Closing the Digital Divide for Low-Income Communities

As a telecom policy expert, it's been exciting to see 2020 presidential candidates, such as Elizabeth Warren, unveil ambitious plans to improve internet access across America. This is more important than ever because 40% of low-income households in California don't have access to the internet at home. This means no access to job postings online, no wikipedia for homework, and no youtube videos to learn new skills. This gap between the internet "haves" and "havenots" is known as the digital divide.

With over 80 percent of well-paying jobs now requiring digital skills, families on the wrong side of the divide have fewer opportunities to get the kind of jobs that can lift them out of poverty.

The digital divide reflects California's racial wealth gap.

The link between internet access and economic opportunity is why Greenlining's Technology Equity team has worked for over a decade to close the connectivity gap. This year, thanks to research funding from Citi Community Development, as well as the leadership of Commissioner Martha Guzman Aceves of the California Public Utilities Commission, we've been able to take proactive steps to close this gap and make internet services more affordable and accessible to the families that don't have it. Below are some highlights of our research and the policy changes we've achieved thanks to that work:

Low-income students are far less likely to have internet access or a computing device, a key obstacle to academic success and economic opportunity.

We helped obtain funding to give youth on the National School Lunch Program or the Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program free laptops, resulting in over 1,200 low-income students receiving laptops (with more to come).

Students with internet access do significantly better on standardized math, science and reading tests.

When families were asked "why" they did not have internet access, the most common answer, by far, was that it was too expensive.

We successfully pushed for rules that require Internet Service Providers developing their networks using state funding to have affordable service plans (\$15/month or less) for low-income families.

Signing up for the "Lifeline" program, which provides low-cost mobile internet to low-income households, was time-consuming and difficult. People had to sign up in person, at inconvenient times and locations, or sign up by mail, which could take weeks.

We partnered with a software developer and helped persuade the CPUC to change its rules for the California Lifeline program so that applicants can enroll online and on their own schedule. This change will also allow community organizations to help more people enroll in the program.


ISPs do not provide accurate data about what areas don't have internet access, at what speed, and at what cost. This hinders statewide efforts to increase internet availability and affordability.


Based on our advocacy, the CPUC implemented rules requiring California ISPs to provide better data on internet availability and conducted a study identifying where to invest state broadband funds and which groups were affected most by the digital divide.


We're proud of what we've been able to achieve this year. However, we still have a long way to go. While the rest of the world is racing to upgrade their internet, US companies are raising prices and slowing down investment in next generation internet networks. A prosperous and connected California requires a public and private commitment to making sure that every student has access to the internet to do homework, learn digital skills and to prepare for our increasingly tech-based workforce. We want internet access to be fast and futureproof so that California can be a leader in developing and adopting the high-bandwidth technologies of the future.

So what's next? We plan to use our research and experience to promote better internet access policies nationwide and to push for California to adopt an ambitious "fiber for all" vision that will close the digital divide. Watch this space for more news over the next year.

How to Open a Business Credit File

As a business owner, it's crucial to improve your company's ability to acquire credit and funding. A business credit file is every bit as important as your personal credit file. Like personal credit, business credit determines whether your company can be trusted by the way it manages its finances. Think of your business credit file as a barometer for the financial reputation of your business

Your business credit file is created by business credit reporting agencies. These agencies are storehouses of collected business and credit information on millions of companies in the United States and throughout the world. The

most widely recognized agencies are Dun & Bradstreet® and Equifax® Small Business.

The first step prior to opening a credit file is establishing your business entity. Next, you will need to obtain an employer identification number also known as your EIN or federal tax identification number. Now that these two fundamental steps are completed the third step is to open a business credit file with each of the major agencies.

Now it's important to understand each business credit reporting agency gathers information about a business through various sources such as payment data from banks and lenders, UCC filings, incorporation filings, business registrations, internet web mining, print and online directories, trade reporters, etc.

Through these data collection methods, a business credit agency may have created a credit file on your company without your knowledge.

So, prior to opening a credit file with a business credit agency it's essential to conduct a company search with each agency to determine if your business already has a file in its database. To conduct a search, visit each agency's website and type in your company name, city and state in the search box provided.

If your company is listed in the search results then order a business credit report so you can review the information being reported on your

company. Check for any inaccuracies. and if If there is any incorrect information contact the credit agency directly. Another option is to submit a dispute and/or update online.

If your business is not listed, one of the ways to open a business credit file is if a is to have a supplier or lender that your company has credit with, reports your payment history to a business credit agency. Consider working with suppliers that issue credit to your business and report it because this will open your business credit file and begin establishing your company's credit rating.

Build a Plan to Protect Your Small Business During National Preparedness Month

When heavy rains were predicted for several South Carolina counties during the first week of October 2015, business owner Michael Marsha placed sandbags around his fabric store and hoped for the best.

Within 24 hours, a massive storm dumped more than eight inches of rain on Columbia, home to Forest Lake Fabrics. The 55-year-old family-owned business specializes in drapery, upholstery, artwork and lighting fixtures. The force of the floodwaters blasted a 20-foot hole in the rear wall. Bolts of expensive fabric were washed downstream as more than six feet of water swept through the store. The building was nearly destroyed, and Forest Lake Fabrics' entire inventory, valued at \$1 million, was ruined.

Marsha received a disaster loan from the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA), which he used to replace inventory and lessen the effects of the next big storm. During the recovery phase, he considered how to prepare for the next big storm and decided to rebuild stronger. He hired builders who waterproofed

the inside and outside walls with a heavy-duty paint that would prevent water from seeping into the building. They also elevated the building six feet and installed impact-rated protection for the windows and doors.

"We rebuilt making sure we'll be prepared for future flooding," Marsha said.

The SBA is committed to making sure America's 30 million small businesses have the resources they need to recover in the aftermath of any disaster. Immediately on the ground following a disaster declaration, the SBA offers recovery assistance to individuals, nonprofits and businesses of all sizes in the form of low-interest loans.

But instead of wondering if your business can withstand the potential destruction caused by the next flood, wildfire, earthquake or hurricane, why not consider structural upgrades where possible. It's also a good idea to make sure your disaster preparation plan is in place, tested, and updated as needed.

September is National Preparedness Month. Led by the Federal Emergency Management Agency and sponsored by Ready.gov, this year's theme is "Prepared, Not Scared." The SBA has partnered with the Insurance Institute for Business & Home Safety (IBHS) to help businesses become more aware of their disaster risks while also helping them develop business continuity plans to recover and rebuild, with an eye on lessening the impact of the next disaster.

Meanwhile, here are a few preparedness tips:

- Look at the building where you do business, inside and out, to determine your potential vulnerabilities.
- Do structural upgrades to protect your property, that can include:

- Adding a retaining wall or a sump pump,
- Choosing noncombustible materials for decks
- Sealing cracks,
- Installing permanent hurricane shutters, and
- Installing impact-rated windows.
- Calculate the cost of having to shut down operations for a week, a month, or six months. Then investigate insurance options (like business interruption insurance) or build a cash reserve that will allow your company to stay open during the post-disaster recovery phase.

Using Hydro Excavation to Expose Directional Boring Utilities

The technology and use of hydro excavation, also known as vacuum excavation, has been a vital service in the construction industry for many years. It has helped avoid countless accidents and injuries when exposing underground utilities.

Utilities have been placed underground in America for more than 200 years. These underground utilities can include sewer and water laterals, telephone, fuel, and fiber optics. Unfortunately, with many updates and new development to our infrastructure through the years, there can be poor documentation—or sometimes none at all—of abandoned utilities left underground. This can sometimes make it difficult for a contractor to avoid hitting a utility line when excavating, even when diggers hotline has been out to stake with their locating flags.

Hydro excavation can be a more efficient and safer way to expose underground utilities. Hydro excavation liquefies the soil with pressurized water. A large vacuum then sucks the slurry-like mixture into a debris tank, typically mounted on the back of the truck or trailer.

${\bf Additional\ benefits\ of\ hydro\ excavation\ include:}$

- Safely removes contaminated materials
- Effectively excavates hard-to-access areas
- Excavates materials suitable for backfilling
- Lowers liability and reduces insurance costs
- Reduces restoration costs

- 100% safe to underground pipes, lines, and operator
- Precision holes for pilings
- Easily works around tanks and vertical pipes inside buildings
- Digs up to 300 feet from the truck
- GPS tracking and event logging system
- Video surveillance and logging
- Remote diagnostics and data logging

Utilities that are shallower in the ground, like communication and electrical lines, tend to be more vulnerable. Water laterals in the cold regions of the country run below the frost line. Here in Wisconsin, I prefer running water service at six feet below the ground, especially if it is under a parking lot. I've seen frost as deep as five feet in these types of locations. Sanitary sewer laterals can vary in elevation.

Uncovering a utility line that was installed using directional boring can be very difficult without using hydro excavation, even when the utility has been located. Typically, a contractor will dig down alongside the flag, out about three to four feet. The excavator will then slowly and carefully dig into the side toward the utility, exposing it from the side. The excavator learns to read the soil, and when they get into the over dig from when the utility was installed originally, they know they are close to the utility line. Cautiously, the excavator knows to slowly hand dig until the utility is exposed. However, when a utility is installed using directional boring, there is no over dig to give warning that the utility line is



near. Hydro excavation can be a great option in these situations.

It is standard practice to call a free locating service (e.g., Diggers Hotline here in Wisconsin) prior to digging. These services, which locate publicly owned underground utilities, typically need 24 hours of notice before excavation or digging begins. A call by the contractor to relocate utilities on the same property may be necessary if the locating flags are lost or after seven days of the first locate. It is critical to know the color codes of the flags to identify the utility located. Check out this helpful chart to learn more about what each color means.

Common projects that need underground locating include planting trees, building decks, installing mailboxes or fences, digging ponds, and pouring concrete.

Diggers Hotline and other free locating services do not locate private underground utilities. Contractors need to do additional research on the property for any unknown obstructions.
