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California's last nuclear plant too vital to shut down

When California voters recalled then-Gov. Gray Davis in 2003, a year after giving him a second term, they established a new political principle: Governors must, no matter what the political or financial cost, avoid power blackouts.


Fairly or not, Davis was blamed when power blackouts hit the state in early 2003 due to a botched overhaul of utility regulation.

That's why, despite his insistence that California will lead the world in conversion to an all-electric, zero-emission society, Gov. Gavin Newsom wants to extend operations of some gas-powered generating plants that had been ticketed for closure and — most ironically — of California's only remaining nuclear power plant, which was to shut down in 2025.

The state's shift to wind and solar power has not kept pace with demand, especially during increasingly frequent heat waves, and we've teetered on the brink of blackouts on particularly hot days. Closing down the gas-fired generators and the Diablo Canyon nuclear plant — the latter supplying about 9% of the state's power supply — would make blackouts very likely.

Newsom's proposal to extend the lives of those vital resources, not surprisingly, generated opposition among environmentalists, threatening to scuttle his energy plan in the final days of the 2022 legislative session, which is to end at midnight Wednesday.

U.S. Department of Commerce Invests \$2.7 Million in American Rescue Plan Funds for Expansion of High-Speed Internet in Rural California

U.S. Secretary of Commerce Gina Raimondo announced that the Department's Economic Development Administration (EDA) is awarding a \$2.7 million grant to Golden State Finance Authority, Sacramento, California, for high-speed internet planning. This grant is funded by the American Rescue Plan.

This project will support the development of a strategic plan to guide the expansion of high-speed internet across 26 rural counties of California. This EDA grant will be matched with \$1.2 million in local funds and is expected to

generate \$400 million in private investment, according to grantee estimates.

"President Biden is committed to harnessing the full power of the federal government to ensure our nation not only recovers from this pandemic but builds a better America for the future," said Secretary of Commerce Gina Raimondo. "This award reaffirms the President's commitment to increasing internet accessibility throughout the United States and lays a strong foundation for the critical investments we will make to expand high-speed internet thanks to the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law."

"The Economic Development Administration plays an important role in supporting community-led economic development strategies designed to boost coronavirus recovery and response efforts," said Assistant Secretary of Commerce for Economic Development Alejandra Y. Castillo. "This investment lays the foundation for the future expansion of high-speed internet to rural and underserved areas of California."

"The digital divide holds back too many communities across the country, including here in California," said Governor Gavin Newsom. "This grant will support the expansion of high-speed internet in rural, underserved areas of the state, complementing California's

historic commitment to achieving broadband for all. I thank the Biden Administration for its work to deliver affordable, reliable high-speed internet across the nation."

"From education to health care, access to highspeed internet is essential," said Senator Alex Padilla. "This funding will help rural counties across California build the foundation they need to expand access to high-speed internet. I'm glad to see the American Rescue Plan continue to improve economic opportunity for all Californians."

Construction Spending Slips In July As Sharp Downturn In Homebuilding Outweighs Advances In Private Nonresidential And Public Projects

Total construction spending decreased by 0.4 percent in July as spending on new houses and apartments tumbled, overshadowing a pickup in private nonresidential and public construction, according to an analysis the Associated General Contractors of America released today of federal spending data. Association officials said their newly released survey, conducted with Autodesk, showed labor shortages and supply chain problems are limiting their ability to complete projects, likely undermining total construction spending levels.

"There were gains for the month for nearly every private nonresidential category, along with a jump in highway and transportation work," said Ken Simonson, the association's chief economist. "But our survey found every type of contractor is facing challenges in finding enough qualified workers to meet the demand that is probably limiting total construction activity.

Construction spending, not adjusted for inflation, totaled \$1.78 trillion at a seasonally adjusted annual rate in July, 0.4 percent be-

low the upwardly revised June rate but 8.5 percent higher than in July 2021. Private nonresidential construction spending rose for the third month in a row, increasing 0.4 percent from June. Public construction spending climbed 1.5 percent from June. However, these increases were negated by a 1.5 decline in private residential spending. That segment was dragged down by a 4.0 percent slide in new single-family spending and a dip of 0.6 percent in multifamily

Ten of the 11 private nonresidential categories in the government's release had at least minor upturns in July, Simonson noted. The largest private segment, commercial construction-warehouse, retail, and farm projects-increased 0.7 percent. Power construction, including spending on oil and gas projects, rose marginally. Manufacturing construction added 0.6 percent. Office construction spending, including data centers, climbed 0.6 percent.

The largest public category, highway and street construction, leaped 4.3 percent for the month. Other major segments were mixed: spending on education structures inched down

0.1 percent, while outlays for transportation facilities rose 1.4 percent.

The association's survey found contractors broadly optimistic about demand for projects, Simonson said. Seventy-one percent of the firms expect to add employees in the next 12 months. But shortages of workers had caused projects to be delayed for 66 percent of the firms, and 82 percent had experienced delays due to shortages or longer lead times for acquiring materials.

Association officials said that labor shortages and supply chain problems are undermining total construction activity. These urged public leaders to boost funding for construction-focused education and training programs. These also called for immigration reform to allow more people with construction skills to lawfully enter the country.

"It is hard to build without builders," said Simonson. "Getting more people exposed to construction is the surest way to expand the industry's workforce and put more people into high-paying

California's last nuclear plant too vital to shut down

However, intensive backroom negotiations appear to have produced results. Late Sunday, a compromise measure to keep Diablo Canyon operating for at least five more years was introduced, just hours before the constitutional deadline. It declares that extending Diablo Canyon operations "is prudent, cost effective, and in the best interests of all California electricity customers."

The legislation, Senate Bill 846, reduces the extended operation from the 10 years Newsom sought and contains some other provisions to mollify environmental critics, such as calling for intense efforts to bring more non-nuclear and carbon-free power on line. However, it also requires a two-thirds vote so that the plant's owner, Pacific Gas and Electric, can meet a looming federal deadline for seeking federal funds to finance extended operations.

Lobbyists working on the issue believe that Senate approval is certain, because the senator who represents Diablo Canyon's site in San Luis Obispo County, John Laird, seems to be on board. Assembly approval is a bit less certain because the issue is caught up in a fierce leadership battle, pitting Speaker Anthony Rendon, who says he will seek another term when the Legislature reconvenes in December, against Assemblyman Robert Rivas.

Although the legislation would keep Diablo Canyon on-line for at least five years, it's highly likely that it will be extended further because it's highly unlikely that enough alternative power will be available by 2030.

Consider using technology to monitor infrastructure. Sensors can automatically inspect infrastructure, collect data and report potential problems while they are small and before they grow into a full-blown catastrophe, helping to keep travelers and the public safe.

Technology empowers contractors to onboard operators with ease. The next generation of workers quickly learns and uses new technologies. Using digital technology throughout the project also lengthens the asset's lifespan.

There are millions of miles of roads in the country, from heavily traveled interstates to quaint stretches of backroads. They all need constant care, but which sections require the most immediate attention? Judging by the state of U.S. infrastructure, it's difficult enough to know.

Technology can take an arduous task that is manual, costly and time-consuming and speed it up. In the process, it will enable more reliable decisions about what infrastructure projects most are in need. Additionally, with technology, infrastructure maintenance decisions can be made locally rather than centrally. which often results in better decisions.
