

Mayor London Breed Announces Balanced Budget that Focuses on Building San Francisco Back from COVID-19

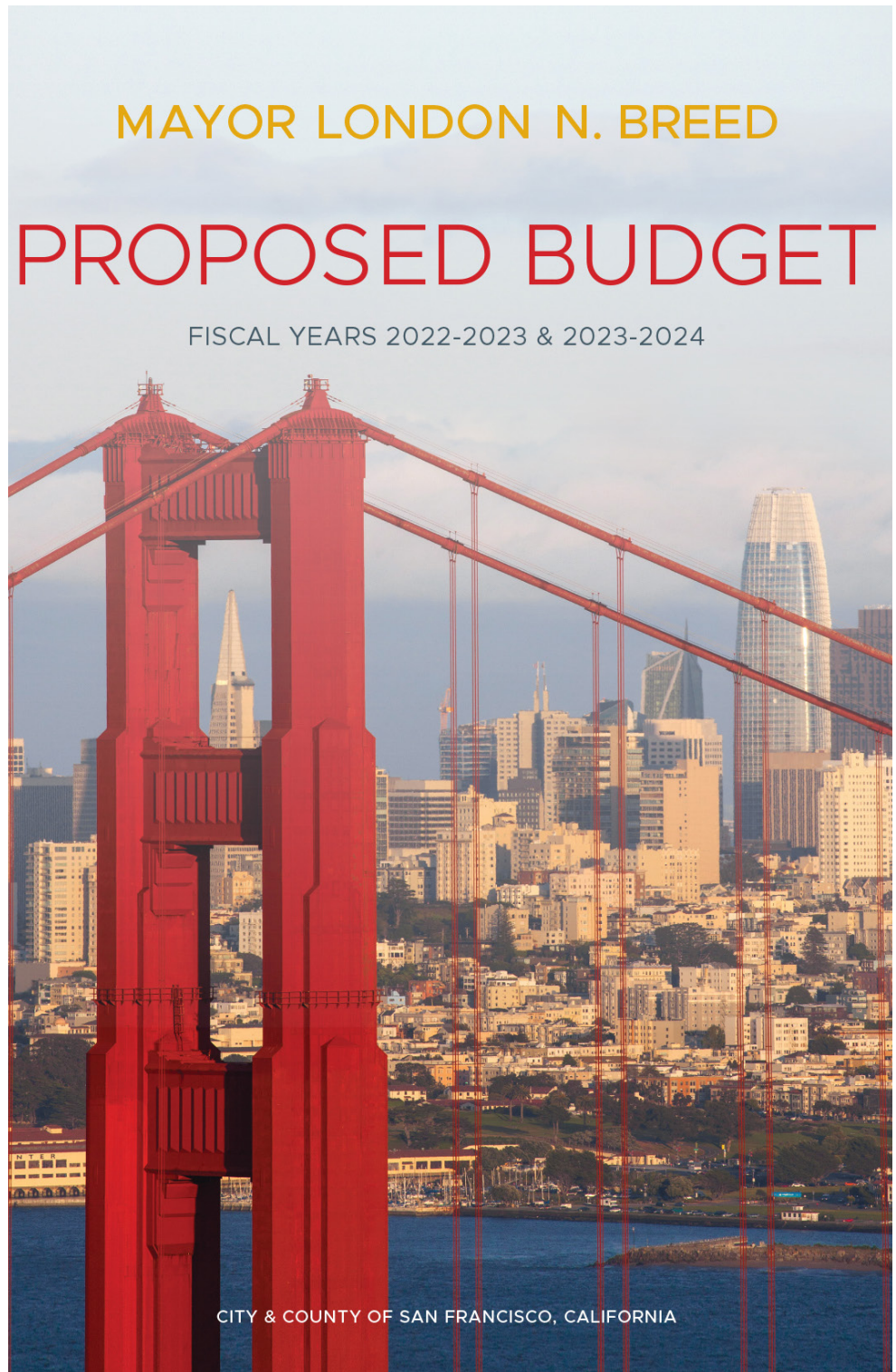
Mayor London N. Breed unveiled her budget proposal for Fiscal Years (FY) 2022-2023 and 2023-2024. The annual \$13.95 billion for FY 2022-23 and \$13.85 billion for FY 2023-24 follows months of collaborative work with elected officials, City departments, non-profit organizations, neighborhood groups, merchants, residents, and other stakeholders. Approximately half of the budget consists of self-supporting activities, primarily at the City's Enterprise departments, which focus on City-related business operations and include the Port, the Municipal Transportation Agency, the Airport, and the Public Utilities Commission. The General Fund comprises the remaining half, which support public services such as public health, housing, support for those experiencing homelessness, safety and fire services, parks management, and others.

"San Francisco is getting back to basics, which means focusing on our economic recovery, creating a safe and welcoming city for all, supporting workers, children and families, and continuing the investments we've made to reduce homelessness in this City," said Mayor Breed. "We have a lot of work to do, but by building on these core services that our residents deserve, we can do the work of bringing our city back from the challenges of COVID and create a brighter future."

Economic Recovery

The Mayor's proposed budget invests \$48.9 million over the two years to promote the City's economic recovery. This will include new direct support for small businesses, as well as new events, activations, public space improvements, and marketing efforts to support areas that rely on workers, tourists, and other visitors. The funding proposal will also continue the City's existing Ambassador programs located in areas like Mid-Market, Union Square, Downtown, South of Market, and along the Embarcadero.

The Mayor's proposed budget also includes \$7.2 million over the two years to support an enhanced Tenderloin cleaning initiative, which will expand Public Works' current cleaning operations in the area. In addition to enhanced cleaning efforts, the Mayor's proposed budget includes \$5.0 million over the two years to support enforcement of the

street vending ordinance, developed in partnership with the Board of Supervisors.

Public Safety and Alternatives to Policing

Since the beginning of COVID-19, the Police Department has experienced both a high rate of officer attrition and difficulty attracting new officers to the Department. To address this, the Mayor will fund a Police Hiring Plan to fill the City's approximately 200 vacant police officer positions. The budget supports this plan by providing:

- **Academy Classes:** Resources to support four academy classes in each fiscal year, backfilling a total of 220 officers over the two years.
- **Recruitment:** Adjusting entry-level step salary for incoming officers, making San Francisco a more competitive department compared to other Bay Area cities. The budget also provides funding to develop recruitment tools and strategies.
- **Retention:** Funding to offer retention bonuses to officers at 5- and 15-years of service to promote longevity and reduce the department's high attrition rate.
- **Modernizing department functions and continuing to promote reform.** In addition to funding the ongoing police reform work underway, the budget adds 12 new professional staff positions over the next two years to continue reform work and sufficiently support Public Records Act requests.

The City made significant investments during the last budget cycle to develop new alternatives to law enforcement response strategies. This budget maintains investments for the Street Crisis Response Teams (SCRT), Street Wellness Response Teams (SWRT), and Street Opioid Response Team (SORT). Further expanding on these investments, the Mayor's proposed budget invests in strengthening community-based outreach teams to improve the City's response to non-emergency and non-medical calls for service that had been the responsibility of law enforcement previously. Enhancements include new Crisis Counselors, which will be embedded in the 9-1-1 Call Center and can help to respond to mental and behavioral health calls as part of the City's services-first strategy.

The City has made bold new investments in homelessness and housing over the last several years through the Mayor's Homelessness Recovery Plan,

which has helped the City experience a 15% reduction in unsheltered homelessness, according to the latest point-in-time count.

Building on these efforts, the proposed budget includes funding for ongoing operations of 410 new adult shelter beds in a non-congregate or semi-congregate setting that were acquired in the current fiscal year, as well as continuing operations for three Shelter-in-Place (SIP) hotels that would otherwise close at the end of 2022. The proposed budget also continues funding for Safe Sleep sites in the Mission and Bayview districts, a 70-unit cabin site on Gough Street, and adds one-time funding to create a new 70-unit cabin site in the Mission.

The Mayor's proposed budget also invests in strategies to end homelessness and provide housing subsidies for transgender and gender non-conforming (TGNC) residents who disproportionately face barriers to housing, services, and employment. These investments fund a citywide strategic goal to end Transgender Homelessness in the next five years.

Offer Benefits for Fathers in Construction to Improve Employee Retention

The challenge of finding employees is real across all aspects of the economy, but is particularly severe for the construction industry, which has seen continued significant growth from low interest rates, stimulus monies, increasing real estate values and pandemic inspired projects. The challenge of finding employees, let alone skilled employees, is likely to continue into the foreseeable future. Construction companies need to adapt to this new normal and offer what employees what they truly want.

As the pandemic continued, employees followed a tremendous burst of economic productivity with feelings of fatigue and burnout. This burn-out became widespread enough to earn the moniker "The Great Resignation." But perhaps a better title is the "Great Reflection," as employees do some soul searching, re-examining life priorities and the role of work. This may be one reason why the focus on mental health resources has become a much larger part of employee benefits programs.

Many studies show poor mental health and stress increase health care costs for chronic diseases, like high blood pressure, diabetes, as well as short-term health care needs. It is also clear that stress and mental health challenges affect worker productivity. These connections became clearer during the pandemic, resulting in employee benefits programs responding with several valuable resource including, access to free counseling sessions, virtual counseling services and subscriptions to apps for wellness, stress reduction and improved sleep.

Increased Family Leave Benefits

During the last year, a lot of articles have been published about women in the workplace and the challenges faced balancing work and child care needs. Despite the advances of society to provide more equity between men and women, this one area of child care and rearing of newborns still seems to fall more on women than on men. This perspective has begun to shift to seeing a role for men in the child care process, but it has been very slow. Focusing on the health of the family and sources of family stress—namely, child care—could play a major role in reducing worker stress and improving worker productivity.

A very practical way to help families with the caregiving burden and stress is to support and enable the partner to take on more caregiving responsibilities at home. Allowing fathers with newborns to take time off by committing to paternity leave is a very simple way to reduce this burden.

The construction industry is clearly male dominated, and providing paternity leave as an employee benefit could be an innovative way to improve worker productivity, reduce worker stress and ultimately improve the ability to attract and retain skilled workers. It may seem counterintuitive to give workers time off work to take care of a newborn being good for business when every worker and every hour is valuable, but it is an investment that could pay off huge dividends.

In a recent study by McKinsey Global, "A fresh look at paternity leave: Why the benefits extend beyond the personal," fathers involved in caregiving, and taking time off work to support working moms and partners, can provide significant and widespread advantages to the entire economy. The study concluded that when fathers have time off work to support their partners, overall family stress is reduced and the father (employee) is happier, more productive and has more satisfying and meaningful family relationships. The support for the partner by the father, allows a faster return to work by the partner helping the entire family finances. In this study of fathers who took time off, 79% were glad they took the leave and 71% noticed an improvement in the relationship with their partner.

Offering paternity leave will not immediately have an impact on a worker that is a new father, as company culture must be changed as well. In America, a work-hard culture has made it shameful for workers to take time off for vacation, sick time or really any reason at all. Fostering a culture that supports time off to recharge and focus on family will be a longer-term effort. But this effort should not be intimidating—start now and start small. Give new fathers some time off. It doesn't need to match what new mothers get off for maternity leave, but a small start can go a long way, even just a week. Begin to create a company culture that encourages time off, assures employees that paternity leave will not have an impact on their career, and supports employee and their families by using more than just paternity leave.

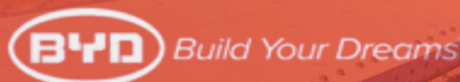

Public works projects shall be subject to compliance monitoring and enforcement by the Department of Industrial Relations. For all projects over Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000), a contractor or subcontractor shall not be qualified to submit a bid or to be listed in a bid proposal subject to the requirements of Public Contract Code section 4104 unless currently registered and qualified under Labor Code section 1725.5 to perform public work as defined by Division 2, Part 7, Chapter 1 (§§1720 et seq.) of the Labor Code. For all projects over Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000), a contractor or subcontractor shall not be qualified to enter into, or engage in the performance of, any contract of public work (as defined by Division 2, Part 7, Chapter 1 (§§1720 et seq.) of the Labor Code) unless currently registered and qualified under Labor Code section 1725.5 to perform public work and proof of registration is provided.

The Contract Time shall be **60** calendar days, and liquidated damages for delay shall accrue. The deadline for Completion is **TBD** (Tentative Date) See Article III of the Agreement for details.

No bid will be accepted by the Owner after this time. Facsimile (FAX) copies of the bid will not be accepted. PLEASE NOTE: DUE TO COVID-19 BIDS WILL NOT BE OPENED. BID RESULTS WILL BE MADE AVAILABLE VIA EMAIL.

A mandatory pre-bid site visit will be held on **June 21, 2022 at 10:00 a.m.**, at Front entrance of the Edna Brewer site. Bidders not attending the site visit will be disqualified.

Bids must be accompanied by a bidder's bond, cashier's check, or certified check for at least ten percent (10%) of the amount of the base bid and made payable to the Owner, as detailed in the Contract Documents.

Owner, or its designee, has determined that certain materials, services, products or things designated by specific brand or trade name shall not be subject to Public Contract Code section 3400(a) in order that a field test or experiment may be made to determine the product's suitability for future use; in order to match other materials, services, products or things in use on a particular Owner public improvement either completed or in the course of completion; in order to obtain a necessary item that is only available from one source; and in order to respond to an emergency declared by Owner.

Pursuant to the Contract Documents, the successful bidder will be required to furnish a Payment (Labor and Material) Bond in the amount of one hundred percent (100%) of the Contract Sum, and a Faithful Performance Bond in the amount of one hundred percent (100%) of the Contract Sum.

The successful bidder will be allowed to substitute securities or establish an escrow in lieu of retainage, pursuant to Public Contract Code Section 22300, and as described in the Agreement Between Owner and Contractor and General Conditions.

The Owner will not consider or accept any bids from contractors who are not licensed to do business in the State of California, in accordance with the California Public Contract Code, providing for the licensing of contractors. In accordance with Section 3300 of said Code, the bidder shall have a **C-10- Electrical Contractor's** license and shall maintain that license in good standing through Completion of the Contract and all applicable warranty periods. For all projects over Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000), the bidder shall state the public works contractor registration number on the Designation of Subcontractors form for each subcontractor performing more than one-half of one percent (0.5%) of the bidder's total bid.

The Director of Industrial Relations of the State of California, in the manner provided by law, has ascertained the general prevailing rate of per diem wages and rate for legal holidays and overtime work. The Contractor must pay for any labor therein described or classified in an amount not less than the rates specified. Copies of the required rates are on file at the Owner's business office and are available on request.
