As California's fund to fix crumbling schools dwindles to nothing, lawmakers are negotiating behind the scenes to craft a ballot measure that would be the state's largest school construction bond in decades.

But some beleaguered school superintendents say the money will not be nearly enough to fix all the dry rot, leaky roofs and broken air conditioners in the state's thousands of school buildings. And it won't change a system that they say favors wealthy, urban, left-leaning areas that can easily pass local bond measures to make needed repairs.

"The big question is, why can't our kids have school buildings that are safe and as nice as other kids' schools, just a few miles away?" said Helio Brasil, superintendent of Keyes Union School District, a rural TK-8 district in a low-income area south of Modesto. "This school is in such bad shape it can feel like a jail. ... I'm speaking up about this because I feel the system needs to be fixed. I don't want the next generation of students to have to experience this."

Two bills are currently under consideration in the Legislature, both of which would bring in billions to repair school facilities. Assembly Bill 247 would raise \$14 billion for K-12 schools and community colleges, while Senate Bill 28, at \$15.5 billion, includes the University of California and California State University, as well.

Legislators are likely to pick only one bill to send to Gov. Gavin Newsom for approval. AB 247 might

have the advantage because it doesn't include the state's four-year university systems, both of which have means to raise their own revenue. So far it's garnered little opposition, while SB 28 is opposed by two contractors' associations because the bill prioritizes projects that use union labor.

The California Taxpayers Association is neutral on AB 247 but opposes SB 28 because it would increase the amount of money school districts could borrow, leading to higher property taxes. AB 247 doesn't change the borrowing limit.

"It should also be remembered that the school districts get to write the ballot questions, and they always use wording that encourages a 'yes' vote and buries the part about the tax increase," said association spokesman David Kline.

Addressing 'the new reality'

Assemblymember Al Muratsuchi, chair of the Assembly education committee and a co-author of AB 247, said he's confident the governor will approve a school bond for the November 2024 ballot, despite competition from a handful of other pricey bond proposals addressing housing, the fentanyl crisis and flood protection.

For Muratsuchi, a Democrat from Torrance, fixing broken schools should be a top priority for California, especially as wildfires and extreme weather intensify.

"Our classrooms are aging, but we also need to address our new reality," he said. "Classrooms of the 21st century should not only address students' technical needs, but the reality of climate change."

7 Ways to Improve Construction Site Safety

Construction is a risky business by almost any measure: It not only has one of the highest business failure rates of any industry, but construction work also sits atop the list of the most dangerous jobs. The construction industry accounted for about 20% of all work-related fatalities in the U.S. Because this line of work has a greater chance of injury or death than others, construction site safety is a priority for contractors to make sure work zones are safe and workers are protected.

In this article, we'll explore the most common jobsite safety risks — and what contractors can do to improve safety for all parties involved.

Common jobsite safety risks

According to the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA), almost 3 out of 100 full-time workers were injured on the job

in 2019. In that same year, 1,061 construction-related fatalities were recorded.

Based on a history of site inspections and recorded injuries, OSHA developed the Focus Four initiative to highlight the four most common jobsite hazards:

- Falls: Employees are often injured by falling through unmarked or unguarded holes in walking surfaces, and slips and trips can be the result of materials or tools improperly placed throughout the jobsite.
- Caught-in or between: Injuries or fatalities could occur when loose clothing gets caught in belts or pulleys while heavy equipment and foundation walls present two immovable objects that can crush or suffocate an employee.
- Struck-by: Building materials being unloaded overhead by cranes or booms frequently result in struck-by incidents.
- **Electrocution:** Contact with overhead power lines and electrical power boxes

presents risks that can lead to serious injury or death during the construction phase.

It's no surprise that the 10 most frequent OSHA violations mirror the Focus Four risks: Fall protection, ladders, and scaffolding accounted for 60% of the top violations in 2021.

Risks to employees are a top priority for contractors, and threats to health and safety aren't the only cause for concern. Unsafe practices on the site could lead to construction delays, legal fees to defend violations, and breach of contract if safety issues are non-compliant with contract terms.

7 best practices to improve construction site

Here are some of the best steps that contractors can take to maintain safety and compliance standards on construction sites.

1. Make safety a priority

Safety starts at the top of the organization. Owners and company leaders need to prioritize safety

within their company culture. When compliance and accident prevention are part of the daily messaging and work routine, everyone becomes involved in safer operations.

Keep in mind that any safety program's success will hinge on consistent messaging and constant interaction with employees.

2. Create a comprehensive site safety plan

A comprehensive and actionable safety plan will help meet compliance standards and reduce risk on the jobsite.

At a minimum, a quality safety plan will include the following:

A description of each project: its scope and location plus general site conditions

Description of identifiable hazards on the project jobsite

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Many rural California communities are desperate for school construction money

Unlike most other states, California does not have a permanent funding stream for repairing school facilities. Money comes from state and local bonds, which generate finite amounts of money, usually through property taxes. Although California has lavished money on schools in the past few years, most of that money is earmarked for efforts to help students recover from the pandemic. It can't be spent on construction.

Typically, larger, urban and more affluent districts, which also tend to be more liberal, have an easier time raising funds. Not only are voters more likely to approve new taxes – the usual way that districts repay bonds - but property values are higher, thereby bringing in more money. In addition, districts can qualify for matching funds from the state, so "the more you have, the more you get," said Julien Lafortune, a researcher at the Public Policy Institute of California.

In 2022, for example, the Mill Valley School District in Marin County was able to raise \$194 million through a bond that taxed local property owners just 2.6 cents per \$100 of a property's assessed value – in a city where the average home price hovers around \$2 million.

Meanwhile, the same year in rural San Lucas, south of King City in Monterey County, the school district tried passing a bond that would have taxed property owners more than twice that rate, but because the average home price is below \$300,000 the bond would have raised only \$3.6 million. Regardless, voters said no.

"The system is inequitable. More (school facilities) money goes to higher-income students than lower-income students," Lafortune said. "There's an understanding in California that we shouldn't have these big inequities when it comes to books, supplies, resources. There's all these efforts to correct inequities. And yet that's not something that exists for school facilities.'

The state has a hardship fund for school districts that can't cover their share of the matching funds. But the process to get hardship money is complicated, time-consuming and can be overly burdensome for rural superintendents who may also be teaching classes, driving the bus and serving lunch.

In a recent report, the Public Policy Institute of California recommends that California survey the condition of the state's thousands of school buildings and adopt a system that ensures the neediest districts get more money.

Although both bills in the Legislature include tweaks to make funding more equitable, they don't go far enough, said Jeff Vincent, co-founder of the Center for Cities and Schools at UC Berkeley. Nearly 40% of California's school districts can't raise enough through local bonds those that manage to pass them — to cover necessary repair costs. Any statewide bond should include significant aid for rural, small and lowincome districts.

"Districts in areas with lower property values are really struggling," Vincent said. "This means that children in more disadvantaged communities tend to have schools in a greater state of disrepair. ... It's not just a matter of aesthetics. It's an issue of environmental health and safety.'

Better facilities, higher achievement

The stakes are high: students whose schools are in good condition perform 5% to 17% higher on standardized tests, are less likely to be suspended, and are more likely to attend school regularly, according to the California Department of Education. The reason, according to researchers, is that students focus better and have more pride in their school when buildings are comfortable and safe, with good air ventilation and temperature control.

LOCAL, SMALL LOCAL AND SMALL LOCAL RESIDENT BUSINESS ENTERPRISE PROGRAM

District Modification: Based on the availability analysis conducted for this specific professional service, the District has reset the LBU Requirement which may be met with a modified 25% Cumulative Local Business Participation (inclusive of Small Local Business Enterprise (SLBE) and/or Local Business Enterprise (LBE) Participation).

The Local Business Utilization Policy requires that there is a mandatory fifty percent (50%) LBU participation with a 25% or less Local Business (LBE) participation and a 25% or more Small Local or Small Local Resident Business (SLBE/SLRBE) participation for all capital program/construction-related contracts and professional services agreements. (See District Modification for this RFQ/P above).

On April 28, 2021, the Board of Education amended the Local Business Policy which had named the City of Oakland as the singular agency to certify local businesses to include five additional local business certifications. For businesses located in Oakland, Local Business and Small Local Business certifications may also be accepted from the Port of Oakland, Alameda County Transportation Commission, Alameda County Department of General Services, US Department of Transportation California Unified Certification Program, and the California Public Utilities Commission.

The District will follow the City of Oakland Small Business size standards in recognizing Small Local and Small Local Resident Businesses.

Oakland awarded \$40.7 million in Infill Infrastructure Grant Catalytic Funding from the State of California

The City of Oakland is one of seven California cities to receive an award from the State Housing and Community Development department through its Infill Infrastructure Grant Catalytic (IIGC) program.

Oakland's grant of \$40,769,344 will support the development of 673 housing units affordable to residents who earn between 20% and 80% of the area's median income. Funds will be used to support critical predevelopment and infrastructure activities including:

- Vegetation clearing and erosion control;
- a new sewer main, realignment of existing utilities and updating of existing utility lines;
- roads enhancements with new surfacing, curbs, gutters, and sidewalks; and
- capital improvements via storm water management, landscaping, and environmental mitigation and remediation.

This funding will help underserved neighborhoods build greener, more walkable communities and allow residents to live closer to work and other key amenities.

"I am grateful to the State for this grant and to the Oakland Housing & Community Development team that worked hard to secure these critical funds," said Mayor Sheng Thao. "In order to address homelessness, we must create more affordable housing, which is why my budget includes the largest investment in affordable housing in city history. This \$40M grant will help advance our goal of increasing the number of affordable, permanent housing units available to Oaklanders, in an equitable and environmentally responsible way."

The IIGC award will support the development of the following Oakland affordable housing projects and corresponding units:



- 1. Lake Merritt BART Senior Housing 97 units
- 2. 285 12th Street 65 units
- 3. 121 E. 12th Street 91 units
- 4. Liberation Park Market Hall, Cultural Hub and Residences 119 units
- 5. West Oakland BART Transit Oriented Development 101 units
- 6. Villa Oakland 105 units
- 7. Villa Fruitvale 105 units

"State funding programs, especially new ones, are not easy to navigate, but the City of Oakland stepped up and met the challenge by submitting a thoughtful application that responded to key criteria like number of housing units, depth of affordability, and housing density, said Craig Shields, Chief of Climate Investments Branch, State of California's Housing and Community Development Department. "The City was well prepared for this application by achieving Prohousing status just about a year ago, establishing city ordinances that facilitate conversion of underutilized build-

ings to housing, having a compliant housing element, and making land available for housing through the Surplus Lands Act."

"As an Oakland resident, I have seen how housing and infrastructure pose a daily challenge, especially for vulnerable communities. The recent state grant offers hope and progress by funding more affordable housing and infrastructure improvements, said Councilmember Kevin Jenkins. "This grant will help build a more sustainable, inclusive, and thriving Oakland, while ensuring that everyone has access to affordable housing. It will play a vital role in shaping Oakland's future, and we are confident we can make the most of it."

"This important state grant will support the kind of senior and family housing that are essential for preventing displacement in Oakland. I am especially thrilled to see that three projects in District 2, near the Lake Merritt BART Station, will be funded," said Council President and District 2 Councilmember Nikki Fortunato Bas. "In fact, this investment means that one of the projects — at E 12th St. and

2nd Ave. — will break ground early next year. The East 12th Street and Liberation Park sites are on surplus City of Oakland land. It will continue to be a key Council priority to use public land for public benefit."

"We are thrilled with this large investment in our work. The State continues to recognize and support Oakland's aggressive development strategy to build housing affordable to very low-income households and people exiting homelessness," said Emily Weinstein, Oakland's Director of Housing and Community Development.

The IIGC award follows the City's successful application in early 2023 to secure \$2.39 million from the State's Prohousing Incentive Pilot Program grant, as well as a successful application for a \$10 million Regional Early Action Planning (REAP) grant, for a total of \$53 million in funds this year from the State

Homelessness and housing affordability are top priorities for Oakland residents. To address these challenges, the City is carrying out a multi-pronged approach. The Housing and Community Development Department is addressing housing affordability issues through its "3P" framework: Protect Oaklanders from displacement; Preserve the existing affordable housing stock; and Produce new, deeply affordable housing units. The Human Services Department is working to provide transitional housing and supportive services to unsheltered residents. And the Planning and Building Department, in partnership with other departments, is updating the City's Housing Element to provide a plan to accommodate more than 26,000 new units of housing over the next eight years, in accordance with state requirements
