


# Though critical to the economy, California's young workers toil in low-wage work

More than 2 million people ages 16 to 24 are working in California — about the same as the population of Houston — making up 12% of the workforce. They comprise a critical portion of the state's economy, according to a new report by the UCLA Labor Center.

But many young people earned low wages, worked long hours — often while going to school — and lacked sufficient worker protections and benefits. These hardships may impact their financial future and the state's economy for years to come, said researchers who examined the years surrounding the COVID-19 pandemic, 2019 to 2021.

"Young people are critical actors in California's vibrant economy and labor force," says the study, released today. "Yet, young workers in California find themselves navigating a tumultuous landscape of societal shifts, economic challenges, and the lingering aftermath of a global pandemic."

About 64% of California's young workers earned low wages — defined as about \$18 an hour, two-thirds of the median wage — and 60% reported difficulty affording their expenses, researchers wrote.

The assumption that young people work at service-oriented, low-wage jobs temporarily before they're propelled to full-time careers isn't necessarily true, said UCLA researcher Vivek Ramakrishnan. Many young people stay in low-wage jobs for years. "When we're looking at the data, we're seeing young people are really struggling in these kinds of roles," he said, adding later, "There's a sense you can get stuck working in the service industry."

The report analyzed data from multiple sources, including the U.S. Census Bureau's American Community Survey, the COVID-19 Household Pulse Survey — which documented the impact of the pandemic — and the federal Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Young workers reflect California's growing diversity. About 3 in 4 are people of color and more than half are Latino. About 15% of high school-aged young people worked full time and half of young people ages 19 to 24 worked full time.

#### Young workers' trap

In the service industry, 40% of young workers are employed in bars, restaurants and retail.

These young people run the risk of being caught in a "circular labor trap," the study says, because these low-wage service jobs are structured with little room for growth or skill development.

"When you have these skill sets that are hyperspecific toward these industries, and not much room for growth, it's hard to compete against students who may take an unpaid internship in a very content-specific area of expertise and gain connections in the career they want to go into," Ramakrishnan said.

Because so many service industry jobs were considered frontline jobs, the pandemic was

She says she wants to empower other women to pursue an electrical career because many don't make it far. Her goal is to foster equity in construction and encourage women to pursue their dreams in the field.

#### Solar Installer

Addressing excessive power consumption starts with promoting renewable energy. Solar panels have increased in demand as more organizations worldwide use this source. The International Energy Agency (IEA) says solar energy accounts for 4.5% of the world's electricity generation, increasing by 26% since 2021.

Solar power's increased demand means a continued rise in the solar installer job market. The BLS says solar photovoltaic installers see 22% job growth between now and 2032, faster than the national average for most jobs. These professionals install and maintain solar panels to ensure they work correctly and reduce the strain on electrical grids.

Some countries don't have reliable power grids, making electricity unreliable in developing nations. However, organizations like the United Nations, the World Bank and others aim to bring solar power and stability to affected communities. These entities financially support businesses serving their communities with renewable energy.

For example, M-Kopa Solar is a Kenyan startup acquiring 100,000 monthly customers due to its recent capital buildup. This company provides solar panels and jobs in East Africa and has expanded operations to Nigeria, Ghana and South Africa. Residents can heat and cool their homes and care for their loved ones easier with this technology.

#### **Heavy Equipment Operator**

Large buildings require giant machines with skilled heavy equipment operators. These professionals have specialized training to navigate bulldozers, excavators, cranes and loaders.

### Though critical to the economy, California's young workers toil in low-wage work

particularly disruptive for young people, who often had to choose between their health and their income. And when grocers and restaurant businesses closed during the pandemic, younger workers, especially young people of color, experienced higher levels of unemployment or underemployment compared to older workers in other industries.

In 2020, the unemployment rate for California's young workers increased to 18% from 9% the year before. That was twice the rate of workers ages 25 to 64.

Unemployment among young people has since rebounded to pre-pandemic levels at 8.7% nationally, according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics.

While many young people are stuck in lowerwage jobs, the research suggests they are contributing significantly to their household income. And about 12% of young workers are heads of households, according to the report. Young workers are overrepresented in households living below the poverty line compared to those over the age of 25. About 14% of young workers lived in poverty compared to 5% of older workers, according to the report. A third lived in households with incomes below 200% the federal poverty line. That number in 2021 was \$53,000 for a family of four.

#### Working through school

Along with responsibility for helping family members cover basic expenses, young people often have to balance work with education, in pursuit of a better future.

About half of young workers go to school. and about 40% of them worked 15 to 29 hours a week, the report says. One-fourth of workers in high school, and more than half in college, worked 20 hours or more a week. And about 17% of young workers worked 40 hours or more weekly.

Postsecondary education became more essential for a stable career, yet with education costs increasing, it was less accessible for young people, according to the report. From 2018 to 2020, the share of California high school graduates enrolled in postsecondary education within 12 months fell from 65% to 63%, according to the study.

While nearly all racial and ethnic groups experienced declines in college matriculation, Black college-going rates plunged from 61% to 55%, and American Indian and Alaska Native rates dropped from 53% to 47%.

Nationally postsecondary enrollment began rebounding last fall, though study researchers said they don't know yet if that's the case in California.

Meanwhile, from 2019 to 2020, young peoples' average student loan amount increased from \$6,847 to \$10,000.

#### **On-the-job training?**

One in 3 jobs in California requires some college education, the study notes. Yet as higher education costs and student debt climbed, job earnings haven't kept up.

Aside from education, researchers found other pathways toward higher paying jobs and careers also are not very accessible to young people. For instance, trade apprenticeships are significantly underutilized. In 2022, there were about 80,000 federally registered apprenticeships in California, but only 24,000 were filled, the study said.

Latino workers held the majority of apprenticeships, 66%, while Black young people held 4%. Most apprenticeships went to young men, 94%, while young women held 6%.

Many apprenticeships are linked to unions. While surveys show young people are more pro-union than ever, they're underrepresented in unionized jobs. Just 9% of young workers are union members, compared to 19% of older workers.

Ramakrishnan said the data paints a "scary" picture of the realities young people face, but it also highlights some areas where policy changes can help.

### Next round of Brownfield grants starts Dec. 5

### Grants aid Cleveland's post-industrial transformation

Several things have long slowed Cleveland's post-industrial transition to embrace new economic drivers. One of the biggest is the lack of large, clean properties near existing labor. The city recently announced a \$50 million land assembly program that could be boosted to \$100 million with other funding. While some of that funding could come from the private sector, another source may well come from a new round of state funding to aid redevelopment, announced today.

The Ohio Department of Development released details on a new round of grant funding available through a program that has already helped hundreds of communities across the state clean up hazardous sites and prepare them for redevelopment. Development released detailed guidelines on the upcoming round of the Ohio Brownfield Remediation Program, including project requirements, eligibility, and the timeline for awards.

This new round of the Brownfield Remediation Program will provide nearly \$350 million in grants over the course of the state's two-year budget (2024-25 which started on July 1, 2023) to clean up industrial, commercial, and institutional brownfield sites that are abandoned, idled, or underutilized due to a known or potential release of hazardous substances or petroleum.

"Many of these longtime eyesores are standing in the way of growth in our communities," said Governor Mike DeWine in a written statement. "Since launching this program, we've helped remove these barriers to progress across the state, and we're excited to partner with local leaders in even more communities to continue this important work."

The first three rounds of the program – announced in April, June, and December of 2022 – provided nearly \$350 million to support 313 projects in 83 counties. The last award included multiple projects in Greater Cleveland, including eight projects in Cleveland and one each in suburban Middleburg Heights and Solon won a total of \$20 million in Brownfield grants.

The largest of those was a \$6 million grant to clean up the former Republic Steel's Upson Nut & Bolt Plant site on Scranton Peninsula just south of downtown Cleveland. That funding was used to remediate soil for a 316-unit apartment complex called The Peninsula now under construction by NRP Group. Another big winner was K&D Group which got \$4.66 million to clean up downtown Cleveland's historic United Church of Christ building, 700 Prospect Ave., for conversion to 120 apartments and 6,800 square feet of ground-floor commercial uses.

"As I've traveled across the state, I've seen firsthand how this funding is not just cleaning up hazardous sites – it's breathing new life into our neighborhoods, our small towns, and our cities," said Lydia Mihalik, director of the Department of Development. "Under the leadership of Governor DeWine and Lt. Governor Husted, and with support of the Ohio legislature, we're empowering communities to turn what was once a source of concern into a beacon of hope for the future."

The DeWine-Husted Administration created the Brownfield Remediation Program in 2021 in partnership with the Ohio General Assembly. This new round of funding was made possible through continued support in the 2023 biennium budget bill, House Bill 33. The Department of Development administers the program. As required by House Bill 33, each county will have access to a \$1 million set-aside, with the remaining funds awarded on a first-come, first-served basis.

Projects that assess or remediate brownfield properties are eligible for funding. Each county has designated a lead entity which may apply for funding on behalf of the county. Entities that contributed to the contamination of properties are not eligible to apply. The Brownfield Remediation Program is part of Governor Mike DeWine's Ohio BUILDS Initiative, which focuses on supporting targeted solutions that impact quality of life, such as water infrastructure improvements, broadband expansion, brownfield redevelopment, and the demolition of blighted buildings.

The Department of Development will begin accepting grant applications on Tuesday, Dec. 5, 2023. Applications will close at 11:59 p.m. Monday, April 1, 2024. Development staff will host a webinar at 10 a.m. on Monday, Nov. 20, to present the guidelines in detail and allow interested parties to ask questions. Program information and full guidelines can be found on the program webpage.
