New Survey Shows Construction Industry Poised for Recovery

More than six months into the COVID-19 crisis, the pandemic’s effects are still reverberating across the construction industry. Projects have been disrupted, scrapped or delayed, and safety is an even more dominant concern than in any other year.

Undeniably, the construction industry is still learning how to grapple with the changes and consequences of the pandemic. The findings of the new 2020 Autodesk and AGC of America Workforce Survey highlight the extent of the impact with insights on labor demand, innovation and technology adoption, and more. More positively, the report also reveals some bright spots and provides a glimpse into the construction industry’s path to recovery.

Here’s an overview of the survey’s key takeaways on how firms are doing in this unprecedented era, and what’s in store for construction in the year ahead.

Construction’s Recovery Still Remains on the Horizon

It’s still much too early to determine the long-term effects of the COVID-19 crisis on the construction industry, but the 2020 Autodesk and AGC of America Workforce Survey provides some insight into the short term impact of the pandemic. Namely, COVID-19 has mostly affected schedules and costs for construction projects, with 60% of projects being postponed or canceled, 44% of projects taking longer than expected to complete, and 32% of projects having costs run higher than projected.

There have also been implications for construction firms’ volume of business. As fewer projects

break ground, many in the industry believe it will take quite some time for business to return to 2019 levels. Specifically, 38% of firms surveyed said they believe it will take more than six months for their volume of business to reach a similar level relative to one year ago. Simultaneously, nearly one third (29%) of firms reported that their business volume has remained the same or greater than last year.

Regardless, the vast majority – 89% — of survey respondents indicated they think some form of government action is necessary to drive economic recovery, with only 11% saying that no additional legislation is needed. As for what kind of government intervention would be beneficial to the construction industry, 55% agreed a larger federal investment in all forms of public infrastructure and facilities would be helpful to their business.

Additionally, the majority of construction firms surveyed stated they would like government protections to help them deal with any legal action stemming from the safety concerns brought on by the COVID-19 pandemic, and ensure that their efforts to address these issues are acknowledged. Particularly, more than half (53%) believe a “safe harbor” set of government-issued protocols are needed to protect firms from tort or employment liability for failing to prevent a COVID-19 outbreak.

Labor Demand Remains Steady

One measure of the construction industry’s strength is the level of demand for labor. The new Autodesk and AGC survey found that the pandemic has had little impact on labor demand in recent months. One half of all firms surveyed

reported no change in headcount as a result of the COVID-19 crisis, and in fact, nearly a quarter (23%) of firms have added employees during the pandemic.

What’s more, 32% of firms reported no change in headcount year over year, and 27% said that headcount had increased in the same time period. Still, 41% of firms reported a decrease in headcount since 2019.

Other survey findings indicate that demand for labor in the industry remains strong. When it comes to employee furloughs, two in three (68%) construction firms said they didn’t have to take such measures, and 38% actually reported increasing base pay rates. And regarding openings for salaried employees, 56% of firms said they have no openings for these roles, and 28% reported having difficulty filling these positions. Specifically, 81% of respondents said that they are having trouble hiring project managers and supervisors.

More measurably, a majority of firms (52%) reported encountering difficulties in hiring hourly craft workers. But similar to salaried positions, 28% of firms said they have no open positions for hourly craft positions, up nearly 300% from last year, when only 9% of firms reported having no openings for hourly craft positions.

This year, firms reported the top positions they’re having a hard time filling included laborers (43%), carpenters (35%), and crane/heavy equipment operators (29%). But in spite of these difficulties, 38% of firms expect to add new employees in the next 12 months, a strong sign that labor demand will increase, and a recovery is in sight for the construction industry.

California's Health Care Workforce Should Be More Diverse, New Report Says

With California facing a serious shortage of health care workers as it copes with COVID-19, a new report from The Greenlining Institute looks at the barriers that keep young people of color out of the health field and what can be done to overcome those barriers.

The report, *Opening Pathways for Youth of Color: The Future of California's Health Workforce*, notes that while Black, Latino and Native American communities make up 62 percent of California's people, less than six percent of California physicians are Latino and just five percent are Black. In partnership with the Alameda County Health Pathway Partnership program, Greenlining conducted surveys

and a focus group with program alumni to get a picture of the challenges they face in pursuing health careers and what sorts of support would reduce those challenges.

"Young people of color want to work in the health care field, but too many obstacles get in their way," said report coauthor Christian Beauvoir. "The starkly higher rate of COVID-19 deaths for Black and Latino Californians reminds us how important it is to have a diverse health workforce that can deliver culturally competent care."

Among the report's key findings:

Challenges young people of color faced included

- Finances, including cost-prohibitive expenses associated with college applica-

tions and tuition,

- Transportation, with lengthy commutes and lack of money forcing many to use riskier transportation alternatives to cut costs, and
- Lack of support systems to help them get into and navigate higher education.

Key supportive factors participants cited included

- Exposure to a variety of health careers and professionals,
- Social support and mentorship, particularly for first-generation and low-income youth, and

- Financial assistance that eased the cost burden and reduced the need to choose between further education and holding a job to support themselves and their families.

The report concludes with a series of policy recommendations designed to reduce the barriers cited and increase availability of supports, including passage of Proposition 16 to allow the state to more effectively address racial disparities in education.

Domestic workers like me deserve health and safety protections like other workers

When the fires started burning here in Sonoma County recently, I thought back to 2018, the last time my city of Santa Rosa was in flames.

My family and I packed our bags and were ready to evacuate, just like we did last time. During the last round of fires, I came back to Santa Rosa as soon as the fires had been extinguished. I got hired to clean homes that had been evacuated by their owners, houses that were full of smoke and ash.

The owners wanted me to clean them up before they returned. I knew it might be dangerous, but after more than three weeks without work, my family needed the money.

I cleaned houses for two weeks, and I began to feel sick. My skin became dry and itchy, my eyes burned, and I got nose bleeds. I developed headaches and breathing problems that lasted for

months, even after I had stopped cleaning houses. My employers did not give me any protective equipment or explain the health hazards of the job.

As a leader of the California Domestic Workers Coalition, I have heard the stories of hundreds of other domestic workers like me, who have felt pressured to work in dangerous conditions, during the wildfires and now with COVID-19. I've heard from workers who were afraid they would lose their jobs if they asked their employers to provide them with protective equipment or non-toxic cleaning supplies.

We have good reason to be afraid. As domestic workers, we do not have the legal right to protective equipment, health or safety training or information about possible hazards on the job because we are not included in the basic occupational health and safety protections of Cal/OSHA. Every other kind of worker has the right to a healthy and safe work environment, and it's illegal to retaliate against them for exerting that right. But not us domestic workers.

That's why we joined forces with state Sen. Maria Elena Durazo, a Democrat from Los Angeles, to pass Senate Bill 1257, the Health and Safety for All Workers Act, which would end the exclusion of domestic workers from Cal/OSHA.

Over the last five months, homecare workers, nannies and house cleaners like me have been meeting with legislators, explaining what it's like to work without health and safety protections.

While there are other bills in the Legislature this year that protect domestic workers from retaliation for trying to protect their health during wildfires, SB 1257 is the only bill that finally gives us the same health and safety protections that all other workers have, whether we are working during a pandemic, a wildfire or facing the normal day to day hazards of our jobs.

On Aug. 30, SB 1257 the Health and Safety for All Workers Act made it through the Legislature and now, Gov. Gavin Newsom must decide if he will sign the bill into law or veto it.

I know the governor is busy dealing with the fires across the state and this pandemic, but I hope he thinks about those of us who will be called in to clean up in the wake of the fires. I'm worried about all of my fellow housecleaners who are out of work because of COVID-19 and are desperate for any income.

They will feel pressure to take any kind of job, no matter how dangerous, and some employers will take advantage of their desperation, just like they took advantage of mine. And sadly with climate change, these forest fires will most likely be more and more damaging each year.

I hope the governor sees that just like other workers, we too get sick and injured at work, we too have families who depend on us, and we too deserve protection.

How to Qualify for a Small-Business Loan in 5 Steps

Qualifying for a small-business loan is easier when you're prepared. Below is a to-do list that will help you get the cash you need to grow your business.

Whether you end up applying for an SBA loan through a bank or opt for an online small-business loan, you should be familiar with each lender's requirements. Knowing whether you meet its criteria before you apply will save you time and frustration.

Here are five steps to help you qualify for a small-business loan.

1. Build personal and business credit scores

Your personal credit score ranges from 300 to 850 (the higher, the better), and evaluates your ability to repay your personal debts, such as credit cards, car loans and a mortgage. You can get a free credit score on NerdWallet.

The FICO score, commonly used in lending decisions, is based on five factors: your payment history (35% of your score), the amounts owed on credit cards and other debt (30%), how long you've had credit (15%), types of credit in use (10%) and recent credit inquiries (10%). Small-business lenders require a personal credit score for loan applications because they want to see how you manage debt.

Paying your bills on time is crucial to building your score. But even if you pay your bills like clockwork, credit report errors could be damaging your score. One in 4 consumers identified damaging credit report errors, according to a 2012 study by the Federal Trade Commission. However, 4 out of 5 consumers who filed a dispute got their credit report modified, the study found. A follow-up study by the FTC found that 20% of those consumers saw a jump in their credit score after resolving errors.

You can get a copy of your credit reports for free once a year at AnnualCreditReport.com and dispute any inaccuracies you find through each of the credit bureaus' websites (Experian, Equifax and TransUnion).

Businesses that are more established and want to apply for bank loans can check out their business credit scores (which generally range from 0 to 100) at three business credit bureaus: Experian, Equifax and Dun & Bradstreet. Check out these five steps to building business credit, and if you see any mistakes on your reports, contact the bureaus.

More than likely, you'll need an excellent business credit score as well as good personal credit to qualify for an SBA loan or traditional loan from a bank; this will depend on the individual lender and business factors such as your revenue, cash flow and time in business. In general, online lenders look at personal credit scores but can be a bit more lenient when it comes to credit

SBA Elevates Women-Owned Small Businesses

Did you know that just three decades ago, women were still required to have a male cosigner on a loan?

While women business owners still face some barriers and challenges, tremendous inroads have been made in the struggle for equal rights and access to opportunity. The U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) is proud to have played a role in supporting women entrepreneurs and helping to enable women-owned businesses to grow at twice the rate of all businesses nationwide.

There are 9.9 million women-owned small businesses in the U.S., according to the SBA data. On some of the most important metrics – business starts, revenue growth, job creation, and the number of years in business – women entrepreneurs have either achieved parity or surpassed businesses owned by men. A 2019 report shows that 21% of employer businesses have majority female ownership, employing 9.4 million workers and amassing \$1.5 trillion in total annual receipts.

This year has been an extraordinarily challenging year for the small business sector, and women-owned businesses, in particular. The SBA, with the full backing and support of the White House and the Treasury Department, launched the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP), which has helped stabilize hundreds of thousands of women-owned businesses, helping put them on a path to recovery.

This August, we are marking Women's Suffrage Centennial and Women's Equality Day appropriately falls on the day the 19th Amendment became law, which granted women the right to vote a century ago. In honor of this monumental and historic progression toward equality, the SBA is highlighting women business owners who have benefitted from SBA mentorship and financial resources:

- **Superstition Meadery, LLC (Prescott, AZ):** Jennifer Herbert (CEO) and her husband Jeff Herbert (CSO) started their meadery in 2012 after Jeff took a mead-making course. With SBA financial assistance and counseling, they gradually grew their business to 20 employees and extended their reach into international markets. In 2019, Jennifer and Jeff were named SBA National Small Business Persons of the Year. When COVID-19 struck, Superstition Meadery applied for a PPP loan, which helped them cover payroll, rent, and more.
- **Omni Ecosystems (Chicago, IL):** Molly Meyer founded Omni Ecosystems, a vertically integrated green infrastructure company, in 2009.

New Survey Shows Construction Industry Poised for Recovery

Firms Are Increasingly Embracing Innovation

Despite the issues and setbacks brought on by the COVID-19 crisis, the construction industry remains firmly committed to moving forward through innovation and technological evolution, the 2020 survey shows. Increasingly, firms are embracing the integral roles of technology and data in the construction industry's future.

In particular, the industry is pursuing mobile and online training options in earnest, with 21% of firms increasing the use of learning programs that include a strong online/video component (e.g., classes held using Zoom, Microsoft Teams, and other platforms). Additionally, 19% of firms surveyed said that they had initiated or increased online or mobile training options, and 18% reported that they had initiated or increased

spending on training development. Just 3% of construction firms stated they had decreased or eliminated spending on this front.

Construction firms are also innovating to address the labor shortage, the survey found. In fact, nearly 40% of respondents said they are implementing new technology to alleviate the shortage, including tools to improve project management (16%), field collaboration (13%), estimating (13%), workforce management (10%), and bidding (9%) at their firms. By embracing digital solutions, firms are more likely to achieve both time and cost savings, mitigating the overall business impact of both the shortage and pandemic.

Indeed, as technology continues to improve efficiency in the construction industry, firms are beginning to see the benefits of a lean approach to projects. While only 6% of respondents said

they had increased or adopted lean construction methods, the survey also provided insight into the effectiveness of this model. Notably, firms that reported they had worked on High Lean Intensity (HLI) projects in the last year shared that a vast majority of recently completed projects were on or ahead of schedule (83%) and within or under budget (82%).

Construction's Strong Foundation Indicates a Bright Future

More than any particular finding, construction firms' collective response to the 2020 Autodesk and AGC of America Workforce Survey most emphatically highlights the industry's resiliency in a year of massive challenges. No doubt projects are being impacted in a significant way. But with the demand for labor remaining strong and more firms embracing technology and innovation to improve efficiency, this year's survey

indicates that the industry is likely to recover, despite the tremendous impact of the pandemic.

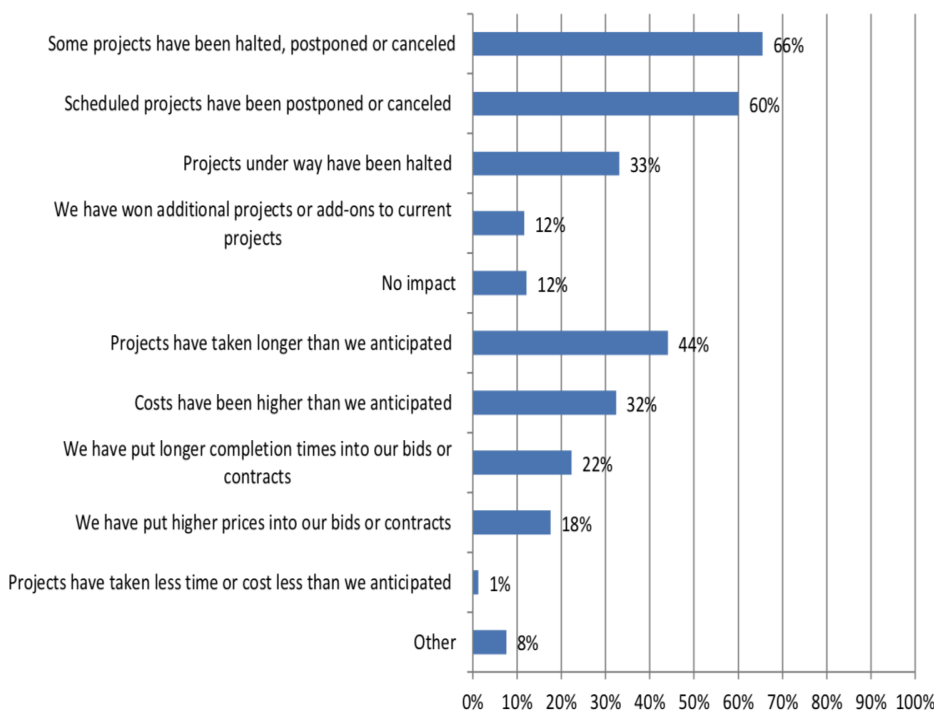
Still, recovery, like many other areas of construction industry growth in recent years, is dependent on firms' willingness to support their workforce, and embrace new technologies. The survey shows that this is happening in the construction industry in the form of online training and educational programs, as well as the use of technology and lean project approaches that are proving to be both efficient and cost effective.

The focus on innovation and resilient spirit evident in this year's survey responses suggest that the construction industry's future looks bright.

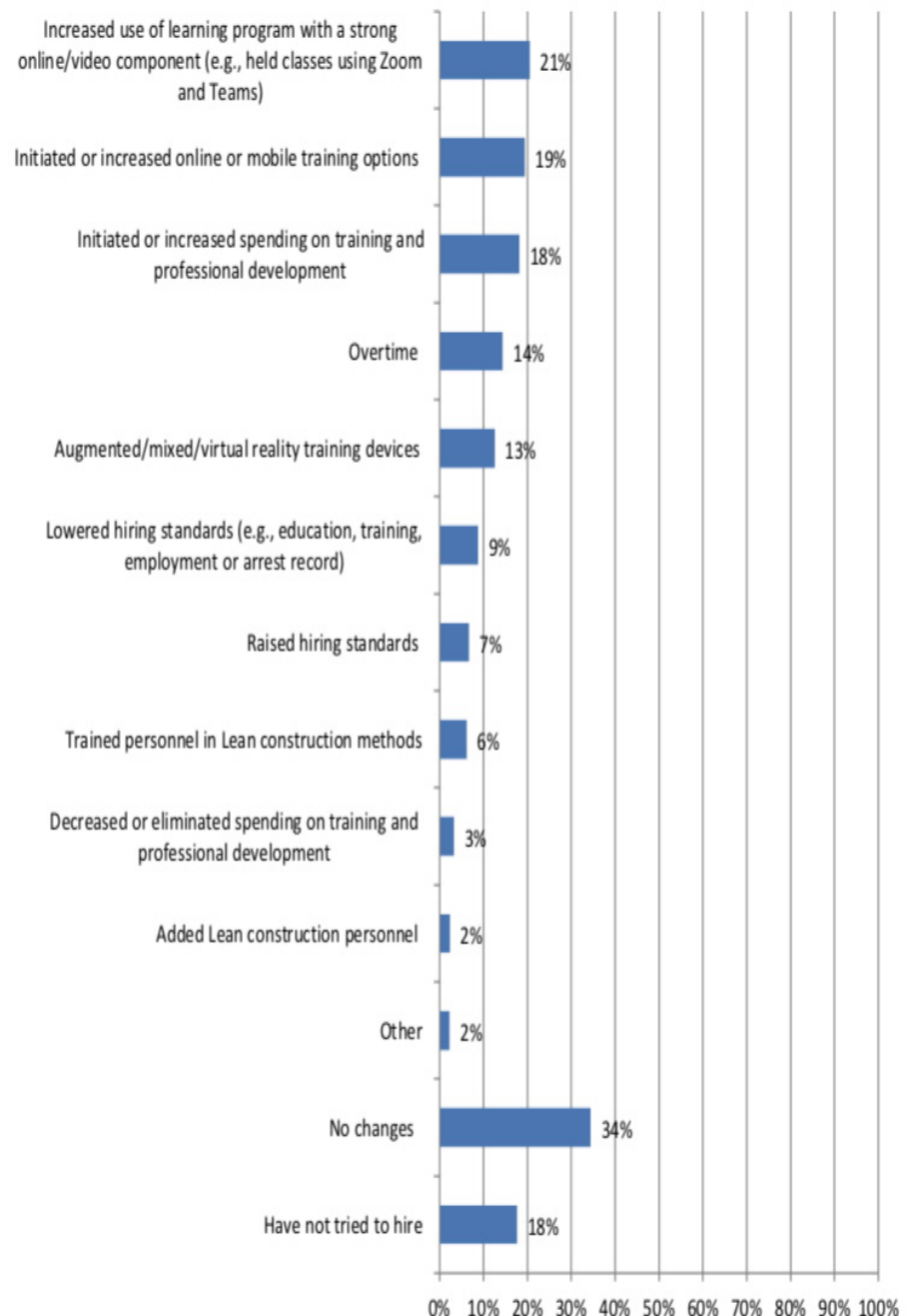

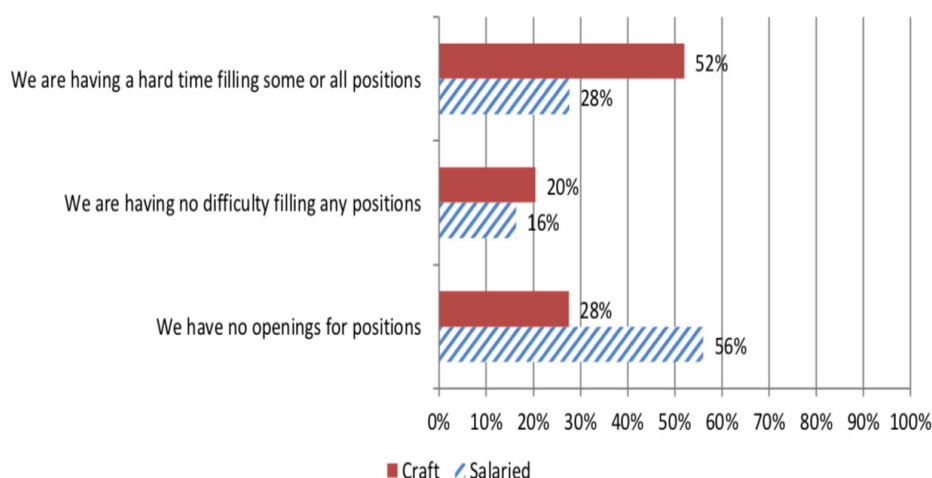
What impact, if any, has the pandemic had on your firm's projects? (Mark all that apply) Responses: 1,653

score requirements, as they place more emphasis on your business's cash flow and track record.

2. Know the lender's minimum qualifications and requirements

Meeting a lender's minimum qualifications and requirements will make you a stronger applicant. Some lenders may offer some flexibility if you're underperforming in one area but overperforming in another, but your best chance of getting approved is meeting or exceeding all of their minimums.

Borrowers typically need to meet minimum criteria related to credit scores, annual revenue and years in business. And lenders generally frown upon recent bankruptcies and other past delinquencies.

If you're looking for loans backed by the U.S. Small Business Administration, you have to meet additional SBA loan requirements. Your business must meet the SBA's size standards because these loans are only for small businesses. Borrowers typically need to have strong personal credit and business revenue, and must be current on all government loans with no past defaults. So if you've been late on a federal student loan or a government-backed mortgage, you'll be disqualified.

Your business must operate as a for-profit company and you can't be on the SBA's ineligible businesses list, which includes life insurance companies, financial businesses such as banks and real estate investing.

Qualifying for online lenders can be easier. Although online lenders typically underwrite loans based on traditional factors such as credit scores, annual revenue and cash flow, the loans carry less stringent requirements than SBA loans. For example, some online lenders may qualify you even without strong credit or an established business, and the lender may be more lenient with a recent bankruptcy. On the downside, this speed and ease of qualification typically comes with a more expensive loan.

Use NerdWallet's business loan calculator to figure out your monthly payment and compare options based on your credit score.

3. Gather financial and legal documents

Banks and other traditional lenders typically ask for a wide range of financial and legal documents during the application process. They can include:

- Personal and business income tax returns
- Balance sheet and income statement
- Personal and business bank statements
- A photo of your driver's license
- Commercial leases
- Business licenses
- Articles of incorporation
- A resume that shows relevant management or business experience
- Financial projections if you have a limited operating history

These requirements can make getting a bank loan time consuming. That may not be an issue if you're in the market for a long-term business loan to finance a major investment.

However, if you need money faster, online lenders may be a better fit, as they can provide a streamlined online application process with fewer documentation requirements and faster underwriting. If you have good credit and strong business finances, some online lenders may offer you rates comparable to those for bank loans.

4. Develop a strong business plan

Lenders will want to know how you plan to use the money and will want to see that you have a strong ability to repay. They may require a solid business plan that details the purpose of the loan and how you expect it to increase profits.

Your business plan should include current and projected financials, and clearly demonstrate that your business will have enough cash flow to cover ongoing business expenses and the new loan payments. This can give the lender more confidence in your business, increasing your chances at loan approval. Your business plan should include:

- Company description
- Product and/or service description
- Management team
- Industry analysis
