The Biggest Sporting Venues Taking Shape

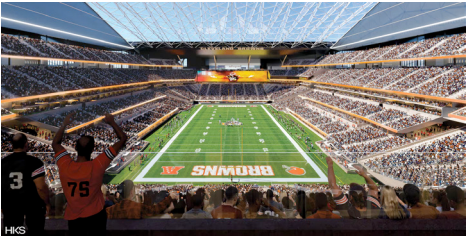
The FIFA World Cup has put several large venues across the country on display. If stadiums and arenas are in your market, this is a good time to be paying attention to what’s in the pipeline.

1. Huntington Bank Stadium

The new facility will feature the largest concourse in the NFL and the shortest average distance from seats to field.

California nearly triples internet infrastructure

Governor Gavin Newsom today announced that California has nearly tripled the operational reach of the state’s Middle-Mile Broadband Network, the state-built network that brings fast, reliable, and affordable internet to communities that don’t have it. The new 1,250-mile operational segment is now ready to connect, bringing the network closer to becoming the largest of its kind in the country. Under Governor Newsom’s leadership, California is building the infrastructure needed to bring affordable high-speed internet to all Californian

California is building the nation’s largest public broadband network to deliver fast, reliable, and affordable internet to every pocket of our state. Internet isn’t a luxury; it’s how people get an education, how families see a doctor, and how people find good-paying jobs. Closing the digital divide means ensuring every Californian has the tools to succeed in today’s connected economy.

The 1,250-mile operational segment forms a continuous backbone that spans from San Jose south along the Central Coast to Los Angeles, east to Barstow, and north through an interconnection point before extending up to Modoc County in the state’s far northeast corner. The milestone builds on momentum from April, when the Governor announced that the Bishop Paiute Tribe became the network’s first customer, connected along the Highway 395 segment.

This expansion proves that California’s Middle-Mile Broadband Network is open for business. It sends a clear market signal to the companies and communities building the last-mile — the final stretch of cable that reaches into homes and businesses — that the infrastructure they need is ready right now. That includes projects funded through the state’s Federal Funding Account (FFA) program, a \$2 billion grant program administered by the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) to fund “last-mile” broadband infrastructure projects in underserved communities, as well as commercial internet providers.

“Reaching 1,250 operational miles is proof that California’s Middle-Mile Broadband Network

has moved from construction to commerce,” said California State Chief Information Officer and California Department of Technology Director Chris Given. “Every mile we bring online is a mile that the Federal Funding Account grantees and commercial providers can build on right now to deliver affordable, reliable internet to the communities that need it most. This network is open for business, and we are ready to connect California.”

“This achievement helps to bring fast, reliable, affordable internet service to all Californians. I am grateful for the continued partnership with the Department of Technology and Caltrans as we fulfill the state’s commitment to Broadband for All with these investments in transformational infrastructure,” said California Public Utilities Commission President John Reynolds.

California closing the digital divide

The Middle-Mile Broadband Initiative ensures that California has a resilient, open-access broadband network connecting communities to high-speed internet for generations to come. Once complete, last-mile projects will take in-

ternet connections from middle-mile lines to homes, schools, businesses, and more.

The middle-mile itself is the physical fiber line infrastructure needed for internet access, capable of carrying large amounts of data at high speeds over long distances. This will bring internet access to previously underserved communities, connecting families to their work, schools, doctors, and friends by way of their devices.

The initiative has now completed or begun active construction on 5,549 miles of the network. That’s nearly 70% of the 8,100-mile system.

This network is a key part of Governor Newsom’s Build More, Faster — For All infrastructure agenda, which has driven historic investments in broadband that will benefit all Californians for generations. You can find more projects supporting your communities at build.ca.gov.

Building the backbone of digital access

In July 2021, Governor Newsom signed Senate Bill 156 (SB 156) into law, creating an open-access middle-mile network to bring equitable

Senator Dave Cortese supports contractors, workers, and infrastructure with Senate Bill 33.

California State Senator Dave Cortese (D-San Jose) today announced that Governor Gavin Newsom has signed his Senate Bill 33 (SB 33) into law, making permanent California’s successful public works claims-resolution process and ensuring contractors are paid fairly and promptly for work performed on public projects.

By eliminating the January 1, 2027 sunset date for Public Contracts, SB 33 preserves a proven framework that has reduced costly litigation, prevented project delays, and improved delivery of critical infrastructure projects throughout California for nearly a decade.

Under existing law, contractors performing extra or change-order work on public projects often carry substantial financial risk while awaiting payment, despite having to cover labor costs, employee benefits, materials, and overhead expenses in real time. Prior to the creation of the claims-resolution process in 2016, some contractors waited months or even years to be paid for completed work, creating financial hardship for businesses and workers alike.

The existing claims-resolution process requires public agencies to respond to contractor claims within specified timelines, pay portions of claims they acknowledge are owed, and participate in structured dispute-resolution efforts including meet-and-confer discussions and nonbinding mediation for contested claims.

Supporters of SB 33 include the National Electrical Contractors Association and United Contractors, along with a broad coalition of construction industry and labor organizations representing contractors and skilled trades workers throughout California.

“California’s union electrical contractors applaud Senator Cortese for his leadership in championing SB 33. By permanently extending California’s public works claims-resolution process, this legislation provides certainty that contractors performing critical infrastructure projects will continue to have access to a fair, transparent, and efficient process for resolving payment disputes. Prompt payment keeps skilled workers on the job, projects on schedule, and taxpayer-funded infrastructure moving forward. We appreciate Senator Cortese’s commitment to policies that strengthen California’s construction industry while protecting the public interest,” said Fred Neubauer, District 9 Vice President with National Electrical Contractors Association (NECA).

2. New South Philadelphia Arena

\$1.5 billion | South Philadelphia, PA | Philadelphia Flyers, Philadelphia 76ers

The Flyers and 76ers are leaving their separate arrangements and sharing a new \$1.5 billion arena in the South Philadelphia Sports Complex, steps from Citizens Bank Park and Lincoln Financial Field. A future WNBA franchise is also slated to call it home. Eventually, this new arena is planned to replace the Xfinity Mobile Arena. The arena proposal was approved in late 2024 and opening is planned for 2030.

3. EverBank Stadium

\$1.4 billion | Jacksonville, FL | Jacksonville Jaguars

The EverBank Stadium, home of the Jacksonville Jaguars, is undergoing a large-scale transformation. Plans include expanding capacity from 63,000 to 70,000, quadrupling concourse width, and enclosing the entire structure in a translucent ViewScope canopy, engineered to cut heat by 70%. The team will continue playing home games throughout 2026 while exterior construction takes shape and make a temporary move during 2027 as interior work picks up. Completion is targeted for 2028.

4. Continental Coliseum

\$900 million | Oklahoma City, OK | Oklahoma City Thunder



Progress is already underway for the new home of the Oklahoma City Thunder in downtown Oklahoma City. Voters approved a one-cent sales tax by a 71% margin to finance this publicly owned and funded project. The 750,000-square-foot arena is designed for optimized sightlines, intimate seating, a 360-degree glass curtain wall, and a street-level fan activation zone called Thunder Alley. The Thunder have committed to remaining in Oklahoma City through 2053. Estimated completion for the arena is slated for late summer 2028.

5. Chicago Fire FC Stadium at The 78

\$650 million | Chicago, IL | Chicago Fire FC



Chicago’s first soccer-specific stadium in 30 years got City Council approval in the fall of 2025 and is targeting a construction start ahead of the 2028 MLS season.
