A Dampening of Euphoria May Be Warranted

Euphoria concerning the U.S. economy, as demonstrated by record-setting stock market indices, won't be dampened much by the just-released and somewhat tame Employment Situation report from the Bureau of Labor Statistics. The total number of American jobs in December rose by a lukewarm +145,000. Also, November's jobs total was revised downwards slightly, by -14,000.

At the same time, though, the seasonally adjusted (SA) unemployment rate stayed constant and exceedingly tight at 3.5%.

Nevertheless, the monthly average climb in U.S. employment in full-year 2019 was off by one-fifth compared with full-year 2018, +176,000 as opposed to +223,000.

Graphs 1 and 2 have been derived from the Job Openings and Labor Turnover Survey (JOLTS). Graph 1 highlights that while total job 'openings' in the U.S. economy, expressed as both a level and a rate, remain quite elevated, they have been easing off a bit over the past couple of years. Also, 'hires', as captured in Graph 2, appear to

have been moving sideways more than upwards.

Consumer Calling the Shots in New Employment

A historically low unemployment rate will render jobs advances, as seen so far in this economic upturn, harder to achieve. In turn, slower employment pickups will lead to a deceleration in consumer spending growth.

For the moment, though, 'the consumer' is still calling most of the shots in the economy, even in the labor market. For example, the biggest climbs in U.S. jobs among industry sub-sectors in December occurred in the consumer spending area. 'Retail' jobs in the latest month were +41,000. 'Leisure and hospitality' jobs weren't far behind at +40,000.

'Education and health services,' a jobs-creating front-runner in many recent months, had an employment gain in December of +36,000.

Construction came in at +20,000, a decent enough jog upwards, but manufacturing was a disappointment, at -12,000.

U.S. construction's monthly average jobs increase in 2019 was +13,000, which was only half of the sector's 2018 performance of +26,000. Still, construction fared far better in 2019 than manufacturing, where the average monthly jobs

pickup plummeted to just +4,000 from +22,000 in the preceding annual period.

Wage Growth Still Loping Rather Than Sprinting Along

Despite negligible unemployment in the U.S. economy, earnings aren't showing much life. For 'all jobs' (and including supervisors) in December, wages rose +2.9% y/y hourly and +2.3% y/y weekly. For 'all jobs' (but excluding supervisors), wages moved upwards by +3.0% y/y hourly and +2.4% y/y weekly.

The compensation increases for construction workers were worse on all four counts. Including supervisors, 'hard hat' workers saw wages in the last month of 2019 that were +2.3% y/y hourly and +1.0% y/y weekly. Leaving out bosses, 'hard hat' workers experienced earnings climbs that were only +2.0% y/y hourly and +0.7% y/y weekly.

Canada Had Huge Jobs-Creation Year in 2019

North of the border, the increase in total employment in December, as reported by Statistics Canada, was +35,000. The good news was further augmented by a drop in the SA unemployment rate from 5.9% to 5.6%.

Canada achieved a strong record of jobs creation in 2019. The nation's monthly average gain in total jobs was +27,000, an uptick of nearly twothirds (+63.4%) compared with 2018's comparable figure of +16,000.

Canadian construction employment ended the latest month higher by +17,000 jobs. But on a monthly average basis throughout 2019, construction contributed only +2,000 jobs, marginally above 2018's +1,000. The bottom line is that construction employment in Canada has remained

nearly fl

250,000 on a consistent basis, peak labor demand will be a thing of the past.

On a year-over-year percentage-change basis, four of Canada's key job-creation metrics have been: 'total' jobs, +1.7% (versus +1.4% in the U.S.); 'services-providing' jobs, +2.5% (versus +1.7% in the U.S.); 'manufacturing' jobs, -2.3% (versus +0.4% in U.S.); and 'construction' jobs, +2.0% (the same rate of increase as in the U.S.).

During 2019, Canada's total jobs count rose by +320,000. An astonishing 96% of that increase originated in either Quebec or Ontario. While

Quebec contributed one-fifth of the gain, it was Ontario that really stepped into the spotlight. Ontario generated more than three-quarters (76%) of Canada's impressive total employment gain in 2019.

SBA Extends Comment Period for Consolidation of Mentor Protégé Programs

The U.S. Small Business Administration is extending the comment period for the proposed rule in the Federal Register to consolidate its Mentor Protégé Programs an additional 21 days in response to the significant level of interest and requests from multiple stakeholders for an extension. The comment period has now been extended to Feb. 7, 2020.

The SBA is proposing to merge the 8(a) Business Development (BD) Mentor-Protégé Program and the All Small Mentor-Protégé Program to eliminate confusion and remove unnecessary duplication of functions within the SBA. This proposed rule will:

- Eliminate the requirement that 8(a) Participants seeking 8(a) contracts as a joint venture submit the joint venture to SBA for review and approval prior to contract award;
- Revise several 8(a) Business Development Program regulations to reduce unnecessary

or excessive burdens on 8(a) participants and clarify other related regulatory provisions to eliminate confusion among small businesses and procuring activities;

- Requires firms to recertify its size and/or socioeconomic status for all set-aside orders under unrestricted multiple award contracts (MACs), except for orders and Blanket Purchase Agreements issued under the General Services Administration's Federal Supply Schedule Program;
- Require firms to recertify its socioeconomic status for all set-aside orders where the required socioeconomic status for the order differs from that of the underlying set-aside MAC contract (e.g., HUBZone set-aside order against a small business set-aside MAC); and
- Allow for size and/or socioeconomic protests issued against unrestricted MACs, or

for set-aside orders based on a different socioeconomic status from the underlying setaside MAC except for orders or Blanket Purchase Agreements issued under any Federal Supply Schedule contract.

Best Hiring Practices: What You Can and Can't Ask a Job Applicant

According to the NFIB*, 62% of small businesses recently reported hiring or trying to hire employees. Many small businesses are stressed to find qualified job applicants and are scrambling to fill positions. If you are in the market for a new employee, there are many considerations: Does the applicant have the skills to do the job? Will he or she fit into your company culture? Can you afford the cost of a potential new employee? Great questions to ask. But in the course of your search for your next employee, be sure you don't run afoul of federal and state rules. If you go about it the wrong way, you not only can lose out on hiring the next best employee, but can be exposed to possible legal action against you. Here are federal and state rules to observe so you can hire wisely.

Federal rules

Under various federal laws, it is illegal to discriminate against a job applicant because of that person's race, color, religion, sex (including gender identity, sexual orientation, and pregnancy), national origin, age (40 or older), disability, or genetic information. This ban on discrimination translates into the following best hiring practices you need to observe. Job postings. You can't advertise a preference that could discourage other classes of individuals from applying for your position. For example, the U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) says a help-wanted ad that seeks recent college graduates' may discourage people over 40 from applying and may violate the law.

Recruitment. You can't use recruitment practices that discriminate against any class of people. The EEOC's example: relying on word of mouth recruitment among mostly Hispanic workers if this would result in all new hires being Hispanic.

Screening. You can't use testing or other screening methods that effectively discriminate against a class of people. For example, it is illegal to make an inquiry about a person's disability before you make a job offer. Once this is done, you can ask the question so you can determine whether any reasonable accommodations are needed.

State rules

The rules on what you can and cannot ask job applicants varies greatly, and the rules are changing rapidly. Check to see whether these rules apply in your state:

Arrest and conviction. The majority of states have "ban-the-box" laws that prohibit employers from making hiring decisions based on criminal records. However, the laws differ, with some banning any inquiries about arrests and convictions, while others permitting requests for information about recent felony convictions. You can find a listing from the National Employment Law Project* of states, counties, and cities that have adopted ban-the-box.

Salary history. More than half a dozen states and cities prohibit employers from inquiring about a job applicant's prior salary history. In other words, you must offer pay based on the job position; this cannot be impacted by the salary that an applicant received for a prior job.

Hair and hairstyle. California and New York passed legislation to ban discrimination based on an applicant's hair texture or style. New Jersey is considering similar legislation.

Final thought

Review your current hiring policies to make sure you not only hire a diverse and talented group of people, but also avoid any hiring missteps that violate federal and/or state law. If you have questions, be sure to discuss them with an employment law attorney.
