Governor Newsom announces statewide plan for economic growth, \$245 million for more jobs

What you need to know: Governor Newsom today released a new economic vision for California's future with a bold plan, realized locally. The unveiling comes alongside the announcement of more than \$245 million in investments to help support workers statewide, including additional investment in LA to bolster the region's ongoing economic recovery from wildfires.

Governor Newsom released the new California Jobs First Economic Blueprint, a statewide plan built with input from 13 regional plans to drive sustainable economic growth, innovation, and access to good-paying jobs over the next decade. The Blueprint is paired with \$125 million in funding to support new, ready-to-go projects, \$15 million for economic development projects for California Native American tribes, \$13 million to support the economic recovery and small businesses in the Los Angeles region, and \$92 million in funding for new apprenticeship and jobs programs.

California's economic dominance and success are grown locally, with the contributions of each diverse region of our state. From agriculture to clean energy to film to every industry in between, our Golden State owes its success to the people, communities, and industries that make it work. I am proud of the collaborative work of


- Occupations with a large share of women are clustered in a few occupational groups, especially in healthcare practitioners and technical occupations.

Study tells California legislators to declare war on red tape — but will they?

Construction of the San Francisco-Oakland Bay Bridge and its more famous cousin, the Golden Gate Bridge, began in 1933, and both were carrying traffic by 1937.

The 1989 Loma Prieta Earthquake severely damaged the Bay Bridge, leading to a decision to replace its eastern section rather than merely repair or refit it.

However state and local politicians argued for more than a decade over design of the new section and how to pay for it. Construction finally began in 2002 and was finished 11 years later — nearly four times as long as the entire bridge took — at a cost of \$6.5 billion, the costliest public works project in California history.

The Bay Bridge saga exemplifies how California, which once taught the world how to build things, lost its mojo by erecting so many political, legal and financial hurdles to getting things done.

Sixty-plus years ago, the state's water managers proposed a canal around the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta to complete the state project that carries water from the northern part of the state to the southern.

As the years rolled by, the project languished. Eventually it was revised to twin tunnels and more recently to a single tunnel, but construction, if it ever occurs, is still many years away.

Lesser projects suffer from the same political and procedural sclerosis. It can take years, or even decades, for large-scale housing projects, electric generation facilities and desalination plants to traverse the thickets of permits from federal, state and local agencies. Even small housing projects are subject to lengthy entanglements in red tape as costs escalate.

A newly released report from a special legislative committee declares that to deal with housing, homelessness, water supply and climate change issues, California "will need to facilitate new construction at an unprecedented scale.

"This includes millions of housing units, thousands of gigawatts of clean energy generation, storage, and transmission capacity, a million electric vehicle chargers and thousands of miles of transit, and thousands of climate resiliency projects to address drought, flooding and sea level rise, and changing habitats."

However, it continues, "each of these projects will require a government-issued permit before they can be built — and some will require dozens! Therefore, only if governments consistently issue permits in a manner that is timely, transparent, consistent, and outcomes-oriented will we be able to address our housing and climate crises. Unfortunately, for most projects, the opposite is true. They face permitting processes that are time consuming, opaque, confusing, and favor process over outcomes."

The Legislature itself erected many of these procedural barriers — most notably by passing the California Environmental Quality Act more than a half-century ago — and the Legislature is controlled by regulation-prone Democrats, so it's remarkable that such a report would be issued.

- 3. Consider how a platform supports collaboration between all stakeholders. Does it allow seamless communication? Is it built for a wide range of stakeholders? Does it have multi-lingual capabilities?
- 4. Is the platform scalable and adaptable to company growth or for diverse project types? Can it handle multiple projects and large-scale operations across varied sectors? How does it adapt to variances in workflows?
- 5. What integrations and compatibility does the platform offer? Does it support APIs for custom integrations?
- 6. What is the cost structure and ROI for using the platform? Is pricing transparent? What metrics can be tracked to support ROI?

Technology solutions should add value for contractors and their clients. These questions and considerations will ensure that companies choose the right technology for their specific needs.

- Of the occupations highlighted below, half are part of the healthcare diagnosing or treating practitioners group or the health technologists and technicians group.
- All of the occupations listed below require some level of postsecondary education for entry, and just under half typically require an associate degree or higher for entry.

Future

- To the year 2031, a projected increase in the number of total women in the labor force will be driven by women over the age of 25
- Women in the prime age for working, ages 25 to 54, will join the labor force over the 10-year projection, adding roughly 2.9 million more workers.
- The women's labor force participation rate is projected to have a smaller decline than that for men, despite both groups likely experiencing falling labor force participation in 2031.

The top 15 occupations by share of women are preschool and kindergarten teachers, speech language pathologists, dental hygienists, licensed practical and vocational nurses, school psychologists, veterinary technologists and technicians, dietitians and nutritionists, medical records specialists, nurse practitioners, child/family/school social workers, registered nurses, diagnostic medical sonographers, occupational therapists, paralegals and legal assistants, and interior designers. All are projected to grow through 2031. 2021 annual median wages vary, with the lowest for preschool and kindergarten teachers (\$36,710) and the highest for nurse practitioners (\$120,680). Educational requirements vary.

The California Assembly Select Committee on Permitting Reform spent months talking to those who have been affected by California's permithappy system, as well as experts on specific kinds of projects, before reaching a conclusion that sounds like it came from conservative Republicans.

"It is too damn hard to build anything in California," Assemblywoman Buffy Wicks, an Oakland Democrat who chaired the committee, said in a statement. "Our broken permitting system is driving up the cost of housing, the cost of energy, and even the cost of inaction on climate change.

"If we're serious about making California more affordable, sustainable, and resilient, we have to make it easier to build housing, clean energy, public transportation, and climate adaptation projects. This report makes it clear: the system isn't working, and it's on us to fix it."

Yes it is — and we'll see whether the report has legs or winds up in the discard bin like so many other governance reform proposals.

sustainable growth of the world's fifth-largest economy.

- \$15 million grant solicitation for economic planning, pre-development, and implementation projects for California Native American tribes.
- \$52 million for new apprenticeships through the Apprenticeship Innovation Fund with a focus on high-demand sectors such as finance, advanced manufacturing, and healthcare.
- \$16 million for pre-apprenticeship and apprenticeship funding for young people ages 16-24 through the California Opportunity Youth Apprenticeship (COYA) grant program. This funding supports pre-apprenticeship and apprenticeship programs that provide hands-on, real-world job training for young people who are often neither working nor in school.
- \$24.1 million in High Road Training Partnership funds to 10 projects statewide to train people for jobs to meet California's most urgent healthcare needs, with a focus on behavioral health and nursing. LA recipients include the Center for Caregiver Advancement, which is training home-health workers to be prepared for disasters such as the Los Angeles fires.

Supporting recovery and rebuilding in LA

The Governor received the Los Angeles Jobs

First Collaborative's regional plan as part of his continued tour of the state's thirteen economic regions, and announced new support to aid in LA's rebuilding and recovery efforts:

- \$10 million on behalf of the State, LA Rises, Maersk and APM Terminals to the LA Region Small Business Relief Fund, a grant program run by the City and County of LA that will be critical in rebuilding fire-impacted communities. This is the first investment by LA Rises, the unified recovery effort launched by the Governor in January and led by Dodgers Chairman Mark Walter, business leader and basketball legend Earvin "Magic" Johnson, and Casey Wasserman.
- \$3 million for the Los Angeles Jobs First Collaborative in their recovery efforts for the region, including for the launch of public-facing campaigns to promote small business support and the addition of capacity for near-term business and economic recovery.

California Jobs First: Bold vision, realized locally

In 2021, Governor Newsom launched a statewide economic development planning process called the Community Economic Resilience Fund (CERF), which was later renamed the Regional Investment Initiative under the banner of California Jobs First in 2023. The objective was to create good-paying, accessible jobs and sustainable economic growth across the state's thirteen regions.

Each region created a planning body — or collaborative — with representation from a wide variety of community partners, including labor, business, local government, education, environmental justice, community organizations, and more. The collaboratives then wrote their own data-driven, community-led economic plans, including identifying strategic industry sectors.

To support this process, California has invested \$287 million since 2022, including \$5 million per region for planning, \$39 million for pilot projects across the state and \$14 million per region to develop viable projects that advance their strategic sectors.

In March 2024, Governor Newsom announced the creation of the California Jobs First Council, made up of nine Cabinet-level agencies, focused on streamlining the state's economic and workforce development programs to create more family-supporting jobs and prioritize industry sectors for future growth.

California's Economic Blueprint

The California Jobs First Economic Blueprint guides the state's investments in key sectors to drive sustainable economic growth, innovation, and access to good-paying jobs over the next decade. Made up of ten strategic industry sectors,

this framework will help streamline the state's economic, business, and workforce development programs to create more jobs, faster.


The state's thirteen economic regions engaged more than 10,000 local residents and experts who collectively identified these sectors as key to driving local economies into the future.

California's economy has industries at all stages of advancement and growth. They are categorized as follows within the Economic Blueprint:

- Strengthen: Sectors where California has an established competitive position and/or significant employment, but where there is leveling growth or wages
- Accelerate: Sectors with moderate to high projected growth that are ready for expansion, where additional investments (e.g., capital, infrastructure) could "bend the curve" to generate growth
- Bet: Emerging sectors with significant investment or high strategic importance to the innovation ecosystem
- Anchor: Regional anchors that are critical for attracting and supporting industry activities while also providing quality, goodpaying jobs within local communities

FTK Martial Arts

Being one of the few female-run martial arts studios in San Francisco, owners Liza Fernandez and Diandra Thompson have worked hard to gain the respect in the male-dominated industry. They found themselves in a competitive environment where families oftentimes have dozens of studios to choose from in the same neighborhood. They were struggling to grow their business and turned to the San Francisco SBDC for professional marketing advice.

Gameplan

SBDC marketing advisor, Molly O'Kane helped them redesign their website with the addition of Google Ads to attract more customers. She also encouraged them to look at the price settings and structures of their competitors and adjust accordingly to charge the going rate and what they were worth. Through these discussions they also decided to simplify their payment transactions by using WooCommerce. The SBDC discovered a grant opportunity with the City of San Francisco and helped the women apply for it.

Results

As a result, Liza and Diandra's monthly new student sign-up doubled and monthly sales increased 75%. They also obtained \$5,000 from the San Francisco Women's Entrepreneurship Fund (SF-WEF) and used this grant to improve their facility and computer system.
