to provide transitioning service members, veterans, and military spouses with an introduction to business fundamentals to help them successfully make the jump from service to startup with the full resources of the SBA. We are proud to celebrate our 200,000th graduate and continue our leadership in connecting our military entrepreneurs with valuable resources so they can pursue their business ownership dreams after serving our country."

B2B is part of the entrepreneurial track of the U.S. Department of Defense's (DoD) Transition Assistance Program (TAP). Boots to Business Reboot (B2BR) offers the same curriculum as B2B to veterans of any era, National Guard and Reserve members, and military spouses without access to a military installation. The 200,000 graduate count grows weekly and includes participants in B2B, B2BR, DOD's TAP Online Learning Management System, and SBA's Military Spouse Pathway to Business, an entrepreneurship course for military spouses that launched in July 2023.

The 200,000th trainee took the B2B course at Fort Leavenworth in Kansas on January 16, 2024. The severe winter weather in the area caused the entire post to run on a two-hour delay. However, the course instructor said the strong qualities of the military community shined through. "Despite the inclement weather and tricky driving conditions, veterans and military spouses showed their adaptability and resilience and arrived for class anyway," said Mitchell Fitzpatrick, B2B instructor and Veterans Business Outreach Center (VBOC) director. "These skills, cultivated over their years of service, are the same ones that will give them a leg up on the competition as business owners."

It's common for many B2B participants to navigate their entire life's puzzle while they take the course. They may be focused on moving arrangements, housing, children's schooling decisions, or steady income. "Many may not circle back to entrepreneurship for months, or even years, after the course conclusion," said Fitzpatrick. "That's why I continuously remind them that the VBOC and SBA resource partner network are always here for them. Whether they want to start or grow a business, there are so many resources out there to assist in that journey. My main message to students is this: you're not alone and you should never hesitate to reach out. If you're on the fence about business ownership as a postmilitary route, taking B2B is a great opportunity to walk out of the course with new tools in your post-military service toolbox and mentors you can reach out to at any time.'

In addition to the B2B milestone, SBA's Boots to Business Revenue Readiness

(B2B RR), hosted by Mississippi State University, graduated its 3,000th trainee in November 2023. B2B RR is a six-week course in developing a business plan. Through interactive virtual classroom discussion, participants refine business models into business plans. Since the pro-

gram's start seven years ago, veteran, service member, and military spouse graduates have used the course material and feedback from instructors to move on to the next phase of their business ownership journey.

Shannon Arick of West Point, Miss., a graduate of the B2B training said, "One thing I learned in the military is that the possible success or failure of a mission may come down to good, solid training. It is the same in business. Boots to Business Revenue Readiness gave me a firm understanding of the steps that lead to having and, more importantly, maintaining a successful business."

Over 1,200 B2B and B2B Reboot classes were offered in person and virtually in Fiscal Year (FY) 2023. In addition, the B2B curriculum was updated in FY 2023 to include updated modules, new exercises, and more. B2B, B2BR, and Pathway to Business courses are offered through SBA district offices, resource partners, and grant partners. To see the current B2B course schedule, visit sba.my.site.com.

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Construction Industry Adds 11,000 Jobs In January

The construction industry added 11,000 jobs in January despite bouts of exceptionally cold or stormy weather that delayed projects in numerous regions, according to an analysis of new government data the Associated General Contractors of America released today. Association officials noted that firms are boosting wages and taking other steps to attract more workers as firms try to keep pace with relatively strong

"Although job gains were modest last month, other evidence suggests there is still lots of demand for workers," said Ken Simonson, the association's chief economist. "Wages rose faster than in other sectors, job openings at the end of 2023 were at near-record levels for December, and construction spending jumped that month.'

Construction employment in January totaled 8,137,000, seasonally adjusted, an increase of 11,000 or 0.1 percent from the upwardly revised December total. The sector has added 216,000 jobs during the past 12 months, a gain of 2.7 percent. Residential building and specialty trade contractors added 2,700 employees in January and 60,100 (1.8 percent) over 12 months. Employment at nonresidential construction firms-

nonresidential building and specialty trade contractors along with heavy and civil engineering construction firms—climbed by 7,600 positions for the month and 155,100 (3.3 percent) since January 2023.

Average hourly earnings for production and nonsupervisory employees in construction—covering most onsite craft workers as well as many office workers—climbed by 5.3 percent over the year to \$35.21 per hour. Construction firms in December provided a wage "premium" of nearly 19 percent compared to the average hourly earnings for all private-sector production employees.

Government reports on job openings and construction spending earlier this week show demand for construction workers and projects remains robust, the economist said. Job openings in construction at the end of December totaled 374,000, not seasonally adjusted, greatly exceeding the 227,000 workers hired and implying that contractors want to hire far more workers than they are able to find, Simonson said. In addition, spending on projects under way that month totaled \$2.1 trillion at a seasonally adjusted annual rate, 0.9 percent higher than in November and 14 percent higher than a year earlier.

How to Win More Construction Bids in 2024

Once you start looking at how much it costs, you may see that you would not get a profit from the job. If you notice this, the best thing to do is dump the bid and look for another project.

Finding the right balance between bidding and winning enough jobs can be hard. You don't want to bid and win so much that you can't finish the jobs on time or so little work that you're not making money.

Choosing the right work to bid on puts you on the right path to more profits. That's why it's important to have a strong bid/no-bid decision process in place.

What is a Bid-Hit Ratio?

Are you keeping track of your bid-hit ratio? If not, you need to start.

Your bid-hit ratio is the number of projects you must bid on to win one job. Understanding this ratio can help you learn how many projects you need to keep your pipeline full. It can also help you cut out bids that you may not be able to win.

To make your bid-hit ratio work best for your business, you should perform an in-depth study:

- 1. List the projects you've bid on and put them into specific groups. These groups can be things like:
- · Public projects
- Private projects
- · Types of buildings
- Trades required
- · Locations of the projects
- Who is the general contractor?
- Who is the project owner?

- 2. After putting your bids into groups, mark the ones you've won.
- 3. Now, you are ready to calculate your ratio. It is the number of bids you have made compared to the ones you have won.
- For example, If you have bid on 7 public projects and won 1 of them, you would give a bid-hit ratio of 7:1.
- 4. Do this calculation for all your categories.
- 5. Now, compare all your ratios.

The goal is to find the ratio with the smallest difference between the two numbers.

Here's an example. If your public project bidhit ratio is 7:1 and your bid-hit ratio for private projects is 4:1, you have a better ratio with private projects. This is because you are putting in fewer bids to win those projects. That means you should focus more on those private opportunities and spend less time bidding on public projects.

Review Profitability

Once you know which kind of projects to go for, it's time to look at how much profit they bring you. To do this right, you must first keep track of accurate job costs for materials, labor, and equipment. Next, you need to compare your actual costs to your estimates and ask the following questions:

- Were my estimates for labor and materials accurate?
- Did I include all the job costs in my estimate, including bonding, supplies, and equipment?
- Did I factor in my profit and overhead mark-up correctly?
- Was my contingency budget enough?

If your profit margins aren't what you expect, you have either made your estimates too low, or there are productivity issues on site, which caused costs to increase.

Regardless of the cause, you should work to resolve the issues to get your profit margins where they need to be.

By combining the data from your bid-hit ratios and your profit margin analysis, you can better seek out the projects you have the best chance of winning and making the most money on.

Conduct a Bid/No-Bid Review

Before you start investing your time into a bid proposal, you need to do a thorough bid/no-bid review of each opportunity.

Here's how:

Get all the project documents, plans, and specifications

- 1. Take the time to read them carefully
- 2. Run calculations on the numbers to see if you can make a decent profit.
- 3. Determine you have the workforce and equipment to complete the job on time.
- 4. Make sure you can also handle the project's size and scope.
- 5. Look out for any "red flags" that might cause problems if you win the project.
- Red flags can be things like unknown site conditions, safety concerns, sped-up timelines, or incomplete or incorrect bidding documents.

There are a couple of other things you may want to consider in your review:

- Project location.
- Duration of the project.

- Other companies you may be competing against for the project.
- The client or project owner.

Doing the bid/no bid review and determining which of the other things are most important to your company will help you when it's time to choose an opportunity.

Identify and Manage Risks

Discovering and taking care of risks may be the most overlooked part of preparing a bid. If you've found potential risks, you need to study each one individually to make them right.

Consider how dangerous the risk is and the impact it can have on the project. If the risk doesn't seem too likely to happen or would have a low impact on progress, it might be easy to take care of. However, a risk that could become a reality and seriously affect the job could hurt your profits

You will be a much better bidder if you can identify the risks connected to a project. It will also make you better prepared to handle a situation when something goes wrong.

Starting this process early means you can avoid bidding on projects that won't make you a profit. It can help you make more accurate bids and contingency budgets, too. Project management will run smoother, and you'll save time, money, and resources as work progresses.

Seek Clarifications, Avoid Assumptions

Outside of your equipment and workers, you also need to make sure your bid covers other things the project owner or architect may require.

Will WA ever end supermajority law for school construction bonds?

Tacoma Public Schools wants to replace five old school buildings, including the 112-yearold structure that houses the 400-student IDEA High School. "It's quite the eyesore," said Rosalind Medina, the district chief financial officer.

In addition, the district also has a long list of mundane, but needed, upgrades across Tacoma schools — electrical work, heating and air conditioner fixes, plumbing replacements and

The price tag: \$650 million. Tacoma, and 20 other districts throughout Washington, will ask voters to approve their construction projects next Tuesday. Unlike most elections in Washington that get decided by a simple majority, school bonds require a supermajority or 60% - to pass. Democratic lawmakers and school district boosters say they hope that the legislature - and voters - can change that.

Supporters of the supermajority law say it's an important check against raising taxes. Washington's Constitution has required that 60% threshold for bonds since it was amended in

Because the supermajority law is in the state Constitution, it faces its own hurdles to change - a two-thirds majority vote in both chambers, then voter approval. But this is not unheard of: School levies, which often augment school operating budgets but can also pay for construction and other spending, used to require a supermajority, but now require only a simple majority after the state constitution was amended in 2007.

That 60% threshold for bonds has been a major hurdle to upgrading and repairing schools in many Washington districts.

From 2013 through 2023, Washington voters passed 143 school bond issues. But in that period, another 114 school bonds failed, because though they collected more than 50.1% of the votes, they fell short of 60%, according to Washington Office of Public instruction figures.

"It creates an unobtainable goal for many communities," Sen. Sam Hunt, D-Olympia, told lawmakers at a Senate Committee on Early Learning & K-12 Education earlier this year.

But the supermajority still has supporters, saying school districts need to justify their tax increases

"The answer is not to change the standards, but to build a better case [for a school bond]. I don't think the answer is to simply change the rules," said Senate Minority Leader John Braun, R-

In most elections, 60% would be considered a landslide. Gov. Jay Inslee's defeat of his GOP challenger Loren Culp in 2020 was considered a blowout at 56% of the vote. The last presidential candidate who broke 60% in the popular vote

was Richard Nixon, who got 61% in 1972.

This session in Olympia, two Democratic pieces of legislation are in play to lower that 60% requirement for school bonds to a simple majority.

Every few years, legislative Democrats try to make this change, but legislation to change the state constitution needs two-thirds approval in both the Senate and House. While supporting the proposed change, Democratic leaders are pessimistic that this will be the year that this passes. Republican legislators are adamant that won't take place, arguing taxes should be difficult to

Washington Superintendent of Public Instruction Chris Reykdal asked Hunt and Rep. Monica Stonier, D-Vancouver, to introduce bills to switch that constitutional requirement back to a simple majority. Reykdal said that he requested the legislation because of the new crop of Republican legislators who were elected to represent their district last November. He hopes that they will see benefits to their home school districts by switching to a simple majority, thus enabling the proposals to pass the two-thirds threshold.

Hunt's legislation has moved to the Senate Ways & Means Committee, while Stonier's legislation has stalled in the House Education Committee. Rep. Paul Harris, R-Vancouver, introduced a bill in 2023 and reintroduced it this year to lower the threshold to 55%. That bill has not moved at all.

Reykdal said a prosperous school district in a prosperous area can easily find money for repairs and building upgrades. However, districts in poorer areas have problems keeping up with maintenance. "The need is enormous," Reykdal

But even large districts can fail to meet that benchmark. While Tacoma schools have successfully passed its three most recent bond measures, it is still haunted by the specter of a 2007 bond issue that failed despite getting 53% of the

Reykdal said the 60% threshold also handicaps local school districts from tapping into state capital-gains-tax revenues marked for school construction and repairs. In 2022, Washington installed a capital gains tax of 7% on such income in excess of \$250,000 per person, with the money earmarked for education and school con-

Between July 1, 2022, and June 30, 2023, the state collected \$487.5 million in capital gains taxes, allocating \$347.5 million to the school construction account, according to the state Office of Financial Management. The OFM predicts another \$290 million will be collected for the school construction account in fiscal 2024. But schools can access those construction funds from the capital gains tax only if local voters pass their construction bonds in the first place.

"Considering most construction positions don't require a college degree, construction careers offer an almost certain path to economic security," said Stephen E. Sandherr, the association's chief executive officer. "Yet too few workers are ever exposed to the many career opportunities available to them in construction as policy makers continue to urge everyone to go to college instead."

Projects Stalled by the Expiration of 421-A Set to Move Forward Following Governor's Executive Action – Creating More Than 1,400 Affordable Units

Governor Also Announces Groundbreaking for 654-Unit Development at 320 and 340 Nevins Street – Renderings Available Here

Governor Launched Bold Executive Action To Address The Housing Crisis Last Year, Proposing Strong Legislative Solutions To Housing Crisis In This Year's Executive Budget

Governor Kathy Hochul today announced that 18 new housing developments will move forward under the Gowanus Neighborhood Mixed Income Housing Development Program, unlocking more than 5,300 units of housing, including more than 1,400 affordable units in the Gowanus section of Brooklyn. Governor Hochul launched the program last year to save thousands of units stalled by the expiration of 421-A as part of a package of Executive Actions to increase New York's housing supply. The Governor also announced today the groundbreaking of 320 and 340 Nevins Street – a 654-unit project, including 154 affordable units, being developed by Charney Companies and Tavros Holdings and one of the first projects to move forward under the "After years of stalled construction, we're putting more than 5,300 new homes back on track and unlocking Gowanus' housing potential," Governor Hochul said. "New Yorkers are facing the lowest vacancy rates in six decades while costs continue to rise — they can't afford to wait for solutions to the housing crisis. The only way to fix this crisis is to build our way out, and until we have a statewide solution, I will keep working to give Mayor Adams and leaders across our state the tools they need to let them build."

Governor Hochul announced the Gowanus Neighborhood Mixed Income Housing Development Program last year to facilitate the development of housing, including affordable housing, in New York City. The program is aimed at targeting specific benefits and affordable housing obligations in line with the now-expired 421-a tax law for development proposals currently vested under 421-a and capitalize on a local 2021 rezoning covering 82 blocks to accommodate housing growth in Gowanus.

The program, which is being overseen by Empire State Development, is moving forward with 18 individual project sites, whose applications were received last fall.

1. Working capital

Working capital measures the difference between a construction company's current assets and current liabilities. In other words, working capital highlights the financial prospects of a business in the short term.

Businesses whose assets (like cash, accounts receivable, inventory, or materials) exceed the value of their liabilities (like wages, debts, vendor payments, or overhead costs) have working capital to use to maintain or grow. On the other hand, companies that have liabilities exceeding their assets lack working capital and may have trouble making payments and staying afloat.

"Working capital evaluates the financial resources a company requires to operate the company," notes Joshua Leyenhorst. "It's something business owners need to consider over the course of the next year of operations. Many companies are only thinking in terms of the next month — the next two payroll periods or upcoming vendor payments — but stable companies typically have sufficient cash forecasts to project their working capital further out."

Working capital is the lifeblood of a construction business. Because payment for construction jobs may be weeks or months after work is already completed, companies must manage their finances carefully to maintain cash reserves for taking on new jobs.

In certain situations, a company's best option is to employ debt capital to finance certain expenditures, which helps keep working capital intact.

2. Debt capital

Debt capital is funding that a construction business acquires by borrowing, typically from banks or other lending institutions. By taking on debt, construction companies can defer payment on large purchases and use cash reserves for more immediate costs, like employee payroll or purchasing materials for a new job.

"In construction, debt capital is often used to purchase so-called 'capital assets,' which would include equipment, vehicles, and real estate," says Joshua Leyenhorst. "Often, the case is pretty strong to use debt financing for long-term assets, which frees up cash for operating expenses. However, companies need to be on the lookout for lender covenants or other restrictions that may make debt capital less attractive."

Construction companies, just like individuals, need a credit history in order to borrow money. Frequently, companies start with a business credit card or another small line of credit that they pay back consistently in order to increase their creditworthiness. That way, as the need for credit increases, a business already has a demonstrated history of paying back debt.
