

A wave of emergencies is testing East LA's resilience. The way its governed doesn't help

More than a month after the Lineage Logistics warehouse fire in Los Angeles released pollutants and the persistent smell of rotten meat into the air, the people of Boyle Heights are still waiting for cleanup and answers.

I watched this disaster unfold on streets I have known my whole life. I know what it means to have a business in this community and what losing it, even temporarily, costs.

I watched La Carreta and La Chispa de Oro restaurants survive decades of disruption and keep serving this neighborhood. I watched the Picaresca Barra de Cafe and Lilly's Cafe launch during COVID — the scariest possible moment to start something new — because their owners decided waiting for the right time was a luxury they could not afford.

We have always had to show up for ourselves before anyone else does. Resiliency is not something you are born with. It's what you develop when the system keeps failing you.

But resiliency has a limit.

This warehouse fire was the fifth major crisis to hit East Los Angeles businesses in six consecutive years: There was COVID-19, the 2025 wildfires, ongoing federal immigration raids and the East L.A. crude oil spill.

The same streets, families and businesses are absorbing shock after shock, with no permanent infrastructure to catch us.

The Lineage facility had a documented record of health and safety violations. Residents had no idea what was behind those walls, but these hazards seem to be concentrated in Black and brown communities. According to UCLA's Latino Policy and Politics Institute, the smoke advisory zone surrounding the Lineage Logistics fire carries a cumulative environmental burden score that's 63% higher than Los Angeles County overall.

The financial reality is just as stark. More than 15,400 workers living in the smoke advisory zone earn below L.A. County's very-low-income threshold. Per capita income in the area is roughly half the county average.

This community has never stood on even ground.

When a small business goes dark for nearly two weeks, there is no cushion to draw on. For immigrant entrepreneurs, the gap between crisis and relief is wider than for other groups.

Mayor Karen Bass has signed executive orders directing cleanup efforts and referencing financial assistance for affected businesses. Lineage announced \$2.5 million in relief at a town hall in July. That matters, but executive orders and announcements are not checks.

The 5% Problem: What Separates Winning Bidders From Everyone Else

Missed it by that much: Losing a bid by a narrow margin doesn't always point to budget problems.

Some of the most painful words a contractor can hear are: "Thank you for your bid, but you lost by 5%." That figure is more than a rhetorical device. An FHWA-sponsored analysis of state DOT construction bids found that the median spread between the lowest and second-lowest bids ranged from 5.3% to 7.7% across the states studied. On a \$2-million project, 5% is \$100,000.

A narrow loss does not automatically mean the contractor's underlying costs were too high. It may reflect a labor assumption that no longer matches field availability, an incomplete picture of regional competition or a price history that was accurate six months ago but less so today. In many close losses, the contractor didn't lose because their costs were higher; they lost because they didn't know what they didn't know.

The risks mentioned above are converging. In the Associated General Contractors of America's 2025 workforce survey, 45% of firms reported project delays caused by shortages among their own workers or their subcontractors' workers. Among firms hiring estimating personnel, 77% said those positions were difficult to fill. Labor scarcity is affecting the capacity to perform work as well as the capacity to evaluate it before the bid.

Material cost volatility is adding more uncertainty. FHWA's National Highway Construction Cost Index rose 6.5% in the third quarter of 2024, even as the producer price index for asphalt fell 6.4% and concrete products increased only 0.4%. The overall market was moving up, but individual inputs were moving in different directions, making it harder to estimate costs consistently over time.

Contractors still need strong takeoffs, production rates and cost controls. But those internal calculations must be tested against a market that changes by item, geography, season, labor availability and competitive field. This variability complicates the bid phase, where contractors

need to not only assess costs, but also whether pricing fluctuation risks make an opportunity worth pursuing.

The Pricing Data Gap

The industry does not lack data. Contractors can access cost books, agency advertisements, plan-holder lists, bid tabs, internal job-cost histories, supplier quotes and estimating systems. In recent conversations with contractors across different sizes and regions, many mentioned using multiple bidding platforms because no single source provided everything they needed. They also expressed a distinct desire for better pricing insights from their current tools.

The problem, clearly, is converting all of those separate inputs into a current market view.

Historical prices are useful only when the comparison is relevant. FHWA's cost-estimating guidance cautions that bid-based estimates depend on prices from similar work and similarly sized projects. Its broader guidance also calls for historical prices to be adjusted for location, project quantities, project size and general market conditions.

That context matters because a statewide average can conceal local competition. In our review of bid data across multiple states, we found cases where one district averaged eight bidders per letting while the neighboring district averaged four. The work and agency may be similar, but the competitive pressure can be meaningfully different. A price that reflects last year's market may fail to account for a recent shift in material availability, labor capacity or the agency's letting schedule.

The result is a gap between having data and having decision-ready intelligence. There is a significant difference between using data to confirm a pursuit decision that has already been made and using it to identify opportunities the contractor might not otherwise have considered. Many legacy workflows answer the question: "What happened before?"

A wave of emergencies is testing East LA’s resilience.

Continued from page 1

The promise of assistance is not the same as delivering it.

UCLA’s research documented what many community members already know: Heightened federal immigration enforcement is discouraging immigrant families from seeking government services — including the public health resources and assistance programs set up in the wake of this fire.

East Los Angeles, next to Boyle Heights, is an unincorporated community with no city council, mayor or city services. Residents and businesses rely entirely on county resources shared across more than 120 unincorporated communities.

That structure has never worked in our favor, and every new disaster makes the math worse.

What actually worked in the days after this fire was the community itself. Inclusive Action, the Boyle Heights Chamber of Commerce, the Los Angeles Economic Equity Accelerator and Fellowship, or LEEAF, and the Hustle and Heart Collective launched a relief fund within days. Leo Abularach and Elisa Hoyos of La Picaresca organized local business owners and civic leaders to identify solutions.

The local governments that serve this area should establish a standing and sustainable small business resiliency fund before the next fire, spill or immigration raid. It must be accessible to immigrant entrepreneurs who cannot depend on federal resources in the current climate.

Community organizations like mine are ready to help design and implement it. County and city leadership must meet us there. East Los Angeles has never stopped waiting. We deserve better.
