California High-Speed Rail Authority Responds to FRA: "Termination is Unwarranted and Unjustified"

California High-Speed Rail Authority CEO Ian Choudri issued a firm and detailed rebuttal to the proposed termination of two major funding agreements in a letter to Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) Acting Administrator Drew Feeley this week. Choudri's response corrects the record on the FRA's "unfounded," "outright misleading," and "disingenuous" assertions and methodologies, highlighting elements of the review as "nothing more than rhetoric aimed at justifying a pre-ordained conclusion."

"Termination of the Cooperative Agreements is unwarranted and unjustified," said Ian Choudri, CEO of the California High-Speed Rail Authority. "FRA's conclusions are based on an inaccurate, often outright-misleading, presentation of the evidence. Among other things, the FRA distorts data that the Authority has furnished to the FRA, includes citations to reports that do not support its conclusions, and employs opaque and disingenuous methodologies."

In a detailed 14-page letter, the Authority meticulously disputes each of the FRA's core findings, while touting the project's substantial construction progress and funding plan.

"I must also take this opportunity to dispute, in the strongest possible terms, the misleading



claim that the Authority has made 'minimal progress to advance construction,'" wrote Choudri. "The Authority's work has already reshaped the Central Valley. We have built many of the viaducts, overpasses, and underpasses on which the first 119 miles of high-speed rail track will run."

Major structures completed include the 4,741foot San Joaquin River Viaduct in Fresno and the Hanford Viaduct in Kings County, the largest high-speed rail structure in the Central Valley, spanning the length of twenty-one football fields. A railyard for materials laydown and logistics to allow for high-speed rail construction is under construction and scheduled for completion this year.

"These are momentous achievements," said Choudri. "Combining feats of engineering, complex logistical and legal coordination, and, on average, the labor of more than 1,700 workers in the field every day, mostly in Fresno, Kings, and Tulare Counties. In total, fifty-three structures and sixty-nine miles of guideway have been completed."

The Authority also rejected the FRA's claim that it lacks a plan to close a projected \$7 billion funding gap, pointing to Governor Gavin Newsom's proposed extension of California's Capand-Trade program, now referred to as Cap-and-Invest, which would guarantee at least \$1 billion annually through 2045. The Authority also noted its forthcoming Request for Expressions of Interest (RFEI) to engage private partners for potential innovative and creative partnerships that could improve cost and schedule of project delivery.

The letter also took issue with the review process, stating that the FRA's own monitoring report in October 2024 found no significant compliance issues, and that the FRA's new position is outwardly inconsistent with its own prior findings.

"There have been no meaningful changes in the past eight months that justify FRA's dramatic about-face," said Choudri. "Instead, the FRA has looked at essentially the same facts it considered in the fall of 2024 and simply reached a different conclusion."

The Historical Legacy of Juneteenth

On "Freedom's Eve," or the eve of January 1, 1863, the first Watch Night services took place. On that night, enslaved and free African Americans gathered in churches and private homes all across the country awaiting news that the Emancipation Proclamation had taken effect. At the stroke of midnight, prayers were answered as all enslaved people in Confederate States were declared legally free. Union soldiers, many of whom were black, marched onto plantations and across cities in the south reading small copies of the Emancipation Proclamation spreading the news of freedom in Confederate States. Only through the Thirteenth Amendment did emancipation end slavery throughout the United States.

But not everyone in Confederate territory would immediately be free. Even though the Emancipation Proclamation was made effective in 1863, it could not be implemented in places still under Confederate control. As a result, in the westernmost Confederate state

Is Commercial Construction Right for Me? 5 Questions to Ask Yourself

In 1947, decades before the federal Clean Air Act, California's leaders began regulating the causes of harmful air pollution. It was also our state that, in 2006 under Gov. Arnold Schwarzenegger, passed arguably the most aggressive greenhouse gas reduction law in the world, setting off a global race for climate action.

California's leadership on the environment has a well-deserved reputation.

So it is with a great deal of pride, and no small amount of sadness, that a growing flaw in the California Environmental Quality Act, one of the principle legal mechanisms we use to protect clean air and water, conserve sensitive lands and habitats and address the pollution that causes climate change, is now cause for concern.

CEQA, as it's colloquially known, embodies the proposition that you should "look before you leap" on issues that could have negative environmental or public health impacts. The law's core legal principle holds that decisionmakers should know the environmental consequences of their actions before taking them.

This purpose remains a worthy one. Unfortunately, over time CEQA has led to unfortunate and inadvertent consequences - in particular, it is commonly used to block much-needed housing in California. But the law is not only harmful in its use: The mere threat of a CEQA lawsuit is enough to stifle new housing developments since such suits can add substantial time, cost and risk for builders who already face daunting construction costs.

The dilemma is how to retain the beneficial essence of CEOA while dealing with the downsides. A bill in the California legislature deals with this and deserves support.

Assembly Bill 609 creates an exemption from CEQA for infill housing projects that are compliant with local laws and not in environmentally sensitive locations. "Building up" in urban locations reduces development pressure on open land in outlying areas. It also reduces commute times and reduces pollution.

As a father and son with lifetimes of experience in environmental causes, we write with some ambivalence. Decades ago, one of us was responsible for the emergence of CEQA as a "super statute," drafting the amicus brief to the California Supreme Court in Friends of Mammoth v. Mono County - the bedrock

case in which the court ruled CEQA extended a public "right of action" against private activity.

Some may view any changes to CEQA as a "camel's nose under the tent," inevitably leading to its demise. Our view is the opposite: Like all laws, CEQA derives its social license from its good-faith application. But when a bedrock environmental law is used to cause measurable environmental harm - for example, by displacing housing developments to agricultural and open lands - that undermines political support for the law.

Thoughtful reforms such as AB 609 can maintain CEQA's core focus on environmental protection, while enabling housing to be built more quickly, cheaply and sustainably.

"Hostility to public investments in high-speed rail, and to California's leadership-hostility that dates back to FRA's initial attempt to revoke federal funding to the Program in May 2019appears to be the real basis for the proposed determination.'

The letter also underscores that environmental clearance is complete from downtown San Francisco to downtown Los Angeles and that electrification of the Caltrain corridor between San Francisco and San Jose is finished.

Choudri concluded his response by calling on the agency to withdraw its proposed termination.

"I hope that FRA and the Authority can move forward to work together to support this Pro-

gram-a project with a big future and great promise to better the lives of Californians and spur economic growth in the state and across the nation."

Construction progresses every day on the California high-speed rail project. There are currently 171 miles under design and construction from Merced to Bakersfield. Nearly 70 miles of guideway is completed, 54 structures have been

Mayor Lurie Celebrates Opening of New Community Resources Center in SoMa

Mayor Daniel Lurie celebrated the grand opening of a new community resource center in San Francisco's South of Market Neighborhood (SoMa). Owned and operated by United Playaz, a San Francisco-based violence prevention and youth development organization, the new facility at 1044 Howard expands United Playaz's wide range of services to prepare vulnerable youth for higher education, employment, and healthy living with a safe, nurturing, and collaborative environment.

The opening of the new resource center builds on Mayor Lurie's work to drive San Francisco's recovery and strengthen community organizations. In his proposed budget, Mayor Lurie protected important support for legal services in the city's immigrant, LGBTQ+ communities, and families.

"It is United Playaz, events like this, and communities like this that give me hope. Because when we work together, come together, and are together, there is no stopping San Francisco," said Mayor Lurie. "This is an organization that delivers on its word. Places and communities like this are what is going to take us back to being the greatest city in the world. Whatever comes our way, San Francisco will stand united."

United Playaz acquired the new space in 2022 to provide an additional 3,200 square feet of much needed programming space, expanding United Playaz's family literacy and adult reentry programs that connect formerly incarcerated individuals with support, resources, and referrals as they transition back into the community. The site is conveniently located in the South of Market neighborhood between Sixth and Seventh Street, just two doors down from the United Playaz Clubhouse at 1038 Howard Street.

In addition to expanding United Playaz's family literacy and adult re-entry programs, 1044 Howard Street will serve as the new home for the SoMa Youth Collaborative Summer Program, funded in part by the SoMa Stabilization Fund through the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development. United Playaz's also plans to utilize the space for community meetings and special events.

The acquisition and rehabilitation of 1044 Howard Street was aided by grants from the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development and the San Francisco Community Investment Fund, as well as \$2 million in state funds, secured by Assemblymember Matt Haney, and \$4 million in federal funding, secured by Speaker Emerita Nancy Pelosi. The project included renovating the existing structure at 1044 Howard Street, expanding the second story, building an outdoor rooftop basketball court, and ensuring the building is seismically sound.

"United Playaz for decades has been actively working to solve some of the most challenging problems that our downtown community faces," said Assemblymember Haney. "They have done the work and they're helping the people of SOMA take their future into their own hands. And now they have a space that matches the scale of their impact."

"For decades, United Playaz has provided lifechanging support to young people, families, and individuals returning from incarceration," said District 6 Supervisor Matt Dorsey. "This new center expands their ability to serve, engage, and uplift, and will stand as a lasting investment in the future of our community. I'm honored to support this important project and extend my deepest gratitude to Executive Director Rudy Corpuz and all the partners who helped bring this vision to life."

Tenorio Sisters Turn Shared Dreams into Tasty Business with Al Chile... está bien bueno!

Laura and Ailin Tenorio, sisters from Mexico, used to make gelatin, cakes and flan (Mexican custard) to sell at school when they were little. "It's funny how we both did the same thing, even though we didn't grow up together," said Laura, who's 17 years older than Ailin.

When Ailin came to the United States, and after they received a settlement from a car accident, Laura said to her sister, "Let's put this money to work before it's gone". Sharing the same dream of achieving financial independence, they acquired a food truck and began attending food fairs. Ailin's goal was to offer an experience as close as possible to eating in Mexico. However, food fairs and farmers markets soon disappointed the sisters –too much work and not enough sales. In addition, the lack of knowledge about the Health Department requirements made things more challenging.

They decided to start catering events. This way they could better estimate the number of clients and reduce food waste. Laura and Ailin became business partners and registered their company as Al Chile...está bien bueno! They began serving a variety of Mexican treats, including ice cream, aguas frescas, smoothies and juices, as well as savory snacks, sandwiches, hot drinks and desserts.

Although catering was an improvement, it still came with its own set of challenges. It was stressful because everything had to be done on the same day, and they didn't have a dedicated space for preparation or enough refrigeration. The sisters decided they needed to find a place where they could prepare, store and sell during the week to avoid wasting food.

They had already found a location in Ontario and were in the process of negotiating when they came across an ad for the Emprendedor@s Program in Rancho Cucamonga. They decided to enroll in the 8-week course led by Monica Robles, Founder and President of Asociación de Emprendedor@s (AdE) and internationally certified JMT Coach (John Maxwell Team). Since the classes were conducted in Spanish, Laura felt more comfortable and was able to easily understand everything. Under Robles' guidance, the sisters paused the negotiations until they were more advanced in their business education. They learned about permits, contracts, business structure, business plan, mission and vision statements, and leasing a commercial space, among other topics.

No sooner had they graduated from the Emprendedor@s Program on, than they enrolled in another training offered by AdE in partnership with San Bernardino County Workforce Development Department (SBC WDD) in Victorville: Entrepreneurship Business Series. Through this new program, they expanded their knowledge on how to hire and manage employees, learned about workers' compensation, and discovered how to access the free resources the County offers to support the success of small businesses.

"What was most important to me was having the guidance of trustworthy people and (...) having the certainly that wherever we were referred to, it was because they were approved by the association and would always help us in good faith," said Ailin.

Thanks to all the mentoring and training they received in both programs, the Tenorio family was able to celebrate the official opening of their business Al Chile...está bien bueno! in the city of Ontario. The event featured a ribbon-cutting ceremony, sponsored by the San Bernardino County Economic Development Department in the City of Rancho Cucamonga.
