

California's new governor must hold down clean energy costs, drive innovation

The California governorship is a peculiar prize. This November's winner will inherit a powerful office that's one-part bully pulpit and two-parts hot seat. Suddenly, every decision they make will ripple through the fifth-largest economy on Earth and the daily lives of 39 million people.

The winner will pay a price for that power, saddled immediately with a spiraling affordability crisis hammering the state's middle class. A good place to start? The price of power.

If California's multi-decade housing failure drives the cost crisis, our ideology-driven energy policy is riding shotgun.

Energy costs feed into everything, devouring household budgets directly and through higher prices. Voters are feeling it. Employers are fleeing it.

We at the New California Coalition — a non-partisan alliance of business, labor and civic leaders — have conducted extensive polling and focus groups with Californians. Our findings align with Stanford University's Deliberative Democracy Lab and the Public Policy Institute of California: Voters want a cleaner energy future — but not if it wrecks jobs, doubles bills or drives out the middle class.

It's a dual mandate with co-equal goals: climate leadership — including sustainability and resilience — and shared economic prosperity — meaning affordability, reliability and economic opportunity.

We found 85% of Californians prioritize affordability over emissions, not because they doubt climate action, but because they doubt the state can deliver it without harming jobs, energy reliability and a shot at the middle class.

The next governor needs to level with Californians: The state accounts for less than 1% of global emissions. We could shut down every factory, park every car and kill every gas plant tomorrow, and global temperatures wouldn't budge. The other 99% of the world just keeps emitting.

Energy costs and the California Dream

High energy costs strangle the California Dream. When electricity and fuel get expensive, everything gets expensive — housing, food and freight.

Businesses feeling the pinch head for lower-cost locales, taking jobs with them. And the industries we claim to want — artificial intelligence, chip fabrication, clean tech, advanced manufacturing — need a stable, affordable grid. California is effectively telling them to enjoy Arizona.

So, what do voters want? Stanford found they support major energy technology — including modern nuclear — provided it keeps power and fuel affordable and reliable.

What they reject is magical thinking: killing off existing energy sources before new ones are viable. This isn't ideology or climate denialism. It's common sense.

Extreme Increases In Aluminum, Steel And Copper Costs Drive Up Prices For Construction Materials In January

The producer price index for materials and services used in nonresidential construction rose 2.9 percent from January 2025 to last month, while construction spending slipped 0.4 percent from December 2024 to December 2025, according to an analysis by the Associated General Contractors of America of two government reports issued today. Association officials said that tariffs are inflating the cost of key materials and urged federal officials to quickly renew key infrastructure measures like the surface transportation bill to give domestic suppliers the certainty they need to boost production.

“Although producer indexes are based on selling prices of domestic producers, the steep tar-

iffs on imported metals and products are clearly enabling U.S. sellers to push up costs for construction materials and equipment,” said Ken Simonson, the association's chief economist. “Providing domestic producers with greater certainty about future demand should encourage greater production and, ultimately, lower prices.”

The producer price indexes for aluminum mill shapes and steel mill products rocketed up by 33.0 percent and 20.7 percent, respectively from January 2025 to last month, the largest year-over-year increases since the supply-chain disruptions of early 2022. Simonson noted that both indexes have been accelerating every month since the president imposed a 50 percent tariff last June. The index for copper and brass mill shapes climbed 15.7 percent year-over-year in January. Imported products containing copper

are also subject to a 50 percent tariff, Simonson noted.

A separate government report showed mixed patterns for construction spending in 2025. The total slipped 0.4 percent from December 2024 to last December. Public construction increased 3.4 percent although the largest segment, highway and street construction, rose only 0.8 percent. Private nonresidential spending declined 1.8 percent, dragged down by an 11.4 percent plunge in the largest subcategory, manufacturing construction. Private residential spending fell 1.3 percent, with a 3.6 percent decline in single-family construction offsetting a 2.9 percent increase in multifamily spending.

Association officials noted that it will be hard for domestic producers to raise capacity for certain

key products unless they have more certainty about future demand. That is one reason why the association recently launched a new national campaign, called America's Moving Forward, to urge Congress to pass a new surface transportation bill before the current legislation expires at the end of September.

“It will be hard for suppliers to boost production if they have no idea about future demand for their products,” said Jeffrey D. Shoaf, the chief executive officer of the Associated General Contractors of America. “Passing the surface transportation bill — the single largest federal construction measure — on time will give domestic suppliers the certainty they need to boost production and offset the impacts of tariffs.”

The next governor must treat energy as a top-of-the-chart priority. Whether through direct oversight, an energy czar, or a cabinet-level leader — direction must come from the Governor's office, with streamlined permitting and measurable targets tracked publicly.

It means building a counterweight to the regulatory state: an economic growth agency backed by job creators, and a formal workforce development role to train Californians for the jobs this transition will create.

It also means redirecting cap-and-invest funds toward innovation that advances the co-equal goals of climate leadership and shared economic prosperity.

The next governor needs to get serious, fast. He or she should first unwind the bureaucratic snarl blocking transmission lines and unleash distrib-

uted energy generation, which involves small, localized energy generators such as rooftop solar, small modular reactors and local microgrids.

We can't electrify everything while strangling the grid.

Next, the new governor should extend Diablo Canyon's operation. It's California's largest source of carbon-free electricity, and it works. End the outdated ban on small modular reactors. Nuclear is clean, stable and here.

California's leader also should ensure the state continues investing in existing oil and natural gas infrastructure while developing new infrastructure for future diversified energy sources.

Supreme Court Rules Tariffs Unconstitutional: Why the Construction Industry Shouldn't Expect Calm Just Yet

The wake of a recent Supreme Court ruling denoting the Trump tariffs unconstitutional poses many possibilities for construction.

The U.S. Supreme Court's 6-3 decision in Learning Resources, Inc. v. Trump did what many expected: it held that the International Emergency Economic Powers Act (IEEPA) does not authorize the President to impose tariffs. What few anticipated was the speed of what followed: within hours of the ruling, the administration announced replacement tariffs under Section 122 of the Trade Act of 1974, imposed a 10% global surcharge effective February 24, and signaled forthcoming Section 301 investigations against most major trading partners.

For those in the construction industry hoping the Learning Resources ruling would restore market stability, the message was unambiguous. The constitutional question may be settled, but the market disruption is not.

A Constitutional Boundary, Not a Market Correction.

The Court's holding is significant. Writing for the six-justice majority, Chief Justice Roberts concluded that IEEPA's grant of authority to "regulate ... importation" does not include the power to impose tariffs—emphasizing that the statute contains no reference to tariffs or duties, that no President has read IEEPA to confer such power in the statute's nearly fifty-year history, and that Congress has consistently used explicit language when delegating tariff authority.

In a plurality portion joined only by Justices Gorsuch and Barrett, Roberts went further, invoking the major questions doctrine to underscore that Congress must clearly authorize delegations of authority involving "economic and political significance," particularly where the claimed power implicates a core congressional prerogative under Article I.

The decision invalidated every tariff imposed under IEEPA since early 2025, including the reciprocal tariffs on virtually all trading partners and the country-specific duties on Canada, Mexico and China that contributed to cost escalations for imported steel, aluminum, lumber, and equipment for the better part of a year. Notably, Justice Kavanaugh, joined by Justices Thomas and Alito, dissented, warning that the process of securing refunds for previously paid IEEPA tariffs will be a "mess."

Most significantly for the construction market marketplace, the ruling was limited to tariffs imposed under IEEPA's now-invalidated tariff authority and, therefore, left the executive branch room to explore other pathways for the imposition of tariffs. For example, Section 232 tariffs on steel and aluminum—now at 50%—remain untouched. Section 301 tariffs are unaffected by the ruling. And the administration's new Section 122 surcharge—set at 10% in a signed proclamation, with the President announcing via social media his intent to raise the rate to the statutory maximum of 15%—applies broadly to imports from all countries not already covered by Section 232 or qualifying under the USMCA. For construction firms, tariff driven market disruption and volatility will likely remain.

Brief Relief, Then Reality

In the hours after the Learning Resources opinion was delivered, a cautious optimism swept through the marketplace. That sentiment faded quickly, however, as industry associations, like the Associated Builders and Contractors, projected modest reductions in prices for specialty equipment, HVAC systems and electrical components—but acknowledged that the structural cost pressures on core materials are likely to be materially unchanged.

The practical reality for the construction industry is that pricing is less affected by whether a tariff is technically lawful under one authority or another, and is far more affected by whether pricing is stable. Stability is likely to remain elusive, as recent patterns of tariff announcement, adjustment and readjustment show no sign of ending.

The Refund Question

One of the most consequential aspects of the ruling is found in its silence: The opinion did not address whether importers are entitled to refunds for tariffs previously paid under IEEPA and, if so, how the refund process will be administered. By most estimates, the federal government collected upwards of \$160 billion in IEEPA duties over the past year. Approximately 2,000 importers have already filed suit with the Court of International Trade to preserve their refund claims. That litigation is just beginning and is likely to extend for months, if not years.

For the construction industry, the refund issue is uniquely complex because the party that paid the tariff at the border is likely to own the refund claim, but the cost implications of the tariffs flowed throughout the market as the costs of construction inputs were adjusted to reflect the market disruptions. Refunds, if they are ever to be issued, will flow to importers of record, with the consumers of wrongfully tariffed inputs likely excluded from cost recoveries.

Whether an importer has any obligation to pass tariff recoveries back through the supply chain will likely depend on each participant's contracts, and many of those agreements were never drafted with retroactive tariff relief in mind. Disputes at every tier of the supply chain should be expected.

What Now?

The question construction professionals should be asking is not whether IEEPA supports tariffs. The Court answered that question definitively: it does not. The question is whether tariffs will continue to be deployed as a primary policy instrument of the executive branch, and the administration's response to the Learning Resources opinion leaves no room for doubt on this important question. Tariffs and market disruptions are here to stay for the foreseeable future. Almost immediately after the Learning Resources opinion was rendered, U.S. Trade Representative Jameson Greer announced that Section 301 investigations will be initiated "in short order" against most major trading partners. Multiple Section 232 investigations are already pending. And if those actions evolve into new tariffs, market volatility can be expected to continue.
