Mayor Garcetti announces \$43.6 million in grants for street safety and L.A. River improvements



Mayor Eric Garcetti announced that L.A. has been awarded \$43.6 million from the California Transportation Commission's Active Transportation Program (ATP) to strengthen our city's infrastructure. These funds will help create three miles of new bicycle and walking paths along the L.A. River in the West San Fernando Valley, and improve street safety and dedicated bike lanes in South Los Angeles.

"The path to prosperity is paved with smart investments in our infrastructure," said Mayor Garcetti. "We are fighting for every dollar possible to make our city more livable, reduce traffic fatalities on our roads, drive improvements on our streets, and create new spaces for walking and biking along our river."

The California Transportation Commission awarded two grants to L.A., which were secured with the support of the Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG), the region's Metropolitan Planning Organization, and L.A. Metro

In the West San Fernando Valley, a \$18.8 million grant will open three miles of LARiverWay trails to the public, providing Angelenos with a safe place to walk and bike. The new path will help Metro complete a project on their Twenty-Eight By '28 Project list — the L.A. River Bike Path, which will help create a continuous 51-mile path along the L.A. River from Canoga Park to Long Beach by 2025.

In South L.A., \$24.8 million will be directed toward the Broadway/Manchester Active Transportation Equity Project. It will fund a dedicated bicycle lane; curb, sidewalk, and crosswalk enhancements; pedestrian islands and signals; new ADA access ramps; and urban shade along the corridor.

"We are glad to see South Los Angeles getting the investment it deserves. This may be the largest known public investment in this neighborhood in generations. We are committed to making up for lost time," said Councilmember Marqueece Harris-Dawson. "The project will transform this

SBA Proposes Certification Rule for Women-Owned Small Businesses

The U.S. Small Business Administration published a proposed rule that will provide a free online application process for women-owned small businesses to be certified and eligible to participate in the SBA's Women-Owned Small Business Program or access contracts as a Women-Owned Small Business (WOSB) or Economically Disadvantaged Women-Owned Small Business (EDWOSB). The SBA is seeking public comments on the proposed rule by July 15, 2019. To submit comments, visit: https://www.federalregister.gov/documents/2019/05/14/2019-09684/women-owned-small-business-and-economi-

cally-disadvantaged-women-owned-small-business--certification.

The following proposals are included in the new rule:

- Allow participation from an expanded list of federal and state entities with existing certification programs, and confirm the continued participation of approved thirdparty certifiers.
- Eliminate the self-certification option consistent with the Small Business Act as amended within the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2015, Public



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PRSRT STD U.S. Postage PAID San Fran CA 941 Permit No. 820 Law 113-291, and require approved thirdparty certifiers to notify applicants of its fees and the option to use SBA's free online certification process.

 Adopt a \$750,000 net worth standard when assessing economic disadvantage for ED-WOSBs and continuing eligibility for the 8(a) Business Development Program.

The proposed rule will bolster the number of federal contract awards to WOSB and ED-WOSB-certified businesses and better empower

agencies to meet the 5% federal contracting goal for women-owned small businesses. Currently, contracting officers must review a contract awardee's documentation to verify an applicant's WOSB and EDWOSB eligibility. By establishing a transparent, centralized, and free certification process, the SBA aims to provide contracting officers with reassurance that firms participating in the WOSB Program are eligible for awards and encourage them to set aside contracts for women-owned small businesses.

SB 50 and a Comprehensive Approach to California's Housing Crisis

As nearly every Californian knows, we are in the midst of a dire housing crisis. Thanks to years of steady population growth and low rates of housing construction, the supply of housing is nowhere near enough to keep up with demand, particularly for low- and moderate-income families. Earlier this year, Governor Newsom announced a lofty goal of building 3.5 million homes by 2025, but I'm skeptical. That would require building 500,000 homes annually in a state where we've built an average of 80,000 homes per year in the last decade. Legislation, like the controversial SB 50, seeks to spur housing construction.

The worst impacts of the housing crisis fall disproportionately on low-income communities of color. Thousands of low-income Californians have left the state in search of a lower cost of living. And many of the low-income households

who are able to stay in California end up moving to far-flung cities with brutal "supercommutes": in Stockton, 10 percent of commuters travel more than 90 minutes to work. In Palmdale, it's 35 percent. Most of these distant bedroom communities have fewer economic opportunities and tend to be more segregated than the state's urban centers. It is painfully obvious to anyone paying attention that the housing crisis is separating California's metro areas into the haves and the

Construction Alone Won't Fix the Housing Crisis

Realistically, we can't build our way out of the housing crisis. If we hit Gov. Newsom's goal we will make a small dent in the shortage, but it would be irresponsible for us to rely on housing production alone to solve the affordability crisis. We need a comprehensive legislative housing package that couples production with strong tenant protections that stop landlords from forcing impossible rent increases or inhumane evictions. We need to create tools that allow people to save

money and close the racial wealth gap. Building housing is important, yes, but an approach that also provides immediate relief for Californians suffering right now is crucial.

The current legislative session has seen an overwhelming number of housing-related bills, each attempting to address the housing crisis in different ways. Some, like AB 1481 (Bonta) and AB 1482 (Chiu) seek to protect tenants vulnerable to displacement, while others, like AB 1279 (Bloom) and SB 330 (Skinner) focus on increasing housing supply. Of all the housing bills out there this year, SB 50 has gotten the most attention. This bill, authored by Senator Scott Wiener of San Francisco, would increase building density near transit stops and in job-rich communities without transit in counties with over 600,000 people. It would also allow fourplexes to be built "by right" statewide. (It should be noted that the bill has some strategic carve-outs for communities that have historically been anti-development . . . I'm looking at you, Marin County.) In "sensitive communities" (the bill's term for

low-income communities of color) vulnerable to displacement, implementation of SB 50 would be deferred for five years while the community creates its own plan. And many (but not all) developments that benefit from SB 50's incentives will be required to include housing units for low-income tenants.

This sounds good, right? With SB 50, the devil is truly in the details. The sentiment behind it is important — we need to build more housing! But for now it remains an imperfect and incomplete tool to address the housing crisis, at least in its current form. Where SB 50 falls short is in its treatment of sensitive communities and community engagement; the most recent bill language leaves a lot of gaps for interpretation over how to identify these communities, what type of power they will be given, and how community planning will be resourced. Low-income communities of color must have autonomy over development — these are not NIMBY groups opposing all new development. These are residents of neighborhoods that still bear

When Mistakes Happen

A colleague or associate has made a mistake -whether minor or grievous - and now you have to deal with it. What do you do? Yelling and screaming is tempting, but is always inappropriate. Throttling and beating are illegal. Since everybody makes mistakes, your response, if handled well, can turn the situation into a learning opportunity. It can actually enhance and help build a more trusting relationship with the other person.

Being a busy person, and knowing that you must "pick your battles," first decide how much impact this specific mistake has upon you or your

clients. Is it part of a pattern of similar issues, such as problems caused by carelessness? How likely is this to occur again? And finally, is this a peer in your firm, a professional colleague, or a staff person? This will help you compose an appropriate and professional response that fits the situation and the relationship.

In addition, consider these four questions before you respond:

- How knowledgeable is the person? Is he
 or she aware that a mistake was made? Often what looks like a serious breach to you
 is not perceived as a mistake by the other
 person. Find out how he or she views the
 situation and explain, if necessary, why
 there is a problem and the consequences.
- Why was the action taken? As you discuss the situation, try to understand not only what occurred, but also the reasoning and decision-making involved. This is an opportunity to learn how the other person thinks and perceives responsibilities. The ramifications of the action may not

be clear to the other person. If this person is a subordinate, you likely have access to information that he or she does not; which could also explain why he or she did not perceive their action as causing a problem, or may have considered factors that you overlooked.

- How clear was your initial explanation?
 Did the person fully understand what you expected? Mistakes occur in situations where "second guessing" is the norm. To prevent this in the future, explain exactly what you want and what level of authority the other person has (if they are a subordinate) Explain how and where they can get required information, and what resources are available before problems arise.
- What is the cost now and in the future of ignoring it? Will it get better on its own? Probably not, but there are exceptions.

Guidelines For Offering Criticism

- Do not judge or generalize when confronting a situation. Be specific about the situation at hand, and what needs to occur to remedy the problem. Set aside your ego. This is not a time to discuss your world view. Distinguish between criticism and cutting someone down. Criticism should not be designed to hurt the other person or increase your stature or power. Be straightforward, direct and objective. Before you begin be clear about why you are doing it and what outcome you desire.
- Be prompt about delivering criticism. Memories fade over time, so do it while everything is fresh. Discuss the situation as soon after the occurrence as is reasonable, but not so soon that your emotions might get the best of you.
- **Support your comments,** rather than saying something vague like "you are never here on time." Provide facts and evidence



- One World Trade Center in New York City was built on the original World Trade Center site and has the same name as the North Tower. At 1,792 feet tall with 104 floors, it is the tallest building in the U.S. and the 6th tallest in the world. The top floor is 1,368 feet above ground level — the same as the original One World Trade Center.
- The tower was designed by architect David Childs and his firm Skidmore, Owings & Merrill (SOM), the same firm behind the Willis Tower. In 2006, the public was invited to sign a 30-foot steel beam before construction began.
- Eventually, the World Trade Center complex will include a National September 11 Memorial & Museum and five high-rise office buildings.

History:

- Formerly known as the Sears Tower, the Willis Tower is a 110story, 1,729-foot building in Chicago. Designed by architect Fazlur Rahman Khan, the Willis Tower was the tallest building in the world for 25 years before the completion of the One World Trade Center.
- The Willis Tower was the first building to use tubes to create the structure. The design included nine square tubes in a 3x3 matrix to form a square base with 225-foot sides. Each tube reaches the 50th floor, with some reaching as high as the 108th floor.
- The tower's observation deck is located on the 103rd floor and is the highest observation deck in the U.S. at 1,353 feet. The antenna for local NBC station WMAQ-TV is the tallest point of the building at 1,729 feet.

Built: 2015 // **Height:** 1,396 feet // **Construction cost:** \$1.25 billion **History:**

- 432 Park Avenue in New York City was designed by architect Rafael Viñoly. His inspiration for the design came from a trash can designed by Austrian designer Josef Hoffman in 1905. Developed by CIM Group, the 88-floor tower contains 125 condominium apartments.
- To construct the tower, they built a 30-foot square of reinforced concrete with 30-inch-thick walls. In order to keep the tower from swaying from high winds, between every 12 occupied floors is 2 floors with a window grid and interior space that are left open to allow the wind to pass through.
- Amenities for 432 Park Avenue include 12-foot ceilings, a golf training facility, private dining, and screening rooms.

- such as "according to your time sheet in the last month, on these dates, you were more than 15 minutes late."
- Consider your location. Feedback is best done in private, and with enough time to assure that a meaningful conversation can take
- place. Choosing ten minutes before rushing off to a meeting is not ideal. Select a time when both of you are calm and focused.
- Is really a skill deficiency? Criticizing something a person cannot change is hard on both parties. If this is an issue that additional training can address, pursue that route
- **Plan the discussion.** Rehearing is helpful. Consider writing down key points to help you clarify your thoughts. This is too important an interaction to do spontaneously.

Final Thoughts

This is a two-way conversation. It is important to be a good listener and invite involvement in solving the problem. Always stick to issues related to work. At the end of the discussion, the next steps to solve the problem should be clear. Be attentive and considerate. Close your door, hold your calls and offer your full attention. Remember to be fair and never hold a person responsible for meeting a goal that you neglected to tell them about.

the scars of redlining. Sensitive communities need resources and decisionmaking power to build economic resilience, and the current form of SB 50 fails to provide either of those.

"Here's the thing: today's housing crisis is the product of a racist, capitalist system that was designed to harm poor people of color. That's the simplest way I can say it. Obviously, a bill like SB 50 is not intended to or capable of addressing that history. But the people who will see the most harm from SB 50 are the same ones who were shut out of the system from the beginning, and that's where we want to see change. We want to see increased housing supply, but not at the expense of low-income communities of color. Greenlining supports an approach that protects renters, expands funding for low-income housing, and increases the supply of housing. On its own, SB 50 is incomplete; but with improvement, it could be an important piece of a larger and more comprehensive housing solution.

I want to leave you with a few thoughts about how we might do things differently. Greenlining's core value has always been to put equity front and center. This means an approach that proactively seeks to improve low-income communities of color, rather than just building housing and hoping it doesn't displace people. It means making sure that the housing we build is actually affordable; that new housing goes hand in hand with broad and deep tenant protections

to make sure people can stay in their homes; that we go beyond community engagement to community governance: and that we are addressing the root causes of the crisis, not just the

Greenlining is working on developing a community development agenda with racial equity principles at its core. The work we do to build strong communities reflects our deeply-held organizational values that put race equity above all. Our approach will be informed by our pioneering banking sector advocacy, in that we challenge systems of power to be more equitable. Making housing affordable is key to community development, but we prioritize multi-sector solutions that acknowledge the intersectional nature of the issues facing low-income communities of color. And finally, our work will be community-driven at all stages. We look forward to applying these principles in the future to create a more equitable world.

D-Day 75th Anniversary: Trump, Macron And Other Leaders Mark A Historic Day

"They won back this ground for civilization," President Trump said of the Allied troops who took part in the massive D-Day invasion 75 years ago today. Trump stood on a stage near Omaha Beach in northern France, alongside French President Emmanuel Macron and other world leaders who thanked U.S. veterans and their allies for preserving liberty.

The commemoration in Normandy, France, marks the 75th anniversary of the massive amphibious invasion, in which more than 150,000 U.S., British and Canadian troops forced their way onto France's shores to bring the fight to Adolf Hitler. They were supported by nearly 7,000 naval vessels and more than 11,000 aircraft in one of the most important operations of World War II

More than 160 World War II veterans sat in rows on a red-carpeted stage during the ceremony at the Normandy American Cemetery and Memorial in Colleville-sur-Mer, France. They included dozens of men who landed on the beaches of Normandy on June 6, 1944.

"You are the pride of our nation, you are the glory of the republic, and we thank you from the bottom of our hearts," Trump told the veterans.

Trump also noted that Allied fighters also came from Poland, Norway, Australia and other coun-

tries. "They were the citizens of free and independent nations, united by their duty to their compatriots and to millions yet unborn," he said.

The U.S. president told the stories of several veterans, including former Army medic Ray Lambert, 98, who sat on the stage behind him as Trump recounted Lambert's bravery and fortitude while serving in the 16th Infantry Regiment of the U.S. Army's 1st Infantry Division, known as "The Big Red One."

Both Lambert and his brother, Bill, survived a day that began with the massacre of thousands of U.S. soldiers on the beaches, the victims of artillery and intense German machine gun fire. Ray Lambert is credited with saving at least 15 men. Although wounded himself, he repeatedly pulled men out of the water and to safety. He stopped only when a landing craft's ramp broke his back, forcing him to crawl back onto the sand.

"Ray, the free world salutes you," Trump said, leading a long round of applause. Both Trump and Macron walked over to Lambert to shake his hand

"They freed a land with no other compass than a cause which was greater than themselves — the cause of liberty," Macron said. "France has not forgotten. France has not forgotten those fighters to whom we owe the right to live in freedom."

Macron spoke of the masses of soldiers who followed, who came ashore in Europe to face battle-hardened troops from Nazi Germany, fight-

ing to win the Battle of Normandy in Operation Overlord. Within three months of the D-Day landing, Allied forces liberated Paris from German occupation.

In English, Macron turned to the veterans on the stage and said, "We know that we owe to you, veterans, our freedom. On behalf of my nation, I just want to say thank you."

Both Macron and Trump spoke of the young men who did not make it home. Trump mentioned the graves of the nearly 10,000 young Americans who are buried near the beach that was code-named Omaha.

"Each one has been adopted by a French family that thinks of him as their own," Trump said. "They come from all over France to look after our boys. They kneel, they cry, they pray, they place flowers, and they never forget. Today, America embraces the French people and thanks you for honoring our beloved dead."

Amid the talk of courage and historic alliances and epic conflict, the ceremony included subtle hints of the complicated current political and social dynamics that are reshaping relationships between the U.S., the U.K., and their European allies.

In his speech, Macron pointedly linked the fight for freedom in World War II to longstanding alliances.

"We shall never cease to perpetuate the alliance of free people," Macron said, citing the creation of the United Nations at the end of the war. He added, "That is what the United States did when it created the North Atlantic Treaty Organization. That is what, a few years later, the leaders of Europe did in bringing about the European Union."

The lessons of Colleville-sur-mer and of World War II, Macron said, have taught us that liberty and democracy are inseparable.

Macron and Trump left the ceremony together, visiting the nearby cemetery with their wives. The two leaders met again later in the day for lunch.

There were at least seven flyovers to mark the D-Day anniversary. According to a pool report, the aircraft included 12 U.S. C-47 Skytrains and two P-51 fighters, along with modern transports and jets — including four F-15s that flew in a missing man formation.

"Despite the forecast of rain, the sun is shining on the American cemetery on the bluffs overlooking Omaha beach," NPR's Eleanor Beardsley reports from Normandy. "There will be 10 ceremonies all along the coast today. Security is tight, with 6,000 police patrolling on land and sea, and drones and helicopters in the skies above."
