

California's Mega Projects 2026: Infrastructure, Innovation & Talent Demand

California's mega projects 2026 represent a defining moment for the state's infrastructure future and for the contractors, developers, and construction professionals tasked with delivering them. This article provides a focused summary of the biggest megaprojects targeting key 2026 milestones, then examines what these initiatives mean for workforce demand, hiring strategies, and career opportunities across the Golden State.

The scale is staggering. More than \$150 billion in collective investment spans transportation, water, energy, and urban development. According to the BLS, California already employs more construction workers than any other state, and overlapping megaproject timelines are intensifying competition for experienced leadership.

- **High-speed rail construction** continues along the Central Valley spine, with critical structures and guideway work advancing toward interim service targets
- **Silicon Valley transit expansion** through BART Phase II, bringing heavy rail to downtown San José and Santa Clara
- **New city-scale developments** such as California Forever in Solano County

- **Water and resilience infrastructure** including Delta Conveyance and major reservoir initiatives
- **Healthcare and education campuses** expanding across UC and private systems
- **Large urban mixed-use districts** near transit hubs across major metros

These megaprojects are creating unprecedented demand for project executives, superintendents, estimators, and project managers who can navigate multi-billion-dollar programs and complex stakeholder environments. The Birmingham Group works with California contractors and developers to staff these

leadership roles through specialized search support.

California High-Speed Rail: Central Valley Spine & 2026 Milestones

California High-Speed Rail remains the state's flagship transportation megaproject, fundamentally reshaping north-south mobility while sustaining construction hiring demand through 2030 and beyond. With design speeds of 220 mph planned across 380 miles connecting Los Angeles to San Francisco, this is North America's most ambitious railway endeavor.

- **Current construction focus:** The 119-mile Central Valley segment from Madera to north of Bakersfield anchors active work. By 2026, targets include substantial completion of major viaducts, grade separations, and structures. As of early 2025, more than 50 structures were complete, with additional packages underway.
- **Environmental and design status:** Over 460 of 494 Phase 1 miles have received environmental clearance, enabling design to advance on the Merced-Bakersfield interim service segment. Right-of-way acquisition continues in parallel.

Ranking Member Markey Introduces SPARK Act to Supercharge Minority Entrepreneurship Nationwide

Ranking Member Edward J. Markey (D-Mass.), alongside Senators Mazie Hirono (D-Hawaii) and Cory Booker (D-NJ), and Representative Ayanna Pressley (MA-7) today introduced the Strengthening Place-based Access, Resources, and Knowledge (SPARK) Act to spur entrepreneurship and increase access to capital and resources for underserved entrepreneurs nationwide. The SPARK Act would create the SPARK Program to provide grant funding to community

organizations that support small business accelerators and incubators, and the SPARK Financing Program to provide grants and low-cost loans directly to underserved small businesses.

"In Massachusetts, Black and Latino-owned businesses report issues accessing capital at twice the rate of white-owned businesses. This gap is not an accident—it's the predictable consequence of intentional, unjust policies that have excluded entire communities from the opportunity to accumulate wealth," said Ranking Member Markey. "Structural problems require

long-term, whole-of-community solutions. My SPARK Act would supercharge existing infrastructure and create a new program that provides direct grants to underserved entrepreneurs. I'm proud of being on a team with Jaylen to help uplift the next generation of underinvested entrepreneurs."

"Our Black, Latino, and women-owned businesses are pillars of our communities, but they are too often targeted for disinvestment with no meaningful opportunities to build wealth," said Rep. Ayanna Pressley. "In order to build wealth across our communities, we must confront the structural inequities that have long been embedded in our economic infrastructure and entrepreneurship opportunity. The SPARK Act would do exactly that—ensuring that the small businesses and business owners we know and love not only have the resources to stay in our city, but to grow. I'm grateful to introduce this legislation with Senator Markey and community partners to ensure our economy reflects the dreams and needs of the people who carry it."

"Hawaii is the most diverse state in the nation, and our economy depends on small businesses and entrepreneurs from all backgrounds. As the Trump Regime continues to attack programs that support diverse businesses, it's critical that we reaffirm our commitment to supporting these businesses and the communities they serve," Senator Hirono said. "By creating a new program that directs grants to underserved entrepreneurs, the SPARK Act will help to foster and strengthen minority-owned businesses in Hawaii and across the country. I'm proud to join Ranking Member Markey in introducing legislation that recognizes the importance of diversity and invests in our future."

"Our nation's economy is strongest when opportunity reaches everyone, not just the wealthiest few," said Senator Booker. "Since its inception, the Small Business Administration has been the voice of entrepreneurs and small business owners who can't access the capital and resources they need to thrive, because they are passed over by big banks, are from a small town, or simply aren't well-con-

California files lawsuit AGAINST TRUMP FOR ILLEGALLY TERMINATING \$1.2 BILLION IN ENERGY, INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRAMS

Governor Newsom's administration filed a lawsuit challenging the Trump administration's unlawful decision to terminate \$1.2 billion in funding for congressionally mandated energy and infrastructure programs. These terminations threaten over 200,000 new family-sustaining jobs and undermine programs slated to save nearly \$3 billion in health costs per year and improve the health of Americans who have suffered from some of the worst air quality in the nation.

The lawsuit, filed with Attorney General Rob Bonta and a coalition of attorneys general, alleges that the termination and abandonment of \$1.2 billion in federal funding for ARCHES (Alliance for Renewable Clean Hydrogen Energy Systems) and \$4 million under the Resilient and Efficient Codes Implementation (RECI) program violate the constitutional separation of powers, as the funding was approved and appropriated by bipartisan majorities in Congress.

We will not allow Trump to sell out our future to his biggest donors. Trump didn't just tear up a contract: he defied Congress, jeopardized more than 200,000 good-paying jobs, and robbed

billions of dollars in health savings from communities that have been hit the hardest by pollution. We're not letting that stand. California will fight for these jobs, this infrastructure, and the global clean energy competitiveness that the Trump administration has ceded to China.

"The President claims to seek 'American Energy Dominance' but, in California, his unlawful termination of over \$1.2 billion in total funding for crucial clean energy projects means over 200,000 union job cuts, rising energy prices, and higher rates of pollution that wreak havoc on our health," said Attorney General Bonta. "The President is cherry-picking this funding at the expense of hardworking Americans and stifling innovation and the economy for the sake of partisan retribution. My office will continue to hold the President and his administration accountable for breaking the law."

"The cancellation of ARCHES' funding was a shortsighted decision from the Trump Administration, one that threatens the promise of California's hydrogen market while the rest of the world surges ahead in its development," said Dee Dee Myers, Senior Advisor to Governor

Newsom and Director of the Governor's Office of Business and Economic Development (GO-Biz). "Today's filing is yet another sign that we will not back down from this threat—we'll keep pushing forward in our effort to create a carbon-neutral economy that benefits all California's residents."

"California is building the electric grid of the future, and we are doing so by slashing emissions, advancing innovation, and focusing on affordability for consumers," said CEC Chair David Hochschild. "The Trump Administration's termination of grants like ARCHES, RECI, and so many other innovative clean energy programs undermine energy independence and make electricity more expensive for consumers. Not on our watch."

In July 2024, the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) and ARCHES announced the official signing of a landmark \$12.6 billion agreement—the largest in DOE history—to build a clean, renewable hydrogen hub in California. In 2023, California was selected as a national hydrogen hub; it was the first of seven to sign its agreement with DOE, which included up to \$1.2 billion in federal funding.

The ARCHES hub was designed to create a network of clean, renewable hydrogen supply and demand and cut fossil fuel use throughout California. With the ultimate goal of decarbonizing public transportation, heavy-duty trucking, and port operations, the new ecosystem would remove 2 million metric tons of carbon per year, roughly equivalent to the annual emissions of 445,000 gasoline-fueled cars.

Trump's economic failure

Trump's unlawful cuts to clean energy and infrastructure projects — and the jobs that come with them — are part of a broader pattern of reckless and illegal actions by his administration. They also reflect failed economic policies that leave American families paying the price.

Under Trump's economy, job growth has fallen to its lowest levels since 2009. Growth stagnated in 2025, with losses in some sectors including manufacturing. The pattern has continued into 2026, with layoffs in January the highest since the Great Recession.

American families are also feeling the pain of Trump's chaotic tariff policies, which are raising the price of food and essential goods and costing American households an average of \$1,000 each last year.

A majority of Americans now believe that Trump's policies are making their lives more difficult and less affordable

California's climate leadership

Pollution is down and the economy is up. Greenhouse gas emissions in California are down 21% since 2000 — even as the state's GDP increased 81% in that same time period, all while becoming the world's fourth largest economy.

California also continues to set clean energy records. In 2023, the state was powered by two-thirds clean energy, the largest economy in the world to achieve this level. California has also run on 100% clean electricity for part of the day almost every day last year.

Since the beginning of the Newsom Administration, battery storage has surged to nearly 17,000 megawatts — a 2,100%+ increase, and over 30,000 megawatts of new resources have been added to the electric grid. California now has 33% of the storage capacity estimated to be needed by 2045 to reach 100% clean electricity.



nected. The high costs of Trump's economy and his attacks on SBA programs have now made it harder than ever to find a quality job and start or grow a small business. This legislation would reverse course, expand access to financing and mentorship, benefiting more Americans by helping women, veteran, and minority-owned businesses grow so their local communities can thrive."

Several community leaders and stakeholders emphasized the importance of the SPARK Act to supercharging minority entrepreneurship nationwide.

"Real economic power comes from ownership, not just having a job, but owning the business, the building, the block. When communities have the resources to build and capital circulates locally instead of extracting out, that's when you create generational wealth, not just jobs," said Jaylen Brown, Founder of Boston Xchange and five-time NBA All-Star for the Boston Celtics. "Senator Markey's SPARK Act invests in the institutions that help people go from employees to owners, from renters to builders. That shift doesn't just build wealth, it builds belonging. And when people feel rooted in the places

they live and work, the benefits ripple across the entire community, creating stability, pride, and long-term economic power."

"Community isn't transactional, it's transformational. When you love your community like family, you don't just write a check and walk away. You build systems that last. You invest in the people and institutions that know how to support businesses the way families do: with trust, patience, and long-term commitment," said Jrue and Lauren Holiday, Founders of the JLH Social Impact Fund. "Senator

Markey's SPARK Act resources the ecosystem builders who show up that way, not for a program cycle, but to build systems that last and create real belonging. When people feel supported and seen, that impact ripples outward, strengthening families, neighborhoods, and local economies for generations. That's the difference between supporting communities and transforming them."

Brown's Wood Shop - Chiseling Out a Digital Presence for Traditional Craft

Suzanne Brown is the owner and artisan behind Brown's Wood Shop, a handcrafted woodworking business located in Pioneer, California. Her work blends traditional craftsmanship with artistic creativity, producing layered, three-dimensional wooden nature scenes and decorative objects. Each piece is meticulously cut using a laser or CNC machine, then hand-stained or painted to create a truly unique finish. Suzanne's creations are both artistic and functional, representing a fusion of generational woodworking heritage and modern artistic expression.

Suzanne's inspiration came from her family's long lineage of woodworkers and her inheritance of a fully equipped woodshop. Initially, she specialized in crafting unique furniture pieces, but as she approached retirement age, she shifted her focus toward lighter, more manageable projects. This evolution allowed her to continue creating while adapting her craft to her changing lifestyle, preserving her family's woodworking legacy in a way that remains sustainable and fulfilling.

However, working in rural Amador County presented challenges. Prior to connecting with the Ru-

ral Business Center, Suzanne faced isolation from other creative professionals and a lack of visibility for her work. Amador County offers limited artistic and business development resources, which made it difficult for her to expand her audience or access professional guidance in digital marketing and business promotion.

That changed when Suzanne discovered the Rural Business Center, a program operated by the California Asian Pacific Chamber of Commerce.

Through the Center's partnership with the Chamber, Suzanne attended a free seminar led by a media expert, which introduced her to digital marketing tools and strategies. This initial exposure led her to sign up for personalized one-on-one sessions with instructors Lisa and Joe Fairgood. These sessions focused on using Canva and social media to promote her work effectively.

The training was transformative. Suzanne not only gained technical skills but also the confidence to

apply them. After creating and posting a short video of her art on Instagram, her work was noticed by Sutter Creek Gallery, which immediately invited her to apply for their next art exhibit. Without this exposure and the individualized instruction she received, Suzanne might never have connected with this opportunity.

"Working with Lisa and Joe has been an incredible experience—they're such a dynamic team!" Suzanne shared. "With their guidance, I feel like I've launched into a whole new realm. I'm deeply grateful to Sherri for connecting us and making this opportunity possible. The classes provided via the Rural Business Center have been truly transformative, and I'm excited to share my future successes. Thank you for all you do!"

Suzanne found the one-on-one instruction to be the most valuable component of the technical assistance. The personalized sessions provided clear, accessible explanations of various social media platforms and their effective use for small business marketing. The hands-on, supportive approach helped her gain confidence in digital tools that once felt intimidating.

Butterfli Technologies

For founders Delilah Lanoix and John Harris, seeing the rise in popularity of rideshare companies was a major catalyst, as they quickly realized people with barriers to mobility were being left behind. This was even more alarming in low-income areas of LA. At the time, they ran a traditional, asset-based non-emergency transportation service, so it was heartbreaking to see how technology was advancing quickly but not serving their target clients at all. So, they decided to pivot their own company, Butterfli Technologies Inc., to address these issues.

Butterfli is an on-demand transportation service for individuals with barriers to mobility. Much like Uber and Lyft, but with a crucial difference: Butterfli serves anyone with barriers to mobility, including seniors, children, individuals with disabilities, low- and moderate-income adults, as well as recipients of Social Security, Medicare, and Medicaid/Medi-Cal. They also serve anyone requiring wheelchair accessibility, special accommodations, individuals who face language or other barriers, and even those requiring drop-off or pick-up from surgery, dialysis, and other procedures.

Most assisted ride companies are non-emergency medical or non-medical transportation services that require customers to schedule rides up to five days in advance. By contrast, SaaS companies entering the space do not have the industry expertise to develop an app that responds to the needs of the rider, payer, and transportation provider. Finally, a ride



on an ambulance can cost thousands of dollars and insurance only approves these when strictly necessary. As one of the first to market, Butterfli provides a rare service for those in need with their technology-based scheduled and on-demand assisted rides available 24/7.

Access to capital has been a key factor in Butterfli's growth, with several small loans deployed to fund technology development and expansion throughout the years. However, Delilah and John needed to bring their cost of capital down in order to posi-

tion themselves for a major grant from LA Metro.

That's when they connected with the Macedonia CDC team. Working together, they were able to secure a \$1 million loan to consolidate outstanding debt and fund new features for their technology platform. This strategic financing not only improved their financial position but also demonstrated to major funders that Butterfli was a sustainable, well-managed operation ready for significant investment.

Shortly after receiving their Letter of Intent for the loan, Butterfli received a major opportunity in the form of a \$6 million grant from LA Metro. The grant program is called Access For All (AFA) and is designed for individuals who meet specific criteria for a wheelchair-accessible vehicle (WAV) due to a disability that limits their mobility. The program's purpose is to expand and improve on-demand service throughout Los Angeles County, ensuring safe, reliable, and inclusive transportation.

Butterfli has also launched their own podcast called Beyond the Curb. Hosted by Disability Ambassadors, Paul Amadeus Lane and Andy Arias, each episode dives into meaningful conversations that inspire inclusion and innovation in assisted transportation.

These milestones represent more than just business wins. They represent thousands of people in Los Angeles who will have reliable, dignified, accessible transportation to medical appointments, work, school, and everywhere else life takes them. They represent a future where technology serves everyone, not just those without barriers to mobility.

From identifying a critical gap in the market to securing major contracts and grants, Delilah and John have built Butterfli into a transformative force in accessible transportation. With the support of Macedonia CDC and strategic access to capital, they're proving that inclusive innovation isn't just the right thing to do—it's good business.
