# Why Midsized Construction Firms Need Strategic AI Leadership

Construction companies come in all shapes and sizes. Thankfully, so do construction-focused artificial intelligence platforms.


Midsized construction firms are at a critical juncture: Digital transformation is moving fast, and AI has shifted from buzzword to bottom-line necessity. Yet many midsized, often family-owned firms still lack defined AI leadership, costing them time, margin and market position.

### THE COST OF WAITING

AI adoption in construction often starts strong but stalls. Project teams test scheduling tools, finance explores forecasting models. But, without strategy or leadership, these pilots rarely scale or deliver measurable ROI.

Waiting on AI leadership exposes firms in three ways:

- Wasted investment—Disconnected pilots and redundant tools burn time and budgets without improving performance.
- Increased risk—AI can spot safety, cost and scheduling issues before they escalate.
   Without leadership, these insights stay buried in data silos.
- Lost advantage—Early adopters gain efficiency and lower implementation costs.
   Late movers pay more to catch up and often need to rebuild what others already optimized



The reality is that most construction firms aren't seeing real results from AI. Industry experience shows that without a clear strategy and strong governance, digital transformation efforts and AI pilots frequently fail to deliver value. Firms that jump in without a roadmap end up with fragmented tools, missed opportunities and higher costs down the line. The lesson: Success with AI comes down to readiness, not speed.

A structured IT and AI readiness assessment creates a clear path to quick wins and scalable value. By identifying where technology can move the needle and ensuring every initiative is aligned with business goals, firms can avoid wasted investment and build a foundation for sustainable innovation.

### LEADERSHIP THAT DRIVES OUTCOMES

Hiring a full-time chief AI officer may feel out of reach, but leadership doesn't require a new C-suite title. Midsized firms can scale AI leadership to fit their organization. Start with an internal champion, someone who understands both field operations and business goals. They don't need to be data scientists; they just need to be empowered to align pilots, vet vendors and drive ROI

Fractional leadership is another proven model. External advisors help define strategy, structure governance and guide implementation without full-time overhead. Integrating AI into existing roles—estimating, operations, finance—helps ensure that adoption becomes part of the workflow, not a separate initiative.

Effective AI leadership means starting with a clear business strategy, robust governance and a focus on data quality. Every AI initiative should be scored for feasibility: Does it align with responsible principles? Is the required data available and clean? Are the necessary skills and infrastructure in place? Is there leadership buy-in? When these fundamentals are in place, firms can prioritize the right use cases, avoid wasted effort and drive measurable outcomes.

### Even California's iconic industries are cutting back in this sluggish economy

As Gov. Gavin Newsom ramps up what appears to be a 2028 White House bid, a mainstay of his pitch during television interviews and social media appearances is California's economy.

As Newsom tells it, the state's \$4-trillion-plus annual economic output is not only the fourth largest in the world, were it a nation, but it's a model of entrepreneurial vigor and programs advancing equity.

Were it only true.

A year ago, the Legislature's budget analyst, Gabe Petek, indirectly blew the whistle on Newsom's braggadocio.

"California's economy has been in an extended slowdown for the better part of two years, characterized by a soft labor market and weak consumer spending," Petek wrote while outlining the state's deficit-ridden budget dilemma.

"While this slowdown has been gradual and the severity milder than a recession, a look at recent economic data paints a picture of a sluggish economy. Outside of government and health care, the state has added no jobs in a year and a half."

Nothing has changed since then. Employment has been stuck at virtually the same level for a couple of years. At 5.5%, California's unemployment rate is the highest of any state, with more than a million workers lacking jobs.

Meanwhile, the state has been overspending its revenues, creating what budget experts call a "structural deficit," meaning spending programs locked into law are greater than the reliable income to fund them.

California really can't afford those compassionate services Newsom boasts about creating. He and the Legislature, amid great fanfare, extended state-paid medical care to undocumented immigrants, only to be forced to roll it back after costs turned out to be double their estimate.

It should be noted that what Petek saw a year ago, and remains fundamentally true today, predates Donald Trump's becoming president, so blaming him, which Newsom attempted earlier this year, is groundless.

One of the most troubling aspects of California's wheel-spinning economy is the turmoil in two revered sectors, high technology in the San Francisco Bay Area and Southern California's movie and television production industry.

Silicon Valley has been shedding jobs for the past several years as it shifts emphasis to artificial intelligence. This weeks' announcement that Amazon is cutting 14,000 jobs — and may eventually double that number as it focuses on AI — was a jolt.

Not all of those cuts are in California, of course, but the online seller has been heavily involved in California, operating multiple warehouses.

"We expect to continue hiring in key strategic areas while also finding additional places we can remove layers, increase ownership, and realize efficiency gains," Beth Galetti, Amazon's senior vice president of people experience, said in a memo to employees.

Meanwhile, the Paramount production conglomerate, a mainstay of the Southern California entertainment industry for decades, also announced payroll cuts as new owners took over.

Paramount on Wednesday began cutting about 1,000 employees, the initial cohort of what could be much deeper cuts. David Ellison, Paramount's new boss, said the reduction is aimed at "building a strong foundation for the future."

The layoffs hit not only Paramount's movie production, but also staff at its CBS television subsidiary, MTV and Comedy Central. The Los Angeles Times reported that another 1,000 jobs are expected to be cut later, bringing the total reduction to about 10% of Paramount's workforce.

Movie and TV production in Southern California has been declining for years as companies have coped with high costs and been lured to other states or nations with lower costs and subsidies. Another iconic movie company, Warner Bros. Discovery, is currently for sale.

Despite California's budget woes, Newsom and the Legislature increased state tax credits — in effect, cash subsidies — for in-state TV and movie productions to \$750 million this year. But the hemorrhage has continued.

### OSHA's 2025 Rules Tighten Safety Requirements: Why Recordkeeping Software Is Now Essential

Construction remains one of the most hazardous industries in the U.S., and OSHA's new 2025 regulations raise the bar for compliance. With the industry still accounting for more than one in five workplace deaths, safety is no longer a back-office task — it's a core business function.

OSHA's recent updates reflect a shift toward prevention and real-time verification. Inspectors are now prioritizing proactive documentation and continuous monitoring through wearable tech and smart helmets. Falls, still the leading cause of construction fatalities, are regulated at lower heights, and new heat illness prevention programs are required in hot climates. Crews must also complete documented hazard analyses before beginning high-risk work such as excavation or steel erection.

Beyond physical hazards, OSHA has expanded its focus to include worker mental health, acknowledging the growing crisis of suicide in the construction industry. Companies are now expected to demonstrate efforts that address both physical and emotional well-being through toolbox talks, training logs and documented prevention programs.

At the same time, penalties have increased again in 2025 — with serious violations now exceeding \$16,500 and willful ones surpassing \$165,000. These escalating fines make proactive safety documentation not just a regulatory requirement but a financial safeguard.

### **Documentation as Defense**

When inspectors arrive, they expect to see proof of safety planning, enforcement and worker training — often on short notice. Paper systems can make this difficult. Records get misplaced, handwriting is unclear and gathering complete documentation can take weeks.

McInnis Construction learned this lesson firsthand After a fall incident the company quickly produced comprehensive digital records showing the worker's training, toolbox talks and attendance. The inspector was impressed by the speed and completeness, and the company avoided fines altogether. The takeaway: strong documentation can mean the difference between compliance and costly citations.

#### The Role of OSHA Recordkeeping Software

Digital platforms such as HCSS Safety make it easier for contractors to stay compliant. Field teams can record inspections, meetings, and incidents in real time from any device. Data is time-stamped, securely stored and easily retrievable during audits. A safety manager can instantly generate OSHA 300 logs, confirm certifications or review safety trends to prevent future accidents.

These features also improve accuracy and foster a culture of safety across jobsites. By integrating documentation into daily routines, companies reduce risk, improve insurance ratings, and demonstrate accountability to both regulators and em-
