Builder's Risk: Three Blind Spots Impacting Your Project's Success

While construction insurance is costly, underinsuring may prove more so in the long run.

Construction projects face countless risks—from unexpected delays to storms, theft and more. While cost considerations may make it tempting to underinsure a project during construction, doing so leaves your investment liable for damages that far exceed builder's risk insurance premiums.

Consider this: As many as 31% of firms report significant delays in projects, with causes anywhere from a contractor's mistake to supplychain delays and even investor reconsideration. The right builder's risk policy—which protects buildings under construction—can mean the difference between a manageable setback and a financial disaster.

Not all builder's risk policies are created equal coverage exclusions, limits and insurer appetite vary widely. What you don't know can hurt you. Increased risks during the construction phase of a contract may create costly financial potholes if not covered by a builder's risk policy, including:

- Hard costs like materials and labor, which include inflation, supply-chain charges and more
- Soft costs, including extended loan interest, permitting fees and additional design expenses, which add up during delays

Historical numbers are often used to estimate builder's risk premiums, but significant risk lies in relying on outdated assumptions or inaccurate figures when budgeting for a project. Inflation is hitting construction costs hard. Since 2020, the industry has experienced above-average inflation rates, including 14% in 2021 and 15.7% in 2022. Supply-chain volatility also creates risks: a fire at a single supplier or a sudden delay in a critical component can send costs spiraling.

Shifting trade policies under the new administration may pile on additional unpredictability. Project materials or equipment subject to tariffs—from overseas or within North America could lead to unexpected price hikes after your contract is set. If your coverage isn't aligned with these evolving risks, you may absorb unexpected expenses out of pocket.

Projects are getting bigger and more expensive, and the global insurance market for megaprojects is heavily influenced by broader economic conditions. Inflation impacts more than just material costs; it leads to higher interest rates, increased capital management and surety requirements. Companies must ensure they can meet these requirements without compromising their financial stability.

CALIFORNIA TOURISM NEWS

Ahead of projected "Trump Slump," Governor Newsom announces record-high tourism — again

Governor Newsom and Visit California announced that California's tourism spending continued to grow in 2024, reaching a recordhigh of \$157.3 billion in tourism spending throughout the state — an increase of 3% from 2023, another record-spending year. This comes after recent news that California's economy is now the fourth-largest economy in the world and experienced a population increase for the second year in a row.

The announcement comes with the release of Visit California's 2024 Economic Impact Report and revised 2025 forecast released today. According to Visit California's report, in 2024:

- Visitors spent \$157.3 billion at businesses across the state.
- Tourism spending supported 1.2 million jobs and created 24,000 new jobs.
- \$12.6 billion in state and local tax revenues was generated from tourism.

Economic progress at risk of Trump Slump

However, the forecast also anticipates a 1% dip in overall visitation and a 9.2% decline in international visitation in 2025, in direct response to federal economic policy and an impending "Trump Slump." Looking ahead, 2025 is projected to be more challenging, particularly due to global economic pressures and a slowdown in international tourism, the direct result of declining global sentiment about travel to the United States. California is already seeing the impact, with a sharp year-over-year decline in March of this year.

In anticipation of the slump caused by the Trump administration, Governor Newsom and Visit California are encouraging Californians to continue to travel within the state to help support the booming tourism industry. The Governor has also launched a new campaign encouraging Canadian consumers to continue to travel to the Golden State.

More people moving to California

In addition to record-breaking tourism, California is welcoming more new residents. Governor Newsom recently announced California's popu-

Mayor Bass highlights completion of debris removal at over 1,000 proper

Los Angeles Mayor Karen Bass highlighted the speed and efficiency of the debris removal process by recognizing that more than 1,000 properties have been cleared of all debris by the U.S.

Army Corps of Engineers and have received final sign off from LA County, a required step for rebuilding to begin.

Phase 2 of the debris removal process began just 35 days after the fires ignited – roughly half the time it took after the devastating 2018 Woolsey

Fire. To date, more than 648,000 tons of debris have been removed from the Palisades area, with a recent average of 55 sites cleared per day.

Earlier this month, Mayor Bass highlighted the start of the rebuilding process in the Palisades by visiting two different construction sites that have been issued building permits by the City. To date, 31 permits for 23 addresses related to rebuilding efforts have been issued for projects in the Palisades. Hundreds of permit applications are in the process of being reviewed. The

first permit was issued 57 days after the start of the Palisades Fire, more than twice as fast as they were issued after the devastating Camp and Woolsey fires.

"We're working every day to expedite the process to get families home and businesses reopened," said Mayor Karen Bass. "Thanks to the tireless work of partners like the Army Corps – who have removed hundreds of thousands of tons of fire debris from the Palisades so far – the rebuilding process is already underway, and our recovery effort is on track to be the fastest in modern California history."

Mayor Bass has worked to expedite this process so that, when property owners are ready, LADBS can issue permits as quickly as possible. Just last week, Mayor Bass issued three executive actions to further reduce rebuilding



costs and timelines for property owners in the Palisades:

Emergency Executive Order 6 establishes Los Angeles' first ever plan check Self-Certification pilot program to reduce time spent on the permitting process for the rebuilding of homes damaged or destroyed by the wildfires. Self-certification is a strategy that supports homeowners in the plan check process by allowing qualified architects to self-certify that their plans meet the California Residential Code. Under the Self-Certification pilot program, plans that are submitted for qualifying homes will no longer require plan check, but the buildings themselves will still be inspected for code compliance to ensure they are safe.

- Emergency Executive Order 7 directs City departments to refrain from collecting permit and plan check fees associated with the repair or reconstruction of homes damaged or destroyed by the January wildfires, pending City Council's adoption of an amendment to waive these fees. Additionally, the Emergency Executive Order requests the City Attorney to prepare and present for Council's consideration the draft urgency ordinance to waive the fees.
- Executive Directive 10 takes a step forward to using Artificial Intelligence technology to support City staff review of project plans against building and zoning codes, saving time and expediting the rebuilding process for residents.

2024 estimates calling for an additional 439,000+ workers to meet the labor demand. While some firms have done a better job of forecasting labor needs, others face serious bottlenecks. Increased regulatory scrutiny around worker eligibility and undocumented labor is expected to grow in 2025. While not an insurable risk, it's one that could create delays, fines or work stoppages.
