

DWR Awards \$187 Million to Improve Sustainable Groundwater Use and Storage Statewide

The Department of Water Resources (DWR) has awarded \$187 million to 32 groundwater subbasins through the Sustainable Groundwater Management (SGM) Grant Program.

The funding will support 103 individual projects that enhance groundwater monitoring, water use efficiency, groundwater recharge, recycled water and water quality, including more than \$160 million that will directly benefit Tribes and underrepresented communities. These efforts will help support local sustainable groundwater management and align with the Newsom Administration’s Adapting to a Hotter and Drier Water Supply Strategy, which builds a climate-ready and safe California that is resilient against climate-driven extremes like drought, flooding, heatwaves and wildfire.

“This water year has proved the importance of managing our groundwater to capture and store as much water as possible in our local communities to prepare for future weather extremes, while supporting the implementation of the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act,” said DWR Sustainable Groundwater Management Deputy Director Paul Gosselin. “We look forward to working with our local partners to make the necessary investments to better manage, capture and store groundwater for future generations.”

California is home to 515 groundwater basins, a critical component of the state’s water supply, and is heavily relied upon by communities, agriculture and the environment, especially during

dry and drought years. During the 2023 Water Year, DWR has determined an estimated 3.8 million acre-feet of water has been recharged; a clearer picture of the 2023 water year’s groundwater conditions will emerge after April 1, 2024, when annual reports are due from the local groundwater sustainability agencies to the State. While some groundwater basins will see benefits from groundwater recharge this year, many groundwater basins still have a long way to go to recover from past decades of drought and over-pumping.

The grant awards are distributed throughout the State, with the full list of awarded projects available here. Regions that will benefit from this funding include:

- In Alameda County, Zone 7 Water Agency will receive \$16 million to support the permitting, design and construction of a well treatment facility to remove contaminants from the water supply. This funding will help to bring approximately 16 percent of the drinking water supply back online and benefit underrepresented communities in the area.
- In Merced County, the Merced Irrigation-Urban Groundwater Sustainability Agency will receive \$3.4 million to execute two multi-benefit projects that fallow more than 1,300 acres of cropland, resulting in increased groundwater recharge, habitat enhancement and reduced flood risk for nearby underrepresented communities.

U.S. SBA Names California as 2023 State Trade Expansion Program Awardee

The U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) announced that a grant totaling \$700,000 has been awarded to the Governor’s Office of Business and Economic Development (GO-Biz) as part of the State Trade Expansion Program (STEP).

STEP is a federally funded grant program that aims to increase export activities among small businesses. The program has helped thousands of small businesses across California sell their products and services overseas by covering various costs associated with entering and expanding into international markets.

Since the inception of the program in 2011, the State of California has received approximately \$9 million in STEP funding to support small businesses with exporting activities. These activities can include participating in foreign trade missions and international trade shows, globalizing websites and engaging in ecommerce, designing international marketing campaigns, and other important means of engagement.

Emily Desai, Deputy Director of International Affairs and Trade at GO-Biz said, “Since 95% of the world’s consumers and two-thirds of all purchasing power are located outside the United States, this grant program plays a critical role in providing access to capital, access to markets, and access to buyers. Helping our small businesses in accessing the benefits of exporting, and the economic resiliency it can

support, is one of our team’s primary goals. This new round of STEP funding will help ensure those benefits are made available to even more California small businesses, particularly those that have historically lacked access to economic opportunity.”

GO-Biz Announces First-Ever Grants to Help Immigrants Succeed in Their Communities

The Governor's Office of Business and Economic Development (GO-Biz) distributed the state's first-ever Local Immigrant Integration and Inclusion Grant (LIIIG) allocations, with over \$6 million to twelve local governments across California (see table below for details). This program provides funding for local governments to bolster efforts focused on helping immigrant families thrive and contribute – increasing community trust and enhancing the ability of local governments to serve their immigrant communities successfully.

Awarded activities for LIIIG funding include:

- Economic Development:** Supporting immigrant entrepreneurs with creating and scaling businesses through various initiatives.
- Social Services Navigation:** Helping eligible immigrants access essential public programs.
- Intergovernmental Technical Assistance:** Developing and implementing culturally appropriate policies and best practices to serve the immigrant population.

“GO-Biz is proud to award local governments the first-ever state funding that focuses on local government immigrant integration efforts,” said Emily Desai, GO-Biz Deputy Director of International Affairs and Trade. “In California, we embrace the diversity and contributions supported by immigrant communities, recognizing them as critical to the collective success of our state and nation. California has relied on immigration to stay globally competitive, and these grants will further support our local governments in their efforts to create economic mobility and enable social inclusion for California's immigrant populations.”

About 27% of Californians are immigrants, and half of California's kids have at least one immigrant parent. Governor Newsom has signed legislation providing increased access to health care, education, and other critical initiatives that help immigrant families be safe, thrive, and grow the economy with their talent and contributions.

The LIIIG is a one-year grant with a performance period from October 1, 2023, through September 31, 2024. GO-Biz is expected to release a limited second round of funding to support further the equitable distribution of funds in rural regions and for underserved immigrant populations.

The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) has awarded the Santa Cruz County Regional Transportation Commission (RTC) \$1.9 million for three Sustainable Transportation Planning Grants for projects that will focus on rural highway safety, and transportation demand management and coastal resiliency along the North Coast's Highway 1 corridor.

The RTC received a grant award for \$285,600 to develop the Santa Cruz County Rural Highway Safety Plan (RHSP) to enhance roadway safety for users of the County's six conventional highways – Highway 1 north of the City of Santa Cruz city limits, Highway 9, Highway 236, Highway 35, and Highways 129 and 152 outside of the City of Watsonville. Through data-driven analysis, the RHSP will identify locations and

patterns of crashes in order to generate and prioritize a suite of implementable countermeasures to eliminate traffic deaths and serious injuries on these highways. This data-driven approach will help direct resources where they are needed and most effectively make the region safer.

project aims to identify options to reduce vehicles miles traveled and emissions, while improving safety.

The RTC also received a grant award for \$1,254,691 to develop a plan for Coastal Resiliency along the Highway 1 Corridor at Waddell and San Vicente creeks. Preliminary investigations indicate that the existing Highway 1 bridge over Waddell Creek, and the Santa Cruz Branch Rail Line and future Coastal Rail Trail corridor over San Vicente Creek are

vulnerable to coastal climate change impacts. This project will identify short-, medium-, and long-term actions for viability and resilience to climate stressors on these transportation facilities in tandem with ecological restoration of the Waddell Creek and San Vicente Creek ecosystems including nature-based resilience solutions. The RTC will partner with the Resource Conservation District of Santa Cruz County and Caltrans District 5 on this project.

RTC staff is excited to get started on these important planning studies and will provide more

information regarding schedule and public participation opportunities over the next few months.

Caltrans' Sustainable Transportation Planning Grant program funds sustainable transportation planning studies to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, improve the state highway system, enhance access to safe walkways and bike paths, and increase natural disaster preparedness.

Caltrans awards transportation planning grants each year through a competitive process to en-

courage local and regional projects to improve the state's transportation network. This year, the program awarded \$66.8 million in state and federal funds to cities, counties, tribes, and transit agencies throughout California to plan sustainable transportation projects. A statewide total of 161 grant applications were submitted. Of these applications, 90 were selected for grant awards.

\$187 Million to Improve Sustainable Groundwater Use and Storage Statewide

Continued from page 1

- In Riverside County, San Geronio Pass Water Agency will receive \$2 million to install four groundwater monitoring wells that will help provide better data information for the area, which serves underrepresented communities. By accessing better data, communities can improve their understanding of local groundwater conditions to answer questions about water use and improve groundwater management.
- In San Benito County, San Benito County Water District will receive \$11.5 million to expand and update the water treatment plant and construct five aquifer storage and recovery wells, as well as a conveyance pipeline for water. The project will help provide a resilient water supply for nearby underrepresented communities.
- In Santa Barbara County, Santa Ynez River Water Conservation District will receive \$5.3 million to finance several studies and plans to identify areas for recycled water, increase groundwater recharge capacity and reduce demand on groundwater. All projects within the subbasin will benefit Tribes and underrepresented communities.
- In Stanislaus County, Oakdale Irrigation District will receive \$14.3 million to expand an existing recharge facility and increase storage by 600 percent. The project will benefit underrepresented communities in the area.

- In Sutter County, Sutter County Development Services will receive \$8.5 million for improved data collection and reporting while also financing a pilot program to support farmers with irrigation system upgrades and underrepresented communities.

The awards mark the second solicitation offered through the SGM Grant Program. In 2022, the program awarded \$150 million during the first solicitation to 20 agencies responsible for managing critically overdrafted groundwater basins throughout the state. Demand for groundwater project funding has been high with the SGM Grant Program receiving nearly \$800 million in requests.

In addition to working with DWR, several awardees will partner with non-governmental organizations to help implement these projects, including the Community Alliance with Family Farmers, Sonoma Land Trust Resource Conservation District, La Luz Center, Ducks Unlimited, Natural Resources Defense Council, River Partners and others. This type of collaboration is highly encouraged by DWR and serves as a great example of how entities with similar missions are working together to prepare for a hotter and drier future.

Breakers Breakfast, Brunch & Lunch is part of a dream come true for Steve and Robby Bancroft, the father and son team who own an award-winning daytime restaurant in their hometown of Pacifica, CA. In the iconic Rockaway Beach portion of town, Breakers opened its doors in the Spring of 2014. Steve has nearly 30 years of experience working in the restaurant industry, often working seven days a week early on in his career while raising Robby as a single father. He enjoyed the concept of working during the day and making cash tips. Through this, Steve could provide for their family while remaining present in his son's life, especially when Robby got home from school. Steve was good at cooking but even better at managing a restaurant and enjoyed doing it. He always talked about owning a restaurant that would provide the same opportunities he had to other single parents, students, and people who didn't want to work late nights.

Challenge

Before the pandemic, Robby heard about the SBDC through Pacifica's Chamber of Commerce

in a social media post. He contacted an SBDC representative, who did the intake and connected him to an advisor. While Steve ran the show, Robby had the task of working on potentially repurchasing shares of the business from their original investor. He was looking for loan information and guidance from the SBDC. Robby was interested in how the process worked, including speaking to the bank and possibly applying for an SBA loan.

Gameplan

During the pandemic, another advisor worked with Robby to develop reliable cash flow forecasting models and secure funding from the various emergency disaster relief loan/grant programs. They also continued to work on repurchasing shares, which subsequently made the Bancrofts 100% owners of their closed restaurant in the fall of 2020. Additionally, the advisor worked with Robby on a solid business plan which included a funding strategy and detailed financial projections.
