2024 reporting by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics shows significant disparities in construction employees. 87.3 percent of those working in the industry are white and women represent only 11.2 percent. Hispanic workers represent 35.1 percent. Underrepresentation among Black and Asian professionals is even lower at 6.5 percent and 2.1 percent, respectively.

Many working in or considering pursuing these male- and non-Hispanic-dominated careers advocate for diversity and equality in construction, especially concerning fair hiring processes, overcoming gender and cultural biases, and distributing fair wages. Some unfortunate historical issues make this a difficult battle:

- Resistance to change
- A lack of diversity awareness

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California awards \$15 million to support economic growth and resilience in tribal communities across the state

Governor Newsom and the California Jobs First Council announced \$15 million in grants to 14 California Native American tribes, tribal coalitions, and tribally led organizations. The grants support projects aimed at spurring economic growth, providing job training, cultivating business development, protecting the environment, and conducting research and development.

"This \$15 million commitment recognizes that, since time immemorial, California tribes have been best aware of the opportunities and advantages of their regions and communities. California is proud to partner with tribes across the state to support good jobs and expand economic opportunity in a meaningful and lasting way, delivering on the promises we made years ago."

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- Kashia Band of Pomo Indians were awarded \$999,000 in order to conduct the pre-development activities necessary to establish the Kashia Aquaculture Center.
- Mechoopda Indian Tribe of Chico Rancheria was awarded \$999,000, to conduct the pre-development activities necessary to establish a Resilience Hub and Multi-Functional Community Center.
- Native Development Network was awarded \$776,000 to conduct research supporting the development of career pathways in the clean economy, healthcare, and high-tech sectors.
- Native First Lending was awarded \$1 million to develop a revolving loan fund for Native American businesses in Los Angeles County.
- Nevada City Rancheria Nisenan Tribe was awarded \$744,000 to support land restoration activities on two culturally significant historical sites.
- Owens Valley Career Development Center was awarded \$1.995 million to develop career pathways in the clean eco**nomy.**
- Pit River Tribe was awarded \$954,000 for a comprehensive land use assessment to identify locations for new businesses in industries such as tourism and outdoor recreation.
- Scotts Valley Energy Corporation was awarded \$1 million for a bioenergy production facility.

- Southern California Tribal Chairperson's Association was awarded \$933,000 to develop an Innovation Ecosystem to support small businesses in the clean economy sector.
- Table Mountain Rancheria was awarded \$950,000 to conduct pre-development activities for the TMR Healthcare Center.
- The Sierra Fund was awarded \$945,000, which will provide economic and workforce development planning support for two local Tribes.
- Tule River Economic Development Corporation was awarded \$1.6 million to develop career pathways and provide training in the clean economy sector.

"Each of these awards represents our efforts to invest in locally driven projects that will advance meaningful job creation, attraction, and access across California," said Dee Dee Myers, Senior Advisor to Governor Newsom and Director of GO-Biz and Stewart Knox, Secretary of Labor & Workforce Development. "The California Jobs First Council is honored to have the opportunity to invest in these 14 communities, and we look forward to working closely with our tribal nation partners to ensure the ongoing success of their projects."

Older Adults Outnumber Children in 11 States and Nearly Half of U.S. Counties

The U.S. population age 65 and older rose by 3.1% (to 61.2 million) while the population under age 18 decreased by 0.2% (to 73.1 million) from 2023 to 2024, according to the Vintage 2024 Population Estimates released today by the U.S. Census Bureau.

The data show the population continued to age, with the share of the population age 65 and older steadily increasing from 12.4% in 2004 to 18.0% in 2024, and the share of children declining from 25.0% to 21.5%.

Ongoing growth among the older population, coupled with persistent annual declines in the population under age 18 has reduced the size difference between these two age groups from just over 20 million in 2020 to just below 12 million in 2024. From 2020 to 2024, the older population grew by 13.0%, significantly outpacing the 1.4% growth of working-age adults (ages 18 to 64), while the number of children declined by 1.7%.

"Children still outnumber older adults in the United States, despite a decline in births this decade," said Lauren Bowers, chief of the Census Bureau's Population Estimates Branch. "However, the gap is narrowing as baby boomers continue to age into their retirement years. In fact, the number of states and counties where older adults outnumber children is on the rise, especially in sparsely populated areas."

As recently as 2020, there were just three states where older adults outnumbered children: Maine, Vermont, and Florida. By 2024, this number had increased to 11, with Delaware, Hawaii, Montana, New Hampshire, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, and West Virginia joining their ranks. Similarly, from 2020 to 2024, the number of U.S. metro areas with more older adults than children increased from 58 to 112. This represents nearly 30% of the nation's 387 metro areas. Additionally, in 2024, three metro areas with at least 1 million people (Cleveland, OH; Providence-Warwick, RI-MA; and Hartford-West Hartford-East Hartford, CT) had more older people than younger people for the first time.

In 2020, 31.3% (or 983) of the nation's 3,144 counties had more older adults than children. This figure increased to almost 45% (1,411 counties) in 2024. In both years, most of these counties had small populations and were located outside of metro and micro areas.

Other Highlights Age and Sex:

• In 2024, the U.S. median age reached a new record high of 39.1, up 0.1 years from 2023, and up 0.6 years from 38.5 in 2020.

- Regionally, the West (38.4) and South (38.8) had the lowest median ages in 2024; the Northeast had the highest (40.6), followed by the Midwest (39.3).
- Maine's population in 2024 was the oldest, with a median age of 44.8; Utah's was the youngest (32.4).
- The median age across all counties in 2024 ranged between 20.9 and 68.1; 74% (2,340 of 3,144) had a median age at or above the median age for the nation.
- Women outnumbered men by 3.4 million, making up 50.5% of the U.S. population in 2024.

groups. Hispanic or Latino populations are of any race unless otherwise specified.

- Between 2023 and 2024, the Asian population grew the fastest (4.2%), followed by the Hispanic or Latino population (2.9%).
- From 2023 to 2024, the Hispanic or Latino population increased by 1.9 million; this gain was larger than the change for all other race and ethnicity groups combined.
- The White population was the only population that dropped, declining 0.1% between

2023 and 2024.

- While the Hispanic or Latino share of the U.S. total population reached 20% for the first time in 2024, only nine states and 457 counties were at least 20% Hispanic.
- The Asian population experienced its largest gains in California, followed by Texas; however, Texas' annual growth rate (6.9%) was substantially faster than California's (2.7%).

Amor Backyard Farm Creates an Ecosystem for Small Farmers in Kern County

Evelyn Young Spath had completed the KIEH Incubator and walked away with insights on a path to complete her business plan, expanded financial literacy, a solid foundation on what is needed in the key areas of business to launch a business, among other impactful takeaways. Evelyn's initial goal was to provide a model for turning backyard lawns into vibrant food sources. She was going to be a model to teach independent micro farmers and create a Community Supported Agriculture system specifically for Black Farmers. But she was still learning what was needed to run a farm as a business and how to replicate it, particularly on a micro scale. She needed more ag science, planning, and thinking in seasons, profit / revenue / price point / margin for micro farming, and dealing with pests.

When KIEH offered an Accelerator, this gave her the opportunity to re-assess her business through a pragmatic lens. While becoming more pragmatic for her own business, Amor Backyard Farm, her heart was to share with other Black Farmers knowledge on being fully versed for the highest possible farming capacity. All the while, she had been growing her connections, becoming more involved in what small farms needed and specifically what Black Farmers were not able to access and other obstacles to success. She created the Kern County Black Farmers Association and ultimately the Kern County Black Farmers Market – a full ecosystem.

What was growing, her reputation and sphere of influence. Opportunities were opening for grants, contracts with the city, and the big win: an ask to participate in an agrivoltaic program.

At this point, Kern Inclusive Entrepreneurship Hub helped her expand her vision of how she could bridge all these facets: her growing expertise, her connections with local Black Farmers, the City of Bakersfield, and her personal farming business. Technical assistance in the form of business planning and strategy helped Evelyn refine her business plan to now look at an opportunity to impact a larger problem: creating a marketplace and buyers that didn't exist for micro and small farmers, creating an ecosystem of opportunity for micro and small farmers in Kern County. "If you grow it, we will buy it and sell it".

Director Kelly Bearden, California State Bakersfield University Small Business Development Center, said, "In a region dominated by medium, large, and very large agricultural businesses, small farmers in Kern County stand out as outliers. The applicant, Evelyn Young Spath, can significantly transform the landscape by providing in-depth technical assistance and guidance to potential small farms and farmers. This focus can lead to a greater community effort to produce value-added agriculture for even the smallest farmers. Throughout Kern County, valueadded agriculture is a key economic strategy and has been identified as an essential component for the county's progress moving forward. "

Her latest project: establish a centralized aggregation and distribution facility along with two satellite facilities in the Southern San Joaquin Valley to connect small-scale, sustainable local food producers with public institution buyers, primarily schools. This infrastructure project will develop 10 acres with cold storage, processing, and distribution capabilities to overcome critical supply chain barriers facing both local farmers and institutional buyers. She will prioritize sourcing from historically underserved producers including socially disadvantaged farmers, those operating on less than 500 acres, and those using organic or climate-smart practices. By providing aggregation, quality control, processing, and consistent distribution channels, this project enables small producers to access larger markets while helping public institutions meet farm-to-school procurement goals and nutrition standards.
