

Governor Newsom’s Clean California initiative marks 100 community designations for safety and cleanliness

Governor Gavin Newsom today celebrates the milestone of 100 communities and organizations across the Golden State having earned the prestigious Clean California Community designation. This statewide effort led by Caltrans encourages local engagement from Californians to make communities cleaner, safer, and more sustainable.

Since July 2021, Clean California has funded 317 projects statewide, and Caltrans and its local partners have removed more than 3.8 million cubic yards of litter from highways and public spaces – the equivalent of filling about 180,000 residential garbage trucks with debris and trash. Under Governor Newsom’s leadership the program is also supporting California’s long-term goals aimed at climate resilience, economic equity and public safety.

“The first 100 Clean California designees are showing what’s possible when communities across the state commit to cleaner, healthier public spaces,” said California State Transportation Secretary Toks Omishakin. “Under Governor Newsom’s leadership, CalSTA and Caltrans encourage all communities to join this momentum and take the pledge for a cleaner California.”

“Unsurprisingly these 100 communities have also led the way by organizing dozens of cleanup events recently during Earth Week and throughout the year,” said Caltrans Director Dina El-Tawansy. “The leadership exemplified by these 100 communities and their residents and local business are proof positive that when each of us commits to making long-term changes in our behavior, we can be part of the solution that makes our state and even better place to live.”

“Our city has made great efforts to revitalize our community and make Pasadena a leading litter-free city in California. We are very honored to have received the Clean California Community designation,” said Pasadena Mayor Victor Gordo. “This recognition reflects the collaborative efforts of our residents, staff and our community partners who are dedicated to creating a cleaner, safer and healthier community.”

Mayor Bass meets union workers on LA Convention Center project

Mayor Bass joined members of the City Council, the State Legislature, City officials, labor leaders, and hundreds of union construction workers yesterday to tour the progress of the Los Angeles Convention Center (LACC) Expansion and Modernization Project, which is part of the Mayor’s larger efforts to revitalize Downtown L.A.

“For decades, the City failed to act to modernize our convention center, harming downtown and our economy. Now, the expansion and modernization of the LA Convention Center is creating jobs and driving economic opportunity, with nearly 20 conventions and events already committed to booking the LACC due to the new expansion,” said Mayor Bass. “We are delivering this project on-time, on-budget, and hundreds of workers are benefiting from the good-paying, union jobs that have been created.”

The historic project will add 193,000 square feet of exhibit space over Pico Blvd to bridge the gap between the West and South Halls, bringing the Center’s total exhibit space to 900,000 square feet once complete and positioning L.A. to better compete for large conventions. It will also increase LACC’s breakout space by 38,000 square feet and add a brand new 98,000-square-foot ballroom with a roof garden terrace and panoramic views of the downtown skyline and the Hollywood Hills.

In October 2025, Mayor Bass joined City and labor leaders to officially start construction on the expansion and modernization of the LA Convention Center. Since then, nearly 20 events and conventions have already committed to or are in negotiations to book LACC. These events represent more than 400,000 total hotel room nights.

The LACC Expansion and Modernization Project is already serving as a powerful economic engine for the City of Los Angeles. In just the first seven months of construction, with more than two years of work still ahead, the project has already generated significant economic impact across the region, including \$50.7 million



in construction contracting opportunities awarded to small, local, diverse, and emerging businesses. \$29.8 million has been awarded directly to Los Angeles-based businesses, and more than \$4.8 million in wages have gone to Angelenos working on the project.

35% of the hours worked on the project have been completed by local workers, exceeding the 30% target in the City’s Project Labor Agreement, and 7% have been completed by transitional workers, including veterans, formerly homeless, and justice-impacted individuals. With construction continuing to ramp up, these figures represent only the beginning of the project’s long-term economic impact and investment into the communities positioned to benefit most.
