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Here's what California could do to help fix the supply chain

If you've never really thought about California's ports or the global supply chain before the past month, that's normal. But they're having problems now, driven by the pandemic, and it's causing a shortage of everything from computer chips to kitchen supplies.

California's problem is a national one, too: The ports of Los Angeles and Long Beach together bring in 40% of all goods shipped to the U.S. by water. So now everyone from port directors to President Joe Biden is interested in fixing the situation.

The backlog's origin story is complicated. Early in the pandemic, factories had to shut down or reduce their output. Shipping companies reduced their schedules, assuming people would be buying less stuff. Protective gear was sent to locations across the globe that don't export many goods, so some of those shipping containers didn't get returned.

Then, people did buy stuff — a lot of stuff. Warehouses struggled to hire enough workers to keep up with demand and they started getting backed up, leaving containers full of new goods at the ports, where they started to create traffic jams, said Chris Tang, a professor at UCLA's Anderson School of Management who studies supply chain issues.

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PRSRT STD U.S. Postage PAID San Fran CA 941 Permit No. 820 This week, California lawmakers talked with experts and stakeholders about what the state could do in the near term to resolve the backlog, and in the longer term, to prevent similar backups in the future.

"I mean, the simple answer to this crisis is that people stop buying stuff, but that's not going to happen," said Assemblymember Patrick O'Donnell, a Democrat whose district includes both the ports of Los Angeles and Long Beach. "So we need to respond, and we need to respond quickly."

Already, federal, state, and local policy makers have taken action. On Oct. 13, Biden announced the Port of LA would operate around the clock, a decision that came after the Port of Long Beach also decided to extend its hours. A week later, Democratic Gov. Gavin Newsom signed an executive order directing state agencies to look for land that could be used as temporary storage, identify freight routes that should be exempted from vehicle weight limits and identify training partnerships with private industry for port and logistics workers. In late October, the federal Department of Transportation said it would offer billions of dollars in loans to shore up California's port and supply chain infrastructure. At the local level, authorities have allowed containers

to be stacked four high, rather than the usual two, and said companies would be fined for leaving containers too long at the ports.

But, experts say the backlog may not be resolved until sometime next year. In the meantime, loitering ships are causing pollution and businesses across the country are facing shortages.

"It has become clear that this is a multifaceted problem, and it will require multifaceted action," said O'Donnell at the hearing. "There is not one switch you can flip."

So what can the state of California actually do to help?

Find land that can temporarily store containers

Dee Dee Myers, director of the Governor's Office of Business and Economic Development, said the solution she'd heard most frequently is for the state to identify parcels of land, either inside or outside port complexes, that can be used as additional temporary storage for containers.

Myers said the agency now has a list of several dozen potential sites, though there are complications for each. The government has a deadline of Dec. 15 to complete its survey, though they may be done sooner, Myers added.

Business Leaders Say New Year Minimum Wage Hikes Will Boost Consumer Spending, Strengthen Recovery

Twenty-one states will be raising their minimum wage to ring in the new year. Another four states and the District of Columbia have increases scheduled later in 2022. Business leaders across the country are speaking in support of the increases, saying they will boost consumer spending, increase productivity and employee retention, and help build a widely shared economic recovery.

In July, Delaware became the 10th state to enact a \$15 minimum wage, with business owners around the state supporting the increase. The first step of the raise will take place on Jan. 1, 2022, when Delaware's minimum wage increases from \$9.25 to \$10.50.

Business owners in states raising their minimum wage are available for comment through the New Year.

Scheduled increases for Dec. 31, 2021 and Jan. 1, 2022 include:

- **California** increases to \$15 on Jan. 1, 2022. Small businesses with 25 employees or fewer have an extra year to comply, reaching \$14 on Jan. 1, 2022 and \$15 in 2023. After the minimum wage reaches \$15 for all employees, it will be adjusted annually for cost of living increases.
- **Delaware** increases to \$10.50 on Jan. 1, 2022, with future increases of \$11.75 in 2023, \$13.25 in 2024, and \$15 in 2025.
- Illinois increases to \$12 on Jan. 1, 2022, with future increases of \$1 a year to reach \$15 in 2025.
- **Maryland** increases to \$12.50 on Jan. 1, 2022, with future increases to reach \$15 in 2025. Small businesses with fewer than 15 employees reach \$12.20 on Jan. 1, 2022, with future increases to reach \$15 in 2026.
- Massachusetts increases to \$14.25 on Jan. 1, 2022 and \$15 in 2023.
- **Michigan** increases to \$9.87 on Jan. 1, 2022. It is scheduled for small annual in-

creases until reaching \$12.05 in 2030 "or a subsequent calendar year."

- **Missouri** increases to \$11.15 on Jan. 1, 2022 and \$12 in 2023, and then is indexed for the cost of living.
- New Jersey increases to \$13 on Jan. 1, 2022, \$14 in 2023, and \$15 in 2024, and then is indexed. Businesses with fewer than six employees increase to \$11.90 on Jan. 1, 2022 and rise gradually to \$15 in 2026, with further increases to reach parity with the regular minimum wage in 2028.

New Mexico increases to \$11.50 on Jan. 1, 2022 and \$12 in 2023.

- New York
 - O Long Island and Westchester increase to \$15 on Dec. 31, 2021.
 - **Upstate New York** increases to \$13.20 on Dec. 31, 2021, with future increases based on an indexed schedule to be set by the Division of the Budget in consultation with the Department of Labor.

- New York City already has a \$15 minimum wage.
- Rhode Island increases to \$12.25 on Jan.
 1, 2022, \$13 in 2023, \$14 in 2024, and \$15 in 2025.
- Virginia increases to \$11 on Jan. 1, 2022 and \$12 in 2023. Increases to \$13.50 in 2025 and \$15 in 2026 can occur if the General Assembly enacts them again by July 1, 2024.

States with indexing where annual cost of living adjustments take effect Jan. 1, 2022 include:

- Arizona increases to \$12.80
 - Colorado increases to \$12.56
 - Maine increases to \$12.75

Minnesota increases to \$10.33 for employers with annual gross revenues of at least \$500,000 and \$8.42 for employers with less than \$500,000

- Montana increases to \$9.20
- Ohio increases to \$9.30

Using other locations as temporary storage is something that private marine terminal operators have been doing for some time, said Robert Leachman, a professor in UC Berkeley's Industrial Relations and Operations Research program. It makes sense, he said, as a short-term solution.

But leaving goods strewn across Southern California could create new problems, such as how best to retrieve them later and negotiate with communities opposed to having a ton of big rigs coming and going, experts said.

Grow the truck driving workforce

Contributing to the backup is a shortage of truck drivers. Truck drivers are independent contractors and are paid per delivery rather than by the hour, Leachman said. When they're stuck waiting at the ports for hours to get their container, it means they're working more hours for the same take home pay. Fewer drivers are willing to take that deal.

There's also a shortage of warehouse workers. "The jobs are hopelessly unattractive so we can't get enough people to fill them," Leachman said. He thinks wages will need to rise to fill those positions.

California transportation secretary David Kim said he's met with the White House, the Governor's Office of Business and Economic Development, California's Labor and Workforce Development Agency, and the Department of Food and Agriculture to discuss driver recruitment and retention. The federal transportation department will also be working with states to expedite the licensing process for truck drivers.

The state can work with universities and community colleges to provide technical training and build the pipeline of people prepared for trucking and logistics jobs, said Nick Vyas, a professor at the University of Southern California's Marshall School of Business. But in the longer term, if it's hard to interest enough workers in these kinds of jobs, automation may be part of the solution, he said.

Tang agrees. In the short run, there's a huge need for truck drivers, but, said Tang, "I think that the long term prospects for truck drivers (are) not good."

Suspend regulations and laws

A coalition of more than a dozen business groups sent Newsom a letter requesting that he suspend several regulations and laws to help solve the supply chain issues. Among their proposals:

- Suspend a variety of environmental regulations and pollution laws;
- Suspend the state's landmark worker status law passed in 2019 that reclassified many independent contractors as employees;

 Suspend a new law passed this year which requires warehouses to disclose to workers any quotas or work speed standards.
 A quick response came from Assemblymem-

A quick response came from Assemblymember Lorena Gonzalez, the San Diego Democrat who introduced both worker laws. She pointed out that the independent contractor law does not currently apply to truck drivers; a battle over an exemption for the drivers is currently wending its way through the legal system. Additionally, the warehouse law isn't slated to go into effect until January of 2022, leading Gonzalez to call the proposals "deceptive." She also said the shortage of truck drivers has been decades in the making, driven by deregulation of the industry and decreasing working conditions.

- South Dakota increases to \$9.95
- Vermont increases to \$12.55
- Washington state increases to \$14.49

Looking ahead, Connecticut will raise its minimum wage to \$14.00 on July 1, 2022 and \$15 on June 1, 2023, with annual indexing beginning Jan. 1, 2024. Nevada, Oregon and the District of Columbia also have increases scheduled for July 1, 2022. Florida's minimum wage will increase to \$11 on Sept. 30, 2022 and then by \$1 a year until reaching \$15 in 2026; Florida will then resume indexing.

The federal minimum wage has been stuck for more than 12 years at \$7.25 an hour since July 24, 2009-the longest period in history without a raise. In February 2021, the U.S. House of Representatives passed the Raise the Wage Act, which would increase the federal minimum wage to \$15 by 2025, as part of the American Rescue Plan, but the Senate did not follow suit.

U.S. Secretary of Commerce Gina M. Raimondo Announces Finalists for \$1 Billion "Build Back Better Regional Challenge"

U.S. Secretary of Commerce Gina M. Raimondo today announced the 60 finalists for the U.S. Economic Development Administration's (EDA) \$1 billion "Build Back Better Regional Challenge" - the marquee of EDA's American Rescue Plan programs - that aims to boost economic pandemic recovery and rebuild American communities, including some that have been grappling with decades of disinvestment. The Build Back Better Regional Challenge provides transformative investments - up to \$100 million per grantee – to develop and strengthen regional industry clusters across the country, all while embracing economic equity, creating good-paying jobs, and enhancing U.S. competitiveness globally.

The 60 finalists – each a coalition of partnering entities – have proposed projects that will develop or scale industry sectors, develop and train the workforce of today, and build resilient economies. Finalists will now compete for Phase 2 of the Challenge, which will award 20-30 regional coalitions up to \$100 million to implement 3-8 projects that support an industry sector. The deadline for Phase 2 is March 15, 2022.

Today's finalists, chosen from a pool of 529 applicants, will each receive a grant of approximately \$500,000 to further develop their proposed projects. These grants will help the finalists take their projects to the next level and position those who ultimately do not receive Phase 2 implementation awards to find new partners and sources of funding. The program has already catalyzed new partnerships and creative approaches to regional economic development.

"The Build Back Better Regional Challenge aims to supercharge local economies and increase American competitiveness around the globe," said Secretary of Commerce Gina M. Raimondo. "The outpouring of interest in this program shows the demand for the Build Back Better agenda and the desire to not only create good-paying jobs, but also strengthen our country's economic resiliency for years down the road."

"We are thrilled to help communities work together—in coalitions of government, nonprofits, academia, the private sector, and others—to craft ambitious and regionally unique plans to rebuild their communities," said Alejandra Y. Castillo, Assistant Secretary of Commerce for Economic Development. "These projects will help revitalize local economies and tackle our biggest challenges related to climate change, manufacturing, supply chains and more. EDA is proud to ignite these plans and help communities nationwide build back better."

Finalists' projects span 45 states and Puerto Rico. Twelve finalists are in coal communities, to which EDA has dedicated \$100 million of the Build Back Better Regional Challenge funds as part of its Coal Communities Commitment. Overall, EDA will allocate \$300 million of its \$3 billion American Rescue Plan appropriation to support coal communities as they recover from the pandemic to help create new jobs and opportunities, including through the creation or expansion of a new industry sector. "In 1972, there were a little over 400,000 women-owned businesses in the United States. Today, there are over 12 million proving that women entrepreneurs have become the fastest growing and one of the most impactful segments of the business community," said Administrator Guzman. "While there has been historic progress in women's entrepreneurship, significant disparities still persist, impacting women entrepreneurs' access to resources and opportunity, especially in the face of the economic challenges posed by CO-VID. That is why I am proud to advance the mission of the Office of Women's Business Ownership and reaffirm our commitment to America's women-owned small businesses."

"Female entrepreneurs are integral to the American economy, starting new businesses at high rates and employing millions. But COVID dealt a severe blow to women-owned businesses, and we can't afford to leave them behind," said Rep. Nydia M. Velázquez (D-NY), Chairwoman of the House Small Business Committee. "I'm pleased to see the Biden-Harris Administration prioritizing driving recovery for these small firms and addressing longstanding inequities for women entrepreneurs. I look forward to continuing to work with Administrator Guzman to eliminate obstacles for women in the small business sector and ensure they are in a position to thrive."

As the fastest-growing entrepreneurial segment in the country, the high growth in entrepreneurship amongst multicultural women is particularly noteworthy. Bill McRae, On Stage Music Academy

A classically trained musician from an early age, Bill McRae spent many years performing and composing. He played keyboards, guitar and bass. After college, he became a music business executive, then a classroom teacher. In 2014, Bill decided he wanted to open a music school. He wanted to share his love of music with students of all ages. Now open, the On Stage Music Academy offers introductory music classes, hands-on education in various instruments and genres, and experience in both recording and live performance.

Bill looked at other music programs and wanted to create something different—his own unique system and school. He grew up in a family business and had worked as a sole proprietor pulling together teams of musicians to play. But opening a business with employees would be a whole new experience. Throughout his career, Bill has always found that reaching out to others for advice and assistance pays off. So he visited the Small Business Development Center hosted by Long Beach City College for help with his idea.

A hands-on team

SBDC Program Coordinator Janice Grass managed Bill's consultations with SBDC Director Mike Daniel and Business Advisors Se' Reed, Brad Pollak, Joseph Jackson, Laura Lara, and Vi Pham. The team at the SBDC helped Bill assess the viability of his idea, complete business and marketing plans, and research suitable locations for his startup. They also guided him to obtain the necessary licenses and permits, negotiate the legal and HR challenges of hiring employees, and learn to use QuickBooks accounting software.

Bill had spent months trying to build a business plan. Daniel showed him how to focus on the financial planning aspect of the business plan. That way, he could immediately assess his idea's viability. "Making sure my business model was financially viable gave me an assurance that I could move forward," Bill says. "That was freeing, because I could start taking [action] instead of waiting until everything was perfect."

With his business plan in place, Bill moved quickly. "The SBDC was very helpful in bouncing ideas off of," he says. Attorney Pham answered his questions about everything from leases and contracts to business structure.

The dream takes shape

Meanwhile, Daniel connected Bill with other service providers. "He helped me find [someone] to work on a logo, people I could reach out to for insurance, an architect, a contractor—he gave me so many names," Bill recalls. After finding an ideal location in Long Beach, Bill again turned to Daniel. He wanted to learn about getting business licenses and permits and having building plans approved.

"Mike has been a sounding board for me," Bill says, "and every bit of information he gave me helped me move forward into the unknown with confidence."

As a sole proprietor, Bill had done bookkeeping before. But getting hands-on help from Quick-Books expert Lara made a huge difference in his comfort level. "I had some training, but [learning from] someone who does bookkeeping dayto-day makes a big difference," he explains. As Bill began to move his business along, he was unsure about whether to hire contractors or employees for his new business. So he turned to Jackson for guidance. "Jackson worked with us on the HR messages that we use when communicating with employees and potential employees [to stay] within California law," McRae says. Daniel and Pollak helped him write an employee handbook, define job descriptions, clarify expectations for employees and develop a workplace culture.

Pollak, a former music executive, provided marketing advice. "Besides being a veteran of the industry and applying his knowledge to my issues, he's very entertaining," says Bill. "We get a lot done in a lighthearted way." Bill worked with Pollak to identify the best marketing channels, refine his message, and create a step-by-step marketing plan that covers everything from an elevator pitch to direct marketing to events.

Meanwhile business advisor, Se Reed helped McRae prioritize how he developed an online presence. "The focus was on developing the website so that anything else we did paid off when people visited it," he says. McRae also avidly attended all of the marketing classes Reed taught.

Starting off on the right foot

"Bill was great to work with and pushed through the [startup] process in a six-month period," said the SBDC Long Beach Director, Mike Daniel. Combining his musical experience with his Business Advisors' expertise, it seems McRae already has a hit on his hands. Just months after the business launch, the school already had a strong base of students. McRae kicked off his marketing using Groupon and Amazon Local of-

fers, which attracted customers from near and far. "A good number of them have continued as students," he says. A successful grand opening attracted the attention of local newspapers. As word-of-mouth built in the neighborhood, Bill was able to target a more specific local clientele.

"Getting advice from people who aren't academics, but who walk the walk, is the biggest benefit [of the SBDC]," he says. "They are so giving."

He was unsure, but when friends and family who knew his talent and skills urged him on, his vision for himself changed. Instead of renting a hair station, he went straight to renting an established barber business.

Truckstop had existed for 50 years and had a built-in clientele, but Mark brought his own as well. When he was still in school, he gave free haircuts to his coworkers at the market. He went to the senior center and gave free cuts to firefighters and kids. He has given many kids their first haircut and after, he takes a picture of them with a fake mustache. It's for fun and the moms love it. "You have to have people skills to do this. And you have to be involved in the community because that's who's coming in here. I've always got my work face on."

Solidifying the dream

When Mark needed a loan, he was referred to West Business Development Center and that's when things started crystallizing for him and his business. West helped him crunch the numbers and put together a business plan presentation for a loan. "I had a very short window and West helped me get through it fast."

West had the expertise and Mark had the hustle. And Mark's confidence was growing. When Starbucks bought out the Truckstop's building, Mark had to apply for another loan for a new shop, now called Airport Barbershop. Once again, West helped with a new business plan. "I didn't think I had business sense, but a lot of that came with West's workshops. I didn't realize it, but I'd already been doing guerrilla marketing. West was my School of Business, basically. They taught me how to use the tools and I already have and translate them into a thriving business."

Now in his fourth year of business, Mark has been able to expand his shop and give himself a raise every year. He sells retail products and has brought in another barber and a cosmetologist as independent contractors. "This is the best money I've ever made, working for myself, but more importantly the feeling is great. It's like a weight off my shoulders, not having to clock in."

A pillar of the community

Beyond creating a living for himself, Mark is contributing to the community. The barbershop is a social scene, where men from all walks of life can let their guard down and shoot the breeze. "We get the firefighters, police, and criminals just out of jail. youngsters and seniors . . . and they're all under the same umbrella here." In the barbershop, everyone gets along and Mark tries to serve as a role model for children in the community as well. He shows them through action what a lot of hard work and a little education can do. "It's been nothing but positive. It feels bigger than me. People look to me."

Mark has found his niche. Having grown up in a household where his mother cut hair, it's not surprising that he owns a barbershop now. His
