

3 Big Shifts Every Construction Pro Should Watch in 2026


- AI-driven data centers now dominate office construction and spur infrastructure work.
- Nonresidential put-in-place spending grows, rewarding diversified, data-informed market strategies.
- Construction costs outpace bids, demanding tighter cost tracking and disciplined bidding.

The U.S. construction market is growing in 2026, but new trends are changing what is being built and where, as well as how much work costs. That's according to ConstructConnect Chief Economist Michael Guckes and Dr. Nicholas Fearnley, Head of Global Construction Forecasting at Oxford Economics, who presented their findings during a recent live event called Where Does the U.S. Construction Economy Go from Here?.

"We do think that the U.S. is going to continue to grow strongly and also outperform other advanced economies [this year]," Dr. Fearnley told attendees. "This U.S. exceptionalism is really

Bid Prices Leap to Fastest Pace In Over 2-Years

being driven by productivity gains we're not seeing in other parts of the world."

So, what's behind this belief? It's one of the three big shifts we're seeing in the construction industry right now.

Shift #1: Data Centers (and A.I.) are Driving Construction

It's probably no secret to anyone in construction that there is a boom in the building of data

centers to support the growing usage of artificial intelligence (AI). In the U.S., data centers fall under the category of "offices," which has created an interesting trend.

"We've seen that data centers are accounting now for around half of office construction activity, and we do expect activity will continue to boom over the coming years as we build a lot more of these," Fearnley told the audience.

But that doesn't necessarily mean that every contractor and tradesperson should pivot their focus to just data centers. These facilities also require a lot of power and cooling to operate. That means as the demand for data centers increases, so does the need for new work in power plants, water systems, and other infrastructure.

Shift #2: Pay Attention to Put-in-Place Spending Forecasts

Guckes says put-in-place spending, or the value of work actually installed, is also set to grow in the U.S. this year. After a small drop in 2025, total nonresidential put-in-place spending is expected to move toward \$1.3 trillion in 2026 and near \$1.4 trillion in 2027.

Private work is growing faster than public work, and commercial and manufacturing are key bright spots in ConstructConnect and Oxford Economics' current put-in-place projections.

Guckes gives a clear recommendation to businesses regarding following these trends.

"We constantly recommend that firms have a diversification strategy when it comes to your revenue strategy, making sure that you're not putting all of your sales and marketing efforts into just one vertical or one subcategory or two subcategories, but really trying to think broadly

Construction group seeks funding for highway and transit improvements

The Associated General Contractors of America is launching a nationwide campaign to push for new federal highway and transit funding to preserve economic growth in communities across the country, association officials announced today. The campaign, called America's Moving Forward, launches as a new association analysis of federal employment data found that most major metro areas in the country added new construction jobs since 2020.

"Improving highways and transportation systems makes it easier for companies to thrive and expand by lowering shipping costs, accelerating deliveries and connecting firms to clients and investors," said Ken Simonson, the chief economist of the Associated General Contractors of America. "But without a long-term transportation bill in place, it is hard to see how most areas will be able to sustain the kind of job growth they have experienced since 2020."

Simonson noted that ten of the nation's 15 largest metro areas added construction jobs between December 2020 and December 2025. The Dal-

las/Fort Worth metro area added the most new construction jobs, 47,100 and experienced the highest rate of growth as well, an increase of 22 percent. Other major metro areas that added a significant number of new jobs included Houston, Miami, Atlanta and Washington, D.C.

The construction economist noted that one reason for the construction job growth in most areas is the significant investments being made by federal and state officials in improving the region's transportation network. He noted that developers look for good transportation connections when siting new projects, manufacturers want efficient shipping routes and businesses want to avoid gridlock.

He cautioned, however, that there are growing indications that Congress may not draft, debate and pass the next transportation bill, known as the Surface Transportation Bill, before the current law expires at the end of September. If that were to happen, the economist warned that it will become harder for states to move forward with the kind of big, multi-year transportation projects that spur significant economic growth.

As a result, the Associated General Contractors of America launched a nationwide campaign

today to educate the public, and through them Congress, about the many benefits of having a highway and transportation bill in place and on time. The America's Moving Forward campaign will use targeted digital and social media advertising to reach constituents in many key Congressional districts across the country and send them to a campaign site to learn more about the benefits of federal transportation funding and connect them with their member of Congress to show their support.

Ads for the campaign are already running in Texas and Missouri and will launch in additional states this spring. The association plans to invest up to \$2 million in the campaign. "While this is a big investment for an association like ours, it is a small price to pay to ensure continued economic growth in America's communities," the economist said.

"If we do our job right, it will be very hard for Congress to kick the can on passing a new highway, bridge and transit bill before the current one expires," Simonson added.

Ranking Member Markey Introduces Legislation to Support Small Businesses

Ranking Member Edward J. Markey (D-Mass.) announced that he introduced the Small Business ICE Disruption Fund Act, which would provide grants to small businesses that have been impacted by the Trump administration's violent immigration enforcement actions on Main Streets across the United States. As raids by masked ICE agents continue to terrorize American communities, small businesses have been forced to close their doors and adapt to steep declines in revenue to survive.

Ranking Member Markey's Small Business ICE Disruption Fund Act would allow small businesses to recoup up to \$1 million in lost revenue as a result of the Trump administration's reckless immigration enforcement tactics.

"From Massachusetts to Minnesota, Trump's ICE thugs are terrorizing communities and racially profiling and targeting individuals for immigration enforcement," said **Ranking Member Markey**. "As a result, frightened small business owners and workers have been forced to reduce hours, barricade doors, or close altogether. ICE is a disaster. My Small Business ICE Disruption Fund Act delivers real disaster relief for Main Street by providing grants for impacted small businesses. We must defund and abolish ICE and make ICE pay—legally and financially—for harm done to our small businesses and the communities they serve."

"Local, immigrant-owned small businesses are cornerstones of communities like Chelsea," said **Gladys Vega, President of La Colaborativa in Chelsea, Massachusetts**. "The indiscriminate targeting of our community has paralyzed our local economy, gravely affecting our local small businesses. Our downtown is often desolate, storefront vacancies are increasing, and the costs of doing business, linked to unfair tariffs, are significantly straining local small business owners, while everyday costs are unaffordable for residents. In this critical moment, we're grateful for the proactive leadership of Senator Markey in protecting our community and local economy."

"We Are ALX applauds Senator Markey's Small Business ICE Disruption Fund Act, which addresses the challenges many Latino-owned businesses have faced over the past year due to excessive federal immigration enforcement,"



said **Eneida Román, President and CEO of We Are ALX**. "When customers and key employees stop showing up out of fear or disruption, revenues decline and our local economy feels the strain, directly threatening the Latino prosperity we've worked so hard to build in our community. This legislation provides much-needed economic relief to help businesses recover and grow, while also boosting our state's economic impact."

"Over the past year, I have witnessed firsthand how immigration related enforcement and uncertainty have significantly impacted our business community. The effects have resulted in revenue loss, staffing shortages, and operational disruptions. Many microbusinesses that rely on immigrant workers and customers have experienced decreased foot traffic and reduced economic activity. Beyond the financial impact, a climate of fear has discouraged families from fully participating in the local economy. That fear has had a direct ripple effect on neighborhood businesses and local commercial corridors. It is also essential to recognize the importance of language access. Many entrepreneurs face language barriers, and critical information is often lost in translation. Providing assistance in their native language is not optional; it is necessary to ensure equitable access, understanding, and compliance. Without culturally and linguistically competent support, many

business owners are unintentionally excluded from programs meant to help them. Microbusinesses operate on thin margins. Even modest declines in revenue or workforce instability can threaten their survival. The economic impact has been real, ongoing, and deeply felt. This bill is important because it acknowledges that these challenges affect entire local economies. Supporting stabilization, access, and equity is essential to protecting jobs and strengthening our communities," said **Elizabeth Cruz, President of the Latin American Business Organization (LABO)**.

"The same politicians who claim to support small businesses are backing ICE actions that crush foot traffic, scare workers from their jobs, and destabilize entire commercial corridors. Ask any business owner in an ICE zone—they'll tell you it's devastating and out of control. These entrepreneurs work tirelessly for their communities, and watching their livelihoods suffer is heartbreaking. The Small Business ICE Disruption Fund offers immediate relief—helping businesses keep staff, pay rent, and stay open during this crisis," said **Richard Trent, National Executive Director for the Main Street Alliance**.

"Independent restaurants and bars operate on some of the thinnest margins - between 3%-5% - of any sector, which means even short-term

disruptions can result in an extinction event and close a business for good," said **Erika Polmar, Executive Director of the Independent Restaurant Coalition**. "When immigration enforcement actions suddenly reduce staff availability or drive customers away, there is often no financial cushion to absorb the loss. We're grateful to Senator Markey (D-MA) for recognizing this reality and introducing the Small Business ICE Disruption Fund Act, which offers targeted, responsible relief to help independent businesses survive unexpected shocks and remain anchors in their communities."

"When employees and customers do not feel safe on their streets, businesses suffer. When Main Street businesses suffer, communities suffer. What we witnessed in Minnesota was a wake-up call: large-scale federal immigration enforcement can destroy local economies in a matter of weeks. The Small Business ICE Disruption Fund Act is a necessary step to protect community stability and financial security," said **Camilla Taylor, Executive Director of the American Sustainable Business Network**.

"Small Business Majority's research found that 47% of small business owners say increased activity by U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement agents has had a negative impact on their business. This includes loss of employees and loss of customers, as well as ongoing fear of ICE activity that makes it difficult for some small firms to even keep their doors open. Although some of the damage done by ICE to small businesses will be difficult if not impossible to repair, a program that offers compensation for small businesses harmed by immigration actions would go a long way toward helping small businesses recover from detrimental immigration policies," said **John Arensmeyer, Founder and CEO of Small Business Majority**.

"Mass deportation efforts are causing small businesses across the county to lose revenue, lost income that we have long said is the Federal Government's responsibility to repay. Senator Markey's bill offers financial help to the thousands of small businesses that have seen their income drop from no fault of their own. Workers, regardless of immigration status, are being detained or afraid to go to work. Consumer spending by the immigrant community has dramatically decreased and there is no revenue at all

about the industry so that when the when it becomes clear that a certain segment of the industry is growing very quickly, you can adapt your business model to that industry that's growing more aggressively," he said.

How Can Construction Professionals Stay on top of Put-In-Place Spending?

To help businesses diversify their strategies, ConstructConnect provides a full five-year view of U.S. construction spending with the U.S. Construction Put-In-Place Forecast.

"Get below the headline numbers. Don't just look at the aggregate data," Guckes cautions. "You really need to be looking at what's happen-

ing at the subcategory level, along with the geographic regions that impact you, whether that's state or city level."

Built in partnership with Oxford Economics, the forecasts offer data down to national, state, county, and city levels, giving construction professionals, contractors, manufacturers, and suppliers the foresight to invest, staff, and stock with greater confidence.

Shift #3: Construction Costs are Rising Higher than Bids

Labor is tight, tariffs on materials like steel and lumber are higher, and many firms are feeling margin pressure. To stay ahead, Guckes and Fearnley say general contractors, tradespeople,

and owners need to track costs closely, use smart contracts, and stay flexible about which sectors they chase.

"I'd say looking for collaborative strategies. So, sort of working together to share risk, maybe considering some escalation clauses to account for risks around material increases [could help]," Fearnley said before also suggesting, "And planning ahead: Knowing where work's going to be, trying to plan ahead for your labor force, maybe locking things in earlier—more at the preconstruction phase instead of the financial close stage. And locking in subcontractors where you can."

Guckes agrees and added that it's also important for businesses to be "ruthless" in their bid discipline.

"I think we need to make sure that as construction industry leaders, we need to be very careful and very thoughtful about how we bid. We don't want to create bids that we can't recover from and bids that end up resulting in either very little profit or maybe even no profit at all," he cautioned.
