California invests \$26 million to recruit more women into construction careers

In an effort to address statewide construction needs and build equity in the workforce, the Department of Industrial Relations (DIR) and its Division of Apprenticeship Standards (DAS) announced today that 25 construction apprenticeship programs have been awarded \$26 million in Equal Representation in Construction Apprenticeship (ERiCA) grants. This funding aims to increase access to construction careers for women and disadvantaged communities

What DAS Chief Adele Burnes said: "With this funding, we are addressing barriers that women face when trying to enter into construction careers. It has been empowering to see the ERiCA grants at work and watch apprentices successfully land jobs in the skilled trades and earn family-sustaining wages.'

Childcare, recruitment, and improving worksite culture

This new funding will support three core areas identified as needed to hire and retain a diverse workforce in the building trades:

- \$11.8 million will go towards offsetting the cost of childcare for pre-apprentices and apprentices. Flexible childcare funding has been identified as one of the primary barriers that women apprentices face in the construction industry. They often need to start working on a jobsite before many daycares
- \$7.2 million to support targeted recruitment efforts to improve gender representation and advance equity.
- **\$7 million** to improve worksite culture by providing mentoring and mental health support. This funding supports anti-harassment and anti-discrimination training for construction crews to create a more welcoming environment for all.

ERiCA awardees

This is the second round of ERiCA grant funding. During the first round, \$25 million in funds

Delta Conveyance Project accountability plan launched with \$200 million funding

The Newsom Administration is committed to supporting local communities that could be impacted during construction of the Delta Conveyance Project. To acknowledge and address those impacts, today the California Department of Water Resources (DWR) released an Accountability Action Plan which memorializes a series of actions that holds DWR accountable to the local community in a transparent, trackable and measurable way. In addition to targeted and strategic communication and support, the plan establishes a \$200 million Community Benefits Program for areas near the construction sites.

The goal of the plan is to avoid, minimize, or offset potential impacts of project construction to

residents, businesses, tribes, visitors to the Delta, and many others. The plan was developed, in part, to address concerns expressed in various community and public input forums during the planning process.

DWR's commitment to accountability and transparency shows that this project is ready to take the next steps and the Newsom Administration continues to call on the Legislature to act on the budget trailer bill to fast-track the Delta Conveyance Project.

The Delta Conveyance Project is the most consequential water infrastructure project in recent California history, and will help ensure that the state can continue to provide water for people, businesses, and farmland throughout the state. The Delta Conveyance Project will upgrade the

State Water Project, enabling California's water managers to capture and move more water during high-flow atmospheric rivers to better endure dry seasons. The tunnel, a modernization of the infrastructure system that delivers water to millions of people, would improve California's ability to take advantage of intense periods of rain and excess flows in the Sacramento River.

The process to begin construction of the current Delta Conveyance Project began in 2019 when Governor Newsom withdrew the previous "Water Fix" twin tunnels project and began a new environmental process to study a single-tunnel proposal. As in previous iterations of Delta convevance, requirements for environmental analysis, public review and comment under CEQA and other permitting processes were completed, including extensive public outreach and more than 7,000 comments and responses.

DWR's Accountability Action Plan follows best practices for how to ensure the local community can productively communicate with project representatives and monitor community commitments throughout the construction

With public transparency being its most impormitments made and aims to foster assurance and trust among interested parties that DWR's intent is comprehensive, earnest and binding.

Protecting Delta communities

The Delta Conveyance Accountability Action Plan has five key components:

Ombudsman Office: The Ombudsman Office will provide for a single point of contact to help ensure that construction-related concerns or grievances are efficiently and fairly addressed and project transparency is sustained.

Regulatory Mitigation: The Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program and other regulatory processes identify measures, commitments and best practices intended to avoid, minimize or offset potential environmental impacts within the project area.

Community Benefits Program: The Community Benefits Program—with a dedicated \$200 million fund-will seek to deliver tangible, lasting and measurable benefits to communities nearest to, and most affected by, project construction activities

Community Advisory Groups: One or more community advisory groups will engage community members in decision-making related to various items.

California could save \$225 million a year by letting state employees work remote

Gov. Gavin Newsom appears to have arbitrarily ordered workers back to the office without using specific rationale such as data on worker productivity, according to a newly released report from the California state auditor's office.

The audit, which state legislators requested in May 2024 after the governor first ordered workers back to the office two days per week after they had been sent to work remotely during the COVID-19 lockdown, found that Newsom's office failed to gather important information about departments' office space needs and costs and did not use any data about state workers' productivity to justify its in-office mandate.

Earlier this year, Newsom signed a new executive order that upped the required in-office days from two to four, but he relented in a series of contracts his administration signed with public employee unions.

State Auditor Grant Parks concluded that California could save as much as \$225 million per year and reduce its office space by nearly a third if it sticks to having employees in the office two



days a week and working remotely three days a week

The governor's office also ignored survey findings from its own oversight agency, the Department of General Services, which had collected estimates from departments on how much office space they would need to bring workers back more often.

"In general, we determined that a one-size-fitsall approach to telework is counter to state policy and may limit opportunities for significant cost savings," Parks wrote.

Supporters of work-from-home cheered the report as further vindication for their claims that Newsom's return-to-office mandates were capricious, politically motivated decisions rather than a true effort to increase worker productivity.

Union leaders say flexible hybrid work policies can simultaneously save the state money and help achieve ambitious climate and emissions goals by reducing commuter traffic.

"This audit confirms what has been apparent for some time: Flexible telework benefits taxpayers, state government, and state employees," said Ted Toppin, executive director of the Professional Engineers in California Government, a union representing state engineers, in a statement Tuesday.

The audit recommended that state lawmakers require departments to identify positions that can successfully telework three days a week and offer such an option. It also instructed the state to develop guidance for departments to evaluate the effectiveness of their telework programs.

Tara Gallegos, a spokesperson for Newsom, said in a statement that the governor's office "respectfully disagrees" with the auditor's findings, which were based on "hypothetical theories and incomplete information."

"This audit on state telework is not a scientific study, nor does it paint a complete picture of the state workforce or the benefits of working in person," Gallegos wrote.

What's at stake

The Delta Conveyance Project would create much-needed and long-overdue improvements to the State Water Project, which provides water for 27 million people and 750,00 acres of farmland. It would allow the State Water Project to better capture high flows during storm events and move that water to where it's needed in the San Joaquin Valley, Southern California, Bay Area, and Central Coast. It would also protect against earthquake risk.

were disbursed to 19 programs.

In this round, 25 building trades organizations that work with programs to recruit, support, and retain workers are receiving funding. Awardee highlights include:

- Cerritos College received \$1.25 million in ERiCA funding, which will be used to support its field ironwork apprenticeship program, where women are learning how to reinforce concrete with steel and cables.
- Los Angeles and Orange Counties Building Trades Council Apprenticeship Readiness Fund received \$2.5 million for childcare, recruitment, and worksite culture. This nationally recognized program provides the skills and training needed to launch successful careers in a range of essential trades, including painting, plumbing, sheet metal works and more.
- San Diego Electrical Training Trust received \$700,000 in funding. Through this program, apprentices are obtaining handson experience in sustainable construction



projects and learning about electric vehicle infrastructure, as well as solar system design and installation.

Associated Builders and Contractors of Southern California received \$550,000 in funding. Over the next two years, the organization is striving to double the number of women enrolled in its pro-

grams through outreach efforts and strategic partnerships with flagship groups such as the National Association of Women in Construction.

The Construction Trades Workforce Initiative (CTWI) is a program that has demonstrated success and has been awarded \$2.4 million. Apprentices who graduate

from CTWI typically earn starting wages of \$75,000 or more per year.

How we got here

The state plans to invest \$180 billion in infrastructure over the next decade. Workforce development and apprenticeships are central to California's plan to meet infrastructure needs and large-scale development projects. Governor Gavin Newsom aims to serve 500,000 apprentices by 2029.

Expanding access to equitable building trades apprenticeships is outlined as a key strategy to advance apprenticeships in California, which is outlined by DAS and the Labor Workforce Development Agency's Five-Point Action Plan.

About the Division of Apprenticeship Standards

The Department of Industrial Relations' Division of Apprenticeship Standards consults with employers to develop a skilled workforce by establishing innovative apprenticeship programs that offer training, to create viable career pathways for Californians.

Green Cleaning

Norton's Green Cleaners is leading the way in alternative dry cleaning methods by reducing their chemical waste and installing energy efficient upgrades. Norton's Green Cleaners opened in 1971 as a dry cleaning service using the 'less than environmentally-friendly' perchlorethylene (chlorinated) solvent for over twenty years. In 2005, Norton's made the change to 100 percent professional wet cleaning, thereby eliminating all chemical waste, as well as expensive and inefficient equipment. Since the switch, Norton's has eliminated the need for a 10 ton chiller that is typically used in dry cleaning services, reducing their electricity bill as well as their carbon footprint.

In order to promote sustainability with their customers, Norton's Green Cleaners started a hanger recycling program where clients can return their hangers for reuse. This program has cut their hanger replacement cost by 30 percent. Biodegradable plastic garment bags are also distributed to clients upon request, promoting a healthy relationship with the environment. Norton's also encourages clients to purchase and $% \left(1\right) =\left(1\right) \left(1\right$ reuse cloth garment bags. Approximately 25 percent of their clients are now using cloth garment bags, and over the next year Norton's Green Cleaners has set a goal to have 75 percent of their clients make the

Building improvements have also helped Norton's to conserve energy. The windows are covered with a sun and heat blocking film, available through a Southern California Edison energy efficiency program. All steam traps have been replaced to eliminate leaks and energy waste within the building. In addition, Norton's Green Cleaners has also replaced the standard fluorescent lighting with T-10 light bulbs to improve energy efficiency.

Green Building Council. The firm's new office building in Pasadena. California serves as a model of sustainable design and has inspired visitors to incorporate green building principles into their own


Sapphos Environmental, Inc. strives to be a leader in environmental policy by setting high goals. These policies are reflected in the firm's efforts to reduce carbon footprints through selection of the office location, choosing low-flow water fixtures, reusing existing structural materials for building reconstruction, and installing ENERGY STAR® qualified appliances and timed light fixtures to enhance energy efficiency.

Early in the design of its own office building. Sapphos Environmental, Inc. decided to make water efficiency their priority. Throughout the design phase of the project, Sapphos Environmental, Inc. sought to identify low-flow or water-free fixtures that would greatly reduce the use of potable water.

Turning Paint into Purpose with B AWESUM

When life threw its toughest challenges at Melanie Glass, she turned inward—and then to art. As a Creative and Mixed Media Abstract Artist, Melanie found more than just expression in paint; she found healing, clarity, and resilience. Art became her lifeline and her launchpad.

After relocating from Pennsylvania to California for her Master's in Art Therapy, Melanie sought to share her creations with the community. A letter to the Fresno Arts Council landed her an offer to present work outdoors at River Park Shopping Center. She declined—not because she lacked enthusiasm, but because her art was bold and larger than life. River Park saw her vision and offered a vacant retail space instead. Melanie accepted with passion, invited three other artists to join her, and opened the doors to B AWESUM.

What started as a pop-up exhibition blossomed into a powerhouse of creativity. Over five years and eight transformed venues, B AWESUM evolved into a thriving gallery and arts hub at the River Park's Art Groove Gallery and Event Centers #1 & #2. Melanie now leads a collective of
