

7 Winter Weather Construction Safety Tips

Construction doesn't stop when winter weather strikes, so it's important to know what steps to take to keep your workers warm and safe. Before the next major winter storm starts to impact your area with snow and ice accumulation, be prepared and review these winter weather safety tips for keeping your workers safe.

Inspect & Clear Jobsites

When winter weather hits you need to inspect your construction sites for downed power lines and trees before allowing workers to begin work. Clear all snow and ice from walking and working surfaces, including walkways, roofs, scaffolding, and ladders. Be sure to stress the importance of fall safety protection to workers when icy conditions exist.

Put down salt or sand to melt icy patches and improve traction for workers. Make sure icy areas that can't be cleared are clearly marked and instruct workers to slow down and take shorter steps, especially when carrying materials and tools to avoid slips.

Knock off any icicles that have formed or cordon off areas to prevent workers from accidentally breaking them loose and creating falling object hazards.

Watch the Weather

The last thing you want is to have a construction site full of workers stranded because a blizzard blew in without you knowing. Give your workers adequate time to secure the construction site and get home safely before severe weather strikes.

As temperatures plummet, keep a careful watch on workers for signs of hypothermia and frostbite. Make sure workers are wearing appropriate clothing for the weather and encourage them to take frequent breaks to warm up from the cold.

Provide a Heated Break Area

Workers expend more energy when working in cold weather in order to keep their bodies warm. Make sure you have a heated trailer, tent or indoor area for workers to warm up from the cold. Limit exposure to the elements by encouraging workers to take frequent breaks in order to rest and warm up, drink warm liquids and change out of wet clothing.



This is a good time to check workers for signs of fatigue, frostbite or hypothermia. Remind workers to limit consumption of caffeine, nicotine and other stimulants as this increases their heart rate, causing them to feel warmer than they actually are.

If using portable heaters in break areas, make sure to properly vent the area and use CO sensors to monitor for carbon monoxide exposure.

Provide Proper PPE

Be sure to take extra steps in ensuring workers are wearing all necessary personal protective equipment (PPE) when winter weather conditions are present.

Hard hats should be worn at all times to protect against falling objects like icicles and slips and falls on ice. Using liners in hard hats will help keep workers warm and prevent heat from escaping.

Gloves and mittens should be selected that enable workers with enough manual dexterity to work with tools and materials. Remind workers to keep their gloves on at all times, especially when climbing ladders, scaffolding, or getting onto construction equipment. Frostbite can occur immediately if workers touch extremely cold metal with bare hands.

Workers should wear waterproof boots with non-slip soles and extra socks to protect against the cold if wearing steel-toed boots since the metal acts as a cold sink.

Goggles, safety glasses, and facemasks can be treated with anti-fog spray to prevent their vision from being obstructed.

Make sure personal fall arrest systems are adjusted to properly fit over bulkier clothing and inspect them before each use to ensure straps aren't frozen with ice.

Warm up Equipment & Tools

Follow the manufacturer's instructions on properly warming up heavy equipment before use. Electrical wires and hoses can become brittle in cold temperatures, so it is important to allow those to heat up properly to avoid damaging your equipment.

Make sure fluids, such as engine and hydraulic oils, in your equipment are rated for the temperatures in your area and replace them if needed. Make sure heaters in cabs are working properly and clear off any ice or snow from windshields and steps. Try and avoid using any equipment that isn't equipped with an enclosed cab to keep your workers warm.

You also need to take extra precautions when working with air compressors and pneumatic tools. Drain fluid from air compressor tanks after each use to prevent the moisture that has accumulated from freezing and damaging the tank. Put antifreeze tool oil in your pneumatic tools and air hoses to protect against the cold. Fire your empty nail guns at 40 PSI in freezing temperatures to warm them up before use.

Layer on the Clothing

Keeping warm is one of the most important things when working in cold weather. The key is finding a balance of wearing enough layers to stay warm while still being able to maintain a good range of mobility to perform your work.

Layer clothing with some moisture-wicking thermals on your inner layer and have a waterproof outer layer to prevent moisture from soaking into your clothing. If clothing gets wet, it's important to change into dry clothes to avoid losing body heat.

Limit the amount of skin exposed to cold temperatures with careful attention to the extremities by wearing knit hats and earmuffs for the head, wool socks for the feet, balaclavas for the face, and gloves and mittens for the hands.

For more tips on keeping warm on the construction site, be sure to check out our 10 Tips for Keeping Warm on the Construction Site.

Put Emergency Kits in Work Vehicles

Make sure each of your company's fleet of work trucks and vehicles is equipped with winter weather emergency kits. Your kits should include a shovel, ice scraper and brush, sleeping bag, water, non-perishable snacks like protein

bars, tow straps, emergency flares, and a back-up battery for your cell phone. It's also a good idea to have some cat litter, salt, or sand to help with traction in case you get stuck. Encourage your workers to create emergency kits for their personal vehicles.

Be cautious when driving in snow and ice. Give yourself plenty of time to get to your destination and leave plenty of space between yourself and other vehicles to avoid accidents.

Construction Firms Foresee Growing Demand For Most Types Of Projects, As 74 Percent Of Firms Plan To Hire In 2022 Despite Supply Chain And Labor Challenges

Construction contractors expect increasing demand for numerous types of projects in 2022 despite ongoing supply chain and labor challenges, as most firms plan to add workers this year, according to survey results released today by the Associated General Contractors of America and Sage. The findings are detailed in Expecting Growth While Coping with the Lingering Impacts of the Pandemic: The 2022 Construction Hiring & Business Outlook.

"Contractors are, overall, very optimistic about the outlook for the construction industry in 2022," said Stephen E. Sandherr, the association's chief executive officer. "While contractors face challenges this year, most of those will be centered on the need to keep pace with growing demand for construction projects."

The percentage of respondents who expect a market segment to expand exceeds the percentage who expect it to contract – known as the net reading – in 15 of the 17 categories of projects included in the survey. Contractors are most optimistic about the market for highway and bridge construction, which has a net reading of positive 57 percent. They are similarly optimistic about transit, rail and airports projects, with a net reading of 51 percent, and water and sewer projects, with a net reading of 50 percent.

These segments all stand to see increased federal investments because of the recently passed Bipartisan Infrastructure bill. Contractors are also upbeat about demand for federal construction projects, with a net reading of 37 percent, and power construction, with a net reading of 29 percent.

The highest expectations among predominantly private-sector categories, with a net reading of 41 percent each, are for warehouses and other healthcare facilities, which includes clinics, testing facilities and medical labs. The outlook for hospital construction is also strong, with a net reading of 38 percent.

Contractors were also optimistic about multifamily residential construction, with a net reading of 32 percent, and manufacturing construction, with a net reading of 27 percent. Expectations were more subdued, however, for public buildings, with a net reading of 20 percent; kindergarten through 12th grade school construction, with a net reading of 19 percent; higher education facilities, with a 16 percent net reading; and lodging, with a 6

percent net reading. Only two categories received negative net readings, both of -8 percent: retail and private office construction.

Optimism about growing demand for many types of construction projects is leading many firms to plan to hire workers this year. Seventy-four percent of respondents expect their firms will expand headcount in 2022, compared to just 9 percent that who expect a decrease. Forty-seven percent of firms expect to increase their headcount by 10 percent or less. However, 22 percent say their

headcount will grow by 11 to 25 percent and 5 percent anticipate an increase of more than 25 percent.

Adding those workers will be a challenge, however. An overwhelming 83 percent report they are having a hard time filling some or all salaried or hourly craft positions, compared to only 8 percent who say they are having no difficulty. And three-fourths of respondents say it will continue to be hard to hire or will become harder to hire this year.

10 job opportunities in a zero-emission future

If any bioregion is well-suited to streak towards a net-zero carbon emissions economy, it would seem to be Cascadia. British Columbia, Washington and Oregon set some of North America's first mandates to reduce greenhouse gas emissions over a decade ago. Abundant hydropower provides an edge, and most voters in all three places say they want to transition away from fossil fuels.

Getting to zero of course would require heavy political lifting. Progress so far has come in fits and starts. But if the climate crisis is to be averted, greenhouse gas emissions must be dramatically reduced. And Dr. Jennie Moore, who directs British Columbia Institute of Technology's Institute Sustainability, points out that would bring big changes to the world of work.

The Tyee asked a dozen experts the question: What are some top jobs we can expect in a net-zero emissions economy in British Columbia and, by extension, Cascadia? Everyone uses their hands, head and heart to do their jobs well. Still, we took what we heard and divided this list into those three broad categories.

Hands: Technicians and carpenters, people able to roll up their sleeves who are unafraid of getting their hands dirty.

Heads: Environmental accountants and engineers who can brainstorm nontraditional fuel sources — the numbers people.

Hearts: Those with a desire to improve how we live, farm or shop can change the way things are done.

Here are some key jobs for a net-zero carbon emissions future economy that may be around the corner.

Using our hands

1. Assembly-line home fabricator

To slash emissions, we're going to have to dramatically change how we build new homes. The days of constructing homes individually, piece by piece, are over — but this could be a good thing for the province's forestry industry, says Alex Boston, executive director of Renewable Cities and a fellow at the Morris J. Wosk Centre for Dialogue at Simon Fraser University.

Boston proposes building homes on assembly lines where companies can better manage cost, quality and waste. Walls, floors and other sections

of a home could be assembled in a factory — down to the insulation and wiring — and then shipped and pieced together like Lego blocks.

Low-quality British Columbia lumber, such as smaller trees or branches, could be made into mass timber, a fabricated material that layers and laminates wood fiber comparable to concrete in strength, Boston says. Mass timber and prefab could be used to build efficient commercial, residential and institutional buildings while maintaining an industry for sustainably harvested lumber.

Passive houses are intentionally designed to reduce emissions and could easily be mass produced on an assembly line, Boston says.

But let's go a step further and imagine mass-producing active houses, which not only reduce emissions, but also have a net-positive effect on the environment and people. House-building assembly lines will shrink the number of some kinds of construction jobs, but Canada's work-

force is shrinking, too, Boston notes. And there is potential for big growth in greener construction — see our next example.

2. Home energy auditor and retrofitter

Don't go rushing to bulldoze current buildings to build greener ones, Boston cautions, because the greenest home is the one that has already been built.

But older homes don't cut the mustard when it comes to energy efficiency, and there's a big market for auditors who can map out those inefficiencies and help homeowners or building managers improve their energy use. A 2017 Columbia Institute report says retrofitting buildings will create 2 million construction jobs by 2050 — so get ahead of the curve, specialize and start handing out business cards.
