

Mayor Bass Announces
More Than \$70 Million in
LA Waterfront Improvements

Mayor Karen Bass announced that her LA Harbor Commissioners have approved \$66.5 million in funding to expand road infrastructure and create new pedestrian walkways along the LA Waterfront, which will be the host site for sailing competitions during the upcoming 2028 Summer Olympics. Additionally, \$3.7 million was approved for construction of new public restrooms at Wilmington Waterfront Park.

“By improving our roads and expanding pedestrian spaces, we’re keeping our Harbor community safe and improving their quality of life by investing in the public spaces they use every day,” said **Mayor Bass**. “As Los Angeles prepares to welcome the world, we’re leveraging this moment to deliver lasting benefits for Angelenos. I want to thank our Harbor Commission for advancing this critical funding and for being a constant champion of our Harbor community.”

A portion of Harbor Boulevard will be reconfigured and expanded under the project. As one of the main thoroughfares along the LA Waterfront in San Pedro, the popular roadway will be expanded to two travel lanes in each direction from the San Pedro (SP) Slip to 22nd Street. A landscaped, scenic pedestrian walkway will also be added to this section as part of the project. Funding will additionally create new public restrooms and pedestrian walkways connecting Harbor Boulevard and Miner Street with direct access to the nearby trolley stop.

“These projects reflect our continued commitment to the LA Waterfront as our City prepares to welcome visitors from around the world for the 2028 Olympic and Paralympic Games,” said **Port of Los Angeles Executive Director Gene Seroka**. “They will also enhance public access to West Harbor and our active, visitor-serving waterfront, creating lasting benefits for generations to come.”

The Port of Los Angeles is North America’s leading trade gateway and has ranked as the No. 1 container port in the U.S. for 26 consecutive years. In 2025, the Port generated \$301 billion in trade and handled 10.2 million container units, sustaining its top rank among U.S. ports.

TECHNOLOGY IN CONSTRUCTION

AI Is Reaching the Jobsite—Is Your Workforce Ready?

Contractors that take a thoughtful, workforce-focused approach to AI will be better positioned to handle ongoing industry challenges.

As construction leaders are being tasked to do more with less, artificial intelligence tools have started to show up in estimating, scheduling, safety documentation and back-office operations. And while some contractors are already experimenting independently, the greater opportunity lies in implementing AI into the construction workforce in a way that supports crews in the field and improves how efficiently projects run.

Generative AI is quickly becoming part of the modern toolbelt, with workers using it to draft invoices, respond to customer questions and troubleshoot technical issues on the job. The use varies by role as well: Estimators might use AI to analyze historical cost data, while project managers could summarize daily reports and spot potential schedule risks. According to ADP Research's Today at Work, 20% of workers in construction and related trades report using AI daily, with another 29% using it weekly.

With AI adoption growing organically across the construction industry, the question is no longer when the technology may arrive, but whether employers are equipped to handle the shift thoughtfully.

Keep People at the Center

The skilled trades run on experience and judgment, and AI works best when able to support those strengths. Positioning it as a tool that helps augment the work contractors are able to do rather than a replacement is the first step in encouraging adoption. For example, estimators can use it to surface cost trends for clients more quickly, which can improve their overall productivity and time to complete various tasks.

Keeping a human in the loop can also help avoid costly mistakes. AI-generated outputs still require a review, especially when dealing with safety requirements, contract terms or cost projections. Maintaining human involvement is essential to providing a personal experience when interacting with clients and potential new hires. Generally, when employees see that technology is there to assist rather than replace them, they are far more likely to embrace it.

Communicate Early and Often

Uncertainty can be one of the biggest barriers to adopting new technology. When workers don't know how AI will be used, they may assume it affects their job security. According to ADP Research, only 22% of workers are confident their job is safe from elimination. Leaders should prioritize transparency when communicating with employees, taking time explain what tools are being introduced, what problems they solve and how their day-to-day responsibilities may change as a result.

These conversations don't need to be long either. Short demos during team meetings, toolbox talks or supervisor check-ins can help get the conversation started. Showing how AI can reduce the administrative burden or help prevent scheduling conflicts gives employees a concrete and relatable reason to engage with the technology. That message should reach both office staff and field leaders, including foremen and superintendents who influence day-to-day adoption.

Communicating job security and maintaining transparency are also important parts of that

message. Workers who feel safe in their jobs are six times more likely to be fully engaged, 6.3 times more likely to be motivated and committed, and 3.3 times more likely to say they are highly productive.

Invest in Practical Training

According to ADP Research, only 18% of workers feel strongly that their employer is investing in the skills they need for the future. When it comes to AI, employees are looking to their organizations for practical guidance on how to apply the technology to their existing work. Frequent, short and focused training sessions can be enough to help them build up technological confidence.

Construction's multigenerational workforce creates a natural opportunity as well. With five generations at work, younger employees often arrive comfortable with AI-enabled tools, while more experienced workers bring jobsite knowledge and judgment. Pairing them for reciprocal mentorship opportunities can help both groups learn from each other, strengthening organizational collaboration.

Skills development should also be broadly accessible across the organization. Online learning platforms can provide up-to-date information on the latest safety and compliance requirements while providing essential training on topics like equipment operation and project management for workers of all ages and career stages.

Reduce Administrative Burden

Managing documentation, compliance reporting and time-tracking can consume significant bandwidth for contractors. The teams who manage these core business functions are also looking to free up time to innovate with ADP's latest Potential of Payroll report finding that 37% of payroll teams are actively scoping out ways to automate administrative workflows using AI. One of the strongest use-cases for AI tools is the ability to free teams to focus less on manual processing and more on higher-value work.

Regulatory complexity is also increasing. Some states have introduced rules governing how AI is used in hiring and employment decisions. Illinois, for example, requires employers to no-

One notable thing about Sampada is that her work has focused on connecting design, cost, constructability, and execution into a single collaborative process rather than treating them as separate functions.

She is also preparing organizations for the next wave of modernization by aligning current processes with emerging platforms such as Autodesk Forma.

tify employees if AI is used in recruiting, hiring or promotions. Colorado has identified AI use in compensation and performance management as high risk, requiring risk management programs and regular assessments. Before implementation, be sure to review applicable state laws anywhere your organization may recruit talent and consult a legal team to limit the potential for non-compliance.

Ultimately, contractors working across jurisdictions need to stay informed. While introducing AI can help track these requirements, organizations still need clear internal policies and trained staff to ensure compliance.

Use Data to Support Safety and Performance

AI is also reaching the jobsite through sensors, wearables and connected equipment. These tools can identify patterns related to safety risks, equipment usage and environmental conditions,

which enable contractors to act before problems escalate. Equipment can also surface inefficient utilization, fatigue or high-risk areas, providing insights that help decrease risk on the jobsite and support a proactive approach to workplace safety.

Linking these findings to training can create a continuous improvement loop. If data shows repeated issues with a task, targeted training can be implemented quickly. This connects technology

directly to workforce development and supports safer, more efficient operations.

A Practical Path Forward

Although AI adoption in construction is accelerating, keeping people at the center, communicating clearly and offering practical training helps ensure that the technology continues to add value.
