A Proclamation on National Small Business Week, 2022

For generations, small businesses across America have shaped and embodied our Nation's entrepreneurial spirit and driven our economy forward. Today, more than 32 million small businesses employ almost half of America's workforce and represent the heart and soul of countless communities. During National Small Business Week, we celebrate America's small businesses and their enormous contributions to American life and prosperity.

When I first took office, the pandemic had devastated America's small business community. Hundreds of thousands of small businesses had closed, main streets were shuttered, and millions more Americans were out of work through no fault of their own. Even with the creativity and resilience of small business owners and workers, COVID-19 took an incalculable toll on so many lives and livelihoods. That is why I made it a top priority to provide substantial, immediate relief to our Nation's small businesses, giving them the tools, resources, and support they needed to reopen, rehire, and rebuild.

My American Rescue Plan and other emergency relief programs distributed hundreds of billions

of dollars to millions of small businesses to keep the lights on and keep workers on the payroll. My Administration also removed historic barriers to level the playing field for businesses across rural and urban America, especially businesses owned by veterans, women, and people of color. These efforts have helped millions of small businesses not only weather the pandemic, but thrive.

My Administration is committed to unlocking new opportunities to help small businesses grow and compete. Through the American Rescue Plan, our State Small Business Credit Initiative provides States, territories, and Tribal governments with resources to establish loan and equity capital programs to support entrepreneurs. In addition, the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law has created unprecedented contracting opportunities for small businesses in every community. Already, more than 4,000 projects have been announced to upgrade America's infrastructure, creating significant opportunities for small businesses to grow. The law is delivering affordable high-speed internet access to every community — urban, rural, suburban, and Tribal — so every small business can use digital technologies and gain new customers across the

California should embrace telework for state employees

Two years ago, COVID-19 prodded the state of California to launch a massive telework program, the most significant operational change to public service since the adoption of desktop computers. It has been a rousing success.

Now we have arrived at a critical juncture as departments formalize remote-work policies for the post-pandemic world: Will we fully embrace flexible telework as COVID worries ease, or slide back toward an outdated, inefficient, butts-

in-seats business model that poorly serves Californians, state employers and state employees?

Early indications, unfortunately, suggest the latter. Departments are ordering employees back to the office by April 1 for two, three and four days a week without identifying any operational need for the mandate.

As president of Professional Engineers in California Government, I can tell you many of the 14,000 state engineers, architects, geologists and related professionals we represent don't understand these recent return-to-the-office edicts. Sadly, two years of employee resilience, innova-

tion and success are giving way to an old paradigm that dismissed state telework for 30 years.

For many reasons, the state must maintain a robust and flexible policy, starting with the Newsom administration's 2021 directive for 75% of state employees to telework. Since then, data show 16 departments tracked by the state are hitting the mark. About 72% of employees eligible for remote work do so full-time, 22% telework part-time and just 6% of employees who could work remotely do not.

The state's experience reflects what studies show: Teleworking employees are as productive or even more productive than commuting staff. When commuting is a quick walk down the hall, employees are generally more relaxed, happier, more efficient and take less sick time.

The governor wisely seized the moment, telling departments that telework was here to stay and should be the first option for state employees, not the last.

"The administration wants to continue to reap telework's benefits for the employees and for the state," Newsom's government operations secretary said last year, "by making sure we encourage as much telework as possible while still meeting our mission to serve Californians."

Since then, telework has saved taxpayers a projected \$22.5 million in relinquished office leases, according to government data, and the savings will nearly quadruple to \$85 million annually in coming years. Telework also reduces the state's carbon footprint, benefiting the environment.

Many of our members value the convenience, savings and work-life balance telework provides. They appreciate the state's accommodations, from state-issued laptops and teleconferencing technology to stipends that help offset homeoffice expenses. They avoid jammed commutes while burning \$6-per-gallon gas. But, above all else, our members have appreciated the implicit trust that they can stay home and still serve Californians.

But as employers roll out post-pandemic work policies, new state rules replace the flexibility, consistency and good faith with random dictates arbitrarily applied to be in the office a certain number of days without identifying how that serves operational needs or the public. In es-

City Announces \$11.4 Million in Grants to Support Commercial Corridors as Part of Economic Recovery

Mayor London N. Breed and the Office of Economic Workforce Development (OEWD) today announced \$11.4 million in funding to launch and implement economic recovery initiatives. The funding will support the stabilization and growth of small businesses and San Franciscobased nonprofits, while boosting cultural celebrations and events that attract residents and tourists to the City's commercial areas. It will also continue to support COVID-19 Resource Hubs for wrap-around workforce and other essential services in vulnerable communities.

As part of the City's economic recovery, the investment will provide community organizations funding to recruit new businesses, train and establish new and existing entrepreneurs, develop new programming, organize festivals and events, and offer technical assistance to small businesses.

The funding will be made available through an open Requests for Proposals (RFP) process. Submissions are due May 19. Organizations selected for the awards are scheduled to be announced mid-June. Individuals seeking to apply for the RFP can visit here www.oewd.org/bid-opportunities/RFP-223.

"The pandemic has had a significant impact on our neighborhood corridors, and although we have made strides with our economic recovery, we still have work to do to get back to where we want to be," said Mayor Breed. This funding not only provides much-needed financial support to our city's merchant corridors during a time when so many people are eager to be out, but it offers our cultural institutions another opportunity to showcase San Francisco's incredible diversity to both residents and visitors. As we reopen and work to ensure an equitable recovery, we are also continuing to fund our Community Resource Hubs, which have filled essential needs for so many who have struggled so much during this pandemic.

The RFP process will also leverage \$1 million in state funds to support Asian Pacific Islander (API) neighborhood commercial recovery. Efforts under these areas will focus on boosting resources to community partners to provide linguistically and culturally-oriented small business technical assistance with an emphasis in densely populated API commercial districts such as historic Chinatown, Japantown, Little Saigon, SOMA Pilipinas, the Sunset and the Richmond

The funding was secured by San Francisco City Attorney David Chiu during his tenure as Assemblymember.

"For over two years, API small businesses throughout San Francisco have had to grapple with both the economic impact of the pandemic and a disturbing surge in anti-Asian violence," said City Attorney David Chiu. "I want to thank the API Council, Chinese Chamber of Commerce, SF Chinatown Merchants Association, Japantown Merchants Association of SF, SOMA Pilipinas and many other business, nonprofit and community leaders who worked with me when I was in the State Legislature to deliver resources that will revitalize API small businesses decimated by COVID-19 and racism."

In addition to investments for the business community, the RRP will also continue to provide funding for the operation of COVID-19 Resource Hubs in the Bayview Hunters Point, Excelsior, Mission and Visitacion Valley. Theses hubs offer essential services to residents including referrals and access to employment assistance, job placement, trainings, housing public benefits, mental wellness, food, and many other COVID-19 resources.

"We're excited to see the return of residents and visitors to our commercial corridors. We're

going to continue to build on this momentum with more activities and events that bring entertainment, music, and many other fun favorites to our public spaces, said Kate Sofis, Director of the Office of Economic and Workforce Development.

"Over the last two years, COVID-19 Resource Hubs have served over 14,000 community members. We recognize the recovery of our economy means we must continue to provide essential resources to communities that were most impacted by the pandemic and this RFP focuses on ensuring resource hubs remain a lifeline for people who need our services," said Joshua Arce, Director of Workforce Development for the Office of Economic and Workforce Development.

The RFP covers economic and workforce development programs to support businesses and workers citywide, in addition to providing programming within key commercial corridors including cultural districts and community benefit districts.

Since the onset of the pandemic, Mayor Breed has allocated over \$63 million for financial relief that served more than 3,300 small businesses. The financial relief programs were designed to serve

sence, work-from-home opportunities are becoming a matter of individual departments' or managers' predilections, not what is necessarily best for California.

This could well bump up against the Professional Engineers in California Government's labor agreement with the state, which says, in part, "no employee's request for telecommuting shall be unreasonably denied."

There is still time for the state to get it right. Extending two years of cooperation and success should not devolve into a costly labor-management dispute over the unnecessary denial of telework options that serve no department objective or mission.

Professional Engineers in California Government urges decision-makers at all levels of state government to stay true to the administration's stated objectives – provide telework opportunities to as many employees as possible to reduce carbon emissions and congestion, save money by downsizing office space, and improve productivity and service to the public.

After all, the administration's remote-work goals, the facts and the last two years support a vigorous statewide telework program that trusts public servants to perform. So do Professional Engineers in California Government.

4 Innovations Transforming Construction Safety

There's no doubt about it: safety matters. Construction firms are always in pursuit of safer jobsites. While nothing beats a combination of training, safety culture, and leadership buy-in, innovation is playing an increasingly important role on- and off-site

Technology has advanced significantly in recent years in the realm of construction safety. In celebration of Construction Safety Week, we're exploring some of those advancements, which are pushing the industry forward and making it safer for all.

1. Machine Learning and AI

What comes to mind when you think of artificial intelligence (AI) on the jobsite? If you're like a lot of people, you think of robots taking care of tasks. While robots do have their place in the future of construction, the real opportunity behind AI and machine learning is much bigger. It lies in its ability to proactively identify risk and thereby reduce safety issues before they even have the chance to occur.

One of the factors that make construction sites so risky is their variability. By nature, jobsites are generally chaotic, busy, and always changing. So how do you reduce risk in a setting that many might describe as inherently risky? Ma-

chine learning can assist through predictive analytics. These analytics uncover patterns to make informed predictions about what may occur, including accidents. Within the industry, more and more firms are using predictive-based safety (PBS) to pinpoint potential risks and proactively address them. According to Engineering News Record, the results for PBS are astounding with early adopters seeing incident rates drop by 50% over a 12-month period.

Autodesk Construction Cloud's Construction IQ is helping construction firms increase safety. Through machine learning and AI functionality, project leaders can identify high-risk areas of projects, resolve issues, and address problematic safety behaviors in real time.

Another construction safety innovation is Newmetrix, designed to minimize risk through predictive analytics, safety observations, and safety monitoring. Newmetrix's construction-trained AI engine, Vinnie, finds indicators of project risk to provide insights, predict where to focus your attention and prescribe specific actions to take.

2. Wearables & IoT

The Internet of Things (IoT) is what makes wearable devices so smart. When inanimate objects can be connected to the internet, they are joining the IoT. Sensors are installed on machines and devices to monitor performance levels, operating conditions, physical states or other data through connectivity.

The evolution of IoT is found in many industries. Homeowners use sensors to detect changing temperatures, healthcare providers track patient health for chronic conditions through therapeutic devices, and project data experts leverage digital twins to improve predictability in project delivery.

In construction, you may hear IoT referred to as telematics. Sensors and inter-device communication can increase response times to emergencies and improve safety for end users. An example of this technology is Triax Technologies' Spot-R clip, which detects sudden falls and shares location information with safety responders. The clip can also be used to send a notification about a hazardous situation (such as a gas leak) and track crews to plan assignments.

WakeCap also offers an IoT-based solution for the construction sector that enables real-time workforce reporting. By integrating sensors into existing hard hats and connecting jobsites via wireless mesh network technology, WakeCap improves worker safety, monitoring whether the hard hats are being worn, helping with evacuations, and ensuring safety teams are covering the site.

Redpoint Positioning offers a range of wearable devices for construction safety. The tag-only solution can be used for social distancing measures through a proximity warning system. The realtime location system fully connects to indoor

environments and displays location data and upto-the-minute analytics.

RealWear is another provider of ruggedized wearables for the construction industry. With their assisted reality safety solutions, construction teams can have hands-free access to project documents, plans, and models using simple voice commands, even in extremely noisy environments.

Beyond wearables, IoT devices can also be used to measure a range of environmental factors that impact health and safety. For instance, Awair Omni's sensors monitor seven key factors that influence the well-being of your occupants: VOCs (chemicals), PM2.5 (inhalable dust), carbon dioxide (CO2), humidity, temperature, light,

3. Qualification Software

Fostering a safe work environment begins with qualified individuals, those who are up-to-date with verifiable credentials and standards. Subcontractors with a strong safety performance history are far less likely to have an incident on their next project. Incidents on-site increase the risk of potential harm to workers and can cause work to be delayed or completely shut down. They can also affect productivity rates, hurt morale, and put your firm at financial risk.

Paul LaRocco, LaRocco's Pizzeria

Born in New York City's Little Italy and brought up in Brooklyn, Paul LaRocco learned a time-honored recipe for thin-crust Neapolitan pizza dough. He brought the New York secret to California and in 2008, he and his wife opened the first LaRocco's Pizzeria, offering eat-in, takeout and delivery service of pizza, calzones and sandwiches made fresh daily.

LaRocco's was profitable from day one, sales increased every year, and the restaurant was voted Best Pizza in Los Angeles for five years running. Paul LaRocco previously owned two successful restaurants, however, when he approached banks seeking a loan to open another location, a challenge emerged.

"I applied several times, and because I was selfemployed, was considered a 'newbie,' despite many years in business. It was very frustrating," LaRocco recalls. Paul and his wife were about to give up on the location they had found when, in December 2013, LaRocco's wife found the Small Business Development Center hosted by Pacific Coast Regional online.

LaRocco worked one-on-one with Business advisors Harold C. Hart-Nibbrig and Sahar Andrade to fine-tune his business plan, obtain an SBA Community Advantage Loan, add social media to his marketing mix, and took the PCR SBDC Guided Business Plan course.

"The business plan course was very helpful," says LaRocco. "I didn't know the ins and outs of how to look at a business plan – how brief it should be, how intelligible, how someone will read it and what's important to include." Once LaRocco completed the course, Hart-Nibbrig edited the plan and provided input. "Their help was very timely and they had a lot of input – they helped me dot all the i's and cross all the t's." In January 2014, LaRocco's received a \$150,000 direct loan through Pacific Coast Regional's SBA Community Advantage Loan Program.

Can you give us a brief bio?

My name is David Aragon. I'm 25 years old, and I was born in Oakland, California. I grew up in the Bay Area, and lived in Orlando, Florida for 4 years. I'm an avid car enthusiast who loves everything about anything with a motor that moves, gasoline or electric. I like working on things, and making them better. I think cars and engineering are like art. My favorite example of this is the Tesla Model S.

What got you started in your particular area of business?

I've always loved cars, and I've always wanted to own a performance racing shop since I was about 14. I bought my first car when I was 16 for \$3,000 and I totaled it 7 months later in a roll-over accident. I only had liability so I had to beg my parents to let me keep in in the driveway and part it out so I can get my money back. I ended up making almost \$7,000 off of it. I would get my paycheck from work and think "I just made \$700 this week on the side. Why am I working 20 hours a week for 450 bucks a month?"

There was a part on the car shade that several people kept asking me to separate from the entire shade. Toyota didn't sell this part separately, and the shade was discontinued. I decided that I was going to re-engineer the part myself.

At 19 years old, I successfully completed the reproduction of the product and started selling them. It even ended up at some of the local Toyota dealerships through some resellers. I only broke even on this product, but I was hooked. I started looking for other ways to make money in the auto industry, and found out that ignition coils were a hot product, and I decided to do the traditional buy and sell in my own private label brand Araparts. In the future I will continue to re-produce new products to market when I have more money to create molds, but this was the perfect start I've been looking for.

But how do you analyze safety and the qualifications of individuals and teams? The latest construction innovations leverage historical data, financial metrics, and performance to evaluate risk. Qualification software like TradeTapp cuts down on the time it takes to measure contractor risk for builders in its risk mitigation platform. It includes built-in automated risk mitigation recommendations to reduce risk early in the preconstruction process.

Another construction safety innovation includes myComply. Their platform helps builders ensure a qualified workforce on their projects, including subcontractor employees. As a testament of the innovation's effectiveness, the New York Department of Buildings (NYC DOB) selected myComply to build the software in its city-wide construction safety database. This centralized database will help the NYC DOB ensure that all construction workers on permitted projects are qualified to perform their work safely and will help permit holders automate the daily tracking

of worker training on the job site, to be in full compliance with regional regulations.

4. Mobile Software
