7 Things to Know About the Sustainable Future of Construction

There have been warning signs in the construction sector for years. The industry creates high levels of physical and digital waste, with 10-15% of materials wasted on every build.

Construction and the built environment account for nearly 38% of all energy-related carbon emissions around the world. And what's more, we're battling low productivity and a growing skills shortage. From an environmental, social and economic perspective, it's simply not sustainable.

But crucially, there's greater appetite for change in construction than ever before. At two events, London Build and the Festival of Digital Construction, panellists came together to discuss the opportunities for change in the industry.

7 key takeaways on the future of sustainability in construction

1. Incremental change won't cut it: we need a paradigm shift

The construction industry has been doing the same things for a long time. According to Dale Sinclair, Director of Innovation, EMEA at AE-COM, you have to look to the beginning of the twentieth century for the last major innovations like steel and drywall. "If you think about the Empire State Building and the speed it was constructed, that would still be impressive today," he noted.

Many of the recent improvements in the industry have focused on optimising traditional approaches – but with pressures like the climate crisis and population growth, we need more radical change. As Jaimie Johnson, Head of Global Systems at Bryden Wood put it, "We can't use traditional techniques to meet population growth. We'll kill the planet before we house the planet."

The construction industry will have a huge impact on the future of the build environment, affecting the lives of people hundreds of years

Mayor London Breed Announces \$4.5 Million in Grants to Over 560 Small Businesses

Small Business Relief Grants will award businesses with grants between \$5,000 and \$25,000 to help alleviate the impact of Stay at Home orders due to COVID-19

Mayor London N. Breed and the Office of Economic and Workforce Development today announced over \$4.5 million in financial relief for more than 560 small businesses in the latest round of small business grants. The Small Business Relief Grants are expected to award over 700 businesses once the application review is complete. Funds can be used for rent relief, payroll, equipment, utilities and bills, and any other expenses needed to stay open, operate their business, and continue to serve the community.

"From the beginning of this pandemic, when we had to lock down the City to keep our residents safe, we knew that it was going to have a major impact on our small businesses and their employees," said Mayor Breed. "That's why we've been doing everything we can as a city, from waiving millions in fees to passing important legislation like Prop H and Shared Spaces. Our small businesses are going to lead our econom-

The goal of the San Francisco Small Business Relief Fund is to provide immediate relief to help stabilize small business operations by offering grants of \$5,000, \$10,000, or \$25,000. The fund targets anchor small businesses that contribute to the culture and vibrancy of neighborhood commercial corridors such as the Bayview, Central Market/Tenderloin, Chinatown, Excelsior, Lower Fillmore, Mission or in cultural districts including Japantown, Calle 24, SoMa Pilipinas, Transgender, Leather & LGBTQ, Castro LGBTQ, American Indian, and African American Arts and Cultural. It also supports small businesses operated by people of color, women, long-standing businesses and storefronts, those most impacted by Stav at Home orders, and those excluded from or otherwise unable to access state and federal programs.

Over 50% of the grant recipients so far are women-owned, and nearly 80% are minority-owned small businesses that operate on thin margins. The program received a total of 843 applications and expects to award a total of over 700 businesses once the review process is complete.

"Delivering relief to our small businesses offers a lifeline essential to San Francisco's recovery and infuses funding right into the hearts of our neighborhoods, said Assessor-Recorder Joaquín Torres. "After so much sacrifice to help protect public health, these grants our helping our small businesses bring jobs back into the community, vitality to our neighborhoods and with it the hope that better days are ahead. With this needed support, small businesses can drive the recovery we all want to see and make our city shine."

"Small businesses are the lifeblood of San Francisco neighborhoods and employ hundreds of thousands of workers. For immigrants, women, people of color and working-class San Franciscans, running a small business is often an alternative to minimum wage jobs and can be a unique path to building wealth for their families and their communities. These grants will help small businesses get back on their feet and keep our neighborhood commercial corridors active and vibrant," said Supervisor Hillary Ronen.

3 Things Small Construction Businesses Need to Know About Construction Insurance

If you own a construction business, you need construction insurance. Every small business needs insurance, but construction companies have unique risks that usually aren't covered by general liability business insurance.

Construction companies still need to carry general liability business insurance, which covers medical and legal fees if someone is injured at your place of business or if someone sues you. But most construction companies also need additional insurance to meet their unique needs.

Here are three important things you need to know about construction insurance.

1. Liability Insurance Can Fall Short

Your traditional general liability business insurance covers your place of business, such as your office or warehouse, and it covers the risk of bodily injury or property damage there. But it doesn't cover any contractor property or any equipment at work sites.

Imagine that you have a portable storage unit full of power tools and other equipment on a job site. Over a holiday weekend, when no one's working at the job site, someone breaks into the storage unit and steals everything inside. By the time your crew returns to the job site, much of your equipment has been scattered at pawn shops around the city — and some it's probably already been resold. Unfortunately, because the theft didn't occur at your primary place of business, the stolen equipment isn't covered by your general liability insurance.

Imagine, now, that your company has almost completed the construction of three homes in a new subdivision and that you have contracts to close on them in the coming weeks. A lightning storm causes a fire in the neighborhood, which spreads and severely damages all three of your properties. Because the fire didn't damage your primary place of business, your losses aren't covered by your general liability insurance.

To ensure that your construction business will be covered against these and similar risks, you'll need to purchase separate insurance designed for construction companies' needs.

2. Construction Insurance Types Vary

Different types of construction insurance meet different needs, such as jobs in progress, construction equipment and materials. The right type of insurance for your company will depend on the kind of work you do and where you perform it. Commercial construction insurance. If your construction company builds new homes or office buildings, it'll need commercial construction insurance to cover in-progress buildings, your business's property and any property in transit between various jobs. This coverage addresses the needs of complex construction operations with high property values and multiple locations.

Construction equipment insurance. Construction equipment insurance provides broad protection for graders, cranes, bulldozers, front-end loaders and other large construction equipment. If you're buying construction equipment insurance, check to see if there are any restrictions on boom length or weight of load; if there are, make sure that your equipment meets the coverage requirements. If your equipment insurance covers repairs or replacement, and it covers the expenses that can accompany the loss of equipment, such as renting substitute equipment, debris removal and pollutant cleanup.

Builder's risk insurance. Most construction companies need builder's risk insurance, which covers buildings under construction (including foundations) and temporary structures and materials that are on-site, in transit or in temporary storage. Builder's risk insurance protects your construction company's interest in the equipment, the value of your property and your materials when they're in use. Coverage continues until a project is completed and the owner has signed off on it. A builder's risk policy could also protect against risks such as theft, earthquake, government action, weather or water damage and mechanical breakdown. Some insurers let you tack on additional coverage for the costs associated with things like site preparation, re-erecting scaffolds and debris removal.

3. Insurance Can Be Bundled

Depending on what your construction company does, you might need more than one type of construction insurance. And the amount of coverage you need will depend on the value of your project or materials.

If you're a remodeling contractor or a deck builder and you work for homeowners at their homes, you might only need enough construction insurance to cover your tools and equipment, as the homeowner is responsible for insuring their property. But if your business owns the property where you're working and it owns heavy construction equipment, you might need a combination of construction insurance types to ensure that you're fully covered.

Mayor London Breed Announces \$4.5 Million in Grants to Over 560 Small Businesses

Mayor Breed led a supplemental appropriation that included this grant program, and a zero-interest loan program to provide small businesses with working capital to help offset losses resulting from the pandemic. In July, the San Francisco Small Business Recovery Loan Fund was launched with the California Rebuilding Fund, which leverages investments to maximize the available loans for small businesses.

Working with State-backed lending partners and local community-based partners, the City has now leveraged additional funding to offer small businesses zero-interest loans ranging up to \$100,000. Small businesses can apply online at www.CALoanFund.org. The program is being administered through the California Rebuilding Fund in partnership with KIVA and local Community Development Financial Institutions (CDFIs), including Main Street Launch, Mission Economic Development Agency, CDC Small Business Finance, Pacific Community Ventures, and the National Asian American Coalition.

"These funds will help me hire three more employees and extend my hours. During the pandemic I had to cut my hours because I didn't have employees and business was so slow," said Lamea Abuelrous, Owner of Temo's Café. "Now I have more foot traffic and my customers are asking me to stay open later. I have a lot of support from the community, I will also be remodeling my shop, painting, buying new tables and chairs."

"The Small Business Relief Fund has been a lifeline for many of our small businesses—providing urgent capital to keep them open and operating while also keeping workers on payroll," said Kate Sofis, Director of the Office of Economic and Workforce Development. "Our small businesses are not out of the woods, the need for additional financial relief extends beyond this pandemic. Through the leadership of Mayor Breed and the Board of the Supervisors, the Office of Economic and Workforce Development will continue to program additional investments and make available more grant dollars with our community partners for our small business community in the months ahead."

"The SF Relief Grant highlights the Mayor's ability to listen and respond to what small businesses on the ground were in desperate need of," said William Ortiz-Cartagena, San Francisco Small Business Commissioner. "The application process was simple therefore making the process equitable! This grant will allow our businesses in the most disadvantaged communities, that were hardest hit by the pandemic, live to fight another day. Gracias."

Since the beginning of the pandemic, San Francisco has provided immediate and ongoing support for small businesses, including making available more than \$52.8 million in grants and loans to support more than 3,000 small businesses, in addition to tens of millions of dollars in fee and tax deferrals, and assistance applying for state and federal funding. This includes legislation introduced and signed by Mayor Breed to waive \$5 million in fees and taxes for entertainment and nightlife venues and small restaurants.

Types of Business Loans

1. Term loans

A term loan is a common form of business financing. You get a lump sum of cash upfront, which you then repay with interest over a predetermined period.

Online lenders offer term loans up to \$1 million and can provide faster funding than banks that offer small-business loans.

Pros:

- Get cash upfront to invest in your business. Typically allow you to borrow a higher
- amount than other types of loans. Funding is fast if you use an online lender rather than a traditional bank; typically a few days to a week versus up to several months.

Cons:

May require a personal guarantee or collateral - an asset such as real estate or busi-

ness equipment that the lender can sell if you default.

Costs can vary: term loans from online lenders typically carry higher costs than those from traditional banks.

Best for:

- Businesses looking to expand.
- Borrowers who have good credit and a strong business and who don't want to wait long for funding.

2. SBA loans

The Small Business Administration guarantees these loans, which are offered by banks and other lenders. Repayment periods on SBA loans depend on how you plan to use the money. They range from seven years for working capital to 10 years for buying equipment and 25 years for real estate purchases.

Pros:

Some of the lowest rates on the market.

- You can borrow up to \$5 million.
- Long repayment terms.

Cons:

- Hard to qualify.
- Long and rigorous application process.

Best for:

Pros:

- Businesses looking to expand or refinance existing debts
- Strong-credit borrowers who can wait a long time for funding.

3. Business lines of credit

A business line of credit provides access to funds up to your credit limit, and you pay interest only on the money you've drawn. It can provide more flexibility than a term loan.

- Flexible way to borrow.
- Typically unsecured, so no collateral required. •

Cons:

May carry additional costs, such as maintenance fees and draw fees.

Strong revenue and credit required.

- Best for:
- Short-term financing needs, managing cash flow or handling unexpected expenses
- Seasonal businesses.

4. Equipment loans

Equipment loans help you buy equipment for your business, sometimes including semi truck financing. (Business auto loans are available for cars, vans and light trucks.) An equipment loan's term typically is matched up with the expected life span of the equipment, and the equipment serves as collateral for the loan. Rates will depend on the value of the equipment and the strength of your business.

Companies are facing very real commercial pressures to become more sustainable. Investors want to know that companies are dealing with the risk of climate change, by adapting their business models. There's greater public and government pressure, which may result in binding regulations.

And critically, owners are beginning to demand greater sustainability, from construction through to operations. Tom Blankendaal, Project Manager, Circular Economy at BAM, shared a story of working with a Dutch bank to create a more sustainable design. "We eventually redesigned the whole project with a trade-off matrix on different sustainability factors, such as energy usage, circularity and total cost of ownership. In the end, we made some very radical design decisions."

There are also commercial benefits. As Dr Bonahis Oko, Sustainability, Carbon and Environmental Lead at Bouyges Energy Services explained, companies should recognise this "carrot" as well as the "stick." "Sustainability measures often drive greater efficiency on projects: for example, reducing mistakes also reduces waste. It's important to look ahead too. Think of sustainability as a factor in the future of the business: an R&D investment rather than just an obligation to fulfil."

3. True sustainability accounts for the whole life of an asset, so adaptability matters

For a meaningful view of an asset's sustainability, owners have to consider its whole life emissions – which can open up new ways of thinking. As Dale at AECOM explained, "The construction of a building only accounts for 20% of its whole life costs. If you make it 20% more operationally efficient over its lifetime, you effectively get the building for free."

Adaptability is essential for maximising a building's usefulness, prompting a move to long life, loose fit assets. "The most sustainable building is the one that already exists," explained Az Jasat, Senior Industry Manager, Industrialised Construction, Autodesk.

Jaimie at Bryden Wood recommended we take inspiration from the Victorians, who built incredible overengineered brick buildings which have been converted to many uses over the years, from water stations to climbing walls to offices to flats. "Let's be the modern Victorians and create the kind of infrastructure that's superbly well-built for a 150-year lifecycle," he said.

4. Industrialised construction and design for manufacture and assembly (DFMA) will be critical

By applying manufacturing techniques to the built environment, industrialised construction and DFMA can increase the efficiency and reduce the emissions of projects. According to Az at Autodesk, "these two movements are our best chance of turning this ship around." Going one step further, some organisations are exploring the potential of platforms in construction: using consistent components and processes to construct a wide range of buildings, in a similar approach to furniture designs at IKEA.

Jaimie at Bryden Wood explained how the Construction Innovation Hub examined the UK's public sector construction pipeline across every department. The project found that 70% of the total pipeline could be constructed with the same structural kit of parts, the equivalent of £35bn of assets.

"More than half of the space in schools, hospitals and prisons isn't sector specific; it might be hallways, toilets, storage or bedrooms," he said. "If you use the same products and processes across these platforms, there's much more scope to optimise the components to make them as sustainable as possible." By using common components on a project called The Forge in London, Bryden Wood saved 20% of the embodied carbon on the build.

5. Both old and new materials have huge potential

Re-evaluating which materials are used in construction – and how – will be critical. As Frank Blande, Senior Sustainability Manager at Multiplex, highlighted, concrete and steel are the two biggest emitters in construction's carbon footprint.

Innovations in materials science could help to solve this issue, as could the renaissance of older building options. Tom at BAM advocated the potential of engineered wood, as a means of not only reducing carbon emissions but capturing them. The largest timber tower in the world was recently completed in Norway, reaching 18 storeys.

There are many elements that impact the sustainability of materials, so better data will also help teams to make more informed decisions about pay offs. Tools like the Embodied Carbon Calculator are already supporting client dialogues. Tony Saracino, Senior Sustainability Success Manager at Autodesk, advocated harmonised ISO standards for material profiles, to take the industry away from rule of thumb estimations.

Better data also creates the opportunity for materials passports, so that components can be reused; given that currently 54% of demolition materials go into landfill, this could have a substantial impact.

6. Data will be the force behind all of these changes

Creating a more sustainable industry must start with data. As Frank at Multiplex explained, "Clear and accurate data helps us to better understand where we actually are – our sustainability baseline. It's then possible to put data-driven strategies in place. As a sustainability team, we're working with other disciplines across the business to get accurate data in place and set minimum data requirements that cover the business, supply chain and collaborators."

Making this information available to project decision makers will help to improve design management, planning and quality. Data can also support closer collaboration with clients. AECOM is currently working with Autodesk on a viewer that simplifies information into a really intuitive interface: allowing everyone to get to grips with the data and understand the implications of the design.

Pros:

You own the equipment and build equity in it.
You can get competitive rates if you have strong credit and business finances.

Cons:

- You may have to come up with a down payment.
- Equipment can become outdated more quickly than the length of your financing.

Best for:

Businesses that want to own equipment outright.

5. Invoice factoring

Let's say your business has unpaid customer invoices, which are typically paid in 60 days. If you need cash now, you can get money for those unpaid invoices through invoice factoring.

You'd sell the invoices to a factoring company, which would be responsible for collecting from the customer when the invoice is due.

Pros

• Fast cash for your business.

Easier approval than traditional funding options.

Cons:

- Costly compared with other options.
- You lose control over the collection of your invoices.

Best for:

- Businesses with unpaid invoices that need fast cash.
- Businesses with reliable customers on long payment terms (30, 60 or 90 days).

6. Invoice financing

This is similar to invoice factoring, but instead of selling your unpaid invoices to a factoring company, you use the invoices as collateral to get a cash advance.

Pros:

- Fast cash.
- Your customers won't know their invoice is being financed.

Cons:

Costly compared with other options.

You're still responsible for collecting the invoice payment.

Best for:

- Businesses looking to turn unpaid invoices into fast cash.
- Businesses that want to maintain control over their invoices.

7. Merchant cash advances

You get a lump sum of cash upfront that you can use to finance your business.

Instead of making one fixed payment each month from a bank account as you would with a term loan, you make payments on a merchant cash advance either by withholding a percentage of your credit and debit card sales daily, or by fixed daily or weekly withdrawals from a bank account.

Pros:

- Fast cash.
- Unsecured financing.

Cons:

Some of the highest borrowing costs — up to 350% in some cases.

• Frequent repayments can create cash flow problems.

Best for:

- Businesses that have high and consistent credit card sales and can handle frequent repayments.
- Businesses that can't get financing anywhere else and can't wait for capital.

8. Personal loans

It is possible to use a personal loan for business purposes. It's an option for startups, as banks typically don't lend to businesses with no operating history.

Approval for these loans is based solely on your personal credit score, but you'll need good credit to qualify.

Pros:

Startups and newer businesses can qualify.
