As construction demand continues to surge across the country, the industry finds itself at a pivotal moment. With workforce shortages mounting and the skilled labor pipeline narrowing, contractors and developers are navigating a landscape defined by complexity and change. The pressure to deliver high-quality projects on time and within budget has never been greater—yet many firms are struggling to fill the boots needed on the ground.

In 2025 alone, projections estimate that the construction sector will need nearly half a million additional workers to keep pace. That's not just a statistic—it's a warning bell. If left unaddressed, this growing gap could hinder everything from public infrastructure improvements to private commercial developments, with far-reaching consequences for communities and economies alike.

Several forces are at play: accelerated retirements, post-pandemic career shifts and a generational perception gap that continues to steer younger workers away from the trades. Over-

coming these challenges will require a fundamental rethinking of how the industry approaches workforce development, project execution and industry culture.

Understanding the Depth of the Labor Challenge

The construction industry has long faced cyclical labor shortages, but the current scenario marks a deeper, more structural shift. Fewer young people are entering the trades, and less than 10% of the current workforce is under the age of 25. As older workers retire—many ahead of schedule due to the pandemic—the pipeline of replacements is insufficient to maintain workforce continuity.

This shortage has very real consequences on the ground: extended project schedules, increased labor costs and elevated risks tied to compliance and safety. When jobsites operate understaffed or with less-experienced teams, the margin for error narrows—and the potential for delays or mishaps increases.

Demand isn't slowing either. Whether it's aging infrastructure, rapid urban growth or the need for more industrial and commercial space, the pressure is on for construction firms to deliver—

IFR and DBE ACDBE Impacts

From the Editors:

In light of the recent Interim Final Rule (IFR) that removes the presumptions of disadvantage based on race and/or sex from DBE certifications, Small Business Exchange will prioritize its Public Policy column for program updates and resources offered to DBEs/ACDBEs seeking "re-certification" or certification.

We begin this issue with the letter from the U.S. Department of Transportation.

This guidance provides information about important changes that the U.S. Department of Transportation ("Department" or "DOT") is requiring recipients of financial assistance from the Department to make with respect to the Disadvantaged Business Enterprise ("DBE") and the Airport Concession Disadvantaged Business Enterprise ("ACDBE") programs.

Background

Recipients of highway, transit, and airport funding distributed by DOT are subject to the requirements of the DBE program, under which they must set goals for participation by small businesses owned and controlled by "socially and economically disadvantaged" individuals.

Recipients of airport funding are also subject to the requirements of the ACDBE program, which requires them to set similar goals with respect to airport concessionaries.

Unfortunately, not all individuals have been treated equally under this program. Instead, Congress has mandated that DOT treat certain individuals—women and members of certain racial and ethnic groups—as "presumed" to be disadvantaged. Other individuals do not benefit from that presumption. This means that two similarly situated small business owners may face different standards for entering the program, based solely on their race, ethnicity, or sex.

On September 23, 2024, the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Kentucky determined that the DBE program's use of race- and sexbased presumptions likely does not comply with the Constitution's promise of equal protection under the law. Accordingly, the Court issued a

preliminary injunction that prohibits DOT from mandating the use of race- and sex-based presumptions with respect to contracts on which the two plaintiff entities bid.

In accordance with the directives of the President and the Attorney General, DOT and the Department of Justice ("DOJ") have evaluated the DBE and ACDBE programs. DOT and DOJ, consistent with the ruling of the District Court, have determined that the DBE program's race- and sex-based presumptions do not comply with the Fifth Amendment's Due Process Clause, which prohibits the Federal Government from depriving individuals of the equal protection of the laws.

On May 28, 2025, DOT (represented by DOJ), along with the plaintiffs in the litigation in the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Kentucky, asked the Court to enter a Consent Order resolving a constitutional challenge to the DBE program. The motion is currently pending. In the proposed Consent Order, DOT stipulated and agreed that "the DBE program's use of race- and sex-based presumptions of social and economic disadvantage . . . violates the equal protection component of the Due Process Clause of the Fifth Amendment of the U.S. Constitution." The parties asked the Court to declare that "the use of DBE contract goals in a jurisdiction, where any DBE in that jurisdiction was determined to be eligible based on a race- or sex-based presumption, violates the equal protection component of the Due Process Clause of the Fifth Amendment," and to hold and declare that DOT "may not approve any federal, state, or local DOT-funded projects with DBE contract goals where any DBE in that jurisdiction was de-

termined to be eligible based on a race- or sexbased presumption."

On June 25, 2025, the Solicitor General wrote to the Speaker of the House, consistent with 28

U.S.C. § 530D, to advise the Speaker that DOJ had concluded that the DBE program's presumptions violate the Constitution, that DOJ would no longer defend the presumptions in court, and that DOJ had taken that position in ongoing litigation. DOT agrees with and adopts the Solicitor General's analysis.

Interim Final Rule and Guidance

In light of DOT's determination that the DBE program's race- and sex-based presumptions are unconstitutional, DOT issued an interim final rule removing the presumptions from the DBE program regulations ("Interim Final Rule"). Because the ACDBE presumptions are functionally identical and suffer the same constitutional infirmity, the rule also removes the presumptions from the ACDBE regulations.

Accordingly, DOT issues the following guidance to recipients of DOT highway, transit, and airport funding.

<u>Unified Certification Programs may not use</u> race- or sex-based presumptions in determining DBE/ACDBE eligibility.

The Interim Final Rule removes race- and sex-based presumptions from the definitions of "socially and economically disadvantaged individual," and instead provides that the owner of a DBE or ACDBE applicant must demonstrate on a case-by-case basis that the individual meets the criteria described in 49 CFR § 26.67.

Section 26.67 provides, in turn, that an owner must:

(1) demonstrate that the owner is socially and economically disadvantaged based on his or her own experiences and circumstances that occurred within American society, and without regard to race or sex;

(2) submit to the certifier a personal narrative establishing the existence of disadvantage by a preponderance of the evidence based on individualized proof regarding specific instances of economic hardship, systemic barriers, and denied opportunities that impeded the owner's progress or success in education, employment, or business, including obtaining financing on terms available to similarly situated, non-disavantaged persons;

(3) state how and to what extent the impediments caused the owner economic harm, including a Tfull description of type and magnitude, and establish the owner is economically disadvantaged in fact relative to similarly situated non-disadvantaged individuals; and

(4) state how and to what extent the impediments caused the owner economic harm, including a full description of type and magnitude; and

(5) attach to the Personal Narrative a current personal net worth statement and any other financial information the owner considers relevant.

Each Unified Certification Program ("UCP") established pursuant to 49 CFR § 26.81 must immediately begin to apply these new certification standards.

UCPs must reevaluate the eligibility of existing DBEs and ACDBEs.

The Interim Final Rule requires each UCP to reevaluate all current DBEs and ACDBEs, to recertify any DBE or ACDBE that meets the new certification standards, and to decertify any DBE or ACDBE that does not meet the new certification standards. The decertification procedures of 49 CFR § 26.87 do not apply to any decertification decisions under this process.

The reevaluation process mandated by the interim Final Rule will ensure a level playing field between existing participants and new applicants, while also eliminating the effects of the unconstitutional presumptions.

efficiently and safely. That's why workforce optimization must become a central strategy for firms that want to stay competitive in this environment

Strategic Collaboration Through Design-Build

One of the most effective tools to address labor limitations lies in the delivery model itself. Traditional project methods often leave subcontractors out of the equation until late in the process, creating disconnects between design, scope and available labor.

The design-build approach flips that dynamic. By integrating owners, designers and contractors from the outset, design-build fosters stronger communication, better alignment and earlier buy-in from the trade partners who ultimately execute the work.

This early collaboration makes it easier to assess workforce availability and adjust scope or schedules accordingly. It also prioritizes quality and capacity over cost alone when awarding subcontracts—ensuring the right teams are in place before ground breaks. The result? Reduced delays, fewer change orders and improved overall project outcomes, even in the face of workforce constraints.

Technology as a Force Multiplier

While people are at the heart of construction, technology is becoming an increasingly valuable ally in offsetting workforce shortages. New digital tools and automated systems are allowing companies to do more with leaner teams, all while improving accuracy and safety.

AI-driven scheduling software can be utilized to dynamically reallocate labor based on progress updates and project variables. Robotic layout and survey systems streamline framing and groundwork, requiring fewer manual inputs. Automated finish applications for tasks like painting, sealing and drywall installation allow for quicker turnaround with smaller crews.

By modernizing jobsite operations, construction firms can appeal to tech-savvy younger workers who might otherwise overlook the industry. The integration of smart platforms and digital collaboration tools also makes it easier to manage multiple teams, track progress and ensure everyone is aligned on goals and deliverables.

Prioritizing Worker Retention and Wellbeing

Attracting new talent is only half the battle. Retaining skilled workers is equally essential—and often overlooked. Companies that want to build

a stable, long-term workforce must prioritize the conditions of their jobsites and the overall well-being of their employees.

This includes creating better onsite experiences, such as shaded areas for rest, food services and climate-controlled break rooms. It also includes celebrating the trades by highlighting field workers during milestone events, giving them recognition on social media or spotlighting their contributions at industry functions.

These strategies not only improve morale but also strengthen loyalty and reduce turnover both of which are essential in a labor-tight market

Shaping the Industry's Future Through Education

For lasting impact, the industry must focus on shifting public perception and expanding access to the trades. Many high school and college students are unaware of the real earning potential and long-term stability a career in the construction industry can offer.

Grassroots initiatives and educational partnerships are helping to change that. Across the country, more high schools are integrating construction programs that offer hands-on experience and industry certifications. Community colleges and trade schools are also stepping up with curricula aligned to today's jobsite demands.

Apprenticeship programs, mentorship pipelines and internship opportunities can serve as powerful tools to introduce young people to the industry in a meaningful way. When students hear success stories from professionals close to their own age—or get a taste of real jobsite experiences—the spark of interest can turn into a full-fledged career path.

Looking Ahead

The construction industry's labor challenge may not have a single solution, but there is a clear path forward for firms that embrace innovation, reimagine collaboration and invest in both people and processes. The coming years will require bold thinking, greater agility and a heightened commitment to workforce development. With strategic planning and industrywide cooperation, firms can not only build better structures but also establish a stronger, more sustainable foundation for the next generation of construction professionals.



San José to Release RFP for Generative Al Platform

City seeks scalable AI tool to increase productivity for 7,000 City employees

The City of San José is building on the successful launch of an AI Upskilling program by releasing a Request for Proposal (RFP) for a secure, scalable Generative Artificial Intelligence (Generative AI) platform. As the Capital of Silicon Valley, the City's goal is to enhance customer service by also providing its AI-trained workforce with the tools to create their own custom AI chatbot assistants on a City-secured platform.

"Our goal is to provide our employees with innovative, responsible technology that helps focus on the work that makes a difference for our residents," said City Manager Jennifer Maguire. "This platform strengthens our ability to serve the community effectively, empowering staff with tools that enhance responsiveness and productivity across all City services."

"We're working to integrate generative AI into everything we do at City Hall because you deserve government that is fast, responsive, personalized and cost-effective," said Mayor Matt Mahan. "Thanks to our workforce up-skilling curriculum, we're already seeing city workers deploy these new tools to automate routine aspects of their jobs and deliver more impact for our community."

City departments have identified a growing need for AI tools that streamline workflows and reduce repetitive tasks. The intended platform is expected to support a range of use cases, including:

Analyzing and summarizing documents, including policies and contracts.

- Drafting reports and other communications.
- Supporting software development and code
 review
- Generating charts and analyzing data.

The City is committed to selecting a secure, privacy-focused solution that aligns with its Digital Privacy and AI policies. The platform should provide secure access to conversational AI tools, have the ability to connect with internal systems and data, and include enterprise-level administrative and privacy controls. The solution must also support low-code and no-code features so employees with different levels of technical experience can use it effectively.

"Generative AI offers a path to fundamentally transform how government delivers services," said Chief Information Officer and Director of the Information Technology Department Khaled Tawfik. "Our focus on secure, privacy-first technology ensures that as we innovate, we also build a future where public services are more efficient, responsive, and accessible, supported by our broader vision to upskill and empower government workforce with emerging technologies."

The City's RFP builds on San José's broader commitment to responsible AI adoption, including the launch of an AI-powered tool to speed up building permit reviews, bus route optimization by the Department of Transportation, object detection tools within the Information Technology Department, and a citywide network of Automated License Plate Readers managed by the Police Department. These efforts reflect San

José's commitment to responsibly leveraging technology to better serve the public.

The RFP is expected to release on October 17, 2025. Interested vendors are advised to create an account on the City's Biddingo portal to receive updates when the RFP is released. Unlocking the Blue Economy with Bubble Robotics

Patricia Apostol & Jean Crosetti met through a shared ambition to apply aerospace-grade tech to ocean challenges. "Bubble Robotics is building the autonomous workforce for the ocean," said Particia and Jean. "Our constellation of resident subsea robots lives at sea, inspecting offshore infrastructure, monitoring ecosystems, and securing critical assets continuously, without costly vessels or divers. Founded by alumni of NASA JPL and ETH Zürich, the team brings frontier space and robotics expertise underwater to unlock the \$3 trillion blue economy."

To support their vision, the cofounders connected with Humanmade, a CalOSBA partner that provides a wide range of industrial workshops where members can take training courses and use equipment to build or make almost anything. They also offer an intensive manufacturing skills training program and a hardware accelerator for startups.

Patricia and Jean shared that, as a hardware startup working under tight timelines, they faced a major challenge: building a complex underwater robot from scratch while preparing for a major demo day. The makerspace provided them with an exceptional range of prototyping tools, including laser cutters, 3D printers, advanced soldering stations, and electronics benches, that they simply couldn't afford or access elsewhere. Humanmade also gave them on-the-ground technical mentorship: from training on new fabrication techniques to troubleshooting when systems failed.

"Thanks to their support, we built and showcased a working prototype in time for our accelerator's demo day," said Patricia and Jean. "That event unlocked key investor conversations, design partner relationships and lined up paid pilots. Their assistance directly enabled our hardware development timeline and was foundational to our early traction.

'We owe a huge part of our first success to the makerspace. Without their equipment, mentorship, and flexibility, especially as they were preparing to move out, we wouldn't have hit our critical demo deadline. They truly made our hardware possible.

... Having access to precision equipment was essential and the staff who assisted us often late into the evenings. That blend of infrastructure and community is what makes a makerspace transformative for early-stage teams like ours."

In her previous roles at Citrix Systems (Cloud Software Group), Autodesk and FORT Robotics, CEO Nivedita Ojha met with over 300 customers and learned that, while the need to automate manufacturing and warehousing is well accepted, companies have struggled to scale up due to numerous challenges.
