# Construction Employment Increases In 212 Of 358 Metro Areas Between September 2022 And September 2023 As Demand Outpaces Worker Supply

Construction employment increased in 212 of 358 metro areas between September 2022 and September 2023, according to an analysis by the Associated General Contractors of America of new government employment data. Association officials said the figures come as many construction firms work to find new ways to recruit and retain enough workers to keep pace with demand.

"The number of metros adding construction employees has slipped in recent months," said Ken Simonson, the association's chief economist. "But contractors continue to report they are busy and have large backlogs, so the decline in metros with job gains probably reflects the dearth of qualified unemployed workers, not weaker demand"

Dallas-Plano-Irving, Texas added the most construction jobs (17,300 jobs or 11 percent), followed by New York City (15,200 jobs, 10 percent); Baton Rouge, La. (9,000 jobs, 19 percent); Portland-Vancouver-Hillsboro, Ore.-Wash. (8,700 jobs, 11 percent); and Atlanta-Sandy Springs-Roswell, Ga. (7,300 jobs, 5 percent). The largest percentage gains were in Baton Rouge, followed by Corvallis, Ore. (13 percent, 200 jobs), Fayetteville-Springdale-Rogers, Ark.-Mo. (11 percent, 1,600 jobs); Portland-Vancouver-Hillsboro; and Dallas-Plano-Irving.

Construction employment declined over the year in 78 metro areas and was unchanged in

68 areas. The largest job loss occurred in Houston-The Woodlands-Sugar Land, Texas (-8,800 jobs, -4 percent), followed by Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall, Fla. (-4,700 jobs, -9 percent); St. Louis, Mo.-Ill. (-4,500 jobs, -6 percent); Nassau County-Suffolk County, N.Y. (-4,100 jobs, -5 percent); and San Francisco-Redwood City-South San Francisco, Calif. (-2,400 jobs, -6 percent). The largest percentage decrease occurred in Kankakee, Ill. (-13 percent, -200 jobs), followed by Bay City, Mich. (-12 percent, -200 jobs); Pittsfield, Mass. (-9 percent, -200 jobs); Binghamton, N.Y. (-9 percent, -400 jobs), and Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall.

Association officials noted said that member firms were finding new ways to recruit workers amid ongoing tight labor market conditions. They noted that construction employers are modernizing the way they recruit, including using digital advertising and building partnerships with local school districts. They added that the association is supporting those recruiting efforts with its own advertising campaigns and resources, like Culture of Care, to help members better retain workers.

"Construction firms are going to great lengths to recruit and prepare enough workers to keep pace with demand," said Stephen E. Sandherr, the association's chief executive officer. "We are working with those firms to help encourage more people to pursue high-paying careers in construction."

# San Quentin Prison is decaying and California would rather 'transform' it than fix it

On each of the five floors of the west block building at San Quentin State Prison is a maintenance sheet that lists year-round problems.

"Water leaking in cell from chase again" was written by a prisoner on a maintenance sheet on the first floor. "Sink drain needs cleaned (sic) out," another wrote. "Wall, sink, toilet area leaking," wrote an occupant of another cell.

Steven Baumgartner's toilet does not flush properly.

"It's been doing it ever since I've been here, and I've been here for a year," he said. He reported it six months ago. "In fact, I was going to report it again."

There are so many unhealthy conditions of confinement that have existed so long that they're practically invisible to men there. Well, invisible to some.

Gov. Gavin Newsom's plan to convert San Quentin into a rehabilitation center does not address the deplorable living conditions at the 171-year-old prison.

The list of problems on the maintenance sheets in the west block span time periods from a few days to several weeks or even months. Some problems don't get fixed.

"Hot water won't shut off – second request," a prisoner in cell 1-W-33 wrote.

The California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation's whopping \$14.4 billion budget and the governor's \$360.6 million price tag to turn San Quentin into a rehabilitation center has

seemingly turned away from the existing problems with the prison's infrastructure. Little has been said about the \$20 million the governor promised for "various improvement projects," but maintenance needs topped \$1.6 billion in 2021.

The overcrowded prison places an excessive strain on its aging infrastructure. Each cell was originally designed to hold one prisoner. Today, most cells are doing double duty, housing two men.

It's not easy to have work done. Harry Terry, who lives in a cell on the first floor, asked maintenance to look into a lack of hot water in his sink. He told me his toilet button sticks, too, and that he has listed the problem twice.

"It's been at least two or three months," Terry said. "Now I'm just living with it."

Correctional officers say they call maintenance "if it's an emergency." For everything else, an inmate building clerk collects the maintenance sheets to create a record and write a work order.

Every floor has maintenance problems. I counted 12 on the second floor; none on the third (because a new sheet had been placed there); five on the fourth floor and 10 on the fifth. The problems are wide-ranging: cells in need of paint, no hot water, lights burned out, sinks clogged, water leaks, ventilation problems and toilets clogged or having low pressure.

Toilets present a particularly gross sanitary problem when they do not flush properly, due to problems with water pressure.

For years, prisoners in the west block have been waiting for San Quentin to repair the leaks in the

The rise of digital standards, 3D/4D/5D design models, reality capture and other technology advances are coming together to create more seamless workflows, timely insights and smart monitoring. They are improving accuracy, speed and flexibility, and adding automation.

A task that used to require days or sometimes months of in-field data gathering, and considerably more time in the office analyzing, evaluating convergence or moving data between solutions, is now remarkably streamlined. Technology enables project teams to handle and analyze mass amounts of data with speed. Further, scan data and design-based BIM (building information modeling) models can be linked and utilized with other resources from design simulations to real-time earthwork activities.

Following are three areas topping the list of technology trends foundational to tunnel survey construction, maintenance and monitoring: sensor fusion, artificial intelligence (AI)

and deep learning, and common data environments (CDE).

#### **Melding Data**

With these combined sensors, surveyors can increase productivity by up to 70%, while reducing rework and waste and construction down time all with greater accuracy during tunnel surveying.

first-floor chase where standing water has been accumulating – along with dust, dirt and possibly mold from years of moisture.

In the dining hall, we have to be cautious where we sit. We often have to look up and make sure pigeons are not ready to bomb our meals with droppings or feathers. On the walls, under a gun rail, paint has been peeling for years.

At some level, the conditions in the west block have a criminogenic effect on some of the men who live there because the underlying message received is that no one cares.

Money will not fix these problems, though. People will.

# Warren County Waynesville Road Bridge Rehab Project Update

As work continues on the bridge rehabilitation project on Waynesville Road over Interstate 71 in Warren County, lane closures will be in place this week.

On Wednesday, November 8, contractors for the Ohio Department of Transportation will remove the existing parapet walls on the Waynesville Road bridge over I-71, requiring lane closures on the interstate. Beginning at 9 p.m., the right lane of I-71 North will be closed until approximately midnight. Then, the left lane of I-71 North will be closed until 5 a.m. Thursday, November 9. Traffic will be maintained.

As a reminder, Waynesville Road is closed through December 23, and while the route is

The entire project also includes rehabilitating bridges over I-71 on Stubbs Mill (which is complete), and Irwin Simpson roads at a later date.

The Prus Construction Company was awarded a contract for approximately \$4.2 million to complete the project, and all work is scheduled to be completed in the fall of 2024.

Their resistance to change can be a challenge, but they can also be a valuable asset when you decide to enhance your safety program using safety software.
