

The Construction Industry: On the Brink of a Paradigm Shift?

As the construction industry currently grapples with the problems of global inflation, de-carbonisation, persistent disputes, and productivity hurdles, it is worth remembering that we have still come a long way in the past 50 years.

Whether it's the infusion of technological advancements, catapulting us from hand calculations into a realm of digital twins, the incorporation of life-saving health and safety regulations, or an overall "raising of the bar" when it comes to skillsets, qualifications, and education minimums required to do each job-the industry has undoubtedly undergone a significant transformation in the past decade. The resultant tide produced by this wave of new changes has likely increased complexities and greater expectations on how the industry can perform.

This wide-spread adoption of new developments certainly begs one important question: Are we on the cusp of a paradigm shift, propelling us towards a fully digitised industry capable of delivering consistent, repeatable and certain results for every customer?

Comparative to shifts seen across other industries, the structural, economic, and societal drivers inherent in the construction industry at present seem to suggest that this new normal is in fact inevitable. To understand the multitude of ways these changes might redirect our industry, we must first dissect these drivers of change namely the four P's: performance, predictability, planet, and people—in a contextualized fashion.

Performance is all about the quality of the final product and how we produce it, hence it is also influenced by productivity and post-use. Lack of predictability is what stifles industry demand, particularly in terms of time and cost, and often plays catalyst to numerous expensive disputes. The planet deals with all the issues of promoting green and sustainable construction, including de-carbonising construction and the circular economy. Lastly, people pertains to how we can continue to upskill the industry to meet these

National Hispanic Heritage Month: Sept. 15-Oct. 15, 2022

Each year, Americans observe National Hispanic Heritage Month from September 15 to October 15, by celebrating the histories, cultures and contributions of American citizens whose ancestors came from Spain, Mexico, the Caribbean and Central and South America.

The observation started in 1968 as Hispanic Heritage Week under President Lyndon Johnson and was expanded by President Ronald Reagan in 1988 to cover a 30-day period starting on September 15 and ending on October 15. It was enacted into law on August 17, 1988, on the approval of Public Law 100-402.

The day of September 15 is significant because it is the anniversary of independence for Latin American countries Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras and Nicaragua. In addition, Mexico and Chile celebrate their independence days on September 16 and September18, respectively. Also, Columbus Day or Día de la Raza, which is October 12, falls within this 30 day period.

Create a Culture of Safety to Improve Labor Recruitment Efforts

The commercial construction industry must rely on skilled labor to survive. Skilled labor, however, is hard to come by. In fact, many construction firms report projects being delayed because of shortages in the workforce.

Part of the problem is training. Few companies have the time, resources or opportunities to train new construction workers. But the biggest reason for the labor shortage in the construction industry is simply a lack of people joining the trades. Decades ago, construction was a respected career choice. Over the years, however, the pressure to get into a four-year college has created negative perceptions of working in the trades.

Some commercial construction companies choose to work with fewer crews as a result of the lack of skilled labor, therefore limiting the number of jobs they can handle. The labor shortage in the construction industry has simply made it nearly impossible to find subcontractors to adequately staff upcoming projects (one survey found that 35% of contractors had to turn down jobs due to a lack of skilled laborers). This then leads to hikes in construction costs and delays in scheduling, which can take a major toll on business

So what's the solution to these construction labor issues?

How to Keep Construction Workers Safe to Prevent Further Labor Shortages

Although safety might not sound like an obvious solution to labor shortages in the construction industry, many companies no longer have backup plans should an injury occur on the job due to the absence of laborers. Consider the vertical structure of a jobsite: Crews can't skip a step and keep moving forward. When a tradesperson gets injured, it delays everything that follows if

the company doesn't have another tradesperson handy

In other words, keeping everyone on the team safe and secure throughout a project-though not a permanent solution-is one of the only ways to immediately mitigate the labor shortage in the construction industry.

Keeping construction workers safe often starts with a company's culture. But a culture of safety entails more than plastering jobsites and office buildings with safety reminders or listing safety as one of the core values of an operation. It takes work and commitment to instill such beliefs and behaviors into every person in the ranks. Here are just a few tactics that can help keep construction workers safe and alleviate labor shortages:

1. Offer safety training

According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, 60% of construction accidents occur in the first year of employment. Therefore, keeping workers

safe can be summed up in a single word: training. Commercial construction companies must ensure everyone on-site is properly trained in basic safety. Also, forepeople should be put through the paces of site safety supervisory training to ensure they can implement project-specific safety protocols.

2. Focus on awareness

From laborers to the lead superintendent, everyone who sets foot on a jobsite should be acutely aware of the importance of maintaining a safe environment. Companies can request that all workers sign a safety agreement that not only details safety procedures but also includes a commitment to report any unsafe conditions to the foreperson or project manager. Safety is hard to manage, and it takes every set of eyes to keep construction workers safe.

5 Tips for Promoting Well-Being and Mental Health in Construction

In 2020, the CDC found that the construction industry has the second-highest suicide rate in the country, and construction workers are 3.5 more likely to die by suicide. With the suicide rate in construction ranked as one of the highest by occupation, industry leaders and members must take the necessary steps to educate and support those at risk. In addition to spreading awareness and education around the topic, something more sustainable and lasting must be done to help prevent and reduce suicides in construction.

To confront this mission head-on, a group of dedicated volunteers founded the first-ever initiative to prevent suicide in the industry shortly after the findings were released. This year, Construction Suicide Prevention Week is September 5 - 9, which coincides with National Suicide Prevention Month. Aimed to spread awareness, garner education, and prevent more lives from being lost, this vital week shines a light on a heartbreaking industry issue.

Why are Suicide Rates Higher in the Construction Industry

While a handful of root causes and factors leave construction workers more at risk than other occupations, most seem to be traced back to the overarching theme of mental health and job strain. Issues such as undiagnosed mental illness, overconsumption of alcohol, drug dependency, high-stress levels, and the stigma surrounding mental health, especially in men, are all too common in this male-dominated industry. Additional risk factors to consider when contemplating why suicide rates are higher in the construction industry include work-related access to lethal means, lack of leadership and support at work, and job insecurity. All of this was also exasperated by the covid-19 pandemic, which magnified many of these factors and created new stressors and challenges.

Tips to Promote Wellness in the Workplace

1. Reduce Stress

Unmanaged and high-stress levels can wreak havoc on your life, whether physically, emotionally, or psychologically. Construction is considered a high-stress job for reasons such as long work hours, physical labor, weather conditions, labor shortages, living through a pandemic, and



more. Overall strain and stress from work carry over into home life, and these occupational factors increase the risk for depression, alcohol and drug use, and suicidal thinking. To combat and reduce stress at job sites over the country, there is a wealth of knowledge to combat and reduce stress in your life.

To reduce stress, specifically in the construction industry, there are a few tips and tricks to implement in your day-to-day life. Eliminate stressors by removing yourself (when you can) from taxing encounters, take care of yourself by eating healthy and getting plenty of rest, participate in activities that bring you happiness, communicate your feelings with trusted confidants, and finally, don't be afraid to ask for help if you notice your stress levels may be too high.

2. Monitor and Moderate Alcohol & Drug Use

For many reasons, the construction industry reports higher drug and alcohol use rates. The Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration conducted a cross-industry study where 16.5% of full-time construction workers reported drinking heavily in the last month, regardless of age or gender. Between 2008 and 2012, the industry ranked second highest with

heavy alcohol use and fifth highest for employees with a substance use disorder.

To combat this issue, the Construction Coalition for a Drug- and Alcohol-Free Workplace was founded to provide organizations and businesses with the resources necessary to implement substance abuse policies. In addition to companywide incentives to reduce alcohol and drug use, those struggling with addiction can also benefit from rehabilitation programs, cognitive-behavioral therapies, and other evidence-based services that help get to the root cause of drug and alcohol abuse.

3. Communicate Openly About Mental Health

Because mental health disorders have such a stigma, it can be challenging to speak up in such a "tough guy" industry. However, valuing emotional health just as much as physical health can help remove the stigma around mental health and diagnoses such as depression and anxiety. One in five workers in the United States experienced an existing diagnosed mental illness in their lifetime; less than 50% of those people actually seek help and support. This leaves room for an 80% success rate with early intervention and treatment, but that's only if people feel comfortable talking openly about what is really going on. Having an open-door policy in place for communication in the workplace not only removes embarrassment or shame around common human issues but also cultivates a stronger feeling of belonging and connectedness between employees and employers. Talking about mental health can seem frightening and very vulnerable. However, we must normalize communication about these complex topics that are the reality in the construction industry.

4. Seek Professional Guidance & Utilize Resources

A massive component of promoting overall wellness in the industry is ensuring programs and resources are in place to get those who are struggling to get the help they need. Having Employee Assistance Programs (EAP) and union Member Assistance Programs (MAP) that cover the cost of mental health care and provide access to therapists and related services should be the industry standard. If you do not have access to work-based programs surrounding mental health, there are lifelines and text lines you can reach out to 24/7 to talk to a trained crisis counselor. This includes the brand-new 988 Suicide & Crisis Hotline, available via text or phone call 24/7, 365 days a year.

5. Foster a Positive Workplace Culture

Lastly, employers are the ones who can create even more opportunities to enhance workplace culture regarding mental health. More innovative outlets like toolbox talks on mental health safety, mental health first aid education, and lunch and learn sessions on topics on reducing stress or coping mechanisms can be highly beneficial for employees. When we learn to integrate mental health practices into overall health in the workplace by incentivizing and promoting wellness, we build a more caring and compassionate culture.

Feeling heard, seen, and valued in the workplace can create long-lasting positive effects on workers. Ideas like bi-weekly check-ins, mental health buddy systems, reduced access to lethal means, and strategic plans for crisis response in workplace suicides can be constructive to create a safe and healthy work environment.

challenges, both in terms of new entrants and lifelong learning.

Spawning from that landscape arises yet another important question: What is the relevance of professionalism in the 21st century and what impact will construction professionals impart on the industry as a whole? Professionalism is defined by codes of ethics and unique bodies of knowledge. However, there are now many professionals involved in construction: how do they work with each other to produce a better industry in a truly effective way?

Construction is a team game and to play it effectively, each member of the team has to be privy to the strategic plan. How do we align the interests of the different stakeholders and professionals to meet the four P's?

Although digitalisation can improve interdisciplinary methods of working, we also need changes in the way construction professionals are educated and qualified. A quantity surveyor needs to understand the work processes of designers and vice versa if each are to achieve a higher level of co-ordinated working. True interdisciplinary working, coupled with a collaborative culture, could thus dramatically improve the four P's – but is it therefore just a skills problem?

Governor Newsom Announces Free Online Tutoring Available to All Californians, \$254 Million in Grants to Improve Libraries Across the State

Governor Gavin Newsom today announced that every Californian can now access free online tutoring available 24/7 through a new initiative offering homework help in every K-12 subject and skillbuilding resources for adult learners. The Governor also announced \$254 million in grants to public libraries in 172 cities across 34 counties to renovate and improve facilities across the state. This is the first round of the California State Library's \$439 million Building Forward Library Improvement Grant Program – the largest investment in public library infrastructure in California history.

Real-time homework assistance can now be accessed 24/7 here and on the websites of any of the 1,130 local public libraries around the state – click on the "HelpNow" link to reach a one-on-one tutor. The pilot program led by the State Library offers assistance in Math, Language Arts, and other core K-12 subjects in English, Spanish, Mandarin, Cantonese, Vietnamese, and Tagalog. There's no age limit to who can use the service. Adult learners can also access writing assistance, citizenship resources and other tools.

"With historic investments to give the youngest Californians a strong start in life, enrich our schools and expand supports like tutoring, we're building on our commitment to create more opportunities for every child in our state to thrive, "said Governor Newsom. "Public libraries are the hearts of communities across the state and our hubs of learning, discovery, and oftentimes – safety. While states across the nation are banning books, California is awarding \$254 million in grants for our historic public libraries – an investment to make books more accessible by repairing and modernizing libraries throughout the state."

The 234 projects in this initial round of funding under the Building Forward Library Improvement Grant Program range from \$14,300 to \$10 million and include efforts to make libraries safer and more accessible, including their ability to be cooling centers for underserved communities. The City of Porterville, whose only library was destroyed in a 2020 fire that took the lives of two firefighters, will receive \$7.2 million.

"Libraries are hubs of community activity – they are a safe haven, an escape into the wonders of reading, a place to find a meal when you need one, to create, to vote, to enrich children, to learn a new skill, and so much more," said First Partner Jennifer Siebel Newsom. "Strengthening our libraries' infrastructure – their ability to safely and effectively meet the needs of the community – is such a critical investment in the community members who rely on them."

ohn Falcon spent 20 years and 6 months in the Air Force. While stationed in Las Vegas in the mid-1990's, John and his wife Marina fixed up old houses. They took on three rehab projects on low income, section 8 housing. Providing safe homes to code to less fortunate families gave them great pride.

John's Air Force experience included 10 years as a pavements maintenance specialist and equipment operator and 10 years in project management. He was deployed all over the world on humanitarian assignments that included hospital and school remodels in Haiti and new school construction in French Guyana. And for business know-how, he attended SBA training programs during his last assignment at Pope AFB. The Air Force clearly trained him to manage construction projects. So the move to federal construction contracting was a logical next step.

Using the GI Bill, he went back to school and graduated summa cum laude with a Bachelors of Business Administration in Management just before retiring from the Air Force in 2007.

He launched Falcon Builders and Developers, Inc. in 2007 with his wife and partner, Marina. Early on, John saw the potential in the lucrative (but incredibly competitive) arena of government contracting and decided to capitalize on the different designations his business qualified for as a disabled veteran owned business. John found the Central Valley Business Incubator/ Small Business Development Center, whose Rich Mostert counseled John and provided technical assistance regarding certifications for government procurement. John attended every training session and networking event and built relationships with contracting officers.

Starting a business wasn't easy, it took him seven months to get his first contract, which was a VA project and he "hasn't looked back." Because John developed a unique niche, his construction company weathered the recent economic crisis. Falcon Builders currently employs 10 people. Most recently he returned to CVBI/SBDC for a review of his five year strategic growth plan. The company has maintained revenue streams and is well positioned for future opportunities; and John is known as the "go-to" person on government contracting issues and is a leader in his local Disabled Veteran's organization. Rich successfully nominated the company for the Regional Veteran-owned Business of the Year, an award that Falcon Builders now displays on the office wall.
