

Mayor Bass secures \$45 million for local businesses

Mayor Bass announced that her ProcureLA program has helped secure more than \$45 million in contracts for small and local businesses in Los Angeles. Small and local businesses are the backbone of Los Angeles’ economy, and Mayor Bass is determined to ensure that L.A.’s businesses can access major contract opportunities. ProcureLA provides L.A. businesses with targeted services, guidance, and resources to build a pipeline of businesses ready to compete and secure major contracts ahead of major events including the 2028 Games.

“L.A.’s small businesses are the backbone of our city, and we must ensure they benefit economically from all of the major events on the horizon,” said Mayor Bass. “We’re breaking down barriers and removing the bureaucracy that has kept L.A.’s businesses from thriving. My administration is moving with intention to ensure that our small and local businesses are prepared to take advantage of these major contract opportunities, and today, we’re starting to see the results of that work.”

“Surpassing \$45 million in contracts is a powerful milestone, but what matters most is the impact in our communities. For decades, PACE has supported small and local businesses as they work to stay open, retain employees, and serve their neighborhoods,” said Kerry Doi, Founder, President & CEO of PACE. “Programs like ProcureLA reinforce that community-rooted businesses are essential to Los Angeles’ future — and we are proud to help position them to compete, grow, and succeed.”

Operated by PACE (Pacific Asian Consortium in Employment), ProcureLA was created by the Mayor’s Office in October 2024 to build a pipeline of businesses equipped to compete for contracts ahead of major regional events including the FIFA World Cup, Super Bowl, and 2028 Olympic and Paralympic Games.

Since launching, ProcureLA has exceeded its benchmarks, including:

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4 Major Challenges Facing the Construction Industry in 2026

In short:

- Four of the biggest challenges facing the construction industry right now are labor shortages, stagnant productivity, worker safety, and slow technology adoption.
- 92% of construction firms reported difficulty filling open positions in 2025, and labor shortages are the leading cause of project delays.
- Construction productivity has grown just 0.4% annually over the past two decades, a fraction of the broader economy.
- AI adoption in construction is accelerating but still lags most other industries, and firms that fail to act now risk being outpaced by those that do.

The construction industry is navigating a difficult stretch. Labor shortages delay projects. Productivity growth has remained mostly flat compared to other industries. Safety remains a persistent problem. And most firms are still in the early stages of adopting the technology that could help address all three.

These challenges aren’t new, but their stakes are higher than they’ve been in years. **Here’s what the data shows about these four major challenges facing the construction industry.**

1. Labor Shortages

According to the 2025 AGC of America and NCCER Workforce Survey, 92% of construction firms reported having a hard time filling open positions. Labor shortages lead to project delays, cited by 45% of firms as the reason at least one project was held up in the past year more than any other factor, including material lead times or permitting issues.

Here’s why it’s happening:

- **An aging workforce:** Experienced workers are approaching retirement age faster than younger workers are entering the trades.



- **A skills gap:** 57% of contractors say available candidates lack the skills, licenses, or credentials needed for open positions.
- **Immigration enforcement:** 28% of firms reported being directly or indirectly impacted by immigration enforcement activities in 2025.

Many firms are trying to address these issues by raising wages. 95% of the firms in AGC’s Workforce Survey increased base pay rates over the past year, and the average construction wage now sits at \$39.69 per hour. That’s 8.9% above the average private sector wage, but higher pay alone won’t close a gap that’s structural in nature.

2. Stagnant Productivity

The construction industry’s productivity record hasn’t improved significantly in the last couple decades. According to McKinsey’s analysis, construction productivity grew just 0.4% annually between 2000 and 2022 compared to 2% for the broader economy and 3% for manufacturing over the same period.

The consequences are significant. McKinsey estimates that if current productivity trends continue, global construction output could fall short of demand by \$40 trillion cumulatively by 2040.

3. Safety Risks in Construction

Worker safety remains one of the most serious problems in the industry. According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, construction and extraction workers experienced 1,032 fatalities in 2024, which is among the highest fatality rates of any U.S. industry sector.

The costs of a serious incident extend beyond the human tragedy: lost productivity, OSHA investigations, and lasting damage to a firm’s reputation and ability to attract workers.

Ongoing training, hazard identification, and consistent enforcement of safe work practices remain non-negotiable. Companies with strong safety programs also tend to be more productive because safety and performance aren’t at odds.

4. Technology Adoption
