

The U.S. construction industry in 2025 looks like it will have both challenges and opportunities for businesses. While ConstructConnect predicts construction spending will grow by 5.2% this year, there's still some uncertainty about what's next. Here's what's behind the uncertainty and where you might find opportunities.

Why is Spending Expected to Grow?

U.S. construction starts, or projects that officially began, dropped by 3.5% last year. However, spending is expected to bounce back in 2025 for two main reasons: Easing financial regulations and potential interest rate cuts.

Michael Guckes, Chief Economist at ConstructConnect, says, "Lower interest rates will function as a first and necessary step in reinvigorating nonresidential construction activity, allowing more nonresidential construction projects to pencil out."

Additionally, lower interest rates could make housing more affordable, which could lead to a rise in residential construction.

Mayor Bass meets with congressional leaders for FIFA World Cup and Olympic preparations.

Los Angeles Mayor Karen Bass, in collaboration with U.S. Representative Sydney Kamlager-Dove, convened members of the Los Angeles County Congressional Delegation and key staff today to discuss ways that local and federal government can work together and ensure that the coming major world events benefit the region for decades to come. In the

coming weeks, the Mayor will also be convening local and State leaders as she continues to work across all levels of government ahead of the 2026 FIFA World Cup and the 2028 Olympic and Paralympic Games.

"It's my goal that the coming world events benefit every part of our city and region," said Mayor Karen Bass. "Together, we will work to secure the necessary resources to deliver events that are safe, successful and fiscally responsible while leaving a lasting legacy for future generations."

"All eyes will be on the United States for the next decade of international sporting events. As the host of seven major competitions, including the 2026 FIFA World Cup and the 2028 Olympic and Paralympic Games, Los Angeles will take center stage," said Congresswoman Kamlager-Dove. "The success of these games depends on a coordinated effort, and I am proud to have co-hosted this briefing to further strengthen our federal-local partnership. I look forward to continued collaboration with Mayor Bass, my congressional colleagues, and the administration to ensure the City of Stars shines bright for all to see."

The Delegation heard directly from Los Angeles Sports & Entertainment Commission President & CEO Kathryn Schloessman, LA28 Chief Executive Officer Reynold Hoover and Metro CEO Stephanie Wiggins to discuss shared priorities and ways to prepare the region for coming world events. The Delegation also heard from Executive Director of the Office of Major Events Paul Krekorian. Executive Director Krekorian was appointed by Mayor Bass to coordinate City departments and external stakeholders, ensuring that upcoming major events generate positive economic impacts that benefit all Angelenos.

California awards nearly \$300 million to local communities to make roadways safer

What you need to know: California is investing nearly \$300 million of federal funding in traffic safety projects to protect public safety across the state.

Governor Gavin Newsom today announced nearly \$300 million in funding for 288 projects aimed at reducing traffic deaths and serious injuries on city and county roads across California.

"We're making roads safer up and down the state with significant investments. I'm proud of the lifesaving work Caltrans has done to protect drivers, pedestrians, and bikers as they go about their daily commutes."

The funding for these local projects is provided through the federal Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP), a critical federal-aid program with the goal of reducing fatal and serious injuries on public roads across the nation.

The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) is using the Safe System approach – which emphasizes multiple layers of protection, including safer road designs – to achieve its goal of reducing fatalities and serious injuries on state roadways to zero by 2050.

Caltrans' adoption of the Safe System approach builds on its ongoing work to embed safety in the state's transportation system. When feasible, transportation projects Caltrans funds or oversees will include "complete street" features that provide safe and accessible options for people walking, biking, and taking transit.

"Under Governor Newsom's leadership, California remains committed to helping ensure that every Californian has access to safe and reliable transportation, no matter who they are or where they live," said California Transportation Secretary Toks Omishakin. "These investments highlight our people-first approach, because we know it will pay the most important dividend of all – their safety."

Safety improvement efforts from projects receiving the funding announced today will be distributed throughout the state, making impactful enhancements from Del Norte County in the north to San Diego County in the south and communities everywhere in between.

A sample of the safety projects include:

- In the Bay Area, a \$5 million project will install Class IV bike lanes in Contra Costa County, a \$4.4 million project will install new high-visibility signage in San Francisco, and a \$1.75 million project will improve intersection lighting and pedestrian throughways.
- Along the Central Coast, a \$4 million project in Santa Barbara County will implement new pedestrian improvements and traffic signals, and a \$2 million project in Santa Cruz County will improve daylight and pedestrian crossings.
- In the Central Valley, a \$3.7 million investment will fund a new roundabout in Fresno County, a \$4.5 million project in Tulare County will install rumble strips, left-turn lanes, and flashing beacons, and a \$2.6 million project in San Joaquin County will improve 42 separate traffic signals.
- In Northern California, nearly \$6 million will go toward installing retro-reflectivity striping throughout Trinity County, and \$1 million will be spent to improve guardrail throughout Humboldt County.
- In Southern California, a \$3.6 million project in Fullerton will provide a protected left lane, a \$1 million effort in Orange County will upgrade nearly 60 signalized interchanges, and a nearly \$3 million investment in Riverside County will install protected bike lanes and ADA-accessible curb ramps.

Since 2007, California has provided \$1.5 billion to local safety projects, which included installing rumble strips, flashing beacons, warning signs, roadway lighting, delineators and new sidewalks to make roads safer.

According to ConstructConnect, total non-residential construction spending may grow by 5.7% this year, while residential spending could increase by 3.6%.

What Projects Could Grow the Most?

The demand for power generation is expected to be a driving force in the industry. This is due to the rise of electric vehicles and tech devices, an increase in the need for data centers, and progress in artificial intelligence.

How Could Tariffs Affect the Market?

Even with growth predicted, tariffs on imported goods may still have a big impact. Higher material costs due to tariffs could lead some companies to consider domestic manufacturing instead.

"If enough manufacturers choose this path, it could substantially enhance the growth trajectory of U.S. manufacturing construction over our forecast period. However, those firms opting for this strategy face considerable risks," says Guckes.





- Kiosks for education and small business opportunities.

The \$34 million investment is funded through a mix of federal, state, and local sources, including \$4.8 million secured by Senator Wiener in the state budget \$12 million in Outdoor Recreation Legacy Partnership federal grants administered through California State Parks; and \$5.8 million from TPL through Prop 68. Additional funding includes over \$6 million from the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission as a collaborative investment in sewer and green infrastructure, development impact fees, the 2020 Health and Recovery Bond and 2012 Neighborhood Parks Bond, and other city sources.

"Buchanan Mall is a terrific addition to our City, adding green space for the community to come together while honoring the rich heritage of the Western Addition," said State Senator Scott Wiener. "I'm incredibly proud to have played a part in the creation of this community led effort to create a vibrant new public space in San Francisco?

Designed to promote intergenerational connections and healing, the renovated Buchanan Street Mall will reflect the resilience of a community that endured decades of redevelopment and disinvestment. The project's vision was shaped through neighborhood feedback gathered in over 20 community events, design workshops, healing and listening circles, as well as more than 1,150 survey responses and 12 documentary videos. Local residents recorded personal stories and were hired to contribute to early design prototypes.

Antelope Valley's First Commercial Net Zero Electric Building

Precision Labs Calibration is a Native American Precision Labs Calibration is a Native American owned business in Antelope Valley that performs high technology calibration services for medical, aerospace, agricultural, and film industries. They calibrate electrocardiography machines, attune sound and light meters, and perform highly accurate measurements of temperature and humidity.

Following five years of a 10 percent annual growth, the owners decided to give back to their community and the world at large by undertaking an ambitious goal to become Antelope Valley's first net zero electric building. A preliminary step in the process was researching their energy needs by using in-house technology. For example, they measured the illumination from the current lighting systems, roof temperatures, cycling time on the refrigerator, the wattage on the in-house public address (PA) system, and other systems.

As a result of assessing their energy needs, they invested in an \$80,000 roof solar system of 60 panels. They also installed LED lighting, timers to shut off refrigerators, control systems that can place the building in a low power state, and additional insulation.
