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How to Bid Like You've Already Won the Job

Your approach to bidding, especially in comparison to the competition, will be reflected in your hit ratio. The bid-hit ratio should be balanced, and you want the number of hits to be as high as possible. For example, if your bid-hit ratio is 3:1, it means that you get a third of the jobs you bid on. That's good, but the goal would be to get to a 1:1 ratio and get every job you want.

More jobs equals more referrals, additional opportunities to bid, and winning additional bids for future projects.

So, how can you get your bid-hit ratio up? Here are a few winning practices to improve your bidding process.

4 Practical Tips for Bidding

There are a few tips you can use to bid as if you've already gotten the job and make your bid more successful.

1.) Keep Everything Centralized

The first thing you need to do is to keep everything you need for your bid centralized. Many subcontractors already have flooded inboxes with bid invitations which can be overwhelming and challenging to keep organized. This often leads to missing bids, deadlines, and emails from

important clients. A centralized bid board makes it easier to keep track of all incoming bids in addition to the ones you are already working on.

Furthermore, a centralized system cuts down on the time you need to spend on the information you put on every bid, like addresses, names, or nonspecific quotes. Your online bid board will populate with the information you want to use automatically, saving you time and preventing errors.

Another reason for a focus on centralization is because it prevents duplicate files and consolidates all information in one place. Since you may have multiple bids to work on, having them centralized helps you manage them more easily. On a cloud-based system, you'll have access from anywhere. You can filter through where the bids are coming from and who's working on them, as well.

As an added benefit, if you combine your bidding system with a synchronized calendar, you'll reduce the likelihood of missing out on work or deadlines.

2.) Use Historical Data to Your Advantage

The nice thing about historical data is that it shows you what does or does not work. You probably already have this data available, but are you actually leveraging it to your advantage?

FRA Launches Notice of Funding Opportunities for the Federal-State Partnership for HSR Projects

The Federal Railroad Administration has published the FY22 notice of funding requirements for the Federal-State Partnership for Intercity Passenger Rail Program, a key funding opportunity that could finally make highspeed rail a reality for millions of Americans.

According to the notice, which initiates the application process for the FY22 funding

cycle, the program "will support projects that improve safety, economic strength and global competitiveness, equity, climate and sustainability, and transformation."

High-speed rail projects check every one of these boxes, making the growing number of electric bullet train projects across America highly competitive for funding from the \$12 billion program. High-speed trains have cut oil demand and air pollution around the world by providing an electrified alternative to shorthaul flights, single-occupancy vehicles, and highway and airport expansions.

The Biden Administration has identified highspeed rail projects as a key eligible use of these funds. In an August 2, 2021 fact sheet about the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, the White House mentioned that the law includes "\$12 billion for partnership grants for intercity rail service, including high-speed rail."

Transportation Secretary Pete Buttigieg told a House Appropriations subcommittee in May he plans to use funds from the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law to demonstrate high-speed rail in 2 or 3 geographies, pointing to the Federal-State Partnership Program as a likely source of funding for these projects.

"We deserve better passenger rail in this country," Buttigieg said on October 19. "But for the long run we also do need to be preparing and investing in high-speed, because that's the

standard that most people in developed countries are getting used to. It makes no sense to me why Americans should settle for a standard of speed and convenience on the rails that's inferior to what a citizen could expect if they live in Germany, or Japan, or Italy, or even Turkey, or Morocco. We should have the best in America when it comes to any form of infrastructure."

America has become a global laggard when it comes to high-speed rail. In 26 nations across the world, high-speed trains collectively carry billions of passengers every year. China has built 25,000 miles of high-speed rail since the mid-2000s and is on track to grow its network to 43,000 miles by 2035.

High-speed rail is a necessity because America's polluting, fly-and-drive status quo is reaching its breaking point. Our highways are full and building more of them will not fix the

Secretary of the Treasury Janet L. Yellen at Inaugural Meeting of Treasury Advisory Committee on Racial Equity

Secretary of the Treasury Janet L. Yellen delivered opening remarks at the first meeting of the Treasury Advisory Committee on Racial Equity (TACRE). The first-of-its-kind committee aims to provide advice and recommendations to Secretary Yellen and Deputy Secretary Wally Adeyemo on efforts to advance racial equity in the economy and address acute disparities for communities of color.

As Prepared for Delivery

Good morning, everyone. Welcome to the Treasury Department. And welcome to the first meeting of the Treasury Advisory Committee on Racial Equity.

I'd like to thank you for being here today, and for the work that you've graciously agreed to do. The formation of this committee is a milestone in Treasury's racial equity agenda. This committee will bring a wide set of outside perspectives to advise me, the Deputy Secretary, and other Treasury officials on how we can bolster our equity efforts.

The inaugural members of the committee come from a broad range of backgrounds – from academia to business to local government. But you

all share a commitment to building an economy that works for everyone. I want to thank Mayor Nutter for chairing this committee, and Felicia Wong for serving as vice chair. And I want to thank Janis Bowdler, my Counselor for Racial Equity, and her team for their hard work.

Let me speak briefly about how the committee fits into our work on racial equity.

Since taking office, President Biden has made clear that our Administration's work to recover and rebuild must be inclusive and equitable. Even before the coronavirus hit our shores, we knew our economy had not worked as well as it should for too many people of color. And we knew that this did not just have a negative impact on underserved communities. Economic inequality is a drag on our economy as a whole.

In fact, I have spent the last few months on the road to lay out our "modern supply-side" agenda. This agenda – reflected in the President's economic plan – recognizes that some of the best opportunities for growth come from investing in people and places that have been overlooked. I believe that investments in disadvantaged communities often result in higher relative returns on investment. And they can boost top-line growth by enabling us to tap all our resources.

At Treasury, we have been guided by this principle in our work. Our first job was to foster a post-pandemic recovery that did not leave any Americans behind. We centered equity in our implementation of the American Rescue Plan – from our housing programs to our aid to state and local governments. Today, economic data indicates that our recovery has been the most equitable in recent history, with record drops in unemployment for many communities of color.

We are also making investments that will drive the future growth of our economy. Over the past vear, the Biden Administration has made three historic investments in the long-term strength of our economy: the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, the CHIPS and Science Act, and the Inflation Reduction Act. Treasury is playing a particularly significant role in the implementation of the Inflation Reduction Act's historic climate change investments - nearly three-quarters of which are estimated to be delivered via tax incentives. You'll hear an update today from Lily Batchelder, our Assistant Secretary for Tax Policy about our efforts there. And you'll also hear from Counselor Natasha Sarin about our efforts to modernize the IRS and ensure that all Americans are playing by the same rules. I believe that these laws provide a transformative opportunity to advance economic fairness.

The Treasury Advisory Committee on Racial Equity will play a major role in our effort. Over the coming months, you will inform our policymaking in areas from tax fairness and capital delivery systems to Treasury's internal efforts to reflect America's diversity in our workforce. And you'll keep us accountable: to make sure we're focused on our North Star of fostering an economy that unlocks everyone's economic potential – including people of color, rural communities and those most affected by climate change. Our entire economy benefits when all Americans reach their full potential.

The work of this committee will make a difference for many Americans. I'm looking forward to hearing your perspectives in this meeting. And I'm looking forward to working together to ensure communities of color and other underserved communities benefit from – and participate in – the economic growth and investments enacted by this Administration.

Again, thank you for all you are doing. Mayor Nutter, I'll turn it over to you.

A data-driven bidding strategy can help you make better decisions about what you want to bid on. For instance, use your historical data to review information such as which general contractors are inviting you to bid on their projects and see what your win rates are with them. It's also just as important to know which GCs you're bidding with but not winning to determine if it's worth your resources to continue pursuing.

To start, you need a system that consolidates and aggregates bid management data, because while you can have data on a static board or spreadsheet, drawing meaningful insights can be challenging and highly manual. Seeing different trends lets you make decisions about how to

spend your time on the bids you are invited to make. This helps you reduce the number of bids you make when you are unlikely to win and increases the likelihood of winning the bids you do make. Beneficially, a detailed reporting system helps you be transparent, sharing details with your team, stakeholders and others.

3.) Bid On and Bid Out Work From One Place

Specialty contractors usually need to solicit bids from other subcontractors. The process can be long and complex, requiring them to re-enter the same data multiple times, send numerous emails with the right files, track everything in spreadsheets and so on

With this complexity comes the risk of losing information and making errors, which can be

damaging to the bid. Once again, a centralized bid management system can help here. The right platform allows you to manage and keep track of all bid invites that come in and are sent out. All information is kept in the same place, so you don't have to worry about missing files or redundant data entry, all while saving you hours of time. It's as easy as switching from bidding on work to soliciting bids for the same project so you can get bids out the door faster.

4.) Add Your Business Enterprise Certifications

Owners are increasingly contractually required to award a certain percentage of project costs to specific business enterprises. The disadvantaged business enterprises (DBE) program is a prime example of this, along with other subcategories,

such as Minority Business Enterprise (MBE), Women-Owned Business Enterprise (WBE), and more.

If you're a specialty contractor and belong to any of the groups mentioned above, it's important to get certified and promote your credentials so you can win more work.

problem of ever-increasing congestion. Transportation planners have known for decades that widening and building new highways reliably draws ever more cars onto the road, creating a vicious cycle of aimless road building that fails to alleviate congestion or address the climate emergency.

The aviation system, too, is hitting the limits to growth. Since communities understandably resist the expansion or siting of major airports in their neighborhoods, the U.S. hasn't built a major new airport in 27 years. As travel demand increases, airports are running out of space to accommodate the growing air traffic.

Electric bullet trains attack the root cause of the congestion crisis by significantly expanding the transportation system's total carrying capacity. While there are 5 seats in the average car and 125 seats in the average plane, there are 900 seats in a standard high-speed train.

"Americans have had it with inefficient, delayed, and congested transportation systems," said Andy Kunz, President of the U.S. High Speed Rail Association. "This program presents a once-in-a-decade opportunity to finally bring high-speed rail to the American people."

Once high-speed rail is available, decades of experience from across the world shows that millions of inter-city travelers will opt for high-speed trains instead of flying and driving, reducing the strain on our whole transportation system and slashing carbon emissions and air pollution across the transportation sector.

Oakland port gateway \$175 million modernisation gets green light

The 7th Street Grade Separation East Project is a joint effort between the Alameda County Transportation Commission (Alameda CTC), CTC and the City and Port of Oakland.

Reconstructing a key access into the port will relieve truck and vehicle congestion, increase safety, and provide flexibility for seaport cargo operations according to the port authority.

This in turn will also contribute to reducing greenhouse gas emissions by curtailing trucks dwell time.

"We would like to thank the state for approving \$175 million to advance the 7thStreet Grade Separation East Project," said Alameda CTC Chair John J. Bauters.

"The project will improve port operations and safety, and provides a new high-quality bicycle and pedestrian pathway connecting the community to the waterfront and recreational facilities.

"The project includes greening requested by the West Oakland community to reduce impacts of goods movement and improve public health."

Alameda CTC will manage the project with financial and engineering support from the Port of Oakland. Other project partners include the Federal Highway Administration, the California Transportation Commission, the California Department of Transportation, Union Pacific Railroad, BART, the Metropolitan Transportation Commission, the City of Oakland and several utility agencies.

The project will commence the construction phase in 2023.

The Port of Oakland witnessed a rise in full imports and exports compared to both last month and October 2021 volumes.

The port handled 145,868 TEU last month compared to 137,776 TEU in October 2021, a 5.9 per cent year-on-year growth.
