In 2025, the engineering and construction industry's early growth momentum was increasingly tested by emerging challenges as the year progressed: Real value added climbed to US\$890 billion in the second quarter-a 1% increase year over year—while real gross output reached US\$1.732 trillion, reflecting a 0.6% fall. By July, total construction spending declined almost 3% year over year, primarily driven by downturns in commercial (-8.2%) and manufacturing (-7%)construction. At the same time, firms grappled with persistent inflation, elevated interest rates, tariff uncertainty, acute labor shortages, supply chain disruptions, and material price spikes. contributing to tightened margins and stretched

Despite challenges, there were notable areas of optimism: A surge in artificial intelligence-driven data center construction and associated focus on energy infrastructure led to segment growth. Advanced manufacturing, health care, and defense activities hinted at selective growth opportunities. Investment in structures is projected

The California High-Speed Rail Authority (Authority) recently celebrated the fifth anniversary of the Central Valley Training Center (CVTC) by recognizing 20 new graduates to complete the program. With the addition of new graduates, the CVTC has surpassed another major milestone of more than 300 students completing the pre-apprenticeship program, ready for a career in transportation

Student Yvette Castro learned about the program thanks to a mentor's recommendation. After learning how to work with an electrical conduit, she took the next steps to become an electrician.

When asked about what kept her through the program, she replied, "My motivation throughout this program has been my mom. Ideally, I want to be in a good spot financially to support myself and her, so she won't have to work so

To date, more than 3,000 individuals have inquired about the CVTC program. Students are then screened, assessed and scheduled for an orientation.

The CVTC introduces students to 10 construction trades and provides hands-on training

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alongside journeymen from fields such as ironwork, carpentry, roofing and masonry. Graduates also earn several industry certifications to help them enter the workforce

The program is a partnership among the Authority, the Fresno-Madera-Kings-Tulare Building Trades Council, Fresno County Economic De-

velopment Corporation, Fresno Economic Opportunities Commission and the City of Selma.

Governor Newsom advances efficiency efforts, announces five new projects completed to improve state government

Governor Newsom's California Breakthrough advisory group — a preeminent group of technology and corporate executives — met Tuesday with the Governor to present new solutions to help advance efficiency and stronger services in state government. Along with the meeting, the Governor also announced five new projects resulting from this effort. Through these projects and others, California is delivering measurable results across state operations — cutting costs and time, modernizing systems, and improving services for California residents.

We're going to keep making government better, faster, and more responsive for Californians. California is home to the most innovative talent — people who wake up every day thinking about how to solve big problems, and we're tapping that spirit to modernize how government serves you.

In just a few months since announcing the California Breakthrough Project, we've already identified real ways to save time and money, cut through the nonsense, and made the experience of dealing with state government simpler and more user-friendly. That's the mission: government that works for you, not the other way around.

An all-hands solution to government efficiency

Tuesday at SV Angel headquarters in San Francisco, Governor Newsom met with the California Breakthrough Group. The group, which first met on June 6, includes Asheesh Birla (Investor), Ron Conway (Founder, SV Angel), Chris Larsen (Executive Chair, Ripple), Jeff Lawson (Co-founder and former CEO, Twilio), Jen Pahlka (author of Recoding America), Jason Wheeler (former CFO of Tesla), Dani Dudeck (Chief Corporate Affairs Officer, Instacart), and leaders from companies including AME Cloud Ventures, Anduril, Coinbase, Instacart, and Snap Inc. At today's event, the group welcomed three new members: Andre Haddad (CEO of Turo), Sam Rodriques (CEO of FutureHouse and Edison Scientific), and Scopely.



Earlier this year, the Governor signed an executive order directing every state agency to engage the entire state workforce in efforts to identify and implement novel efficiency measures. The order also created a new Governor's Innovation Fellows Program, state staff with a mission of collaborating to address unique statewide challenges through innovative ideas. At the meeting, the Breakthrough Members provided the Governor with an update on the work underway, including their support of the Innovation Fellows. The Fellows, with assistance from the Office of Data and Innovation (ODI) and UC Berkeley Goldman School of Public Policy, are working with a group on public impact initiatives and state operations improvements.

Efficient, effective, engaged

From hiring practices to water management, here are the latest wins that demonstrate how the state, alongside the California Breakthrough advisory group, is building a more efficient, effective, and engaged government for you:

#1 Fast-tracking state hiring

California has streamlined its hiring process and made applying for and moving between state jobs easier — by merging 67 generalist job titles, covering more than 32,000 positions, into just eight classifications. This will make it much easier for applicants to find the right role and for

current employees to advance their careers and avoid being stuck in narrow job categories. Additionally, changes to peace officer job requirements will open opportunities across 90 classifications, impacting over 26,000 positions. This simplification helps applicants more easily find the right roles while greatly reducing the number of civil service exams applicants need to complete. In an early pilot, the state has also reduced application review time by nearly 87 percent while maintaining the state's merit-based hiring practices.

#2 Transparent Water Rights Records

A new system from the State Water Resources Control Board, the California Water Accounting, Tracking, and Reporting System (CalWATRS), replaces an outdated system that's almost 20 years old. It simplifies the reporting process and reduces errors, and is part of ongoing work to digitize paper water rights records—some well over 100 years old—to make information readily available to the public for the first time through an interactive map. The new system also helps state officials take action when there is drought. For the first time, it makes the state's 40,000 water rights records easily accessible to the public, while streamlining reporting for water rights holders.

#3 Saving millions through smarter tech contracts

The California Department of Technology (CDT) teamed up with the Employment Development Department (EDD) to consolidate multiple Salesforce license agreements into a single enterprise contract. This strategic move improved the state's negotiating power—saving EDD \$2.3 million, or 10%, on Salesforce costs alone. CDT also successfully negotiated a 12.4% discount under the Cisco CaliONE Statewide Agreement, benefiting eight departments. This strategic consolidation resulted in over \$12 million in savings on hardware purchases for the State of California.

#4 Reducing printing costs

The California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR) combed through traditional printing activities to identify publications and items that no longer needed to be published in paper form or could be distributed digitally. CDCR has ceased printing entire regulatory packages and only prints required notices, moved printed workbooks online, and now prints required notices and visitor passes in-house for a total savings of more than \$563,000.

to pivot from a 2025 decline to modest growth (nearly +1.8%) in 2026, with AI-related data center outlays continuing to support engineering and construction (E&C) work.

The E&C industry enters 2026 confronting rising material costs, persistent labor shortages, and shifting project demand. Meanwhile, digital transformation, data center expansion, and strategic mergers and acquisitions are reshaping project sourcing, financing, and delivery.

Against this backdrop, E&C firms may consider focusing on four key trends when planning their growth strategies.

- Evolving tariffs: Building resilience against supply chain disruptions and rising material
- Shifting priorities: Growing focus on data centers and energy infrastructure to drive E&C's next wave
- Embracing digital transformation: Innovating to optimize capacity, cost, and competitiveness
- Persistent talent shortage: Leveraging digital and workforce innovation to unlock opportunities

1. Evolving tariffs: Building resilience against supply chain disruptions and rising material

Recent tariffs, especially on steel and aluminum, reaching up to 50%—have sharply raised construction material costs. The effective tariff rate for construction goods climbed to a 40-year high of 25% to 30% in 2025. The financial impact is evident: Material prices have risen steadily from May through August 2025.

With E&C firms already operating on narrow margins, facing customer price and schedule sensitivity, or both, these increases, and associated procurement delays are acutely felt. Tariffs have intensified this pressure, compelling firms to adopt new risk management and procurement strategies. Elevated costs are also affecting both ongoing and future projects—with an 88.2 % YoY increase in project abandonment activity for August 2025; this has led developers to revisit budgets and adjust financial projections. Industry research indicates that increased tariffs on building materials like lumber could pose additional challenges to affordability.

According to a survey by Autodesk, nearly half of E&C firm executives classify their supply chains as "fragile due to geopolitical tensions," a figure that continues to rise. In response to these challenges, E&C firms are shifting from ad hoc procurement to more systematic approaches. Many are pursuing "no-regret" strategies that deliver value regardless of how trade policies or market conditions evolve. These include:

Takeoff. It's the first real step in every job. It's where the bid is made or broken. Yet no two estimators do it the same way. Your method might just say more about your personality than you think.

Which type are you?

The 8 Construction Takeoff Personality Types

1. The Sniper

You have one gear: precision. You zoom in on the plans with a laser focus that could burn through a PDF. Every count is exact. Every measurement is down to the fraction of an inch. Nothing gets

Your team can trust your numbers, always. You're the go-to person for complex plans. Just don't expect a lot of small talk while you're in the zone.

2. The Perfectionist

If a line exists, you trace it. If there's a door on the plan, it's counted, categorized, color-coded, and cross-referenced. Your finished takeoffs look like works of art, clean enough to hang in

Your work is beautiful and thorough. But Rome wasn't built in a day, and neither is your takeoff. That attention to detail is great until the bid is due tomorrow.

You trust your gut, and it's usually right. You eyeball dimensions and use your past experience to fill in the gaps. If the team needs a takeoff done quickly, you're the one they go to.

Your confidence is solid. You can knock out a preliminary bid faster than anyone. But that "good enough" number can sometimes lead to some tough phone calls later on.

4. The Historian

Your favorite phrase is, "This is how we did it on the last job." You've got a library of old bids and use them like templates. If it worked then, it'll work now, right?

This approach is practical and saves time upfront. But when the specs change (and they always do), relying on old numbers can kill your margin before the first shovel hits the ground.

5. The Collaborator

You won't click a single button without getting a second opinion. You love team input and are great at keeping everyone in the loop. "Hey, can you take a look at this?" is your mantra.

Teamwork is good. Collaboration is key. Humility is a solid trait. But waiting for three other people to sign off on a door count can slow the whole bid process down.

6. The Innovator

You're the one who won't stop talking about AI and new technology. You're always looking for a better, faster way to do things. You have trial accounts on every new software platform and are the first to try any tool that promises to save a few minutes.

You're pushing the company forward. You find ways to cut busy work and help the team win. Sometimes your experiments fail, but your wins? They're big.

7. The Overthinker

You question everything. You count the outlets, then recount them. Then you check the specs one more time just to be sure. You see potential problems everywhere.

Your bids are usually rock-solid because you've thought of every possible issue and have run the numbers a few times. But all that second-guessing burns a lot of time and can lead to analysis
