The city of Carlsbad doesn't want grey monstrosities blighting its lovely Pacific landscape, so it has strict height and visibility requirements for parking structures.

"Most parking structures generally have two to four bays, but given the height limits and the restraints of the site itself, this one is six bays wide," says Spencer Yoder, senior preconstruction manager for McCarthy Building Companies Inc., and leader of the company's parking structure preconstruction group in Southern California and Nevada

McCarthy was the perfect company for the job. With 18 offices in 10 states, employee-owned McCarthy works on numerous parking proj-

# California announces latest round of tax credits that will spur \$87 million in private investment across the state

What you need to know: As part of the California Jobs First initiative, the state is awarding \$34.4 million in California Competes tax credits to five companies looking to expand in California, supporting investment in a range of cutting-edge sectors throughout the state.

The Governor's Office of Business and Economic Development (GO-Biz) announced the latest round of awards through the California Competes Tax Credit (CalCompetes) program, creating good-paying jobs and spurring \$86.8 million in new investment across the Golden State.

"California is turning bold ideas into real opportunities. With major investments in the industries driving our economy, we're creating good-paying jobs, bringing in millions in private investment, and building a resilient economy that supports all Californians."

The awardees span a number of strategic sectors, including the clean economy, aerospace and defense, high-tech and manufacturing, that continue to drive the future of California's economy:

- **Nextracker** is investing nearly \$33 million to deliver reliable solar power and integrated software solutions in Fremont
- **A.S. Aerospace** is investing \$19 million to continue manufacturing precision aerospace hardware
- **EVO Power USA** is investing more than \$1 million to deliver fully integrated battery energy storage solutions in Rancho Santa Margarita
- **RIS Rx** will expand development of their personalized healthcare software in Newport Beach through a \$4 million investment
- Le Vecke Corporation is investing \$30 million to expand their adult beverage manufacturing facility in Jurupa Valley

"Companies focused on long-term, sustainable growth are expanding across the state, creating new opportunities for California's worldclass workforce," said Dee Dee Myers, Senior Advisor to Governor Newsom and Director of GO-Biz. "These investments reinforce California's continued leadership in the emerging sectors shaping the state's economic future."

Since 2013, CalCompetes has awarded tax credits to more than 1,200 businesses who collectively committed to creating nearly 160,000 jobs and spurring more than \$50 billion of private capital investment across the state.

Over the past five years, CalCompetes has invested in companies such as Pacific Steel to construct the first steel mill in California in more than 50 years in Kern County; Relativity Space to expand their ability to manufacture 3D-printed rockets to carry satellites into space; AES to expand solar energy and battery storage operations across the state; Element Resources to build a hydrogen fuel manufacturing facility in the Antelope Valley; and many more.

In February, Governor Newsom released the California Jobs First Economic Blueprint -a new economic vision for California's future. The Blueprint, which is being implemented by the nine state agencies on the California Jobs First Council, outlines key initiatives to support regional growth, invest in 21st century job training, create an attractive environment for job creators and strengthen California's innovation economy -all to help increase access to good-paying jobs for Californians.

ects, including a previous garage at Legoland. To meet the city's aesthetic requirements for the new 372,000-square-foot, 1,130-stall structure, McCarthy painted it off-white and added Spanish-inspired tile inlays and wood trellises on the top level "to break up that basically hard, solid, horizontal line that is the top of a parking structure," Yoder says. "It definitely doesn't look like a big gray box."

Given Legoland's proximity to the coast, the project had to meet additional requirements, including a state coastal development permit to verify that the structure does not infringe on wildlife areas. City code also required 5% of the stalls to have charging stations for electric vehicles.

"The entitlement process itself was a little longer than a typical parking structure may be, but that wasn't unexpected," says Yoder. "We've developed some good relationships with the city, we knew who to talk to, knew where we needed to go to get things done and keep things moving along."

#### **BRICK BY BRICK**

McCarthy broke ground on the project in March 2024 with the removal of an existing asphalt surface lot. Among the challenges? Safely managing the flow of employees and guests at the popular park, which receives roughly 3 million visitors each year.

"There are tens of thousands of patrons onsite each day," says Yoder. "Our typical construction week—Monday through Friday, sometimes Saturday—coincided directly with their typical open hours. On a concrete pour day, we were out there at 3:30 or 4:00 a.m. to get our pour done, get trucks offsite and get out of there before any patrons arrived, just to eliminate any chance of interaction between the heavy equipment and somebody coming in their minivan with their family."

#### NOT A SNAP DECISION

The most intriguing part of the project: McCarthy used a new concrete maturity-monitoring technology to save time and reduce costs. When pouring a concrete deck, workers test the compressive strength by sending 5-10 cylinders of concrete to a laboratory, where the foot-high, four-inch-wide cylinders are then broken in a hydraulic press. Parking structures in Southern California are built with a post-tension cable deck, and if the five-inch-thick concrete isn't the correct strength—around 3,000 PSI—the ends of the cables can pull out and snap.

"It is an exceedingly dangerous situation," Yoder says.

As part of its innovative new approach, Mc-Carthy pours sensors into the slabs. The sensors "understand what the relative strength will be at any given time based on the heat of the concrete as it cures," Yoder says. "The idea is to speed things along and give us real-time data so that eventually we can come to the site on a Monday morning and have data from the whole weekend from a Friday pour, and know immediately if we're good to go. We'll still need a signoff from a structural engineer, but it could eliminate the need to have that third-party lab."

That boost in speed is important for staying on schedule, especially on a project like this, where the garage has an unusual shape.

"Generally, we like a concrete deck to be poured in as close to a square shape as possible," Yoder says. "With this one, our concrete pours would span a width of up to maybe 360 feet, which is about double what we would typically like to see. If we lose a day in there, that offsets the whole schedule by over a week."

This project, however, is definitely on track. The parking structure is scheduled to open in late 2025, but was largely finished by April. That makes Yoder happy, but his favorite part of any project is the topping-out day, when the last concrete deck is poured and when full carpenter and finishing crews—all McCarthy-employed union workers—are working onsite with a full reinforcing crew.

"Between those three groups, there are at least 65 individuals up on top of this building, working together simultaneously," he says. "It's a beautiful thing to see everybody just move so smoothly." The teams come together seamlessly—kind of like Legos.

### Mayor Lurie Kicks Off Summer 2025 Opportunities For All, Black 2 San Francisco Programs

Mayor Daniel Lurie kicked off the Opportunities for All (OFA) and Black 2 San Francisco (B2SF) summer internship initiatives, opening doors to new hands-on career development experiences for young people in the city and driving economic recovery by investing in future generations. Administered by the San Francisco Human Rights Commission (HRC), the programs leverage partnerships with major city employers to give young people the tools to find and succeed in good-paying jobs.

The kickoff of the programs builds on Mayor Lurie's work to drive San Francisco's recovery by investing in the city's young people. In his proposed budget, Mayor Lurie protected important support for legal services in the city's immigrant community, LGBTQ+ community, and families. Earlier this month, he celebrated the opening of a community resource center that will provide services preparing young people for higher education and employment, and support community-based services, driving the city's economic recovery.

"San Francisco needs young people—your energy, your creativity, your heart—to help us build a city that works for everyone and that's ready for the challenges that lie ahead," said Mayor Lurie. "Opportunities for All and Black to SF are giving young people the chance to build the skills, connections, and experiences that will shape them into the next generation of San Francisco's leaders."

Since 2019, OFA has placed nearly 15,000 interns in meaningful summer internship assignments across public, private, and nonprofit sectors in San Francisco and this summer nearly 2,000 students have been placed. Interns aged 13 to 24 are placed in cohorts and based on their interests, matched, and assigned to work at least 20 hours per week at partner sites including Accenture and other corporate locations, Code Tenderloin and other community-based organizations, and a variety of city and county of San Francisco departments and agencies.

Now in its second summer, B2SF will welcome 70 participants to live, work, and learn in the city. Many B2SF interns are undergraduate students at historically Black colleges and universities and are making critical connections to San Francisco's economy and culture.

"We know what a crucial responsibility it is to open doors and create pathways for our young people," said Mawuli Tugbenyoh, HRC Acting Executive Director. "Significant and impactful exposure to a variety of fields, and to mentors in industry areas where they have an interest, is something every teen and young person in San Francisco should have access to, regardless of their home neighborhood or family income. And now, as we welcome the second summer cohort of B2SF interns, it demonstrates our ability to create opportunities for the next generation of the city's workforce. I am grateful to all the staff and placement partners for their hard work on this."

Both initiatives are public-private partnerships, drawing from public city funds, private philanthropic dollars, and nonprofit engagement support, as well as the state Youth Jobs Corps. Anchor partner Japanese Community Youth Council, a community-based youth development organization in the Western Addition, supports with managing all intern applications and materials.

Initiative fellows serve as peer leaders for both OFA and B2SF. Fellows are primarily past participants who offer their experience and perspective to current interns. All participants have access to training and professional development opportunities, including around financial literacy and career networking.

"When Opportunities for All was launched, the aim was to provide every young person who applied with quality work experience—a chance for actual career development that is so often out of reach for teens and youth in the city who do not have the connections or family resources that their peers might enjoy," said District 10 Supervisor Shamann Walton. "OFA, and now Black to San Francisco as well, represent a chance for exposure and real advancement for so many, and are an example of meaningful youth development that works for all involved. I am glad these initiatives have been given the support needed to continue."

"As an alumna of this program, Opportunities for All is very close to my heart," said Kahmarii Jones-White, HRC OFA Payroll Analyst and former OFA participant. "Opportunities for All, to me, means a chance for everyone to learn and to challenge themselves and each other. From my perspective, as a former participant for five summers and now as a staff member for two years at HRC, I am so thrilled to be supporting and advancing this work."

#### Creating Award Winning and Sustainable Wines

Fetzer Vineyards is not only popular for its affordable and palatable wines; the company has been a recognized role model for sustainability since it formalized its commitment to the environment in 1998.

Fetzer monitors every decision they make to ensure their carbon emissions create minimal impact. They employ numerous actions to maintain a green business that have helped to protect the environment, save money, and gain them a tremendous amount of recognition. Fetzer's vineyard has been recognized for a wide range of programs including hosting the wine industry's largest solar array, steering an effort to use innovative lightweight glass in wine bottles, a zero waste approach to waste management with significant waste reduction achievements, utilizing natural farm practices, and promoting energy and water conservation.

In 2006, Fetzer joined the Climate Action Reserve to voluntarily report and monitor their greenhouse gas emissions. Fetzer's vineyards are also certified through the California Certified Sustainable Wine growing program.



This graph shows the amount of waste that Fetzer Vineyards has diverted from landfills since 1990. Fetzer has seen over 95 percent in waste reduction since they began taking actions to limit the amount of trash they produce.



Fetzer's administration building is topped with a 40 kilo-wat solar panel array. This array provides the majority of the building's energy needs.

# **Small Business Highlight**





Quivira Vineyards and Winery, located in Sonoma County, believes they can make a positive impression on the land by using only organic and biodynamic farming practices. Biodynamic farming, simply put, is a "closed loop" agricultural philosophy

created to maintain crop health without added chemicals or external additions. The core of biodynamics is creating the healthiest soil and environment possible for Quivira's vineyards, compost, chicken coops and vegetable garden.

In addition, Quivira is committed to conserving energy and installed a 55 kW solar electric system, which supplies 100 percent of their energy use. The winery's guest houses and estates also feature solar panels, supplying the structures with 75 percent of



Quivira composts organic material from the vinevards in a 500-cubic vard compost pile. The compost is used to fertilize the vineyard, returning nutrients to the soil.

their energy use. Quivira also has drastically reduced water use at the winery and estate. A steam cleaning machine allows for winery equipment to be cleaned while using 98 percent less water than traditional methods. The steam cleaning method not only reduces water waste, but also the need for chemical detergents. To protect natural water sources, Quivira built low-fall dams and planted natural grasses to contain water runoff from the vineyard. Farm lanes were also moved 12-15 feet away from a natural creek to reduce chemical and agricultural pollution in the water stream.

Quivira is also a financial supporter of Trout Unlimited, a non-profit dedicated to protecting cold water fish and watersheds. The donations enable Trout Unlimited to protect cold water fish, like trout and salmon, restore and conserve natural water ways and host public awareness campaigns.

## Manuel Palos Sculpture Inc.

Manuel Palos Sculpture Inc. is a business specializing in sculptural art. The business creates and sells sculptures, crafted from various materials, which are then marketed and sold to art enthusiasts and stores like Restoration Hardware. The business is focused on producing high-quality, artistic sculptures.

Manuel Palos Sculpture is one of the leaders in architectural restoration and does custom work for Architects, Interior Designers, builders, contractors, and landscape designers across the country. His work can be found internationally from private commissions to major public placements including several projects for the City and County of SF including the restoration of the Palace of Fine Arts

Manuel Palos was born and raised in Mexico, influenced by the notable landmark structures

and architecture that surrounded him. Manuel honed the ancient skill of stone carving and sculpture by living and studying in Italy and becoming a master stone carver and sculptor. Over the last 10 years, he has added his daughter Alexandra to the business who also runs it with him.

He has become well-known for his many private and public commissions and notable projects across the nation. In addition to his work, he teaches stone carving in his San Francisco studio and holds stone carving and sculpture workshops in his studio in Puerto Vallarta

SBDC advisor David Mitroff, Ph.D. has played a pivotal role in helping Manuel Palos and his daughter Alexandra overcome various challenges through one-on-one consulting sessions. The challenges included negotiating contracts with retailers who were having difficulty, especially during COVID, securing new vendors of materials, designing outreach

programs to attract new clients and determining the best ways to retain and secure new employees. Through these personalized consultations, the business received targeted advice and strategies that have resulted in a remarkable increase in sales by \$150,000, reaching an annual sales figure of \$500,000. This growth also led to the creation of three new employee roles, which also means this highly skilled art continues to be taught to new apprentices.

The most important part of the technical assistance received by the owners, Manuel and Alexandra Palos, was the advice and guidance related to marketing and sales strategies, especially on how to price their unique sculptors and the type of restoration work they provide. This included mapping out the financial modeling, product release dates, and sales strategies for long-term growth. These strategies not only helped the business increase its top-line revenue but also

had a direct impact on its ability to create and maintain jobs. While other resources and services offered by the SBDC were also valuable, the increased sales and job creation resulting from improved marketing and sales were likely the most critical outcomes for Manuel Palos Sculpture Inc.

'Our sessions with our SBDC advisor David Mitroff over the last 3 years has helped us map out a clear strategic business growth plan, be accountable and have a person to share our vision with who understands us. We are artists first and David with his deep understanding of business taught us how to be in the business of art. Equally as important, he reduced the pressure of the business and made the business fun again, which allowed my father and I to grow closer together personally and professionally.
