I want to thank the National Association of Women Business Owners (NAWBO) and all of its members for the opportunity to share my thoughts with you today. I am delighted to be here in my home state of Florida in the beautiful city of Jacksonville with so many amazing business leaders and champions of entrepreneurship. You are all the definition of women's economic empowerment.

I am excited to participate alongside you in celebrating and promoting women's entrepreneurship. As NAWBO looks forward to its 45th anniversary next year, let's take a moment to recognize the tremendous amount of success you have already achieved.

I learned that NAWBO got its start back in 1975 with a few women who were ahead of their time with the idea to create a professional business community. It's remarkable that you now have 60 chapters and nearly 5,000 members across the United States and a presence in more than 60 countries worldwide. This is an amazing feat which all entrepreneurs, not just women should celebrate!

Because of your efforts – one of the most transformational initiatives for women, the Women's Business Ownership Act, was signed into law by President Ronald Reagan in 1988. And since then, women and girls all across America have had the rights and the increased resources they need to not only start a business, but grow and scale it into a successful enterprise. I always say that success as entrepreneurs isn't just about us having seat in the boardroom, or running our own companies, it's about controlling our own fates, and empowering women in societies here in America and around the world.

Although 1988 doesn't sound like a long time ago, it was a different world for women business owners – many states required a male relative to co-sign a business loan. The Women's Business Ownership Act changed that, by allowing women to gain control of their finances. This transformed the landscape of women's entrepreneurship, making it one of the fastest growing segments of the U.S. economy, and contributing to national GDP.

Mayor Garcetti announces formation of International Gender Equity Network

L.A. will form the first-ever international gender equity network for cities, Mayor Eric Garcetti announced at the Third Annual State of Women & Girls Address and Expo, where he and First Lady of Los Angeles Amy Elaine Wakeland joined more than 1,000 female leaders and students for a day of inspiration, motivation, and education.

The network will assemble cities throughout the world committed to promoting gender equity

initiatives, exchanging best practices, and using the gender equity toolkit developed in Los Angeles to build their own models for progress and action.

"Gender equity is everyone's responsibility and no one gets there alone," said Mayor Garcetti. "We are making extraordinary progress in Los Angeles, and the network will allow us to share our strategies with cities around the world, and lead a broader conversation about successes and

"Nobody can do everything, but everyone can do something to advance the cause of equality and justice," said Wakeland. "Together, we can make real, lasting change — and build a Los Angeles where women are never excluded from our economy, and girls are never excluded from the vital work of changing the world. They should know that this city has their backs — and that women and girls truly do move L.A."

The State of Women & Girls Address and Expo is a tradition started by the Mayor and First Lady, bringing together female leaders of all ages for thoughtful conversations about the state of gender equity, advancing policies that increase opportunities for women and girls, and building a more equitable and inclusive city. The inaugural State of Women & Girls Address in 2017 was the first-ever gender equity conference lead by a Mayoral administration in the City of Los Angeles. This year's event drew more than 1,000 women and girls — including hundreds of LAUSD students. The Mayor and First Lady honored the City of Los Angeles Bureau of Engineering with the 2019 Gender Equity Award, in recognition of its innovative recruiting and hiring practices.

Following the Mayor and First Lady's State of Women & Girls Address, attendees visited the #WomenMoveLA career expo — where they could receive information about job opportunities and connect with mentors. The expo also offered on-site health screenings and mindfulness demonstrations, female empowerment art displays, and a curated marketplace featuring local, women-owned businesses. Following the expo, students attended the Young Women's Assembly session, where they gained career insights from meeting with female executives in government, technology, entertainment, and business.

New Educational Resources Available to Four Million Post-9/11 Veterans

PsychArmor Institute (https://psycharmor.org/) launched a new course portfolio, "Transitioning Service Members & Their Families," to provide service members and veterans with the information, tools, and resources needed to be successful in today's workforce and in the community.

According to the Pew Research Center, 44% of post-9/11 veterans reported that their readjustment to civilian life was difficult. With approximately 200,000 service members leaving the military every year and returning to civilian life, transition support is an urgent priority. A 2018 Veterans Affairs report highlighted the unmet needs of transitioning members, noting that no single agency has the resources or tools to support all former service members.

Without the structure provided by the military, veterans may experience difficulties in translating their diverse, unique skills to civilian careers. Resources like the new PsychArmor Institute videos—which are aligned to the strategic priorities of the Department of Labor, Veterans Affairs, and the Department of Defense—help veterans more easily access the support available to them.

"Every transition is unique—and there's no one right way to do it," said Tina Atherall, CEO of PsychArmor Institute. "These courses provide service members and their families with the foundation and resources they need to successfully navigate their own transitions."

Supported by the Schultz Family Foundation, this series of 13 videos covers topics from building an effective transition plan to resume writing. Each course is presented in a visual, engaging style by experienced veterans, business and philanthropy leaders, and subject matter experts—including former Secretary of Defense Robert Gates, General Pete Chiarelli of the U.S. Army, and Howard Schultz, co-founder of the Schultz Family Foundation and former CEO of Starbucks.

"The transition school portfolio represents the collaboration and dedication of senior leaders across private, public, and philanthropic sectors. Together, our goal is to ensure that service members can build on their military experience as they transition to their next mission," said Daniel Pitasky, executive director of the Schultz Family Foundation. "We are proud to partner with organizations like PsychArmor Institute to provide tools and resources for service members and their families that can help ease the transition to civilian life. It's good for everyone—including our communities and our businesses."

Access to Capital Ready to Grow Your Business?

Top Small Business Grants for Women

For an entrepreneur seeking financing, the ultimate fantasy (well, except for winning the lottery) is receiving a grant. That's because grants, unlike loans, don't need to be repaid. Nor do they require you to give up some of your precious ownership in your business the way investors do.

As you might expect, grants aren't exactly easy to come by. Similar to scholarships that students earn for college, finding grants for which you are eligible, going through the application process, and following up requires time and effort. However, the payoff can be worth it.

Grants exist for all types of reasons and from many sources. The federal government gives grants; so do nonprofits and corporations. In this post, I'm focusing on grants for women business owners.

As women entrepreneurs have become a major force in the world of small business, there's less and less need for grants programs specifically aimed at women. However, some still exist: here are five of them.

1. The Amber Grant

This grant honors the memory of a young woman who wanted to be an entrepreneur but died at age 19 before she could achieve her goal. Launched 20 years ago and operated by WomensNet, this program gives a monthly \$2,000 grant to one woman business owner. At year-end, one of the monthly winners is chosen for an additional \$25,000 grant. Learn more about the Amber Grant.

2. Cartier Women's Initiative Awards

This global grant for women entrepreneurs is open to women worldwide, as long as they are in the initial stages of developing their businesses. Out of seven global regions, a total of 21 finalists are chosen. All the finalists get personalized business coaching, attend entrepreneurship workshops, and have access to networking events. Businesses that meet the proper criteria also receive a scholarship to attend the INSEAD Social Entrepreneurship 6-Day Executive Programme. In addition, seven laureates receive \$100,000 in prize money, and 14 finalists receive \$30,000.

3. Tory Burch Fellows

Entrepreneur Tory Burch founded the Tory Burch Foundation to help women business

owners succeed. The Foundation's Tory Burch Fellows program chooses 10 Fellows annually; each receives a \$10,000 grant, a trip to Tory Burch headquarters for three days of networking and workshops, and a year of ongoing support. Each Fellow is also given the opportunity to pitch their business concept to a panel of judges and compete for a \$100,000 investment. (Half of the money is a grant and half is a recoverable grant, which is equivalent to a zero-interest loan). Learn more about Tory Burch Fellows.

4. Open Meadows Foundation

The Open Meadows Foundation gives grants of \$2,000 to women-led organizations that promote gender, racial and economic justice and that work to benefit women and girls. Organizations

You might think construction businesses are less susceptible to cyberattacks than other industries. However, construction companies collect a large amount of data that is attractive to cyber criminals, including employee information, client data and intellectual property, specifications, and more. In fact, the data breach that affected Target stores in 2013 resulted from a hacking attack against an HVAC contractor servicing the retailer. Small contractors are not immune and are often easier targets due to smaller IT budgets and fewer security resources.

Some causes of data breaches for contractors include lost devices, hacked systems, malicious

code (malware), improper disposal of records, and employee (insider) action. Additionally, as more and more networked technology is incorporated into construction equipment, that equipment can be targeted by cyber criminals as well. To defend against these threats, your data security plan should contain several key components:

- Automatically update your firewall and antivirus software and apply all security-related software patches provided by vendors.
- Be sure all mobile devices have both hardware and software encryption.
- Regularly train employees on cybersecurity.
- Secure your Wi-Fi network both within your office and at job sites with encryp-

tion and a strong password. MAC filtering can restrict your network to allow only approved devices.

- Regularly back up data to an offsite location.
- Screen all vendors you use to verify their

cybersecurity practices.

Being proactive is always the best defense so your business is not an easy target for hackers. However, in the unfortunate event of a cyber loss, be sure you have cyber insurance in place, which can provide coverage for both first- and third-party claims.

And looking at milestones, next year, we will celebrate the 100th anniversary of the Nineteenth Amendment. The right to vote was a fundamental transformation for women in and of itself, however, it also paved the way for monumental changes in the way we are now able to participate in every facet of the society and the economy.

Your efforts come at a pivotal moment, as we in the U.S. government are focusing on promoting extensive platforms that will increase every opportunity for women all over the world to have the training, mentorship and resources they need not only to compete, but to succeed in every marketplace.

I couldn't agree more with the line featured on the NAWBO website: "Success is a combination of being at the right place, at the right time, and doing something about it. For entrepreneurs and women in general, that place and time is right now."

I always reiterate to my team in Washington, that we must constantly work to connect with U.S. businesses and support their work, leveraging those connections to spread American prosperity. This is especially true when it comes to women-owned and women-led businesses.

I was very happy to see that in 2018, Florida had the fastest growth rate of new women-owned business in the nation with a 58% increase since 2007, according to a report by American Express

Women entrepreneurs like you are driving nation-wide progress on employing more workers and bringing prosperity to the small towns that are the heart of American economic activity. As a native Floridian, I am so pleased to see my home state doing well in an area that I believe is critical to our national economic growth.

My mission as Assistant Secretary of the Economic Bureau at the State Department is to level the playing field for U.S. companies, to boost opportunities for U.S. exporters, and to ensure that we advance women's economic empowerment throughout all our lines of effort.

When it comes to women's enterprise, we've come a long way, but there is still work to be done.

Organizations like NAWBO enable us to come together and discuss how to overcome the challenges we still face and seize opportunities for every woman.

Our current National Security Strategy states that "Societies that empower women to participate fully in civic and economic life," are "more prosperous and peaceful." The Administration will "support efforts to advance women's equality, protect the rights of women and girls, and promote women and youth empowerment programs."

In early February, the President officially launched the Women's Global Development and Prosperity Initiative (W-GDP). Exactly as the name implies, when women participate fully in the labor force, the GDPs of nation's rise. The W-GDP is the first whole-of-government effort to advance global women's economic empowerment. The initiative aims to reach 50 million women by 2025 and will focus on the following three pillars: (1) Women's Entrepreneurship, (2) Workforce Development and (3) Enabling Environment.

Through W-GDP, the United States is committed to expanding entrepreneurship, unleashing access to capital and technology, enhancing women's labor force participation, and addressing the underlying barriers that prevent women's equal participation in the economy.

We recognize that advancing women's economic participation is fundamental to achieving our economic policy goals. I believe we accomplish this goal by engaging the private sector to promote women's economic empowerment. Whether we are paving the way for businesses to access overseas markets, negotiating air transport agreements, or supporting innovation by bolstering intellectual property protections, we are working toward a better and stronger business environment. Very simply, that means better supporting YOU.

There is an expression, "if she can't see it, how can she be it?"

I hope that the next generation of women see themselves as leaders and that women's economic empowerment is not necessarily a topic of discussion, because women are just naturally there. And that starts here, and I believe it starts with ensuring the private sector understands that investing in women is about economic success. I work to better connect the Department to the private sector. My goal is to ensure U.S. private sector concerns are integrated into our policy priorities.

I want to tell you a little bit about my bureau's POWER – or the "Providing Opportunities for Women's Economic Rise" Initiative. POWER is a multi-tiered program that connects the U.S. private sector with U.S. government initiatives overseas on women's economic empowerment issues. I am particularly excited to tell you about it because a group of NAWBO entrepreneurs were part of the inspiration for this initiative. Last year, I met with a NAWBO members, who were amazingly successful here in the U.S. and they asked me about scaling their enterprises globally. And in my travels, I heard the same from women entrepreneurs in Europe, Asia, Africa, everywhere.

And I thought maybe I can do something to connect all of these amazing women around the world and empower them by connecting them to each other and to opportunities.

So POWER uses a coordinated channel to convene and work with U.S. private sector entities. This group includes women business owners, industry experts, and investors, who will identify and link U.S. private sector priorities to opportunities abroad in support of women in business.

Over the past year, my team has been meeting with U.S. private sector firms to better understand the needs and challenges they see when it comes to economically empowering women. We have spoken with over a dozen U.S. companies and private sector entities, including NAWBO, which has been a vital stakeholder to help us better identify issues women like yourselves are facing when building and expanding your business.

In the coming year, we look forward to deploying our programs and serving as a partner for private sector partners looking to work together to empower women globally.

I wanted to describe one story that I found particularly meaningful.

When officers at one of our embassies in South America noticed that very few of the bidders on embassy contracts were women, they dug deeper to see how they could better engage womenowned businesses. The answer actually was not that complicated.

They developed an outreach program focused on procurement training for women-owned businesses. Within one year, this prompted an increase from \$70,000 in embassy contracts with women-owned businesses in 2016 to over \$580,000 in contracts in 2017.

By engaging in this way, the embassy increased competition in the market, which in turn lowered costs for U.S. taxpayers.

This is one of many examples demonstrating that economic empowerment of women is not just the right thing to do, it is smart business. But we need to keep pushing the envelope and seizing opportunities. I will be working with my team in DC to see how we can take this success
