

Los Angeles County gives \$105,000 to 12 small businesses

The Los Angeles County Department of Economic Opportunity (DEO) announced the award of \$105,000 in Small Business Mobility Fund (SBMF) Launch Grants to support 12 small businesses establishing or expanding brick-and-mortar locations in unincorporated areas of Los Angeles County. The SBMF Launch Grants were announced on January 8, 2026 as part of DEO’s Economic Mobility Initiative, expanding education, training and technical assistance, and capital to businesses that need it most countywide.

The SBMF Launch Grants are designed to help entrepreneurs transition into physical commercial spaces and strengthen local economic activity in underserved communities. Grant awards provide \$5,000 for businesses operating in non-retail commercial spaces, such as offices and warehouses, and \$10,000 for businesses operating in retail commercial spaces with storefronts. DEO has partnered with Initiating Change in Our Neighborhoods (ICON) Community Development Corporation (CDC) to administer the program, including application and eligibility review and technical assistance for applicants.

A total of 12 businesses have been selected to date for funding through a competitive review process, with awards supporting costs associated with opening and activating physical locations. Eligible uses include tenant improvements, façade upgrades, signage, and required permitting. Many of the selected businesses have been adversely affected by the wildfires and are working to relaunch within their communities. Others are launching a brick-and-mortar or other commercial ventures, investing in new product lines with visual signage, and scaling up their storefront operations.

“Our small businesses have shown remarkable resilience as they continue to navigate economic challenges and recovery efforts, especially those in our unincorporated communities such as Puente Valley and East Los Angeles,” said Los Angeles County Chair and First District Supervisor Hilda L. Solis. “These grants represent more than financial support; they are a targeted investment

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Solving the Construction Labor Gap Starts with Training

The labor shortage is a familiar problem that faces construction leaders every day. While that gap in available workers isn’t going away, there is a shift taking place that deserves the industry’s attention.

A critical step in the right direction, more young people are showing interest in the trades. New data from the National Association of Home Builders (NAHB) shows interest in construction careers among young adults has doubled over the past decade.

No doubt, this is a positive sign and one the industry has needed, but on the jobsite there is a stark difference. It seems that, so far, that interest hasn’t translated into a meaningful increase in skilled workers entering the field.

The gap between curiosity and career is where the real problem exists.

Interest Is Growing, But the Pipeline Isn’t

Maybe the conversation about the labor shortage, which has been ongoing for years, is finally starting to draw the attention that we need. That’s as much of a bright spot as anyone in the industry could hope for right now as builders are beginning to see more awareness around the trades, especially among younger generations who are reconsidering the traditional four-year college path.

The real issue is what comes next.

Interest without access doesn’t build a workforce. Many of the young people showing interest in the trades still don’t know how to take the first step. They may not fully understand what specific careers in the industry look like or how to get started in training. At the same time, college is still looked at as the default for students’ futures by high school administration. Even when they’re interested in the trades, they may not always be given a clear view of construction as a career early enough to make an informed decision for their future.

The result is a disconnect. There’s more interest, great, but the system to convert that into real jobsite participation is still inconsistent.

Where Training Still Falls Short

Another challenge is the gap between training programs and real-world construction.

There is a disconnect between what is taught and what actually takes place on a jobsite. Modern construction is fast-paced, highly planned and coordinated and increasingly dependent on communication and organization across multiple disciplines. That environment can be hard to replicate in a classroom setting.

When new, young workers come into the field lacking that education, they come with a learning curve that can slow productivity and sow confusion. Experienced crews are already stretched to their limit and don’t always have the time required to fully train someone from the ground up.

That doesn’t mean training programs lack value – that couldn’t be further from the truth. It simply means they need to be more closely aligned with the realities of the actual job.

The Case for Earlier Exposure

Giving potential young construction workers exposure to the industry as early as possible is one of the single most effective ways to start turning this problem around.

When students are introduced to the trades before graduating from high school it changes their perceptions. Suddenly, construction stops look-

ing like a fallback option and more like a viable career path. This approach helps them to begin seeing how the industry doesn’t just offer jobs, but long-term career opportunities.

That exposure can take many forms, including:

- Jobsite visits
- Internship programs
- Hands-on workshops
- Partnerships between schools and local contractors

When setting up a strategy for this, the goal isn’t just to show them what construction looks like. It should also focus on what a future in the industry can become.

Apprenticeships That Lead Somewhere

Exposure is only the first step in taking this new level of interest and transforming it into a usable tool to bolster a firm’s workforce. The next is to create structured pathways into the workforce.

What that means is incorporating apprenticeships and internships into the firm’s long-term plan, but it’s imperative these go beyond just observation. Real progress happens when young workers are given responsibility on the job site with guidance and a clear sense of advancement. That includes illustrating that construction careers aren’t limited to entry-level roles. There are paths into areas like project management, leadership, specialized trades and even business ownership. When these are visible it becomes far easier to see one’s future and commit to the industry for the long term.

Mayor Bass signs budget to reduce homelessness, hire police, improve services

Mayor Karen Bass signed the City budget for Fiscal Year 2026-2027 focused on continuing her work reversing longstanding trends by reducing homelessness, building more housing, hiring more officers, and investing in basic city services. Mayor Bass was joined by Council President Marqueece Harris-Dawson and members of the City Council’s Budget and Finance Committee, including Chair Katy Yaroslavsky, Councilmember Tim McOsker, and Councilmember Eunisses Hernandez along with a number of City workers from multiple departments.

“As Mayor, my focus has been to change the direction of L.A. by reversing longstanding trends on homelessness, housing, public safety, and investment in basic city services. This budget builds on that work so we can keep making progress,” said **Mayor Bass**.

“This budget is evidence of the dedication of Mayor Bass, Budget Chair Yaroslavsky, and the City Council to prioritize the needs of

Angelenos, claim LA as our home, and make the city the one we all deserve,” said **Council President Marqueece Harris-Dawson**. “From prioritizing city services and infrastructure improvements to investing in public safety, together we are readying our city to welcome the world and build long-term benefits for residents.”

“I want to thank Mayor Bass and her team for putting forward a budget that, from the outset, was built around many priorities shared by this Council,” said **Councilwoman Katy Yaroslavsky**. “This final budget does two very important things: It preserves and further invests in core City services, and it strengthens the City’s financial position. It also reflects a serious effort by the Council and the Mayor to keep Los Angeles moving forward while putting the City on a path towards fiscal sustainability.”

“In a year defined by significant fiscal challenges, this budget is centered on the City’s core responsibilities, including sidewalks, streets, curbs, public safety, homelessness re-

sponse, and basic city services,” said **Councilmember Tim McOsker**. “Throughout this process, we remained committed to funding our values, protecting core services, supporting our workforce, and putting Los Angeles on stronger financial footing for the future. I want to thank Mayor Bass for putting together a strong proposed budget, as well as my colleagues on the Budget and Finance Committee for their tireless work throughout this process to deliver a responsible budget for the people of Los Angeles.”

“At a time when the federal government is attacking immigrants, trans people, and working-class families while investing in punishment and division, Los Angeles chose to invest in care, prevention, dignity, and the basic services our communities rely on,” said **Councilmember Eunisses Hernandez**. “These wins happened because Angelenos organized and fought for them, and I’m proud that this budget reflects the power of people refusing to give up on each other.”

The \$14.85 billion balanced budget projects increased property, business, sales, and utility tax revenues, promotes greater efficiency in City services, and maximizes the use of special funds and new revenue enhancements. It prioritizes the following:

Continuing to Drive Down Homelessness

- Maintaining Inside Safe, all interim housing beds and street level services to continue Mayor Bass’ work that has brought street homeless down by nearly 18 percent.
- Increasing funding to address RV encampments.
- Increasing funding for oversight, transparency, and accountability.

Bolstering Public Safety

- Increasing police hiring to 510 new officers. This maintains Mayor Bass’ long-term goal of 9,500 officers.

The Thomas gets underway in Tremont

Team pursuing west-side developments

It’s a project that has gone under the radar amid the many others on Cleveland’s near-West Side. But today, a development team assembled to break ground for The Thomas apartments, 2422 W. 7th St. in Cleveland’s Tremont neighborhood.

Unfortunately, they weren’t able to poke their shovels into the sunbaked, rock-like soil. So they’ll leave that hard part to the excavator which has already arrived on the 0.148-acre site to begin constructing the 12-unit apartment building.

The development team noted that this project, like several others they’re working on, will cater to a market that they say is not being adequately served in Cleveland and especially on the city’s West Side — the middle.

“This is characterized as ‘missing middle’ housing, a development type of which the City of Cleveland has looked to encourage throughout the city,” said James Asimes, president of development at The Dalad Group of Independence. The Thomas is named after a relative of his.

He said Dalad, in partnership with others including Property Advisors Group of Beachwood, is in the early stage of development of two other projects in Cleveland that would provide a similar development style. One is 8400 Lake in the

Detroit-Shoreway neighborhood and another is The Park-Phase Two in Tremont.

For The Thomas, Dalad is partnering with Horsepower Capital Partners of Chagrin Falls, Horton Harper Architects of Cleveland, and Rockaway Civil LLC of Kirtland,

“We are actively seeking additional opportunities across the city and region to apply a ‘missing middle’ development approach and we believe there is demand in the market for sensible, affordable apartments of this ilk,” Asimes added.

The development acquired property for The Thomas as TDG Jefferson, LLC in November 2025, paying \$283,500, Cuyahoga County property records show. It was purchased from another developer who didn’t deliver its own proposed project — a quartet of luxury, for-sale, attached townhouses.

That developer, ParaPrin, had built in Sandusky but not yet in Cleveland. While it didn’t build the townhomes, it prepared the site for development. In 2023, it razed two existing residential structures on the site.

One was a two-unit, 3,896-square-foot house built more than a century ago. The other is an 820-square-foot building dating from 1870 and described by county records as a “motel.”
