Midway through 2025, here's the outlook for the construction economy in North America.

The construction economy in the U.S. and Canada is facing some tough challenges as we head toward the middle of 2025. Experts are hopeful for improvement, but the industry is dealing with slow growth, labor shortages, and different trends across regions. Economic forecasters currently more pessimistic about outlook for the economy than at the beginning of year

The good news? ConstructConnect Chief Economist Michael Guckes says, "While things are volatile now, they will not be volatile forever."

Here's a look at what's happening right now, thanks to the research of leading economists in construction.

Here's how the construction economy is doing right now

The overall economy remains uncertain, with only small signs of growth.

Overall:

- **GDP Growth:** As of May 2025, the U.S. economy is expected to grow by just 1.2% this year. That's a slow pace.
- **Construction Activity:** Total construction is down by 13% compared to the same time in 2024. However, there are opportunities

in civil projects, military work, and data centers.

Canada's economy shows mixed results. Alberta is struggling, where construction starts are down nearly 50% compared to last year, but the Atlantic provinces (New Brunswick, Newfoundland and Labrador, and Prince Edward Island) saw a near 170% jump in starts. Such a mix shows how much construction trends can vary widely across regions.

How labor challenges are impacting the construction economy

Finding workers is still a big issue for construction. Wage demands and new immigration policies in the U.S. are making things even harder. Guckes points out, "Construction is disproportionately more dependent on foreign labor than a lot of our peer industries."

Here are some key takeaways:

- **Hiring Trends:** Jobs in construction grew by 1.7% over the past year, but the pace is slowing down. Residential construction, which stayed strong earlier, is now flat.
- Job Openings: Job openings in construction have dropped a lot over the past three years. Even so, layoffs are at record lows. This suggests companies are hanging on to workers because they expect better times ahead.

"By tackling polluted and abandoned properties, these Brownfields grants restore local pride, improve neighborhood health, and ignite economic vitality," said EPA Pacific Southwest Regional Administrator Josh F.W. California awards \$52.4 million to reinvest in communities, increase economic opportunity across the state

The Governor's Office of Business and Economic Development (GO-Biz) awarded \$52.4 million to 33 organizations through the California Community Reinvestment Grants (CalCRG) program, which serves communities disproportionately affected by past federal and state drug policies.

The funds come from the cannabis tax revenue generated by The Adult Use of Marijuana Act

(Proposition 64, 2016) and aid qualified community-based organizations and local health departments in a range of activities, including:

- Job placement
- Mental health treatment
- Substance use disorder treatment
- System navigation services
- Legal services to address barriers to reentry
- Linkages to medical care

"The California Community Reinvestment Grants program continues to serve as a valuable resource for communities that have faced longstanding barriers to opportunity," said Dee Dee Myers, Senior Advisor to Governor Newsom and Director of GO-Biz. "This latest round of awards will support the economic health and well-being of neighborhoods across the state that need and deserve this critical level of reinvestment."

Past federal and state drug policies led to the mass incarceration of people of color, decreased

access to social services, loss of educational attainment due to diminished federal financial aid eligibility, prohibitions on the use of public housing and other public assistance, and the separation of families. So, while it's a positive sign that more young workers are open to go into a trade rather than get a college degree...there are still some challenges attracting these workers to construction roles.

Key Characteristics of Generation Z

- 1. Digital Natives. Gen Z is the first generation to grow up in a fully digital age. They are accustomed to rapid technological advancements and instant access to information. To engage and retain Gen Z talent, construction firms must leverage digital tools and platforms in both recruitment and daily operations.
- Purpose-Driven. This generation values purpose and social responsibility. Gen Z seeks employers with a strong commitment to sustainability, diversity, and community impact.
- Entrepreneurial Spirit. Desiring to make a tangible impact, Gen Z exhibits entrepreneurial traits. Construction firms can tap into this spirit by fostering an environment

that encourages innovation, problem-solving, and continuous improvement.

- Diversity and Inclusion Advocates. Gen Z is known for its emphasis on DEI. Companies promoting a diverse and inclusive workplace are more likely to resonate with Gen Z, who actively seek environments where different perspectives are valued and respected.
- 5. Preference for Flexibility. Work-life balance and flexibility are highly valued by Gen Z. This makes recruiting and retaining Gen Z more difficult for construction roles that are on site, have inherent environmental risks, and don't offer as much flexibility.

Understanding the nuances of Generation Z is the first step in developing effective recruitment and retention strategies tailored to them.

Why Generation Z is Hard to Recruit & Retain

Because Generation Z has a unique set of attributes and expectations, it makes it difficult to attract and retain them to work in the construction industry, which can be slow to adapt to change. Let's dive into the specific challenges, so you can more easily overcome them.

Challenges of Hiring Generation Z in Construction

An Associated General Contractors (AGC) study found that 85% of construction firms have open positions they are trying to fill. Increasing demand for construction projects is part of this, but it's also because applicants lack the basic skills needed and one-third can't pass a drug test.

- Different career expectations. Gen Z tends to explore a variety of career paths rather than committing to a single career early on. To hire them, you'll need to convince them of the benefits of a career in construction. We recommend using Construction Learning Paths to show them the varied and fulfilling path they can take in the industry.
- Digital natives. Gen Z are masters of technology. They expect to have access to tools and cutting-edge technology at work, just like they have in their personal lives. Construction firms that haven't embraced digital transformation may struggle to hire Gen Z employees.
- Demand for purposeful work. This generation seeks meaningful work that aligns with their values. Construction companies might struggle with stereotypes of the profession despite the profound societal impact of the industry on communities and economies.

response to the homelessness and behavioral health crisis, Mayor Lurie has created the San Francisco Police Department (SFPD) Hospitality Zone Task Force to improve public safety and street conditions downtown 365 days a year and unveiled his "Rebuilding the Ranks" plan to fully staff the SFPD and Sheriff's Office.

Midway through 2025, here's the outlook for the construction economy

• **Wages:** Wages in construction remain strong. Workers in this field earn about 19% more than the average worker in the economy.

Ken Simonson, Chief Economist at the Association of General Contractors, explains, "Firms are not only not hiring right now, they're not even looking to hire at the extent that they had been." He predicts, "[Firms] still expect a pickup [in construction activity] in the near future, and that's why they're hanging on to the workers they have."

How immigration policies have affected the construction economy

Labor shortages make immigration policy an important issue for construction. Guckes predicts competition for labor will grow, both inside and outside of construction. Kermit Baker, Chief Economist for the American Institute of Architects, agrees. He says, "Immigration has taken a back seat with the focus on tariffs, but the immigration policy is likely to pick up momentum."

Guckes adds, "[When] it comes to the battle for labor and competing for labor, we not only are going to see a lot of intra-competition—construction firms trying to steal from construction firms' quality labor—but we're also going to see a lot of outside demand for those same laborers because there are just so many firms that will be desperate to find people to do necessary jobs. And we saw that, of course, during COVID."

We will have to keep a close eye on this aspect as 2025 continues.

What kinds of construction projects are succeeding in 2025

Not all areas of the construction industry are

struggling. Fonda Rosenfeldt, Vice President of
Content Acquisition for ConstructConnect says,
"Public spending right now is driving activity.
Private work is cautious but growing."

Here's a closer look at bidding activity and where the growth is happening:

Bidding Activity:

- U.S. public sector bids are up 3.4%, while private sector bids are down 3.8%, compared to 2024.
- Bids in Canada show declines on both sides. Public bids are down 10.4%, and private bids are down 6.5%.

Where Growth is Happening:

• Infrastructure and institutional projects, like schools or hospitals, are seeing growth. However, retail and industrial construction are slowing. Big projects worth at least \$1 billion, known as "megaprojects", are a major focus. Around \$120 billion worth of these projects are planned across Canada and the U.S.

Speaking on megaprojects, Rosenfeldt says, "Will they be leading construction spending this year, with so many of them starting? Those are all things to be seen."

Tariffs and the risks to watch for in construction in 2025

The economy adds more pressure to the construction industry. Inflation is increasing, unemployment is expected to go up, and the chance of a recession has doubled since January.

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
